PROCLAMATION.

Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906 I hereby declare all that area in the Ukamba and Kenya Provinces set forth and described in the Schedule hereto to be an infected area and I hereby prohibit the movement of cattle from one farm in such area to another farm in such area or on to or along any public road, track, or way in such area except with the permission of a Veterinary Officer, Inspector or other Officer in charge of such area.

Schedule.

The area bounded by a line from the Athi River Station along the Athi River to Donyo-Sabuk, thence along the Eastern Boundaries of the settled farms to Fort Hall, thence along the Eastern and South Eastern Boundaries of the Kikuyu Reserve to the Kamiti River, thence along the Kamiti River and the Northern borders of the settled farms to mile post 353 on the Railway, thence along the Railway to mile post 348, thence along the Eastern Boundary of the Forest Reserve to the Southernmost point of the Scottish Mission settlement, thence to Messrs. Peak and Bull's farm, thence along the Southern Boundaries of the settled farms to the Mbagathi River, thence along this river to its junction with the Athi River, thence along the Athi River Station.

NOTE.—Permits for the movement of Cattle can be obtained from either the Chief Veterinary Officer at Nairobi, the District Commissioner Kiambu, and the Provincial and District Commissioners Fort Hall.

Other Issuers of Permits will shortly be appointed and their names will be published in the Press.

Applicants applying for permits in writing should clearly state the number of Cattle they wish to move; the $\mathbb{P}\sqrt{2}$ exact route they wish to follow; the destination; whether the permit is for the single or return journey, and if the latter, the number of days applicant expects to be absent.

Special permits will be issued to Transport riders by the Chief Veterinary Officer.

AN ORDINANCE

Enacted by the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate.

Entebbe, March 10th, 1908. H. HESKETH BELL Governor.

No. 4 of 1908.

Sleeping Sickness Prevention.

IT is hereby enacted as follows:---

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Uganda Sleeping Sickness Mode of citation. 1. Ordinance, 1908."

In this Ordinance and the Rules thereunder "infected place" means Infected place. any district or place or any lake or river or part thereof within the Protectorate which is declared by the Governor to be infected with Sleeping Sickness.

The Governor may by Proclamation declare any district or place or any Governor may 3. lake or river or part thereof within the Protectorate to be an infected place for declare any declare any the purposes of this Ordinance and shall define the limits thereof.

to be an infected place.

The Governor may make Rules for the regulation of intercourse between Governor may 4. places declared to be infected and between places declared to be infected and make Rules. other places, and for the control and regulation of all persons from time to time

within infected places, and may apply all or any of such Rules to any infected place or may make special Rules in regard to any particular infected place and may make Rules generally applicable to persons within or without infected places for the purpose of carrying out this Ordinance in the prevention of Sleeping Sickness.

The power to make Rules shall include a power to fix reasonable fees, Fees, charges and 5. tariffs. charges and tariffs.

The Governor may fix such penalties for the breach or non-observance Penalties. 6. of any Rule as he may think proper, not exceeding imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term of two months or a fine of 1,000 Rupees or both, and when no penalty is imposed by the Rules the breach or non-observance of any Rule shall be punishable to the extent aforesaid, and may provide that any canoe or other vessel in respect of which a breach or non-observance of any Rule has been committed may be confiscated or otherwise dealt with.

RULES.

Sleeping Sickness Ordinance 1908.

Rules made by the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate under the Sleeping Sickness Ordinance 1908

These Rules may be cited as the Sleeping Sickness Rules, 1908.

Mainland : Canoes and other Vessels.

Mode of citation.

1.

Canoes registration and permit. 2. No cance belonging to the mainland shall ply on Victoria Nyanza unless it has been registered and a permit to ply has been obtained. Such permit shall be obtained from a Collector or other Officer appointed to issue the same and shall state the period during which and the purpose for which it is valid and such terms and conditions shall be observed and complied with.

3. A registered canoe shall have its registration number painted on the bows and near the stern in large numerals and the owner shall be given a certificate of registration.

4. Canoes may be registered by the Collector, Entebbe, or Jinja, or by such other Officer as the Governor may appoint. The registering Officer may refuse to register any canoe. Registration shall be annual and after the present year shall be made on the first day of January in each year.

5. The headman in charge of a canoe shall carry with him the registration certificate and permit to ply.

6. No cance or other vessel shall touch the mainland or land passengers or crews, except at landing places duly authorized by the Governor by notice in the *Gazette*, without the consent of the Deputy Commissioner or a Sub-Commissioner. No person from any cance or other vessel shall camp on the mainland, except at such authorized landing places, without the consent of the Deputy Commissioner or a Sub-Commissioner.

7. No cance or other vessel, unless it shall belong to a native of the Sesse Islands and shall be registered there, shall go to the Sesse Islands, without a special permit from the Collector, Entebbe, which permit shall be countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner and shall be carried on the journey by the person in charge of such cance or other vessel.

8. Any person found travelling in any canoe or other vessel in respect of which the preceding Rules so far as applicable have not been complied with or found contravening the preceding Rules may be arrested without Warrant by any Government officer and the canoe or other vessel may be seized. Any canoe or other vessel so seized may be confiscated or otherwise dealt with by order of a competent Court.

9. Rules 2 to 9 shall so far as applicable apply to the whole of the mainland within a distance of two miles of the Victoria Nyanza.

Sesse Islands: Canoes.

Canoes.

10. No canoes shall leave the Sesse Islands group and go to any other island.

Canoes and other vessels and landing places.

Cances or other vessels and the Sesse Islands.

11. No cance shall leave the Sesse Islands and go to the mainland save between authorized landing places. The only authorized landing places for this purpose are the prescribed landing places situate on the islands of Bugala and Lulamba respectively, and at Banga near the Gaol at Entebbe.

12. Every canoe used for travelling as authorized by Rule 11 shall be registered and shall have its registration number painted on the bows and near the stern in large numbers and the owner shall be given a certificate of registration. Applications for the registration of canoes shall be made to the Saza Chief Kweba or in his absence to his principal representative or to such Officer as shall be appointed for that purpose by the Governor.

13. The headman of every canoe travelling as authorized by Rule 11 shall carry with him the certificate of registration of such canoe together with a written permit for the voyage upon which the canoe is bound. Such permit shall be obtained before any voyage is commenced from the said Saza Chief or his representative or Officer as aforesaid and the terms of the permit as to the commencement and completion of the voyage and otherwise shall be complied with.

14. Any person found travelling in any canoe in respect of which the preceding Rules have not been complied with or in contravention of the preceding Rules may be arrested without warrant by any Government officer and the canoe may be seized. Any canoe so seized may be confiscated or otherwise dealt with by order of a competent Court. 15. Rules 10 to 15 shall apply to the Sesse Islands group.

Entry, Residence, and Employment in infected places to which the Rules are applied.

(See Rule 18, at present the two mile zone other than the places specially excepted)

16. No person shall enter into or remain in an infected place except with the permission of a Sub-Commissioner. Any person found in an infected place in contravention of this Rule may be arrested by any Government officer without a warrant.

17. No employer of labour shall employ persons within an infected place nor shall such persons enter an infected place for the purpose of such employment unless the following conditions are complied with :---

(a) The employer shall obtain a permit in writing from the Sub-Commissioner. Such permit shall specify the number of persons who may be so employed, the infected place where they may be employed, and the period during which such permit is to be in force.

(b) The employer shall procure all persons proposed to be employed by him as aforesaid to be certified as free from Sleeping Sickness by a Medical Officer of the Protectorate. Such persons shall be sent for certification accompanied by a responsible headman, together with a list of the names of the persons under him whom the employer wishes to have certified.

(c) A certificate shall be given by the Medical Officer to the employer in respect of those persons who are certified as free from Sleeping sickness. Such certificate shall be in a form to be approved by the Medical Officer and shall state the names of the persons to whom the certificate shall refer and shall contain an identification number in respect of each such person.

(d) Each employee as aforesaid shall receive from his employer an identification tally in the form to be approved by the Medical Officer.

(e) Such tally shall be worn by such employee to whom it is issued while he is in an infected place. It shall not be transferred to or worn by any other person. Any employee found in an infected place without his identification tally shall be deemed to have committed an offence under these rules.

(f) The above-mentioned certificate shall be granted for and be valid during the period of one month only from the date of certification, unless the Governor shall for special reasons otherwise direct.

(g) The fee for examination and certification of each employee shall be paid by the employer, and in the case of employers other than Government shall be one rupee for each employee.

18. Rules 16 to 18 shall apply to the whole of the mainland within a distance of two miles from Victoria Nyanza except the following places, namely :----

The Entebbe peninsula south of a line drawn from the head of Buwaia Bay to the head of Kisubi Bay, and the shore line from the head of Kisubi Bay to a distance of half a mile beyond Luzira Point for the distance of two miles inland.

The township of Jinja.

The landing places from time to time authorized under Rule 6.

Mainroads leading to any of the abovementioned places.

Fish.

19. No person shall fish in Victoria Nyanza within a distance of two miles Fishing. of the mainland. Any person found fishing in contravention of this Rule may be arrested by a Government officer without a warrant.

Purchase of fish-

20. No person shall buy or otherwise receive fresh fish which comes from Purchase of fish. that part of Victoria Nyanza within which fishing is prohibited. Any person found in possession of fresh fish shall be deemed to have committed an offence unless he can show that he had reasonable grounds for believing that the said fish did not come from that part of Victoria Nyanza within which fishing is prohibited as aforesaid.
