**DECLARATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES OF  
MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT BILL, 1998**

*(Published on 10th July, 1998)*

**MEMORANDUM**

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

On 22nd March, 1996, Parliament passed a resolution to the effect that all members of Parliament shall, in future, declare their business and financial interests including farming interests and fixed assets. And that such a declaration shall be entered into a register which shall be open for inspection by members of the public on request.

The object of this Bill is, therefore, to give effect to that resolution passed by Parliament on 22nd March, 1996. And this is being done in the interests of transparency and accountability.

The Bill provides that every Member of Parliament shall make a written declaration of all his or her assets and liabilities and those of his or her spouse and his or her dependent children. The written declaration is to be lodged with the Clerk of the National Assembly who shall be the Registrar of Members' Interests. On receipt of the written declaration, the Registrar is required to enter it into a register to be established as the Register of Members' Interests. The Register will be open for inspection by the public on request.

The declaration of assets and liabilities shall be made within 90 days of the coming into force of the Act and subsequently within 90 days of taking and subscribing the oath of allegiance on being elected as a Member of Parliament. Failure to declare or knowingly making false declaration would constitute contempt of Parliament.

The Bill also provides for the appointment by the Committee of Selection of Parliament of a Committee to be called the Committee of Members' Interests. The Registrar of Members' Interests will act as Secretary to the Committee. The Committee will be responsible for ensuring that Members of Parliament comply with the provisions of the Act. It is empowered to investigate any allegation of contravention of any provision of the Act. If the Committee, after considering the allegation is of the opinion that an offence has been committed under the Act, it shall refer the matter to the Attorney-General for the appropriate action to be taken.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Declaration of Assets and Liabilities of Members of Parliament Act, 1998.

Interpretation

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires —  
 “assets” includes any property, moveable and immovable, incomes present and contingent, owned by a Member;

“child” includes a stepchild and a lawfully adopted child;

“liabilities” includes responsibility according to law to satisfy a debt, duty or obligation quantifiable in monetary value, present and contingent;

“the Registrar” means the Clerk of the National Assembly appointed under section 7 as the Registrar of Members' Interests.

Declaration of assets and liabilities

3. (1) Every Member of Parliament, that is to say, the President, the Elected and Specially Elected Members of the National Assembly including the Speaker of the National Assembly shall submit to the Registrar a written declaration of his or her assets and liabilities and those of his or her spouse and any unmarried child under the age of 18 years —

(a) within 90 days after the coming into force of this Act; and thereafter,

(b) within 90 days of taking and subscribing the oath of allegiance on being elected as a Member of Parliament.

(2) Any subsequent assets acquired or any liabilities incurred by a Member of Parliament shall be declared within 90 days of the acquisition of the assets or incurring of the liabilities, as the case may be, and the Register of Members' Interests shall accordingly be amended.

4. Any Member of Parliament who fails to make a declaration shall be guilty of contempt of Parliament; and any Member of Parliament who knowingly makes a false declaration shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding P2 000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months, or to both.

Failure to make declaration constituting contempt of Parliament

5. Any assets acquired by a Member of Parliament after the initial declaration made under section 3 and which are not reasonably attributable to income, gift, loan, inheritance or any other reasonable source shall be deemed to have been acquired unlawfully and shall be an offence under this Act.

Unlawful acquisition of assets

6. (1) The Committee of Selection of Parliament shall, at the commencement of the first session of each Parliament, appoint a Standing Committee on Members' Interests (in this Act referred to as "the Committee").

Appointment of Committee of Members' Interests

(2) The Deputy Speaker shall be the Chairman of the Committee.

(3) The members of the Committee shall hold office for the life of the Parliament.

7. The Clerk of the National Assembly shall be appointed as the Registrar of Members' Interests and shall act as Secretary to the Committee.

Appointment of Registrar

8. (1) The Committee shall be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this Act.

Functions of Committee

(2) Any allegation that a Member of Parliament has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Act shall be made to the Committee which may investigate such allegation.

(3) If the Committee, after considering the allegation, is of the opinion that the Member has contravened any provision of this Act and that such contravention amounted to contempt of Parliament, then the provisions of section 11 shall have effect.

(4) Where, however, the Committee, after considering the allegation, is of the opinion that an offence has been committed, it shall refer the matter to the Attorney-General for the appropriate action to be taken.

9. (1) There is hereby established a Register of Members' Interests (in this Act referred to as "the Register") as set out in the Schedule.

Register of Members' Interests

(2) The Registrar shall be responsible for the management and maintenance of the Register.

(3) The Register shall, in respect of a person who ceases to be a Member of Parliament, be closed.

10. (1) The Registrar shall, on receipt of any written declaration made under section 3, enter such declaration in the Register.

Entry of declaration in Register

(2) The Register shall be available for inspection by any person on such conditions as may be prescribed by the Committee.

(3) The Register shall, on demand, be produced in evidence before a court of competent jurisdiction.

(4) The provisions of subsections (2) and (3) shall not apply to the Register in respect of a person who has ceased to be a Member of Parliament.

Penalty

**11.** (1) Where the Committee has come to a decision that a Member of Parliament is in contempt of Parliament in terms of the provisions of this Act, it may —

- (a) warn or reprimand the Member;
- (b) suspend the Member for a period not exceeding 30 sitting days of the National Assembly; or
- (c) impose a fine of not more than P1 000.

(2) Where a fine imposed under this section is not paid within 14 days from the date of imposition, the Speaker shall order that the amount be deducted from the Member's emoluments.

Appeals

**12.** (1) There shall be established an Appeal Committee which shall consist of the following Members of the National Assembly, namely:

- (a) the Speaker of the National Assembly;
- (b) the Leader of the House; and
- (c) the Leader of the Opposition in the National Assembly.

(2) Any Member of the National Assembly aggrieved by a decision of the Committee on Members' Interests may appeal to the Appeal Committee whose decision thereon shall be final.

Establishment of Fund

**13.** (1) There shall be established a Fund to be called the National Assembly Fines Fund (in this Act referred to as "the Fund") which shall be under the control and management of the Speaker.

(2) All fines imposed in terms of section 11 shall, when collected, be paid into the Fund.

(3) The moneys accruing to the Fund shall be disbursed in such manner as may be determined from time to time by the Members of the National Assembly.

Contravention of conditions of use of Register

**14.** Any person who contravenes any condition prescribed for inspecting the Register shall be guilty of an offence, and on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding P5 000, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years, or to both.

**CONSUMER PROTECTION BILL, 1998**  
*(Published on 10th July, 1998)*

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly is set out below.

The object of the Bill is to provide for the regulation of business practices with regard to consumers, so as to expurgate unfair business practices and secure the rights of consumers. To achieve this objective the Bill provides for the establishment of an Office which shall be a public office, and enables the appointment of a Director and other staff to administer the provisions of the Bill and run the Offices under clauses 3 and 4.

In clause 5 the Bill empowers the Office to monitor the business sector and investigate business practices which have, or are likely to have, the effect of exploiting or prejudicing the interest of any consumer. An important function of the Office listed under clause 5 is the dissemination of consumer related information with the objective of facilitating the education of the consumer on the products and services available on the market and assisting him or her to make an informed choice.

The Office is further empowered to receive complaints of unfair business practices and to carry out thorough investigations to determine the facts of the complaints received under clauses 7 to 10.

Redress mechanisms for the complaints received are provided for in the Bill. A complaint can be redressed either by the Office assisting the parties to arrive at a settlement under clause 11 or through petitioning the court under clauses 12 to 15.

The Bill makes provision for the institution of court proceedings, enables the court to issue urgent orders so as to minimise loss in certain instances and empowers the court to order reimbursement to consumers who have suffered financial loss, where necessary.

The Bill empowers the court, under clause 16, to appoint a curator to manage the business affairs of a person found responsible of practising unfair business practices with the objective of reimbursing, as far as it is possible, the losses suffered by consumers as a result of the unfair business practices.

The confidentiality of information made in accordance with the provisions of the Bill is protected under clause 17. The application of the Bill cannot be excluded by contract under clause 18. The final provision of the Bill, clause 19, empowers the Minister to make regulations for the better carrying out of the purposes and provisions of the Bill.

- (a) to whom or to which any commodity is offered, supplied or made available, where such person or organisation does not intend to apply the commodity for the purposes of resale, lease, rendering services or the manufacture of goods for gain;
- (b) from whom or from which is solicited or whom or which supplies or makes available any investment;

“curator” means a person or body of persons appointed by the court under section 16 to manage such business affairs, as the court may determine, of any person found responsible for practising unfair business practices in terms of this Act, so as to reimburse or compensate, as far as it is possible, any person that may have been defrauded thereto;

“Director” means the Director of the Office appointed under section 4;

“identity card” means an identity card issued to an investigating officer under section 6;

“investigating officer” means an investigating officer appointed under section 6;

“investment” means any money or other property, or any facility intended for use in connexion with any venture or scheme for profit, or purported to be so intended;

“Office” means the Consumer Protection Office established under section 3;

“unfair business practice” means any business practice which, directly or indirectly, has or is likely to have the effect of unfairly affecting any consumer;

3. There shall be established, in accordance with the laws governing the public service, an Office to be known as the Consumer Protection Office.

4. (1) Subject to the laws governing the public service there shall be appointed —

(a) a public officer to be the Director of the Consumer Protection Office; and

(b) such number of public officers as may be deemed necessary, to work in the Office under the supervision of the Director.

(2) The Director shall hold such qualifications and experience, relevant to consumer protection, as the department responsible for public service management may determine.

5. (1) The Office shall, subject to the control of the Minister, be responsible for the administration of this Act.

(2) Without derogating from the generality of subsection (1) the functions of the Office shall be to —

(a) conduct research on consumer protection policies, laws and regulations and make recommendations to the Minister on improvements required thereon;

(b) disseminate information to enable consumers to acquire knowledge of basic consumer rights and obligations and the skills needed to make informed choices about goods and services;

(c) formulate and implement consumer education programmes;

(d) conduct comprehensive surveys on consumer behaviour, consumption patterns, market prices, size and quality of products, unfair business practices and any other related matters, and publish reports on the findings of the surveys;

(e) collect and analyse information on harmful and unsafe products, publish reports on the findings and make recommendations on safety standards to the Government;

(f) receive and investigate complaints of unfair business practices;

(g) obtain warrants to search, seize and cause the testing, where necessary, of products on the market to ensure that specifications, performance, quality and safety standards, as may be determined by the Office under section 8, are met;

(h) preside over disputes of unfair business practices with the objective of assisting the parties to the dispute to reach settlement;

(i) assist a consumer or class of consumers to initiate civil or criminal proceedings arising from an unfair business practice; and

(j) do all such other things as may be necessary to protect consumers from purchasing or otherwise acquiring substandard goods or services or from being otherwise exploited.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Director may, in the performance of the functions of the Office, permit and consider representations made by any consumer organisation or movement on any matter of consumer protection.

6. (1) The Director may designate such number of persons in the service of the office as investigating officers, as it may be deemed necessary after consultation with the Director of the department responsible public service management.

Investigating  
officers

(2) An investigating officer shall hold such qualifications as the Director of the department responsible for public service management may direct.

(3) Each investigating officer shall be issued with an identity card, in a form to be prescribed, and shall have such identity card in his possession when performing any function under this Act.

### PART III — *Complaints and Investigations*

7. (1) Any consumer may lodge a complaint against an alleged unfair business practice with the Office.

Lodging of  
complaint

(2) The Director shall cause a complainant to be assisted, where necessary, to submit a written complaint.

(3) The Director shall cause a preliminary analysis of a complaint received to be made and a report to be drawn up containing recommendations as to whether there are sufficient grounds to warrant the alleged unfair business practice to be investigated.

8. (1) The Minister may instruct the Office, in writing, to investigate any allegation of unfair business practice.

Investigations

(2) The Office may, where it deems it necessary, institute investigations into any form of business to determine whether the business is operating in accordance with set standards of practice.

(3) To determine the set standards of practice for any particular business, the Office may consult such organisations that may regulate the particular type of business under investigation or that may provide similar products or services at a standard recognised nationally or internationally.

9. (1) The Office may summon any person who is able to furnish any information on the subject of an investigation or who has in his possession or under his control any document, book or other object relating to such subject, to appear before the Office to be questioned or to produce the document, book or other object.

Power to  
summon and  
question

(2) A person summoned under subsection (1) shall be questioned under oath or affirmation.

(3) A summons referred to under subsection (1) shall —

- (a) be in the prescribed form;
- (b) contain particulars of the subject of the investigation;
- (c) be signed by the Director or other authorised officer of the Office; and
- (d) be served in the prescribed manner.

(4) A person appearing before the Office under subsection (1) —

- (a) may be assisted at the hearing by any person who is reasonably acquainted with the facts of the subject of the investigation; and
- (b) shall be entitled to the prescribed witness fees.

(5) A person summoned to appear before the Office under this section shall not be entitled to refuse to answer any question or to produce any book, document or other object on the grounds that such answer, document, book or other object would incriminate him.

(6) Subject to subsection (7) incriminating evidence, arising out of the answers, a person may give to the Office in answer to questions posed by the Office, shall not be admissible in any criminal trial against that person.

(7) A person who has been summoned in accordance with this section, who —

- (a) fails without sufficient cause to attend at the time and place specified in the summons, or to remain in attendance until the conclusion of the proceedings or until excused from further attendance;
- (b) refuses to take oath or make affirmation;
- (c) fails to produce, when requested, any document, book or other object in his possession or under his control; or
- (d) knowingly makes a false statement;

shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding Pula 2 000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months, or to both.

Search and  
seizure

**10.** (1) Subject to subsection (2) the Director or an investigating officer may, if he or she considers that a document, book or other object connected to any investigation under this Part is being concealed within specified premises, enter the premises to conduct a search and seize any item found within the premises.

(2) The Director or an investigating officer shall not enter, conduct a search or seize any item in terms of subsection (1) unless he or she has obtained —

- (a) the consent of the owner of the premises or the person in charge of the premises; or
- (b) a search warrant.

(3) The court shall grant the application for a search warrant if it appears, on information given on oath or affirmation, that there are reasonable grounds to suspect that —

- (a) an unfair business practice exists or may come into existence; or
- (b) a document, book or other object which may afford evidence of such unfair business practice is within those premises.

(4) Where a Magistrate is satisfied from information given on oath or affirmation by the Office, that urgent action by the Office is required to obtain evidence pertaining to the contravention of the provisions of this Act, which evidence is likely to be concealed or destroyed, the Magistrate may dispense with any procedural requirements and grant a search warrant to the Office at such time and place and under such conditions as the urgency of the matter may require.

(5) A search warrant granted by the court shall —

- (a) authorise the Director or an investigating officer mentioned in the warrant to enter the premises identified in the warrant to conduct searches, examinations, take extracts or copies, seize any item or to do any other thing that may assist with the investigation;
- (b) be executed by day, unless the court authorises its execution by night; and
- (c) be in force until it is executed, cancelled by the court or a period of one month from the day of its issue expires, whichever occurs first.

(6) The Director or an investigating officer executing a search warrant under this section shall, before such execution or upon demand by any person whose rights may be affected -

- (a) present his identification card; and
- (b) hand to such person a copy of the warrant.

(7) The Director or an investigating officer shall not seize any item found within the premises being searched in accordance with the provisions of this section unless he or she has handed the person from whose possession or charge the item is being seized, a receipt of the seizure in the prescribed form.

(8) A person from whose possession or charge a document, book or other object has been seized shall, as long as it is in the possession or charge of the investigating officer concerned or the Office, be allowed on request to make copies or to take extracts from it at any reasonable time at his or her own expense and under the supervision of that investigating officer or other authorised person in the service of the Office.

(9) A person shall not be entitled to refuse to answer any question or to produce any document, book or other object on the ground that such answer, document, book or other object would incriminate him.

(10) Subject to subsection (11) incriminating evidence, arising out of any answer, a person may give to an investigating officer in answer to an enquiry made by the investigating officer, shall not be admissible in any criminal trial against that person.

(11) Any person who —

- (a) obstructs or hinders the Director or an investigating officer in the performance of his functions in terms of this section; or
- (b) knowingly makes a false statement or gives a false answer to any enquiry;

shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding Pula 2 000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months, or to both.

Arrangements

**11.** (1) The Office may negotiate with any person and conclude an arrangement for —

- (a) the discontinuance or avoidance of an unfair business practice or any aspect of it;
- (b) the reimbursement, with interest, if any, to affected consumers; or
- (c) any matter relating to the unfair business practice.

(2) An arrangement —

- (a) shall be in writing and signed by the parties thereto; and
- (b) may be concluded at any time after the institution of an investigation, but before the institution of court proceedings, if any.

#### PART IV — *Court Proceedings*

Institution of

**12.** (1) Upon the completion of an investigation, or where the Office has failed to resolve a complaint of unfair business practice through an arrangement as provided for under section 11, the Office may cause civil proceedings to be instituted so as to obtain -

- (a) an order preventing the continuation of an unfair business practice, and where necessary, compensation and damages against any person alleged to be responsible for the unfair business practice; or
- (b) a declaratory judgement with a view to prohibiting any business practice or any type of business practice, in general or in relation to a particular commodity or investment which is commonly applied for the purposes of or in connexion with the creation or maintenance of unfair business practices.

(2) A declaratory order made in terms of subsection (1) (b) may be published by notice in the Gazette.

Urgent  
provisional

**13.** (1) Where a court is satisfied from information placed before it by the Office that circumstances relating to a particular matter, which matter is a subject of an investigation under this Act, render that matter urgent in that irreparable prejudice would be caused to a consumer or any group or class of consumers if the matter were to be dealt with by the court at proceedings in due course, the court may issue a provisional order —

- (a) prohibiting any person mentioned in the order from performing any act connected with the subject of the investigation;
- (b) attaching any money, other property or assets of whatever nature, held by any person;
- (c) preventing, in any other way, the prejudice in question; or
- (d) authorising the Office to take any action specified in the order.

(2) A provisional order issued under subsection (1) —

- (a) may be amended or withdrawn by the court on application by the Office or by a person affected by such order;
- (b) shall remain in force for such period or extended period as the court may from time to time determine; and
- (c) shall, unless withdrawn or lapsed, remain in force until the proceedings are finalised.

(3) A provisional order issued under subsection (1), and any amendment, withdrawal or extension thereof shall, where the court so directs, be published in the Gazette and in such other media as the Court may deem appropriate.

**14.** (1) Where in proceedings instituted in terms of this Act the court is satisfied that it is in the public interest that any particular business practice which is the subject of proceedings before the court should be declared unlawful, the court may —

Declaration of certain business practices to be unlawful

- (a) declare the business practice or type of business practice concerned to be unlawful either in relation to a particular area of the business or generally as may be supported by the evidence presented;
- (b) declare any agreement, accord, undertaking or terms thereof to be void;
- (c) prohibit, subject to subsection (2), any person from —
  - (i) entering into or being or continuing to be a party to an agreement, arrangement or undertaking;
  - (ii) using advertising; or
  - (iii) applying a scheme, practice or method of trading.

(2) The court, may on application by any person and after hearing the Director, and any other interested person, grant exemption from a provision, condition or requirement contemplated in subsection (1), to such extent, for such period and subject to such conditions as may be specified in the exemption.

**15.** (1) Where a court, pursuant to proceedings instituted in the court under this Part, is satisfied that an unfair business practice exists or may come into existence, the court may issue such order as may be necessary to prevent the continuation of the unfair business practice, and such order may, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, direct —

Order prohibiting unfair practice

- (a) any person practising the unfair business practice to take such action, including steps for the dissolution of any body, incorporate or unincorporated, or the severance of any connexion or association between two or more persons, necessary for the discontinuance of the unfair business practice; or

(b) any person who is or was party to an act or omission which has led, in whatever manner, to the practice and perpetuation of an unfair business practice to cease committing such act or omission.

(2) If the court finds that money was accepted from consumers in the course of an unfair business practice, and it is necessary to limit or prevent loss to such consumers, the court may order any person responsible for such loss to repay the money, with interest at the prescribed rate, to the affected consumers.

(3) Where the court is satisfied that as a direct result of an unfair business practice a consumer has suffered loss, other than monetary loss, it may order the person responsible for the loss to pay such damages as it may determine.

Appointment

**16.** (1) Notwithstanding any action taken to compensate any consumer who may have lost money paid into an unfair business practice under section 15, the court may appoint a curator to limit or prevent any financial loss to such consumer or group of consumers.

(2) Without derogating from the generality of subsection (1) and subject to such conditions as it may impose, the court may authorise the curator to —

(a) realise such assets of the person responsible for the unfair business practice in question which are necessary for the reimbursement of any of the consumers concerned and distribute them among the said consumers;

(b) take control of and manage the whole or any part of the business of such a person in which event the management of the business or affairs of the person involved in the unfair business practice shall vest in the curator, subject to the supervision of the court, and any other person vested with the management of the affairs of that person shall be divested thereof;

(c) make payments, transfer property or take steps for the transfer of property of the person responsible for the unfair business practice at such time, in such order and in such manner as the curator may deem fit;

(d) open and maintain banking or similar interest-bearing accounts;

(e) enter into agreements on behalf of the person responsible for the unfair business practice;

(f) convene from time to time, in such manner as he or she may deem fit, a meeting of creditors of the person responsible for the unfair business practice for the purpose of establishing the nature and extend of the indebtedness of that person to such creditors and for consultation with such creditors in so far as the curator deems it necessary;

(g) negotiate with any creditor of the person responsible for the unfair business with a view to the final settlement of the affair of such creditor against that person;

- (h) make and carry out, in the course of the management by the curator of the affairs of the person responsible for the unfair business practice, any decision which in terms of the provisions of the Companies Act, would have been required to be made by way of a special resolution;
- (i) dispose of, by public auction, tender or negotiation, any asset of the person responsible for the unfair business practice; and
- (j) perform such further, incidental or ancillary duties or functions as may be necessary to give effect to any order of the court.
- (3) The court may at any time amend, withdraw or vary any power granted to a curator and any such amendment, withdrawal and variation may be published by notice in the Gazette.
- (4) At the appointment of a curator -
- (a) the management of the business or affairs of the person responsible for the unfair business practice shall vest in the curator, subject to the supervision of the court, and any other person vested with the management of the affairs of that person shall be divested thereof; and
- (b) the curator shall recover and take possession of such assets of the person involved in the unfair business practice as may be necessary.
- (5) A curator who is not in the full-time service of the State shall out of the funds of the person responsible for the unfair business practice, in respect of the services rendered by him or her be paid such remuneration as may be prescribed; provided that if the funds of the person involved in the unfair business practice are insufficient to adequately compensate the curator, the curator shall be paid from public funds such further remuneration and allowances as the court may determine.
- (6) The curator shall report to the court on his or her administration of the affairs of the person responsible for the unfair business practice, and shall at the request of the court provide any other information set out in that request.
- (7) The curator shall keep a proper record of the steps taken by him or her in the performance of his or her functions and of the reasons why such steps were taken.
- (8) Any person who, in any way, obstructs, hinders or prevents the curator from discharging or performing any of the directives contained in a court order issued under this section shall be guilty of an offence and be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding Pula 7 000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or to both.

Confidentiality

**17.** (1) No person shall disclose any information obtained by him or her in the exercise or performance of any powers, functions or duties under this Act, except —

- (a) in so far as may be necessary for the purpose of exercising or performing any power, function or duty under an Act of Parliament; or
- (b) by order of the court.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of subsection (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding Pula 2 000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months, or to both.

Excluding or limiting application of Act

**18.** Any agreement or contractual term purporting to exclude the provisions of this Act or to limit the application thereof shall be void.

Regulations

**19.** The Minister may make regulations providing for any matter which under this Act is to be prescribed or for the better carrying out of the purposes and provisions of this Act, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, such regulations may make provision for —

- (a) prescribing procedures, forms and fees;
- (b) prescribing the qualifications and training of investigating officers under this Act;
- (c) prescribing the minimum specifications, performance, quality and safety standards required for any type of commodity or service being offered to consumers;
- (d) prescribing the persons to be defined as consumers under the Act; or
- (e) requiring any form of business to keep such records and to make such periodic and other returns as to such matters as the Minister thinks fit, and prescribing a time limit for the making of such returns.

## SECOND SCHEDULE

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section 33 of Collective Investment Act, 1996, the Minister of Finance and Development Planning, having duly consulted the Interim Investment Supervisory Committee, hereby makes the following Regulations —

PART I — *Preliminary*

## Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Collective Investment Undertakings Regulations, 1998.

## Interpretation and application

2. (1) Unless the context otherwise requires —

“investment advisor” means any person employed by a collective investment undertaking to advise it in respect of any decisions with regard to the investment or management by it of its assets, and the reinvestment of the proceeds thereof;

“representative” means the principal officer representing the interests of a person not resident or registered in Botswana;

“undertaking” means a collective investment undertaking.

(2) These Regulations apply to the categories of collective investment undertakings permitted to be licenced to operate in Botswana under section 7 of the Act.

PART II — *Application for Licence*

## Application for licence

3. (1) An application for a licence to operate a collective investment undertaking shall be made to the Registrar by the principal officer of the undertaking, and the application shall contain information set out in the First Schedule.

(2) The application for a licence shall be accompanied by the following documents —

- (a) certificate of incorporation in the case of a company, or certificate of registration in the case of a trust;
- (b) the offering document to be issued by the undertaking;
- (c) the name of the auditor of the undertaking;
- (d) the name, address and audited accounts of the depository;
- (e) the name, address and licence of the fund administrator;
- (f) documentary evidence of the details of a depository and fund administrator required under regulations 5 and 9 respectively; and
- (g) all contracts and agreements between the undertaking and the depository and between the undertaking and the fund administrator.

(3) An application for a licence by a person not resident or registered in Botswana shall be accompanied by —

- (a) evidence of local registration; or
- (b) a representative agreement.

(4) The Registrar may grant a collective investment licence to an applicant who has satisfied the requirements of this regulation.

4. The requirements of regulation 3 impose continuing obligations with regard to a licenced collective investment undertaking and in the event of failure to comply with any such obligation the Registrar may —

- (a) suspend the licence of the undertaking for such time, or until the happening of such event as the committee may determine; or
- (b) withdraw the licence of the undertaking.

### PART III — *Depositary*

5. (1) No person shall be registered by the Registrar as a depositary for a collective investment undertaking unless the person —

- (a) is a body corporate with a registered office or registered branch of its foreign office in Botswana having a minimum issued and paid up capital and non distributable capital reserves of not less than one million Pula;
- (b) has its liabilities guaranteed by a financial institution which has a minimum paid up share capital of five million Pula;
- (c) has a registered office or registered branch of its foreign office in Botswana;
- (d) is not engaged in or connected to the business of fund administration for any collective investment undertaking;
- (e) has directors who hold such qualifications and experience in financial matters as the Registrar may determine; and
- (f) has directors who have not been convicted of a felony or any offence involving dishonesty.

(2) The Registrar may register an applicant who has satisfied the requirements of sub-regulation (1) as a depositary for a named collective investment undertaking.

(3) The term 'financial institution' shall include institutions falling within the definition of the term 'bank' under the Banking Act, and institutions who provide the service of underwriting, marketing, or the administration of contracts of insurance and reinsurance.

6. It shall be the duty of the depositary to —

- (a) take into its custody or under its control all the property of the collective investment undertaking and hold it in trust for the participants in accordance with the provisions of the constitutive document;
- (b) take reasonable care to ensure that the sale, issue, repurchase, redemption and cancellation of units or shares effected by a collective investment undertaking are carried out in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the constitutive document of the undertaking;

- (c) take reasonable care to ensure that the methods adopted by the fund administrator in calculating the value of units or participatory interests are adequate to ensure that the sale, issue, repurchase, redemption and cancellation prices are calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the constitutive document of the undertaking;
- (d) carry out the instructions of the fund administrator in respect of investments unless such instructions are in conflict with the provisions of the offering or constitutive document;
- (e) take reasonable care to ensure that the investment and borrowing limitations set out in the constitutive document, and the conditions under which the undertaking was licenced, are complied with;
- (f) take reasonable care to ensure that unit or share certificates are not issued until subscription moneys have been paid;
- (g) ensure that any investments requiring registration held on behalf of shareholders or unit holders by the undertaking are properly registered in the names of the participants, or, with the consent of the participants, in the name of an eligible nominee; and
- (h) issue a report to the participants which is to be included in the annual report, stating whether in the opinion of the depositary the fund administrator has in all material respects managed the undertaking in accordance with the provisions of the constitutive document and the report shall include any steps the depositary has had to take to ensure compliance by the fund administrator with the constitutive document in this respect.

Retirement of depositary

7. (1) The depositary shall not be entitled to retire except upon the appointment of a new depositary and subject to the prior approval of the Registrar.

(2) The depositary shall be considered to have retired and shall be de-registered only when the new depositary, with the approval of the Registrar, takes up office.

Depositary, fund administrator to be independent

8. The depositary and the fund administrator shall not be connected persons and shall be persons who are independent of each other.

PART IV — *Fund Administrator*

Fund administrator requirements

9. (1) No person shall be licenced to administer and manage a collective investment undertaking as a fund administrator unless the person —

- (a) is a body corporate with a registered office or registered branch of its foreign office in Botswana;
- (b) has sufficient financial resources at its disposal to enable it to conduct its business effectively and meet its liabilities, in particular it shall have a minimum issued and paid-up capital and capital reserves of P250 000 or its equivalent in foreign currency;
- (c) is engaged solely in the business of collective investment fund administration and management;
- (d) does not lend money to any material extent;
- (e) maintains at all times a positive net asset position;

- (f) ensures that at least two of its directors shall be resident in Botswana;
  - (g) supplies the Registrar with the biographical details and an account of the professional qualifications and experience of the directors and every person succeeding them in office;
  - (h) ensures that none of its directors has been convicted of a felony or any offence involving dishonesty; and
  - (i) requires and has proof that any investment advisor that it may appoint is appropriately qualified for the performance of his functions.
- (2) The Registrar may grant a fund administration licence to an applicant who satisfies the requirements of sub-regulation (1).

**10.** (1) It shall be the duty of a fund administrator to —

- (a) manage the collective investment undertaking in accordance with the constitutive documents and in the exclusive interest of the participants and to fulfil the duties imposed on it by law;
- (b) maintain or cause to be maintained the books and records of the undertaking and prepare or cause to be prepared the accounts of the undertaking and have at least one report published in respect of each financial year and sent to all registered participants; and
- (c) ensure that the constitutive documents are made available for inspection by the public free of charge at all times during normal office hours at its place of business and make copies of such document available upon the payment of a reasonable fee.

Duties and obligations of fund administrator

(2) A fund administrator shall be liable to the participants, the depositary and to the investment advisor for any loss suffered by them as a result of the unjustifiable failure of the fund administrator to perform its obligations.

**11.** (1) Subject to the approval of the Registrar, a fund administrator may be retired from administering and managing a collective investment undertaking by the depositary of the undertaking, if —

- (a) the fund administrator goes into liquidation, becomes bankrupt or has a receiver appointed over its assets; or
- (b) evidence is adduced by the depositary that a change in management is desirable in the interest of the participants.

Retirement of fund administrator

(2) A fund administrator shall retire —

- (a) if it is shown to the satisfaction of the Registrar that the fund administrator has committed an act or omission which, in terms of the constitutive document, disqualifies it from further administration and management of the undertaking; or
- (b) when the Registrar withdraws the fund administrator's licence.

(3) Upon the retirement or dismissal of the fund administrator, the depositary shall appoint a new fund administrator as soon as possible, subject to the approval of the Registrar.

PART V — *Offering Document*

Matters to be disclosed in offering document

12. Each collective investment undertaking shall issue an offering document containing information listed in the Second Schedule, which information shall be sufficient to enable a prospective participant be in a position to make an informed judgement of the investment proposed, and which, as far as it is possible, —

(a) reflects the actual position of the undertaking at the date of the issue of the offering document; and

(b) is equivalent to a prospectus for the purpose.

Audited report to accompany offering document

13. The offering document shall be accompanied by the most recent audited report and accounts of a collective investment undertaking and with a semi-annual report, if published after the annual report.

Offering document to accompany application

14. No application form for membership to a collective investment undertaking shall be issued to a prospective participant unless it is accompanied by the offering document of the undertaking or an advertisement or report containing all the information required under the Second Schedule.

Estimated yields and forecasts

15. (1) Where performance data or estimated yield is quoted in an offering document, advertisement or any other invitation to the public to invest, the Registrar may require justification of the calculation.

(2) No forecasts of a collective investment undertaking's performance may be made.

PART VI — *Audit of Collective Investment Undertaking*

Auditing of accounts

16. (1) The accounts of a collective investment undertaking shall be audited at such frequency as the Committee shall determine by notice published in the *Gazette*.

(2) A collective investment undertaking and its auditors shall comply with such standards as may be prescribed by the Committee in the rules and with such directives and practices as the Committee may from time to time determine by notice published in the *Gazette*.

Periodic reports to be submitted

17. (1) Each collective investment undertaking shall submit to the Registrar and the Committee, periodic reports at such times as the Committee may determine by notice published in the *Gazette*.

(2) The periodic reports required to be submitted under sub-regulation (1) shall contain —

(a) evidence of compliance with liquidity and other ratios as may be applicable or as may be prescribed in the rules by the Committee;

(b) evidence of compliance with the objectives of the collective investment undertaking as set out in its constitutive document and as enunciated in any offering document;

(c) a balance sheet and profit and loss account; and

(d) such additional information as the Registrar may, from time to time, determine.

Maintaining of accounting information in Botswana

18. A collective investment undertaking shall maintain in Botswana and be in a position to produce on demand by the Registrar, all accounting and other information which constitutes essential documentation for —

- (a) preparation of accounts and portfolio evaluations;
- (b) the establishment of certificates of title and indebtedness;
- (c) the analysis of participatory interest or shares in circulation;
- (d) all agreements such as agreements with the trustees, promoters, managers, advisors, depositories and any other providers of services acting on behalf of the collective investment undertaking; and
- (e) vouchers recording all transactions.

19. (1) Following the completion of any audit prescribed by the Act, these Regulations or any rules, a collective investment undertaking shall publish a report containing the following —

- (a) statement of assets and liabilities which shall describe all -
  - (i) transferable securities;
  - (ii) debt instrument;
  - (iii) bank balances;
  - (iv) other assets; and
  - (v) liabilities;
- (b) aggregate net asset values;
- (c) number of participatory interest in circulation;
- (d) net asset value of each participatory interest;
- (e) a portfolio distinguishing between -
  - (i) transferrable securities admitted to official exchange listings;
  - (ii) transferrable securities dealt within or on another organised market; or
  - (iii) other transferrable securities;
- (f) a statement of the developments concerning the assets of the collective investment undertaking during the reference period including —
  - (i) income from investments;
  - (ii) other income;
  - (iii) management charges;
  - (iv) depositary charges;
  - (v) other charges and taxes;
  - (vi) net income;
  - (vii) distributions and income reinvestment;
  - (viii) increase or decrease in capital accounts;
  - (ix) appreciation or depreciation of investment;
  - (x) any other changes affecting the assets and liabilities of the collective investment undertaking; and
- (g) a comparable table covering the last three financial years and for each financial year at the end of the financial year including the following —
  - (i) the total net asset value; and
  - (ii) the net asset value of each participatory interest.

(2) The committee may issue rules prescribing the form and content of any audit report and accounts to be published and audited pursuant to the provisions of this regulation.

PART VII — *Miscellaneous Provisions*

20. A collective investment undertaking or similar arrangement that is exempt from the provisions of section 31 (1) of the Act, shall comprise of —
- (a) an undertaking or arrangement permitting participation in specified mortgage bonds which are stipulated to be and are registered in favour of a nominee company of which the Registrar has approved, which participation is on such conditions as the Registrar may deem fit;
  - (b) a nominee company the identity and shareholders of which, and the terms and conditions of which, meet such criterion as the Registrar may determine by notice published in the *Gazette*;
  - (c) a bank licenced in accordance with the provisions of the Banking Act, 1995;
  - (d) a fund registered in accordance with the provisions of the Pension and Provident Funds Act;
  - (e) a life insurance fund established in accordance with section 70 of the Insurance Industry Act;
  - (f) a partnership syndicated to own immovable property, develop it and split the profits derived from the rental stream; or

21. Without the prior notification and written approval of the Registrar, no collective investment undertaking shall effect changes to —
- (a) its name;

  - (d) the depositary;
  - (e) the auditor; or
  - (f) the ownership or control of the persons listed in paragraphs (c) to (e).
22. (1) Any person making an appeal against any decision of the Registrar in accordance with section 35 of the Act, shall, within one month of the pronouncement of the decision at issue, lodge a written notice of appeal with the Registrar, clearly setting out the decision being appealed against and the grounds of appeal.
- (2) Upon receipt of the notice of appeal referred to in sub-regulation (1) the Registrar shall —
- (a) prepare and despatch by registered post to the appellant a statement of the reasons for his decision; and
  - (b) require the appellant to state, in writing, within a period of 60 days, whether he proposes to continue with his appeal.
- (3) If the appellant states that he does not propose to continue with the appeal he has lodged or if he does not furnish the Registrar with a reply within the period prescribed in sub-regulation (2), the appeal shall lapse.
- (4) Upon receipt, by the Registrar, of the appellant's statement expressing the appellant's decision to proceed with the appeal, the Registrar shall, within 60 days, forward to the Minister —
- (i) the notice of appeal;
  - (ii) the statement of the reasons for the Registrar's decision;

- (iii) the statement of the appellant's decision to proceed; and
- (iv) any other relevant document or such further information as the Minister may require.

(5) Upon receipt of the Minister's decision on the appeal, the Registrar shall, within 48 hours, communicate it to the appellant.

**23.** (1) Any person who is guilty of the non-rendition of any balance sheet, account, statement, document or report required to be furnished in terms of these Regulations, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding P10,000, as provided for under section 33 (2) of the Act.

(2) Any person who, in relation to these Regulations, commits an offence under section 36 of the Act, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable, upon conviction, to the penalty provided under the said section of the Act.

(3) Subject to sub-regulations (1) and (2), any person who contravenes the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding P 500 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both.

**24.** The committee may prescribe in the rules to be applicable to the different categories of collective investment undertakings permitted to be licenced to operate in Botswana under section 7 of the Act —

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

**PUBLIC SERVICE BILL, 1998**  
(Published on 13th July, 1998)

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The main object of the Bill is to re-enact with amendments the provisions relating to the public service.

3. Section 4 of the Public Service Act empowers the Permanent Secretary to the President to define and incorporate in General Orders, rules of conduct for public officers. It is proposed to amend the section to also empower the Permanent Secretary to make rules or give direction in respect of conditions of service in the public service.

4. There is at present no provision in the Public Service Act empowering the Permanent Secretary to the President to delegate any of his functions to the Director of Public Service Management or to any other Permanent Secretary, although the Permanent Secretary to the President has been delegating some of his functions administratively. However, the legality of such administrative delegation was recently challenged in the courts. To obviate any future challenge of the delegation of functions by the Permanent Secretary to the President, it is proposed to amend section 6 of the Public Service Act to provide that the Permanent Secretary to the President may, with the consent of the President, delegate any of his powers under the Public Service Act to the Director of Public Service Management or to any other Permanent Secretary.

5. An appointing authority who intends: (a) to extend the probationary period or terminate the appointment of an officer on probation, or (b) to make an officer who has been promoted to revert to his former rank, or (c) to terminate the appointment of an officer serving on contract, is required to advise the officer of his intended action and to inform him of his right to make representations within 14 days on receipt of such advice. It has been found that the period of 14 days within which an officer is required to make representations is too short. It is therefore proposed that sections 11(4), 12(2) and 14(1) of the Public Service Act should be amended to extend the period within which representations should be made to 21 days.

6. A public officer on probation who has served his probationary period remains on probation until he is informed in writing that he is confirmed or his appointment is terminated. Thus if an appointing authority inadvertently forgets to inform an officer who has served his probationary period, such officer remains on probation for an indefinite period. This is unsatisfactory. Consequently, it is intended to amend section 11(8) of the Public Service Act to provide that an officer on probation shall be deemed to have been confirmed in his appointment if at the end of 12 months following the end of his probationary period, he has not been informed in writing of the outcome of his probation.

7. Section 15 of the Public Service Act provides that an officer who wishes to retire from the public service should give six months' notice whilst if the appointing authority wishes to retire an officer he should give him three months' notice. It is considered that the period of notice should be uniform. Section 15 of the Act is being amended to provide for three months' notice on each side.

8. Section 22 of the Act is amended to provide that disciplinary proceedings may be instituted against an officer despite the fact that criminal proceedings arising from the same facts are being investigated or pending against the officer. However any statement made or evidence given at the disciplinary proceedings will not be used against the officer in any criminal proceedings.

9. Section 23 of the Act is amended to provide, among other things, that an officer convicted of a criminal offence involving moral turpitude shall not be paid his emoluments from the date of his conviction pending a decision of the disciplinary officer as to whether any emoluments should be paid and pending the taking of any disciplinary proceedings against him. An officer convicted of a criminal offence may be dismissed from the public service without any disciplinary proceedings being instituted against him. A successful appeal against conviction and sentence shall not be a bar to disciplinary proceedings being instituted against the officer arising out of the same facts. For, a misconduct for which an officer may be dismissed from the public service does not necessarily amount to a criminal offence. For example, to be insubordinate is a misconduct, but it is not a criminal offence.

10. Part VII is new. It reproduces the provisions dealing with misconduct and unsatisfactory service of a public officer contained in the Public Service Regulations. These are substantive provisions which should be in the Act itself. Clause 30 defines misconduct, whilst clause 31 sets forth particular types of misconduct. And clause 31 prescribes the penalties that may be imposed in disciplinary proceedings.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

PART I — *Preliminary*

Short title  
Interpretation

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Public Service Act, 1998.
- 2. (1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires —
  - “appointing authority” means any person or body having power, whether delegated or otherwise, to appoint to office in the public service;
  - “appointment” includes a transfer, a promotion, a temporary appointment and, if the person appointed to act draws the salary of the office, an acting appointment;
  - “Commission” means the Public Service Commission or the Judicial Service Commission, as the context may require;
  - “Committee of Selection” has the meaning assigned to it by paragraph 82 of the Standing Orders of the National Assembly;
  - “Director” means the Director of Public Service Management appointed under section 5;
  - “promotion” means the appointment of a public officer to a different public office with an increase or potential increase of salary;

“public office” and “public officer” have the same meanings as in the Constitution;

“responsible officer”, in relation to a public officer, means the public officer designated, or to whom the necessary power is delegated, under this Act, to exercise disciplinary control over and to remove from office that public officer;

“transfer” means the appointment of a public officer to another public office with no alteration or potential alteration to salary.

(2) For the purpose of the public service and section 112 of the Constitution, “Permanent Secretary” includes the holder of the public office of that designation responsible, subject to the directions and control of the Minister, for the supervision of a Ministry, and the holders of the following public offices, namely, Secretary to the Cabinet, Administrative Secretary in the Office of the President, Attorney-General, Auditor-General, Deputy Attorney-General, Director of Public Service Management, Commander of the Botswana Defence Force, Deputy Commander of the Botswana Defence Force, Commissioner of Police, Secretary of External Affairs, Secretary of Economic Affairs, Secretary of Budget Affairs, Secretary of Financial Affairs and Secretary to the Independent Electoral Commission.

(3) For the purposes of this Act, “the Permanent Secretary” means the holder of the public office of that designation responsible, subject to the directions and control of the Minister, for the administration of a Ministry, and includes the Attorney-General in respect of the Attorney-General’s Chambers, the Auditor-General in respect of the Auditor-General’s Office, the Clerk of the National Assembly in respect of the offices of the National Assembly, and the Registrar of the High Court in respect of the staff of the High Court and the Magistracy.

## PART II — *Administration of Public Service*

3. The exercise of any powers or the performance of any duties under this Act shall be subject to such general directions of the President as the President may deem necessary.

Directions of  
the President

4. (1) The Permanent Secretary to the President shall be the head of the public service and shall, subject to the Constitution and this Act, have vested in him the administration of the public service.

Head of the  
public service

(2) The Permanent Secretary to the President may, by General Orders, make rules or regulations or give instructions for controlling the conduct of the public service and providing for the conditions of service of the public service.

(3) Any rules or regulations made, or instructions given, in terms of subsection (2) shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this Act and shall be complied with by all public officers.

Director of  
Public Service  
Management

(4) The Permanent Secretary to the President may at any time exercise the functions of any other Permanent Secretary in any matter falling under this Act, and if he so does he and not the other Permanent Secretary shall be regarded for the purposes of that matter as that other Permanent Secretary.

5. (1) There shall be a Director of Public Service Management (in this Act referred to as "the Director"), who shall be a public officer appointed by the President.

(2) The Director shall, subject to the Constitution and this Act, be responsible for the following matters, namely —

- (a) conditions of appointment and terms of service;
- (b) the administration of General Orders;
- (c) the recruitment of public officers, including volunteers and technical assistance personnel;
- (d) staff complements and gradings;
- (e) the administration, structure and assessment of salaries;
- (f) public service training policy;
- (g) discipline, staff training and welfare;
- (h) localization and staff development programmes;
- (i) staff inspections and organization and methods;
- (j) the approval and administration of schemes of service;
- (k) allowances and policy with regard to pensions and gratuities;
- (l) personnel statistics;
- (m) such other matters as may be prescribed.

PART III — *Appointments to the Public Service, etc.*

Powers of  
appointment,  
discipline and  
removal

6. (1) Subject to the Constitution, the power to appoint, remove or exercise disciplinary control over any public officer shall be vested —

- (a) in the case of any public officer on the superscale grade D1 and above (other than an officer to whom section 110 of the Constitution does not apply), in the Permanent Secretary to the President; and
- (b) in any other case, in the Director in accordance with this Act.

(2) The Permanent Secretary to the President may, with the consent of the President, by directions in writing, delegate any of his powers under this section to the Director or any other Permanent Secretary, but notwithstanding any such delegation, the Permanent Secretary to the President may exercise any powers delegated by him, and may from time to time cancel or vary any such delegation.

(3) The Director may, with the consent of the President, by directions in writing, delegate any of his powers under this section to any public officer, but, notwithstanding any such delegation, the Director may vary or set aside any decision made by such public officer in the exercise of his delegated powers.

(4) The appointing authority shall not appoint, promote or transfer any person to or from any post in the National Assembly without the prior approval of the Speaker of the National Assembly.

(5) In giving approval to any appointment, promotion or transfer referred to in subsection (4), the Speaker shall act on the advice and recommendation of —

(a) in the case of the posts of the Clerk, Deputy Clerk or Clerk's Assistants, the Committee of the National Assembly Staff established in accordance with the provisions of subsection (6); and

(b) in any other case, the Clerk of the National Assembly.

(6) The Committee of Selection shall, at the beginning of the first session of every Parliament and for the duration of the life of such Parliament, appoint a committee to be known as the Committee of the National Assembly Staff, of which the Speaker of the National Assembly shall be the chairman.

(7) The Committee of the National Assembly Staff appointed under subsection (6) shall be responsible for tendering advice and making recommendations to the Speaker with regard to appointments and promotions to, or transfers from, any post in the National Assembly.

(8) Before any power relating to the appointment of the Secretary to the House of Chiefs is exercised, the appointing authority shall consult the Chairman of that House.

(9) No person shall be appointed to the personal staff of the President except with the approval of the President.

7. (1) In selecting candidates for appointment the appointing authority shall have regard primarily to the efficiency of the public service.

Criteria for  
appointment

(2) When any public office is vacant the following persons shall, subject to satisfying any scheme of service laying down the qualifications for any public office, be qualified for appointment to such office in the following order of priority —

- (a) any public officer who is a citizen of Botswana;
- (b) any other citizen of Botswana;
- (c) any public officer, whether on pensionable or contract terms, who is not a citizen of Botswana;
- (d) any other person who is not a citizen of Botswana but whose appointment to such office is approved under section 8 or deemed to be approved under section 9.

8. (1) No person who has been convicted of an offence involving moral turpitude or who has been dismissed from the public service shall be appointed to any public office without the approval of the President.

Disqualifica-  
tion for  
appointment

(2) No person shall be appointed to public office unless he holds such qualifications as have been prescribed for appointment to that office:

Provided that the provisions of this subsection may be waived with the approval of the Minister to facilitate the localization of the public service.

(3) No person who is not a citizen of Botswana shall be appointed (other than on transfer or promotion) on pensionable terms to any public office except with the approval of the President.

(4) Subject to subsection (3), no person who is not a citizen of Botswana shall be appointed to any public office unless the appointing authority is satisfied that no citizen of Botswana who is qualified and suitable for appointment is available and the President is satisfied that it would not be in the public interest for the office to remain vacant.

Appointment  
of citizens of  
certain  
countries

9. The appointment of any person to any public office shall be deemed to be approved if such person is a citizen of a country prescribed by the President as a country whose citizens may be recruited into the public service of Botswana without reference to him.

Retrospective  
appointments

10. Subject to section 13, any appointment by an appointing authority may be made retrospective to such date as he deems appropriate, whether or not such date is prior to the commencement of this Act.

Probation

11. (1) Where any person is appointed to any public office (otherwise than on promotion or transfer) on pensionable terms he shall first serve a probationary period of two years, or such other period as may be prescribed by the Minister for particular public offices.

(2) Where any person who is required to serve on probation under this section has previously been employed in the service of the Government or in such other service as may be prescribed, the period or any part thereof of such previous service may, at the discretion of the appointing authority, be regarded as service on probation for the purposes of subsection (1).

(3) Not more than six nor less than three months before the expiry of a probationary period the appointing authority shall consider whether —

- (a) the public officer should be confirmed in the public office;
- (b) his services being otherwise satisfactory, the probationary period should be extended so as to afford the public officer further opportunity to pass any examinations which are a condition precedent of appointment;
- (c) the probationary period should be extended to afford the public officer the opportunity of improvement in any respect in which his work or conduct have been unsatisfactory; or
- (d) the services of the public officer should be terminated:

Provided that no probationary period shall be extended for more than 12 months.

(4) Where the appointing authority is of the opinion that a probationary period should be extended or terminated he shall before extending or terminating such appointment advise the public officer in writing of his intention and inform such officer of his right to make representation thereon within 21 days.

(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section but subject to the giving of notice as prescribed in subsection (4) an appointing authority may terminate a probationary appointment at any time without assigning reasons therefor.

(6) An appointing authority may reduce a probationary period if the public officer has fulfilled all the requirements necessary for confirmation in office and either —

- (a) he has previously served in the public office or in a similar office on non-pensionable terms; or
- (b) the reduction of the probationary period is necessary for administrative reasons:

Provided that no probationary period shall be reduced by a period exceeding the period which the public officer concerned has served in the public office or a similar office on non-pensionable terms or a period of 12 months, whichever is less.

(7) The termination or non-confirmation of a probationary appointment shall not be dismissal or removal from office and the decision of an appointing authority to terminate, extend or not to confirm a probationary appointment shall be final and no appeal shall lie therefrom to any other person or body.

(8) A public officer on probation for two years shall be deemed to have been confirmed in his appointment, if at the end of 12 months following the end of the probationary period, he has not been informed in writing of the outcome of his probation.

(9) In this section "appointing authority" does not include a person to whom powers to appoint to public office have been delegated under section 6, and where, but for this subsection, a person to whom the power to appoint to public office has been delegated would have power to confirm in office or extend or terminate a probationary period or exercise any other power under this section, such power shall be exercised by the officer delegating the power, namely, the Permanent Secretary to the President or the Director, as the case may be.

**12.** (1) Where a public officer is, on or after the coming into operation of this Act, promoted to a higher public office, the first six months (exclusive of any period of leave) from the effective date of the promotion shall be a probationary period.

Promotion

(2) The Permanent Secretary of such officer may, within such period of six months, if he is of the opinion that such officer has failed to perform satisfactorily the duties of the public office to which he was promoted, or that his conduct has been unsatisfactory, inform the officer in writing that his reduction to his former rank is under consideration, and inform him of his right to make representations thereon within 21 days.

(3) The Permanent Secretary shall forward such representations, if any, together with his recommendations to the officer's responsible officer.

(4) The responsible officer shall decide whether the public officer should revert to his former rank but may, if he is of the opinion that the work of the officer requires a further trial, postpone his decision for such period as he considers necessary:

Provided that if the responsible officer has not reached a decision within three months of the matter being referred to him the officer shall not revert.

(5) The decision of the responsible officer under subsection (4) shall be final and shall not be subject to any appeal.

Date of promotion

13. (1) Where any public officer is appointed to any public office on promotion the effective date of his promotion to such office shall, subject to subsection (2), be that fixed by the appointing authority.

(2) The appointing authority shall not fix as a date of promotion a date which is earlier than the latest of the following dates —

- (a) the date upon which the vacancy occurred;
- (b) the date upon which the officer became qualified for promotion;
- (c) the date upon which the officer assumed the functions of the office:

Provided that the appointing authority may, in special circumstances, fix a date of promotion which is earlier than the date mentioned in paragraph (c) but no such date shall be appointed which is earlier than the later of the dates mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b).

PART IV — *Termination of Appointments and Retirements*

Termination of contract

14. (1) If it appears to the Permanent Secretary that the appointment of a public officer serving on contract should be terminated (otherwise than by dismissal) in accordance with the provisions of his contract, the Permanent Secretary shall advise the officer in writing that the termination of his contract is under consideration and inform him of his right to make representations thereon within 21 days.

(2) The Permanent Secretary shall forward such representations, if any, together with his recommendations to the responsible officer who shall decide whether or not the contract should be terminated.

Retirement of public officers

15. (1) In this section, "public officer" means a public officer admitted to permanent and pensionable terms of service.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this section —

- (a) a public officer shall retire from the public service on attaining the age of 60 years; and
- (b) a female public officer may retire from the public service on marriage.

(3) Subject to this section, a public officer who has attained the age of 45 years may in the discretion of the appointing authority be retired from the public service.

(4) Subject to subsection (3), a public officer shall have the right at any time before or after attaining the age of 45 years to give written notification to his responsible officer of his wish to be retired from the public service, and if he gives such notification he shall —

- (a) if such notification is given at least three months prior to the date on which he attains the said age, be so retired on attaining that age; or
- (b) if such notification is not given at least three months prior to the date on which he attains the said age, be so retired on the first day of the fourth month following the month in which that notification is received.

(5) If in the opinion of the appointing authority it is in the public interest to retain a public officer in his office beyond the age at which under this section he is required to retire, such officer may, if so willing, be so retained from time to time by the appointing authority for such periods as that authority may determine.

(6) The Minister may, by order published in the Gazette —

- (a) determine an age greater than 60 years, for the purpose of the retirement of public officers under subsection (2); or
  - (b) determine an age greater than 45 years for the purpose of the retirement of public officers under subsections (3) and (4),
- and on and after the date on which such order comes into operation —
- (i) the reference in subsection (2) to the age of 60 years, or
  - (ii) the reference in subsections (3) and (4) to the age of 45 years,

shall be regarded as reference to the greater age respectively determined in that order.

(7) On the abolition of any public office, a public officer holding the same shall, unless transferred by the appropriate authority to some other public office, be deemed to have retired from the public service.

(8) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect any provision of the Constitution relating to the removal from office or retirement of a judge of the Court of Appeal, a judge of the High Court, the Attorney-General or the Auditor-General.

(9) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the compulsory retirement of a public officer in accordance with any regulations made under this Act relating to disciplinary action.

**16.** (1) Where it appears to the Permanent Secretary that a public officer is incapable by reason of any infirmity of mind or body of discharging the functions of his office, he may (and shall if the officer so requests) call upon such officer to present himself to a medical practitioner approved by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Health, or to a Medical Board appointed in that behalf by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Health, with a view to it being ascertained whether or not such officer is so incapable.

Retirement  
on medical  
grounds

(2) After the public officer has been examined by the medical practitioner or Board, as the case may be, the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Health, shall forward the report of the examination to the Permanent Secretary together with his own recommendation on the matter.

(3) The Permanent Secretary shall forward the said report together with his own recommendation and any representations which the officer concerned wishes to make to the responsible officer who shall decide whether the officer should be called upon to retire on medical grounds.

(4) The decision of the responsible officer shall be final and shall not be questioned in any court.

PART V — *Public Officers*

General duties of public officers

17. It shall be the duty of every public officer to aid and assist the Government of Botswana according to the Constitution and other laws of Botswana, to carry out and obey all lawful orders of the Government and, subject to the Government's authority and direction to exercise the functions of his office impartially, efficiently and without delay so as to serve the people of Botswana and promote their welfare and lawful interests.

Whole time of public officer is at the disposal of the Government

18. Unless it is otherwise provided in the terms of his appointment or in any other written law —

- (a) every public officer shall place the whole of his time at the disposal of the Government; and
- (b) no public officer may claim as of right additional remuneration in respect of any official duty or work that he is required by competent authority to perform.

Fees for official services

19. No fee, reward or remuneration of any kind whatsoever, beyond his emoluments, shall be received and kept for his own use by a public officer for the performance of any service for the Government, unless specially authorized by law or by the terms of his appointment or by the Permanent Secretary to the President.

Emoluments not to be ceded

20. Subject to the provisions of any other written law, no public officer shall, without the written approval of the Director (given after consultation with the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry responsible for finance), or the Minister responsible for finance, cede, assign or transfer the whole or any part of any salary or allowance payable to him.

Publications interviews and use of official information

21. Subject to the provisions of any other written law, every public officer shall comply with the following rules of conduct —

- (a) he shall not, without the express permission of the Permanent Secretary to the President, act as the editor of a newspaper (not being a publication of the Government), nor take part directly or indirectly in the management thereof, nor publish in any manner anything which may be reasonably regarded as of a political or administrative nature, but he may publish in his own name other matter relating to subjects of general interest;

(b) whether on duty or on leave of absence, he shall not (except with due authority) allow himself to be interviewed on questions of or connected with any matter affecting or relating to the public policy, defence, military or economic interests or resources of Botswana;

(c) he shall not directly or indirectly reveal, or use for private purposes, any information coming to his knowledge or acquired by him of the nature or the contents of any document communicated to him either in the course of his duties or in his capacity, as an officer, otherwise than in the proper discharge of his duties as authorized by law or competent authority.

22. (1) If the Permanent Secretary becomes aware that criminal proceedings have been or are about to be instituted against a public officer, or considers that disciplinary proceedings should be instituted against a public officer, and is of the opinion that such officer should be interdicted from the performance of his duties pending the taking of proceedings against him, he shall report the matter to the responsible officer recommending the interdiction of such officer:

Interdiction

Provided that where the Permanent Secretary is the responsible officer, he shall proceed to take such action as may be taken by a responsible officer in accordance with subsections (2) and (3) and section 23.

(2) On receipt of a report under subsection (1) the responsible officer shall decide whether the public officer should be interdicted and, if so, the amount of salary (being not less than one-half) that should be paid to such officer during the period of his interdiction.

(3) If as a result of the proceedings the public officer is awarded a punishment less than dismissal the responsible officer shall decide what proportion of the emoluments withheld, if any, shall be paid to such officer:

Provided that if no punishment is awarded the whole of the emoluments withheld shall be paid to such officer.

(4) Disciplinary proceedings may be brought and concluded against an officer notwithstanding that criminal proceedings arising out of the same facts are being investigated or are pending against that officer:

Provided that no statement made or evidence given by the officer in the disciplinary proceedings shall be used against him in any criminal proceedings arising from the same facts.

23. (1) Where a public officer is convicted of a criminal offence involving moral turpitude, he shall receive no emoluments from the date of such conviction pending a decision by the responsible officer as to whether any emoluments shall be paid to him.

Withholding of salary

(2) Where a public officer is convicted of such a criminal offence the responsible officer may, upon production of a certified copy of the record of the criminal proceedings dismiss the officer without instituting disciplinary proceedings against him.

(3) If the public officer appeals against such conviction, his emoluments shall continue to be withheld pending the outcome of the appeal, but if the appeal is successful and the sentence is set aside, he shall, if his services have been terminated, in the absence of disciplinary proceedings, be reinstated with effect from the date of termination, and he shall have repaid any emoluments withheld:

Provided that such setting aside shall not be a bar to disciplinary proceedings being instituted against such officer arising out of the same facts, but in respect of a different offence under the laws or administrative orders governing the conduct of public officers.

PART VI — *Commissions*

Definition

24. In this Part, "member" in relation to a Commission, includes any person or body of persons appointed to assist the Commission in the exercise of its functions.

Protection of members of Commissions from legal proceedings

25. Every member of a Commission shall have such and like protection and privilege in the case of any action or suit brought against him for any act done or omitted to be done in the *bona fide* execution of his duties as is by law given to acts done or words spoken by a judge of the High Court in the exercise of his judicial office.

Privilege for communications of Commissions

26. No person shall in any legal proceedings be permitted or compelled to produce or disclose any communication, written or oral, which has taken place between a Commission, or any member or officer thereof, and the Government, or the President, or a Minister, or any officer of the Government, or between any member or officer of a Commission and its chairman, or between members or officers of a Commission, in exercise of, or in connection with the exercise of, the functions of a Commission, unless the President consents in writing to such production or disclosure.

Powers of Commissions

27. (1) For the performance of a Commission's functions the Commission may —

- (a) inspect Government offices;
- (b) examine official documents, books or other records;
- (c) obtain information and advice from any public officer or other Government servant; and
- (d) do all such things, including the taking of evidence on oath and the administration of oaths, as are incidental or conducive to the exercise of the Commission's functions.

(2) A Commission may require any public officer or other Government employee whose evidence appears to be material to the determination of any inquiry or investigation conducted by the Commission, to attend, at such time and place as may be specified by the Commission, to give evidence or produce an official document, book or other record in his possession or under his control which relates to a matter in question at any inquiry or investigation.

(3) No public officer or other Government servant shall be compelled to answer a question the answer to which may render him liable to prosecution on a criminal charge.

(4) Nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring a public officer or other Government servant to disclose information or produce an official document, book or other record, the disclosure or production of which —

- (a) is prohibited or restricted in terms of the Income Tax Act, the Statistics Act, or any other written law prohibiting or restricting the disclosure of information; or
- (b) is certified in writing by the Minister to be contrary to the public interest.

Act 12 of 1995

28. Each Commission shall as soon as possible after the end of any calendar year submit a report to the Minister in respect of the discharge of its functions during that year and the Minister shall lay every such report before the National Assembly.

Commissions' annual reports

29. Any person appearing before a Commission or any person or body conducting an inquiry or investigation on behalf of a Commission shall be entitled to be represented by a legal practitioner admitted to practise in Botswana.

Legal representation

#### PART VII — *Misconduct and Unsatisfactory Service*

30. Any act done without reasonable excuse by a public officer which amounts to a failure to perform in a proper manner any duty imposed upon him as such, or which contravenes any enactment relating to the public service or which is otherwise prejudicial to the efficient conduct of the public service or tends to bring the public service into disrepute shall constitute misconduct; and the setting forth in section 31 of particular types of misconduct shall not be taken to affect the generality of this subsection.

General definition of misconduct

31. It is misconduct for a public officer —

- (a) to be absent from duty without leave or reasonable excuse;
- (b) to be insubordinate;
- (c) to use, without the consent of the prescribed authority, any property or facilities provided for the purposes of the public service for some purpose not connected with his official duties;
- (d) to engage in any activity outside his official duties which is likely to involve him in political controversy or to lead to his taking improper advantage of his position in the public service;
- (e) to engage in any gainful occupation outside the public service without the consent of the prescribed authority.

Particular types of misconduct

32. Subject to the provisions of section 10 of the Pensions Act, the following are the penalties that may be imposed in disciplinary proceedings under this Act in respect of misconduct or unsatisfactory service —

- (a) dismissal, that is termination of appointment with or without forfeiture of all retirement benefits;
- (b) removal, that is termination of appointment with or without a reduction in retirement benefits;
- (c) suspension from duty with consequent loss of pay and allowances for a period not exceeding three months;
- (d) reduction in rank, that is removal to another grade with an immediate reduction of salary;
- (e) reduction of salary, that is an immediate adjustment of salary to a lower point on the salary scale attached to the post in question;
- (f) deferment of increment, that is a postponement of the date on which the next increment is due, with corresponding postponements in subsequent years;
- (g) stoppage of increment, that is non-payment for a specified period of an increment otherwise due;
- (h) in the case of an officer who is the holder of a non-pensionable post, suspension from duty with consequent loss of pay and allowances for a period not exceeding 15 days;
- (i) reprimand.

PART VIII — *Offences and Penalties*

Influencing an

authority, etc.

33. Any person who otherwise than in the course of his duty or who in the course of his duty improperly, directly or indirectly by himself or by any other person in any manner whatsoever, influences or attempts to influence the decision of the Permanent Secretary to the President, the Director, an appointing authority or a responsible officer shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding P500 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both:

Provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed to make unlawful the giving of any reference or testimonial to any applicant or candidate for any public office or the supplying of any information or assistance requested by such officer.

Supplying  
false  
information

34. Any person who in connection with the exercise by the Permanent Secretary to the President, the Director, an appointing authority or a responsible officer, of his functions wilfully gives to such person any information which he knows to be false or does not believe to be true or which he knows or believes to be misleading by reason of the omission of any material particular, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding P500 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both.

35. Any person who otherwise than in the course of his duty, or in the course of his duty improperly, directly or indirectly by himself or by any other person in any manner whatsoever, influences or attempts to influence the decision of a Commission or of the chairman or of any member shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding P500 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both:

Improperly

Commission

Provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed to make unlawful the giving of any reference or testimonial to any applicant or candidate for any public office or the supplying of any information or assistance requested by a Commission.

36. Any person who in connection with the exercise by a Commission of its functions wilfully gives to a Commission or any member thereof any information which he knows to be false or does not believe to be true, or which he knows or believes to be misleading by reason of the omission of any material particular, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding P500 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both.

Supplying

37. (1) Any member or other person who, without the written permission of the Minister, knowingly publishes or discloses to any other person otherwise than in the exercise of his official functions the contents of any document, communication or information whatsoever which has come to his notice in the course of his duties in relation to the Commission shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding P500 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both.

Improper  
disclosure

(2) Any person who knows of any information which to his knowledge has been disclosed in contravention of subsection (1) and who publishes or communicates it to any other person otherwise than for the purposes of any prosecution under this Act or in the course of his official duty shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding P500 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both.

#### PART IX — *Miscellaneous*

38. The President may make regulations for the better carrying out of the purposes and provisions of this Act, and without derogation from the generality of the foregoing such regulations may provide for —

Regulations

- (a) the procedure for making applications for the creation and abolition of public offices;
- (b) the procedure for notifying and advertising vacancies in the public service;
- (c) the procedure for the engagement or re-engagement of public officers on contract;
- (d) the procedure for taking disciplinary action against public officers;

- (e) anything in this Act which is to be or may be prescribed;
- (f) the setting up of bodies for the purpose of consultation between Government and members of the public service and the procedure and functions of such bodies;
- (g) the body which may conduct examinations in connection with any scheme of service or for any other purpose of the public service.

39. The Public Service Act is hereby repealed.

Saving

40. Notwithstanding the repeal of the enactment effected by section 39, every statutory instrument made under the enactment and in force on the day immediately before the commencement of this Act shall continue in force as if such instrument had been made under this Act.

**BROADCASTING BILL, 1998**

(Published on 13th July, 1998)

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The objects of the Bill are: (a) the establishment of a National Broadcasting Board which will be responsible for overseeing broadcasting activities in the country, including allocating available spectrum resources in such a manner as to ensure the widest possible diversity of programming and optional utilisation of the spectrum resources, and (b) issuing of broadcasting licences.

3. Part II of the Bill deals with the establishment of the National Broadcasting Board, its composition, and the appointment of the members of the Board and the functions of the Board.

4. Part III of the Bill deals with the issuing of broadcasting and re-broadcasting licences and the control and supervision over broadcasting activities in the country by the National Broadcasting Board.

PART I — *Preliminary*

Interpretation

Act No. 15  
of 1996

1. This Act may be cited as the Broadcasting Act, 1998, and shall come into operation on such day as the Minister may by order made by statutory instrument appoint.

2. In this Act unless the context otherwise enquires —

“the Authority” means the Telecommunications Authority established under section 3 of the Telecommunications Act, 1996;

“the Board” means the National Broadcasting Board established under section 3.

“broadcasting” means the distribution of television or radio, as defined herein, by means of terrestrial, satellite, cable or optical fibre and capable of being received on suitable apparatus by the public;

“broadcasting service” means a single defined service which consists in the broadcasting of television or sound material to the public or sections of the public or the subscribers to such service;

“the Committee” means the Nominating Committee established under section 8;

“community” includes a geographically founded community or any group of persons or sector of the public having a specific, ascertainable common interest;

“community broadcasting service” means a broadcasting service which —

- (a) is fully controlled by a non-profit entity and carried on for non-profitable purposes;
- (b) serves a particular community;
- (c) encourages members of the community served by it or persons associated with or promoting the interests of such community to participate in the selection and provision of programmes to be broadcast in the course of such broadcasting services; and
- (d) may be funded by donations, grants, sponsorship or advertising or membership fees, or by any combination of any of them;

“licensee” means any person to whom a broadcasting or re-broadcasting licence has been issued under this Act;

“private broadcasting service” means a broadcasting service operated for profit and controlled by a person who is not a public or community broadcasting licensee;

“public broadcasting service” means a broadcasting service provided by any statutory body which is funded either wholly or partly through State revenues;

“radio” means the conveyance of one or more channels of audio information by means of an electromagnetic wave most usually propagated in space, having a frequency below 3000 GHZ;

“register” means the register of licensees established under section 15 (7);

“television” means the conveyance of visual information, together with one or more channels of associated audio or suitably encoded textual information, or both.

## PART II — *National Broadcasting Board*

3. There is hereby established a National Broadcasting Board (in this Act referred to as “the Board”) which shall perform such functions as may be conferred on it by this Act or any other enactment.

4. The Board shall consist of 11 members who shall be appointed in accordance with the provisions of section 5.

5. (1) The Minister shall appoint the following persons as members of the Board, namely —

- (a) an officer from the Office of the President;
- (b) an officer from the Ministry of Commerce and Industry who is responsible for administering copy right legislation in that Ministry;
- (c) an officer from the Department of Cultural and Social Welfare in the Ministry of Labour and Home Affairs;

- (d) a representative of the Authority; and
- (e) seven persons, one of whom shall be designated as Chairman of the Board, appointed from a list of 10 candidates nominated by the Nominating Committee in accordance with the provisions of section 8.

Tenure of office

6. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this section, each member of the Board shall hold and vacate office in accordance with the terms of his or her appointment ;

(2) A person shall not be appointed to be a member of the Board for more than five years at a time, but shall be eligible for re-appointment on the expiry of the period of appointment.

(3) Any member of the Board may at any time resign his or her office by notice in writing to the Minister.

Remuneration of members

7. The Board may pay to each member such allowances as the Minister may, after consulting the Ministry of Finance and Development Planning, determine.

Nominating Committee

8. (1) There shall be established for the purposes of this Act a Committee which shall be called the Nominating Committee (in this Act referred to as "the Committee").

(2) The Committee shall consist of the following members —

(a) a Chairman who shall be a member of the Law Society of Botswana nominated by the Council of the Law Society;

(b) the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Botswana or "his or her nominee;

(c) a representative of the Office of the President.

(3) The Committee shall, by consensus, nominate 10 candidates desirous of being appointed as members of the Board and shall submit their names and recommendations on each candidate to the Minister.

(4) Every candidate to be nominated shall be interviewed by the Committee.

(5) For the purpose of interviewing candidates for nomination under subsection (3), the Committee shall cause to be advertised in the Botswana Government Gazette and in any local newspaper inviting candidates desirous of being appointed to the Board to apply to the Committee to be interviewed for nomination.

(6) The interview of candidates for nomination under subsection (3) shall be conducted in accordance with the principles of transparency and openness.

Secretariat of the Board

9. (1) The Authority shall be the Secretariat of the Board and shall discharge such functions of the Board as may be delegated to it.

(2) The Authority shall designate to the Board such officers of the Authority as may be necessary for the performance of the functions of the Board and the administration of this Act.

(3) Without prejudice to the preceding provisions of this section, the Authority shall advise the Board on technical matters in relation to its functions.

(4) Regulations may provide for the payment to the Authority of any expenses or costs incurred by it in the performance of its functions under this Act.

**10.** (1) The functions of the Board shall be —

- (a) to issue broadcasting licences;
- (b) to exercise control over and to supervise broadcasting activities, including the relaying of radio and television programmes from places in and out of Botswana to places in and outside Botswana;
- (c) to allocate available spectrum resources in such manner as to ensure the widest possible diversity of programming and optional utilisation of the spectrum resources.

Functions  
of the Board

(2) The Board may establish different application and assessment procedures for private, community and public broadcasting including invitations through tendering process and shall, to the maximum extent possible, consistent with safety, efficiency and economy, give preference to enterprises which are owned by citizens or in which citizens have significant shareholding.

**11.** Arrangements relating to the meetings of the Board shall be such as the Board may determine.

(2) The quorum at any meeting of the Board shall not be less than one and a half of the number of the members of the Board.

### PART III — *Broadcasting Licences*

**12.** (1) No person shall carry out any broadcasting or re-broadcasting activities except under and in accordance with a licence issued under this section to such person conferring on him or her the right to use a station for broadcasting or re-broadcasting.

(2) An application for a broadcasting or re-broadcasting licence shall be made to the Secretariat and shall be accompanied with the following particulars —

- (a) the name of the broadcasting service;
  - (b) the name and place of residence of the directors or producers of the broadcasting service;
  - (c) the name, place of business and place of residence, if any, of the proprietor thereof;
  - (d) any prescribed fees; and
  - (e) such other information as the Secretariat may require or as may be prescribed.
- (3) Regulations may provide for -
- (a) the payment of an annual or other fees for broadcasting or re-broadcasting licences;
  - (b) the frequencies that may be used in the operation of a station, the power limitations in respect of a station and any other technical specifications;
  - (c) the prevention of electric and other disturbances of radio reception or of transmissions over any telegraph line;

Issue of licences

(d) the location of a transmitter station and the geographical area to which the broadcast or re-broadcast may be made.

13. (1) Subject to the availability of frequencies, and subject to the provisions of subsection (2), the Board may, on receipt of an application for a broadcasting or re-broadcasting licence, if it is satisfied that the applicant has fulfilled all the requirements for a grant of licence, issue a licence to the applicant.

(2) A licence issued under subsection (1) may be issued subject to such conditions and restrictions, including geographical restrictions, as the Board may consider necessary, and such conditions and restrictions shall be endorsed on the licence.

Restrictions on broadcasting or re-broadcasting of programmes

14. A licensee shall not broadcast or re-broadcast —

(a) any material or programme of which he or she is not the copyright owner; or

(b) any broadcasting signal received by him or her for the purpose of re-broadcasting,

unless he or she has, prior to the broadcast or re-broadcast, obtained a written permission of the copyright owner of the material, programme, or re-broadcasting signal, as the case may be, to do so.

Notice of change of particulars of licensee

15. (1) Whenever —

(a) the name of any broadcasting or re-broadcasting service licensed under this Part is changed;

(b) any person acquires the proprietorship or any interest in the proprietorship of any broadcasting or re-broadcasting service under this Part;

(c) the director, producer or proprietor of any such broadcasting or re-broadcasting service is changed,

the proprietor of such broadcasting or re-broadcasting service shall lodge a notice of such change or acquisition with the Secretariat, and subject to the provisions of subsections (2) to (4), the Secretariat shall cause to be made such correction in the register as may be necessary.

(2) The Secretariat shall refer, a notice of change or acquisition submitted to it under subsection (1), to the Chairman of the Board for his or her consideration and approval before any correction is made in the register.

(3) Where the Chairman of the Board, after considering any notice of change or acquisition referred to him or her under subsection (2), is of the opinion that such change or acquisition, as the case may be, would be detrimental to the development of the broadcasting sector, he or she shall refer the matter to the Board for its decision.

(4) The Board may —

(a) approve the change or acquisition, in which case, it shall cause the Secretariat to make the necessary correction in the register; or

(b) refuse to approve of the change or acquisition and revoke the licence of the licensee.

(5) Every return and notice mentioned in this section, except a notice in relation to the change in name of any broadcasting or re-broadcasting service, shall be signed by every person therein named.

(6) Any person who —

(a) knowingly lodges or causes to be lodged with the Secretariat any return or notice under this section which is false in any material particular; or

(b) carries out any broadcasting or re-broadcasting activities in contravention of this section,

shall be guilty of an offence.

(7) For the purposes of this section the Board shall cause to be established and maintained a register of licensees wherein shall be entered every return made under this section.

16. Every person required to be in possession of a broadcasting or re-broadcasting licence in accordance with the provisions of this Part shall produce the licence for inspection on demand by any person authorised thereto by the Board.

17. (1) Where a licensee has failed to comply with any material condition included in his or her licence or has defaulted in payment of any fees imposed under this Part, the Board may by notice in writing to the licensee revoke the licence.

(2) A licence shall not be revoked, nor shall its renewal be refused without giving the licensee a reasonable opportunity to be heard by the Board.

18. Any person aggrieved by the revocation of his or her licence, or by the Board's refusal to renew his or her licence may appeal to the High Court within such time as may be prescribed.

Appeal

19. A licensee shall —

(a) keep and store sound and video recordings of all programmes broadcast or re-broadcast for a minimum period of three months after the date of transmission of the broadcast or re-broadcast, or for such further period as may be directed by the Board; and

(b) on demand by the Board produce such material that has been broadcast for examination or reproduction.

20. Without prejudice to the provisions of section 178 of the Penal Code (relating to obscene publications) a licensee shall, where a programme to be broadcast or re-broadcast is not suitable to be exhibited to children, advise or warn members of the public accordingly.

21. Regulations may prescribe a code of practice which shall be observed by all licensees.

PART IV — *Miscellaneous Provisions*

22. A person who —

(a) is guilty of an offence under this Act; or

(b) contravenes any provisions of this Act shall be guilty of an offence and,

shall be liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding P5 000 or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding three months, or to both.

Offences

Regulations

23. The Minister may by statutory instrument make regulations providing for any matter which under this Act is to be prescribed or is to be provided for by regulations or which otherwise is necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the provisions of this Act.

Consequential and transitional provisions

24. (1) Nothing in this Act shall affect the validity of the processing of any licensing application submitted to the Authority or any broadcasting licence issued by the Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Telecommunications Act, 1996, immediately before the commencement of this Act, and such application shall be dealt with in terms of this Act, and any licence issued by the Authority shall continue in force as if it had been issued under this Act.

(2) The proprietor of any radio or television station operating in Botswana immediately before the commencement of this Act shall within six months of such commencement apply for a licence under this Act.

Amendment of section 2 of Act 15 of 1996

25. In consequence of the provisions of this Act, section 2 of the Telecommunications Act, 1996, is hereby amended by inserting at the end of the definition of "telecommunication service" the words "but excluding a broadcasting service as defined in section 2 of the Broadcasting Act, 1998;"
