### NURSES' BOARD FOR GHANA PRELIMINARY QUALIFYING EXAMINATION

Notice is hereby given that the Preliminary Qualifying Examination for all Pupil Nurses in training who have completed one or more years nursing experience in a Training Hospital approved by the Nurses' Board by the 30th April, 1971 and have attended at least seventy-five per cent of the lectures in each subject of the syllabus laid down by the Nurses' Board for the Preliminary Qualifying Examination, will take place on 11th, 12th, 13th and 14th May, 1971 at 7.30 a.m.

This examination will consist of—

- (a) Anatomy and Physiology—2 hours paper and 10 minutes oral;
- (b) Elementary General Nursing—1 hour paper and 30 minutes practical;
- (c) Hygiene and Elementary Food Values—1 hour paper and 6 minutes oral;

in accordance with regulation 41 (a) and (b) of the Nurses' Regulations of 1954.

The centres for examination will be Accra, Kumasi, Sekondi and Tamale.

**NURSES' BOARD FOR GHANA  
FINAL QUALIFYING EXAMINATION**

Notice is hereby given that the Sixty-first Final Qualifying Examination in accordance with Regulation No. 41 (b) of the Nurses' Regulations of 1954, will take place on the 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st May, 1971 commencing at 7.30 a.m.

All final candidates must prove—

- (a) that they will have completed three years consecutive training in nursing of the type for which they seek registration, in a hospital approved by the Board by 30th April, 1971;
- (b) that they have attended at least seventy-five per cent of the lectures in each subject of the syllabus laid down by the Board for the Final Qualifying Examination;
- (c) that they have passed the Preliminary Qualifying Examination or the Preliminary State Examination;
- (d) that they can produce a certificate to the effect that their conduct has been good and they have shown diligence in their work, both theoretical and practical.

This examination will comprise—

- (a) General Nursing—30 minutes practical;
- (b) Surgical Nursing and First Aid—2 hours paper and 6 minutes oral;
- (c) Medical Nursing—2 hours paper and 6 minutes oral.

The centres for examination will be Accra, Kumasi, Sekondi and Tamale.

**(a) DEPARTMENT OF ARCHAEOLOGY**
