TO ALL WHOM THESE MAY COME

INSTRUMENT GRANTING AMNESTY TO PRISONERS UNDER SENTENCE OF DEATH ON THE OCCASION OF THE DECLARATION OF GHANA AS A REPUBLIC ON 1st JULY, 1960

In exercise of the powers conferred on the President by Article 50 (1) and (c) of the Constitution of the Republic of Ghana, the President acting in consultation with the Council of State hereby substitutes a less severe form of punishment with effect from eighteenth day of December, 1970 in the manner following:—

1. (i) Subject to sub-paragraph (iii) of this paragraph the death sentence of each of the prisoners named in the Schedule below shall be commuted to imprisonment for 15 calendar years with hard labour without the usual remission for good behaviour and that this shall be with effect from the date of conviction of each prisoner.

(ii) Subject to sub-paragraph (iii) of this paragraph, where any prisoner named in the Schedule below has with effect from the date of his conviction served 15 calendar years without the usual remission for good behaviour he shall be released forthwith.

(iii) The amnesty so granted shall not however apply to those prisoners named in the Schedule below and who are on the effective date of this instrument, mental patients.

2. Subject to sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph 1 above where a prisoner named in the Schedule below is an alien, he shall be deported immediately after serving his sentence.

VACANCY FOR RECEPTIONIST

Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons for the post of a Receptionist (non-pensionable) in the Regional Administration, Bolgatanga.

(2) STENOGRAPHER/CLERK GRADE I

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess the minimum educational qualification of School Certificate with credit in English Language, or the G.C.E. Ordinary Level with passes in at least 5 subjects including English Language; be able to type at the rate of 40 words per minute and take shorthand at the rate of 100 words per minute and must possess a Certificate to that effect issued by the Principal of the Government Secretarial School.

Duties.—The duties of a Stenographer/Clerk Grade I may be various, depending on the Section to which he is attached and may include supervision of a group of clerks with a view to maintaining acceptable standards of output and quality. He may be required to conduct routine correspondence on his own initiative.

(3) STENOGRAPHER/CLERK GRADE II
