EXTRADITION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2018

(Published on 23rd March, 2018)

MEMORANDUM

 A draft of the above Bill, which it is intended to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The object of the Bill is to comply with the Eastern and Southern African Anti-Money Laundering Group mutual evaluation of Botswana which evaluation identified gaps in the Extradition Act (Cap. 09:03) (hereinafter referred to the as "the Act") to that end the Bill proposes the following —

a. clause 2 of the Bill amends section 3 of the Act by inserting a new subsection
 (4) which gives the President statutory powers to authorize the application of the Act to countries it does not apply to; and

clause 3 of the Bill amends section 8 of the Act by inserting a new subsection
 (3) which gives Botswana the powers to prosecute on behalf of another country where the surrender of a fugitive criminal has been declined.

- "(4) Where an arrangement has not been made under subsection
- (1) with respect to the surrender to a country of any fugitive criminal, the President may, by Order published in the Gazette, direct that this Act shall apply in the case of that country subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be specified in the order.
 - (5) Any order under subsection (4) may prescribe what crimes shall be deemed to be extradition crimes for the purposes of the order and this Act.".

Amendment of section 8 of the Act

- 3. Section 8 of the Act is amended by inserting immediately after subsection (2), the following new subsection -
 - "(3) Subject to the provisions of subsection (1), where a fugitive criminal has not been surrendered, the requesting country may subject to the laws of Botswana submit the case to the Director of Public Prosecutions for assessment of the evidence and where the evidence is sufficient to warrant prosecution of the matter the Director of Public Prosecutions may prosecute.".
