Unesco is seeking applications for the post of Programme Specialist (General Education) at the Unesco Secretariat in Paris.

Qualifications:

- (a) Candidates for this post should have maturity, breadth and variety of educational experience over a period of more than ten years, having passed through successively more difficult and responsible assignments in education, including current or very recent experience in educational administration at a high level.
- (b) In addition, candidates should have experience of experimental and innovatory programmes in general education.
- (c) Candidates should have an advanced University degree or its equivalent and be familiar with theoretical concepts of educational programmes, finance and administration. Academic preparation should be sufficiently diversified and generalized to allow the applicant to relate one field to another.
- (d) Ability to work co-operatively with different cultural and ethnic groups.
- (e) Candidates should be fluent in English, French or Spanish and have a good working knowledge including ability to draft in at least one of the other two languages.

GHANA WATER AND SEWERAGE CORPORATION

The Ghana Water and Sewerage Corporation employs 4,000 persons (including 260 senior staff members) for operating their supply systems located in Ghana. The field management is conducted from the 9 Regions of Ghana, each Region headed by a Regional Manager.

The Regional activities are divided into 2 major sectors—the Industrial Sector which seeks to reduce costs of producing water supply and the Commercial Sector whose objective is to promote revenue collection to predetermined targets.

The Head Office of the Corporation located in Accra is similarly divided into 2 major organisational units—an Engineering Department and a Commercial Department. The Commercial Department is responsible for providing staff assistance in matters of finance and personnel to the Regional Management and has the following 4 units under it, i.e. Finance, Stores, Personnel and Manpower and Training.

A suitable person is required for immediate appointment as *Commercial Manager* to head the Commercial Department.

The Commercial Manager will maintain overall management surveillance and control over the Commercial Department and will be responsible for formulating and promoting policies and procedures for achieving significant improvements in the performance standards in such activities as financial control and revenue collection, personnel, training and stores administration.

Qualifications.—Candidates should possess a high degree of initiative and resourcefulness and must either—

- (a) be Associate Members of the Institute of Chartered Accountants (A.C.A.), or Member of Association of Certified and Corporate Accountants (A.C.C.A.); or
- (b) possess suitable degree in Economics or Business/Public Administration with personnel management/public finance as special subject; and
- (c) must have had at least 10 years' post-qualification experience in a responsible position in a reputable commercial or industrial establishment or governmental agency.

Salary.—Terms to be negotiated including contract terms.

The Corporation also requires *Professional Accountants* and *Auditors* to fill a number of vacant positions in the Finance Unit.

The Accountants will be required to perform duties which include:—

- (i) Supervision of accounts;
- (ii) preparation of quarterly financial returns, including income statement, balance sheet, production report, commercial operation report, accounts receivable report for general management information;

- (iii) appraisal of monthly returns on (a) revenues and (b) unit cost of production, and recommendations for increasing revenue and reducing expenditure;
- (iv) designing, installing, and improving costing systems and supervising their operation;
- (v) reviewing or revising accounting and internal control systems; and
- (vi) generally co-ordinating all financial matters.

Successful Audit candidates will be required to undertake inspection of accounts, advise upon methods and conduct special investigations into specific accounting problems.

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess the requisite professional qualification with some experience in a responsible position.
