INCREASES IN "TRO TRO" FARES

Up till now the "tro tro" vehicles have been plying within Accra and its suburbs in the same way as taxis operate. It has now become necessary, in view of numerous complaints from the public about exorbitant fares charged, that this Ministry should remind the "tro tro" operators of the maximum fares which shall be charged for the various distances they cover.

2. Accordingly, the Ministry is publishing today, for the information of the general public, that the following fares in the Schedule appended hereto are those in force in the City of Accra and its suburbs. Until the Prah Committee, now investigating specific aspects of the cost of transportation in the country, reports and recommends otherwise, it shall be unlawful for any "tro tro" driver or owner to charge higher fares than the rates hereby published. The Prah Committee's report however is not expected within a week as published in some Accra dailies.

3. The Police have been asked to take action against any driver or owner of "tro tro" who infringes this law. The public are advised to report offending drivers to the Police for action.
