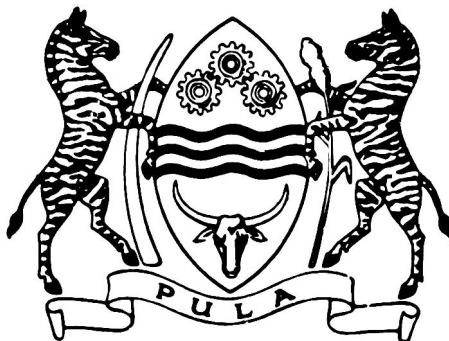

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The object of the Bill is to empower the Director of Veterinary Services to allow the movement of stock into or through stock-free zones whenever he considers it in the public interest to do so.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

1. This Act may be cited as the Diseases of Animals (Amendment) Act, 1982. Short title
2. The Diseases of Animals Act, 1977, is hereby amended by substituting for section 8 thereof, the following new section — Amendment
of Act
No. 9 of
1977
8. (1) The Minister may, by statutory instrument, make an order declaring such areas as may be specified in such order to be stock-free zones for the purpose of the control of disease. “Stock-free
zones, fences
and dipping
tanks”
- (2) Without prejudice to the provisions of subsection (1), the Minister may, by notice published in the Gazette,
 - (a) direct that stock be removed from a stock-free zone;
 - (b) direct the erection of dipping tanks, spray races, smudge houses and such other structures as he may consider necessary for the purpose of the control of disease;
 - (c) direct the erection and maintenance of fences on any land for the purpose of the control of disease;

- (d) declare specified routes or modes of transport along which cattle are moved from place to place within Botswana to be stock routes; and
 - (e) prohibit the sinking of boreholes within 8 km of any fence erected under paragraph (c).
- (3) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this section, the Director may, where he deems it necessary so to do, by written permit, allow any person to move stock into or through a stock-free zone on such conditions as may be specified in the permit."

CONSTITUTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1982
(Published on 11th March, 1982)

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The laws relating to citizenship are contained partly in the Constitution and partly in the Citizenship of Botswana (Supplementary Provisions) Act (Cap. 25:01). The Law Reform Committee recently made certain recommendations which will necessitate the amendment of the citizenship laws of the country. In the light of the recommendations it is considered desirable to re-enact with amendments, in one Act, the provisions relating to citizenship. The proposed new Citizenship Bill, 1982, will be presented to the National Assembly at the same time as the proposed amendment to the Constitution.

3. Clause 2 of the Bill therefore proposes the repeal of sections 20 to 29 inclusive (the provisions relating to citizenship) of the Constitution.

Short title 1. This Act may be cited as the Constitution (Amendment) Act, 1982.

Repeal of sections 20 to 29 inclusive of the Constitution 2. Sections 20 to 29 inclusive of the Constitution relating to citizenship are hereby repealed.

Preservation of existing citizenship 3. Every person who was a citizen of Botswana at the commencement of this Act shall remain a citizen notwithstanding the repeals effected by this Act.
