MINISTRY OF HEALTH
VACANCIES FOR PUPIL LEPROSY CONTROL ASSISTANTS

Applications are invited for scholarship awards for training leading to appointment in the Ministry of Health as Leprosy Control Assistants. Selected candidates will be bonded to complete the course and to serve the Government for a period of not less than 5 years afterwards.

2. *Qualifications:*

Candidates must—

- (a) be citizens of Ghana;
- (b) possess the Middle School Leaving Certificate; and
- (c) not have attained their 30th birthday.

3. The course which is non-residential will last for two years during which period candidates will have formal and in-job training at the Ghana Leprosy Service, Ankaful, Elmina. During the period of training candidates will receive an allowance of N¢280 per annum rising by annual increment of N¢20 to N¢300 per annum (under review). All candidates who complete the course satisfactorily including the passing of a departmental test will be considered for appointment on probation to the pensionable grade of Leprosy Control Assistants on salary Range 12, 17, 27 (N¢426–N¢864).

4. Applications should reach the Senior Medical Officer-in-charge, Ghana Leprosy Service, P.O. Box 26, Elmina not later than 19th June, 1971. Candidates from Northern/Upper Regions should send their applications to reach the Senior Leprosy Control Officer, P.O. Box 196, Tamale not later than 19th June, 1971.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR PROMOTION TO THE GRADE OF PRINCIPAL TEACHER, 1971

The above examination will be held in Accra on Friday, 27th August, 1971.

2. Serving Senior Teachers, holders of the Associate Certificate and Assistant Education Officers who have attained a minimum of five years' aggregate service in those grades by 1st July, 1971, are eligible to take the examination. Retired teachers who have been re-engaged are not eligible.
