CONSTITUTION OF BOTSWANA

Authorisation to Exercise Functions of Office of President

TO: HIS HONOUR SLUMBER TSOGWANE, M. P., VICE PRESIDENT

WHEREAS IT IS PROVIDED by section 36 (1) of the Constitution that whenever the President is absent from Botswana or considers it desirable so to do by reason of illness or any other cause he may, by directions in writing, authorise the Vice President to discharge such of the functions of the Office of President as he may specify, and the Vice President may discharge those functions until the President's return to Botswana or the revocation of such authorisation, as the case may be;

AND WHEREAS I intend to be absent from Botswana from 30th April, 2018 and I consider it desirable to issue directions as aforesaid;

NOW THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid I authorise you, SLUMBER TSOGWANE, in your capacity as Vice President, to discharge with effect from 30th April, 2018, all the functions of the Office of President, except —

- (a) the power to dissolve Parliament in accordance with the provisions of section 91 of the Constitution;
- (b) the power to appoint to the Office of Minister or Assistant Minister in accordance with the provisions of section 42 of the Constitution;

Provided, however, that you can appoint the present Ministers or Assistant Ministers to act in place of any Minister who is otherwise not available;

- (c) the power to remove a Minister or Assistant Minister from office in accordance with the provisions of section 43 of the Constitution;

until my return to Botswana or this authority is revoked by me, whichever happens first.

The proposed project entails mineral exploration for copper and silver in Ghanzi District. Decommissioning

The following activities should be carried out during the decommissioning:

- Capping of all drilled boreholes.
- Collection and disposal of domestic waste at Ghanzi landfill and licensed approved facilities.
- Levelling of any soil piles made during exploration activities.
- Any fly camps setup by the exploration crew should be taken down and the area rehabilitated.

Conclusions

The EMP has established that the overall benefits of the project outweigh the potential negative impacts that may be caused by the projects. Some of the identified positive impacts include creation of temporary employment opportunities, and potential economic diversification if the mine is commissioned. Some of the identified negative impacts include damage to local tracks from movement of exploration vehicles; potential increase in ambient noise. The proposed mitigation measures and monitoring activities should be implemented and used as a guide during the exploration activities.

Recommendations

The EMP has indicated the proposed exploration can successfully be carried out with the implementation of the proposed mitigation measures for the negative impacts.

The Major Findings of EIA

i. Nature and Magnitude of the Activity

Construction and operation of an ultra-modern, 123 bed private hospital and rehabilitation centre, catering for specific health needs. The construction is planned to take place on a 5ha plot and the building foot print will be 12300m².

ii. Rational for the project

There are no advanced specific orthopaedic rehabilitation facilities in the Botswana, and the country currently outsources most of its acute services to neighbouring South Africa which provides a major inconvenience for locals seeking orthopaedic and rehabilitation care.

iii. Location of the Activity

The proposed development is located along Francistown – Matsiloje road on plot 1098, Portion 2, farm number 36 NQ. The farm is bordered by the Botswana Defence Force area to the west, Farm 32 – NQ to the north, impala to the east and portion 3 of farm 36-NQ located to the south.

iv. Anticipated Environmental Impacts and Proposed Mitigation Measures

The environmental impacts and mitigation measures identified by the EIA study for major concerns are presented in detail in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and summarised below. A detailed Environmental Management Plan to help manage and monitor potential impacts is included in the EIS.

i. Nature and Magnitude of the Activity

The Department of Building and Engineering Services on behalf of Department of Clinical Services in the Ministry of Health and Wellness intends to construct a 73 bed health care facility on a site measuring about 20.9 hectares. The new primary hospital which will include a general, maternity and tuberculosis (TB) wards will also provide specialised services in the area of ophthalmology, orthopedic, X-ray and radiology as well as counselling services. The proposed development will also include the construction of 69 staff houses (48No. two bedroom flats, 16No. three bedroom town houses and 5No. three bedroom houses with servants' quarters and carports), the construction of a solar farm to generate hot water for the facility as well as the installation of a waste converter that would treat solid medical waste that would be generated by operation of the hospital. The hospital and staff houses will be connected to the Moshupa centralized waterborne sewerage system which will be constructed during the 2018/2019 financial year. The completion of this sewage works will be completed prior to the completion of the construction of the hospital and staff houses.

ii. Location of the Activity

The proposed project site for the new primary hospital and staff houses is located in Moshupa Village in Lephapeng Ward. The site is bordered to the east by Diratsame II Community Junior Secondary School, to the south by Moshupa Senior Secondary School and to the west, north and north east by developed and undeveloped residential plots. The site is accessed along a gravel road which starts at the end of the tarred road which terminates in front of Diratsame II Community Junior Secondary School and joins the four way intersection between Monakwe Monakwe and Jane Tshitlho Tsie Roads.

iii. Anticipated Environmental Impacts and Proposed Mitigation Measures

The table below presents a summary of the significant anticipated Environmental Impacts and proposed mitigation/enhancement measures identified by the EIA Study.

Anticipated Environmental Impacts**Construction Phase (Positive Impacts)**

1. Employment creation

Proposed Mitigation/Enhancement Measures

As much as possible residents of Moshupa Village and its surrounding settlements should be considered when recruiting labour especially for the semi-skilled and unskilled labour. Provision should be made for table top small scale food vendors to sell their food.

Construction Phase (Negative Impacts)

2. Potential soil and water pollution

Washing of construction vehicles' and equipment should be restricted to a designated washing bay which should be constructed within the project site.

The designated wash bay should be equipped with an oil water separator.

Washing of construction vehicles' and equipment should be carried out using water only. No detergents should be allowed.

3. Land pollution

A temporary waste holding facility comprising of a roof, gate and side protection using nets should be provided at the construction site. A soil bunded area consisting of two partitions should be constructed to store and treat contaminated soil.

Operation Phase (Positive Impacts)

4. Provision of improved physical infrastructure (tarred road, stormwater & sewerage reticulation)

There should be regular monitoring of the road, storm water drainage systems as well as sewerage reticulation to ensure that they are in good condition.

Anticipated Environmental Impacts

5. Enhanced aesthetics of the project site and its surrounding areas
6. Improved biomedical waste management (use of waste converter)
7. Boost to local household income and economy
8. Provision of higher order health care facilities' and services

Proposed Mitigation/Enhancement Measures

There should be regular maintenance of the hospital and the staff houses. Routine maintenance should also be undertaken for the road, water, sewerage and stormwater drainage facilities.

The waste sterilization converter should be maintained regularly to ensure that the process of managing biomedical waste is efficient. The waste from the converter system should be disposed of at the Kanye landfill.

Local businesses within Moshupa and surrounding settlements should be considered for opportunities' to provide services to the hospital and staff housing complex.

The hospital and staff housing management as well as the Department of Building and Engineering Services should ensure that the facilities are maintained on a regular basis.

Operation Phase (Negative Impacts)

9. Land pollution

Adequate number of recycle bins should be provided within and around the residential properties.

Use of colour coded bins for easy identification and the bins should be disposed regularly.

Waste disposal should be undertaken by a licensed and registered waste company.

10. Risk of flooding due to change in flow of surface runoff

Prohibit disposal of solid waste materials into the drainage channels. Regularly inspect and maintain all drainage channels to keep these free of obstructions.

Decommissioning Phase (Positive Impacts)

11. Land reclamation to enhance aesthetics of decommissioned sewage site
12. Cessation of stench from the sewage ponds currently located within the site (Decommissioning of existing sewerage ponds)

Ensure that the site is properly decommissioned and reclaimed for recreation purpose.

With the desludging and decommissioning of the ponds, the stench from the existing sewage ponds will cease.

Ensure that all waste materials from the decommissioning of the ponds are properly disposed off.

iv. Conclusion

The conclusion from the findings of the EIA study is that the benefits of implementing the project outweigh the negative impacts. The implementation of the project will provide a state of the art healthcare facility that would not only serve the community of Moshupa but also its surrounding settlements. The negative impacts identified by the EIA study can be minimised through the implementation of the mitigation measures and recommendations made in the Environmental Management Plan which formed part of the EIA study.

v. Recommendation

Following the undertaking of the Environmental Impact Assessment study, it is recommended that the project be allowed to proceed with due implementation of all the management measures recommended.

The public notice present major findings of the Environmental Management Plan for the design and construction of Thalamabele Veterinary Gate-Mosu road project. HERBCO Technical Services have been awarded a contract by Ministry of Transport and Communication through Roads Department.

The need for construction of the Thalamabele Veterinary Gate to Mosu road emanated from the current road which is of gravel standard and requires regular maintenance to cope with growing traffic volumes. This therefore has necessitated the upgrading of the road from gravel to bituminous standard.

i) **Nature and Magnitude of the Activity**

The road starts at the animal disease control cordon fence of the Department of Animal Health and Production where it crosses the Francistown – Orapa Road (A30), referred to as the Thalamabele Veterinary Gate. The start point is approximately 140km from the City of Francistown and about 20km from the nearest village of Mokubilo. From the start point the road continues in a north-easterly direction to Mosu Village which is about 25km (to Kgotta).

ii) **Location of the Activity**

The project route, Thalamabele Veterinary Gate to Mosu Road, is located in the Central District within the current Boteti East Constituency.

iii) **Anticipated Environmental impacts of the Activity and proposed mitigation measures to respond to the negative environmental impact**

The environmental impacts and mitigation measures identified by the Environmental Management Plan (EMP) study are presented in detail in the Environmental Impact Assessment study and summarised in the table below. A detailed EMP to help manage and monitor potential impacts is included in the EMP report.

The plot is located in the outskirts of Mochudi (Boseja Ward) along Mochudi-Sikwane Road; on the other side of the road is Raserura English Medium Private School. The project site is located next to Zakhem Construction premises.

The conclusions from the findings of the EIS are that all the negative impacts identified can be mitigated and their severity minimized through the implementation of the mitigation measures and recommendations made in the Environmental Management Plan. It is therefore recommended that the project be allowed to proceed.

NOTIFICATION FOR PUBLIC REVIEW OF ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT (EIS) FOR THE PROPOSED SHERWOOD FILLING STATION AND FARMER'S POINT TRUCK YARD

The major findings of an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Study undertaken for the Proposed Sherwood Filling Station And Farmer's Point Truck Yard are as summarised hereunder:

Nature and Magnitude of the Activity

Total Botswana (Pty) Ltd has been operating a service station at Sherwood, Martin's Drift since November 1969. The filling station and farmer's point truck yard business operates in a property allocated for the same use as it falls within the compatible proposed and current use of the land. Total intends to remove the existing underground storage tanks (USTs) at Total Sherwood Filling Station and the above ground truck tanks at the Farmer's Point Truck Yard and replace these with new UST's, with increased capacity, along with refurbishing the site. The developer proposes to add additional two 45m³ underground double walled tanks for the filling station and two 60m³ underground double walled tanks for the farmer's point truck yard, and add all other associated connections for power and pipes. These developments will happen within the same plot to become part of the existing infrastructure.

Location of the Activity

The Total Sherwood filling station and Farmer's Point Truck Yard is located along Martin's Drift (B140) Road within the Central District in Sherwood, Martin's Drift.

Anticipated Impacts and Proposed Mitigation Measures

The environmental impacts and mitigation measures identified by the EIA study are presented in detail in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and summarised in the table below. A detailed Environmental Management Plan to help manage and monitor potential impacts is included in the EIS.

The major findings of an Environmental Impact Assessment Study (EIA) undertaken for the proposed sand burrow pit are as summarised hereunder. The EIA study was undertaken by Longlit Environmental Assessment Consulting Pty Ltd led by Ndobano Lokae of BEAPA No. 20130063 on behalf of Tironte Building, Moulding and Maintenance (Pty) Ltd.

Nature and Magnitude of the Activity

In respect of this sand burrow pit project; the mining company Tironte Building, Moulding and Maintenance (Pty) Ltd is set to extract sand in a 100m x 100m. Equipment and personnel resources for the production process include the following:

- 2 x (5 cubic meters) tipper truck
- 1 x (10 cubic meters) tipper truck
- Fencing material for the burrow pit
- A hired mobile toilet
- A plastic bag at the burrow pit for waste collection
- 1 x record keeping man based at the burrow pit
- 4 x drivers for the tipper trucks
- 1 x managing directors: Mr Peter Maipheto
- 2 x office/procurement people based in Shakawe

Rationale for the Project

Tironte Building, Moulding and Maintenance (Pty) Ltd is a private company registered to carry out business in Botswana and the director for this company is Mr Peter Maipheto. Mr Maipheto through the above business company has been conducting business in industrial minerals including river sand, gravel, bricks and construction business for the past 20 years. The focus of the business is local communities who are supplied with complete bricks of various sizes, lintels, ream beams, raw gravel and sand and concrete/quarry stones. The project can benefit the construction of Shakawe Primary Hospital that is being built at the moment, the Mohembo Bridge, the new mall in Shakawe that is being built and ESP projects in the district.

Location of the Activity

The gravel burrow pit allocated for Tironte Building, Moulding and Maintenance (Pty) Ltd near Nxamasari is accessible at the following coordinates: 18 34 25.85 S and 021 58 52.30 E. The total area for the burrow pit 100m² and all the rights are given to Tironte Building, Moulding and Maintenance (Pty) Ltd.

Anticipated Impacts and Proposed Mitigation Measures

The environmental impacts and mitigation measures identified by the EIA study are presented in detail in the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Report and summarised in the table below. A detailed Environmental Management Plan to help manage and monitor potential impacts is included in the EIA.

Site clearing activities should be limited to the project site.

Selective cutting of tree species is recommended

All vegetative debris from clearing activities should be temporarily stored at the location that will not interfere with construction. Vegetation will be avoided for woods needs to local people around the Nxamasari area.

Adequate dust suppressant measures including regular sprinkling of water especially on loose dirt, un-vegetated areas and stripped road surfaces should be undertaken regularly to control fugitive dust generated during site preparation and construction activities.

Stringent material handling/overhauling procedures should be put in place and enforced.

Stock piling of earth materials for construction should be carried out within temporarily constructed enclosures to limit fugitive dust.

All construction equipment should be maintained accordingly to ensure that exhaust emissions are minimized. They should comply with BOBS Vehicle Emission Standards.

All construction vehicles should be tuned and maintained regularly to ensure that emission levels are kept within permissible limits.

All construction machinery should be in a good working condition and engines switched off when not in use.

Workers should be provided with adequate protective clothing during construction activities to prevent them from contracting respiratory diseases.

Ensure that the site and all stockpiled reserves at the site including soil resources to be retained for rehabilitation in addition to top soil are properly enclosed.

All stockpiled sand or spoils should not be kept for long periods otherwise they should be covered with tarpaulin to prevent it from being blown away by winds.

The project management must ensure that the machinery including all equipment used for the project internally and externally as long as it directly has to do with the sand mining is fitted with acoustic covers to avoid unnecessary noise.

Construction activities should be planned to avoid prolonged noise generation activities.

Machinery should always be switched off when not in use, rather than being left to cause unnecessary noise and in some instance environmental pollution.

Noisy equipment should be sited whenever possible away from residential properties and noise-disruption should be minimized.

Workers should be provided with mufflers to minimize the noise impact from operation of machinery/trucks.

Workers should be provided with earplugs and be engaged in diversified activities to prevent prolonged exposure to noise levels of more than 85dB per 8 hour shift.

Speed limits of 40km/h along the project routes should be enforced to attenuate noise from construction vehicles that would be plying the roads.

Construction vehicles and heavy plant standing for extended periods of time (e.g. weekends and holidays) shall have drip trays placed beneath them.

Topsoil and vegetation to be removed in areas designated for storage, and stockpiled appropriately.

Disposal of contents of drip trays to be in accordance with relevant hazardous materials disposal requirements. There are used oil collectors in Maun who are ready to collect this oil at no cost.

Minor repair or servicing of machinery and vehicles are to be undertaken at appropriate workshop areas in Shakawe.

Workers should be provided with appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to avoid unnecessary accidents. Dust masks, ear muffs, eye protection and safety shoes are some of the important PPEs for this project.

Provision of safe equipment and vehicles for use by workers. Disease vector control for such diseases as malaria.

Provision of emergency health response systems and first aid.

Provision of potable water and sanitary facilities for workers.

Provision of adequate ablution facilities, mobile toilet facilities to be used.

Workers should be inducted on proper use of machinery and equipment.

Health and safety education and awareness should be provided to workers on the project.

A First Aid Box stocked to the specifications as prescribed in the (Factories Regulations) should be readily available on site daily.

Implement good housekeeping practices, such as the sorting and placing loose construction materials or demolition debris in established areas away from foot paths.

The project promoter must implement appropriate mitigation measures, which must include the following.

"Stop-go" controls at burrow pit site road access points

Warning signs

Safety barriers

Noise and Dust Control

Developer to provide method statement of site specific dust control measures.

Dust suppression can be undertaken by, but not limited to, watering relevant areas. Watering of erosion prone areas must be conducted in moderation and with an erosion monitoring system in place.

Hazardous Materials

Information on all hazardous materials (Material Safety Data Sheets, MSDS) must be kept on site and available to all. This must include safety information such as how to handle these materials or treat injuries as a result of these materials

Hazardous materials shall be stored in a contained, stable and safe environment with relevant labels placed on storage containers and lids firmly applied to prevent spillage.

Storage facility is to comply with relevant safety and hazardous material regulations.

Staff training is to be provided for all those handling and working with hazardous materials.

Fire Prevention

Fire prevention measures shall be taken in the vicinity of vehicles and in areas where fuel is present e.g. near the tipper trucks.

"No-smoking" signs to be placed in areas used for storage of oil and fuel.

Basic firefighting equipment shall be readily available on site. Construction workers shall be made aware of the procedures in the event of a fire.

Conclusions and Recommendations of the Study

The EIA report prepared for Tironte Building, Moulding and Maintenance (Pty) Ltd represented the final Environmental Impact Assessment Study for the sand burrow pit 2km west of Nxamaseri village in Okavango Sub-District belonging to Mr Peter Maipheto.

The recommendations made by the consultant are as follows; Consideration must be given to extension of the surface rights period for the sand burrow pit within which the project promoter had to obtain acquisition of clearances and permits for extension of the time period if need arise.

DEA should approve this project to be implemented to help address sand material shortages in Shakawe and the surrounding areas.

An Environmental Practitioner should be engaged to monitor the implementation of the operations and clearing stages.

During construction all works for the proposed sand operation and related activities must be conducted in an environmentally friendly manner in order to promote sustainable development as well as conserve the environment;

All the legislations, policies, regulations and plans in this report should be adhered to at all times by the project promoter.

All mitigation measures and recommendations in the EIA report must be implemented in totality.

Any sensitive issue which in any way may harm the environment but not captured in this report must be reported to management and project coordinator or EAP and have it attended to well in time and also engage the EAP for assessment.

There will also be need for DEA to audit the project to ensure compliance with the EIA and national laws.

All the legislations, policies, regulations and plans in this report is adhered to at all times by directors of Tironte Building, Moulding and Maintenance (Pty) Ltd.

The consultant therefore concludes that based on the findings especially the existing legal requirements (licenses and certificates) as well as the project proponent having knowledge in the industry for over 20 years up to date, the EIA study conducted is adequate and up to standard to guide construction activities and the project can therefore be given a go ahead to resume operations once all permits and licenses are issued.

Nature and Magnitude of the Activity

The proposed projects consist of two 2-star camps in the Northern Zone (Nari and Elephant), while Tau which will be a 4-star camp is located in the Southern zone of NG 18. The proposed Nari and Elephant camps are to be located next to seasonal water pools where boreholes have been dug to provide wild animals with water supply during dry periods. Tau Camp is to be located on an island on the flood plains of the Southernmost part of NG 18. A borehole will be dug for water supply at the proposed Tau Camp. The Camps will comprise of infrastructural developments and activities which are consolidated under the following main components.

Each camp has 16 commercial bedded tents – these are the eight decked tents which are fully en-suited in which clients will be lodged.

Staff village – this includes 2 management tents, 4 guides tents at the Nari and Elephant camps while the Tau camp will have 5 management tents and 5 guides tents. In addition, the staff village will have a kitchen, ablution facility and an entertainment area

Power for each camp will be provided from Solar Farm units (one for camp and one for staff village), with back – up generators.

For Nari and Elephant Camps, water will be supplied from existing boreholes while Tau camp will be supplied from the borehole to be dug.

Domestic reverse osmosis systems will be installed onsite for each camp to process and clean water to supply portable water.

Activated sludge and wastewater treatments system will be installed on each site for water treatment. This system has been found to be able to treat waste water to acceptable standards before discharge into the environment. The waste water should meet the BOBS 93:2012 standards prior to disposal.

There will be a waste shelter for holding solid waste temporarily on site before disposal at the Maun Landfill

The camps will be accessed via existing earth tracks (). These tracks were created during the time when the concession was used for hunting. The Tau camp on the other hand will be accessed using boats during rainy season as it is located on an island on the flood plains

There will be provision of a garage for safari vehicles and carports for all the three camps

Envisaged activities for all the camps include boat cruises and game viewing

Rationale for the Project

Considering that there is only one 16 bedded camp in the northern zone of NG 18, which occupies 90% of the concession area landscape, and that the only camp has been directly operated by the proponent, the proponent has built a clientele that would like to explore the interlinkage of water pools and lagoons of the northern NG18. Most of the clients are the former hunters in the same concession area, who would like to spend continuous nights under the stars, in camps located at the same water pools where they used to hunt. The proposed camps therefore become responsive to the clientele, bringing nostalgic memories. As it is currently, when these clients come they only stay NG18, as well as upmarket southern zone which is rich with flora and fauna. In addition, the developer intends to provide employment opportunities and to boost the revenue performance for the beneficiary of the local community.

Location of the Activity

The 3 camps are located in the concession area NG 18. Nari and Elephant Camps are proposed to be located in the Northern Zone while Tau Camp is located in the Southern Zone.

Location of Project Activity

The proposed site is located on the outskirts of Matebeleng village; the site is approximately 2.5km from Oodi junction, and about 1km from Matebeleng *Kgotla*. The site is accessed through the paved road that passes through the village and the gravel road that passes by Matebeleng Primary School.

The study area is located in the Block 7 neighbourhood in Gaborone, on the north side of the project site there are already existing BHC Flats and on the eastern part of the plot there is a church called Glory Time Church. THE REFURBISHMENT OF KWARA CAMP IN NG/20

The major findings of an Environmental Impact Study (EIS) undertaken for the proposed Refurbishment of Kwara camp in NG/20 are as summarised hereunder.

Nature and Magnitude of the Activity

Kwara and Little Kwara camps operate on adjacent sites within a continuous band of riparian vegetation in the southern region of NG/20 near to the boundary with the Moremi Game Reserve. Kwando Safaris propose to rationalise the site of the current Kwara and Little Kwara camps to allow for a single upgraded camp to operate on the site. The refurbished Kwara camp will provide accommodation for up to 18 guests in a unique and well designed camp which provides increased guest luxury and privacy. The proposed project will involve the refurbishment of front of house facilities including guest rooms, central guest lounge and dining area as well as the back of house facilities and staff village. The refurbished camp will be principally developed on the site of the existing Kwara camp. However, to allow for a slight expansion in the size of each guest unit and improved spacing between units the final refurbished camp will extend into the current Little Kwara site.

The refurbishment of Kwara camp will include the following activities:

Extensive decommissioning of existing developments at both Kwara and Little Kwara camps.

Removal of all concrete from the site – estimated 170 tonnes.

Installation of a BioRock waste treatment plant for all liquid waste.

Installation of a hybrid solar power plant with backup 30 kVa diesel generator.

Development of nine guest units including one family unit.

Development of one pilot/private guide unit.

Development of one main guest dining and lounge area and one private dining and lounge area.

Development of 40 single occupancy staff accommodation with en-suite ablutions for managers, guides and junior staff.

Extensive refurbishment of back of house supporting infrastructure including vehicle workshop and fuel storage.

Rationale for the Project

The purpose of this project is to rationalise the site of the Kwara and Little Kwara camps to allow for a single upgraded camp to operate on the site. The proposed refurbishment of Kwara camp and decommissioning of Little Kwara camp will reduce the environmental impacts both at the development site and in the surrounding area. This is as a result of reducing the total bed night capacity at the site from 26 to 18 beds as well as the removal of the duplicated back of house facilities. It will ensure that Kwando Safaris continue to maintain the standards expected of them as well as guaranteeing the long-term viability of the camp. Refurbishing the camp will also allow Kwando Safaris to improve the environmental efficiency of the camp through the installation of a solar plant and a modern above-ground sewage treatment plant and grey water reticulation system together with energy efficient lights and equipment throughout.

Location of the Activity

Kwara camp is located at GPS S 19.107961° GPS E 23.264368° (Decimal degrees, WGS 1984) in the south of NG/20, along the northern border of the Moremi Game Reserve. The 175,000Ha concession is a commercial photographic Controlled Hunting Area (CHA) under the management and operation of Kwando Safaris.

Anticipated Impacts and Proposed Mitigation Measures

The environmental impacts and mitigation measures identified by the EMP study are presented in detail in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and summarised in the table below. A detailed Environmental Management Plan to help manage and monitor potential impacts is included in the EIS.

Conclusions and Recommendations of the Study

The consultants recommend that the redevelopment of Kwara camp goes ahead according to the proposed plans and recommendations as laid out in the EIS. The proposed developments will significantly improve the use of the Kwara site and provide an improved tourism product for guests whilst also improving living and working conditions for all staff. Moreover, the developments will help to ensure the long-term success of the operation, thus safeguarding jobs and revenue. The refurbishment will improve the environmental credentials of the camp with the removal of all concrete from the site and through the installation of an above-ground liquid waste treatment plant together with the installation of a solar plant and solar geysers.

As with all projects there are a number of impacts that will need mitigation. In this project they include: the risk

of soil erosion, compaction and contamination through use of machinery and supply trucks, risk of air and noise pollution from machinery use, risk of vegetation destruction and wildlife disruption from activity on the sites and risk to staff of working in extreme wilderness areas. The EMP report provides detailed Impact identification, Mitigation strategies and Monitoring Plans for all phases of the project which the construction team and operator should follow during both refurbishment and operation of the camp.

In compliance with Section 10 of the Environmental Assessment (EA) Act No 10 of 2011

The major findings of the Environmental Impact Assessment for the above project are as summarised below:

Nature and Magnitude of the Activity

The project proponent, Sky Bridge Capital (Pty) Ltd, has proposed to develop a fuel depot within an existing industrial plot at Area G in Francistown. The proposed project will include development and operation of two diesel tanks, a bund wall and associated fuel dispensing equipment and buildings.

Rationale for the Project

The main objective of the project is to supply diesel to service buses and trucks with 500PPM and 50PPM diesel.

Location of the Activity

The proposed project will be located at Plot No. 15769, Area G in the City of Francistown. The area has been zoned for industrial use.

Anticipated Environmental Impacts and Proposed Mitigation Measures

The table below presents a summary of the impacts associated with proposed development together with the proposed mitigation measures for each, as per the project EMP.

Environmental Impacts Predicted	Proposed Mitigation Measure
Negative impacts	
Ground and surface water contamination	Ground water contaminants such as chemicals and fuels must be stored in areas located away from water sources. Substances such as fuels must be stored on concrete base to avoid contaminating surface and ground water sources.
Soil contamination	Soil contaminants found on site such as fuel and chemicals must be placed on concrete bases with bund walls or impermeable PVC lining whilst awaiting treatment. Equipment such as oil spillage kits must be made available onsite for treating any immediate oil spillages. Maintenance of machines and vehicles must be done regularly to prevent fuel spillages.
Noise pollution	Use regularly maintained equipment that does not produce excessive noise. Noise producing activities should be undertaken during the day time only. Blasting activities (if required for foundations must be carried after consulting with nearby communities to minimise disturbance of activities practiced.
Air pollution	Gaseous emissions from site machinery and vehicles must be reduced or prevented by regular maintenance. Dust suppression techniques must be applied to prevent generation of excessive dust during excavation works.

Environmental Impacts Predicted

Increased waste generation

Proposed Mitigation Measure

Use the designated waste holding areas at the mine for the waste from the site.

Waste produced from the site must be disposed at legal and licensed waste facilities.

Awareness campaigns regarding waste must be presented the construction workers.

Recyclable waste must be separated and stored for recycling at licensed and legal recycling facilities.

Waste vegetation must be cut up and left as compost.

Occupational health and safety risks

A health and safety policy must be developed by the contractor.

Fencing of construction areas to keep unauthorised people out.

Signage at site entrance.

Adequate protective equipment and clothing must be provided to the construction workers.

Risks of disturbance of archaeological sites

An archaeological induction with construction personnel must be conducted to inform on procedures to be followed in the event of an archaeological discovery.

Discovery of archaeological remains such as subsurface artefacts and archaeological sites must be reported to the BNMM immediately.

Traffic disruption

Dust suppression should therefore be undertaken on the gravel haulage route and speed limit should be controlled.

Positive Impacts

Employment creation

Acquisition of unskilled labour from communities near the project site, train for required skills where possible.

Establish transparent and agreed means of hiring, firing and skills development.

Utilise local supplies and local subcontractors where possible.

Conclusion

Conclusions drawn from the Environmental Impact Study are that negative environmental impacts may arise as a result of the implementation of the project; the impacts are manageable and can be minimised by implementing the proposed mitigation measures. Positive impacts such as employment opportunities are also expected. Mitigation measures have been proposed to curb the adverse impacts and enhance the positive impacts of operation, and if correctly implemented, most of the identified negative impacts will be minimised or eliminated.

Recommendation

Following the undertaking of the Environmental Impact Study for the project, it is recommended that the project be allowed to proceed with due implementation of all the mitigation measures recommended.

ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

REGULATION

1. Citation
2. Exemption from regulation 9 (3) of Cap. 43:02 (Sub. Leg.)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Investment, Trade and Industry by section 27 as read with section 31 (2) (h) of the Trade Act, the following Regulations are hereby made —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Trade (Exemption) (No. 19) Citation Regulations, 2018.

2. Clicks Organisation (Botswana) (Pty) Ltd operating at Plot No. 74343, Mowana Park, Phakalane, Gaborone is exempted from the provisions of regulation 9 (3) of the Trade Regulations, which state that such business shall carry out its business from a store of at least 1500 square meters.
