NOTICE.

Telegrams Exchanged with Government Telephone Stations.

Certain Government Stations at which there are no Telegraph Offices have been connected by telephone to the Telegraph system of the Protectorate for the convenience of Executive Officers, and applications have been received from members of the public to make use of the communication so afforded for the purposes of sending telegrams. It has therefore become desirable to publish the conditions under which such telegrams can be accepted as follows:—

(i) Telegrams may be accepted for transmission from Government Telephone Stations by permission of the District Commissioner during such hours and on such days as he may prescribe. The District Commissioner will be responsible to the Postmaster General for the due collection of the charges (which will be the ordinary rates) and in any case where the amount to be paid is uncertain, owing to the District Commissioner being unacquainted with the method of counting of words or other cause, he may require the sender to deposit a sufficient sum to cover fully the probable cost of the message, the balance to be returned to the sender on receipt of notification from the Capacial Post Office of the province and the province and the capacial Post Office of the province and the capacian post of the province and the capacian post of the province and the capacity of the capacity of the province and the capacity of the capacity of the province and the capacity of the

from the General Post Office of the precise amount payable.

(ii) Messages may be accepted at telegraph Offices for transmission to Government Telephone stations, but the senders of the messages must take all risks of delay on account of any difficulty experienced in obtaining the attention of the Government Telephone Station in question, also the risk of mutilation of the message through its having to be transmitted over the Telephone. Telegrams cannot be sent out for delivery by messengers from Government Telephone Stations and persons expecting them must apply at the District Commissioner's Office.

Issue of Young Trees and tree Seeds by the Forest Department.

To encourage tree planting, young trees and tree seeds are issued by Government at cost price. The price is the same whatever the quantity taken. Applications for young trees must be accompaned by a remittance in cash or by postal order made payable to the Chief Conservator of Forests, Nairobi. Cheques

cannot be accepted.

The prices for plants include the cost of pots or planting pans. If these are returned they will be paid for in cash or other young trees. Larger plants in separate tins or pots, plants not up to standard size, as well as surplus stock, seed, or plant, will be charged for at special rates which will be furnished upon application at the nurseries. For very remote localities the cost of transport can be reduced by taking out the seedlings and packing them in moss, but there is some risk in so doing. When such seedlings are received they should be pricked out at once into pots or pans. They will then become transplants ready for planting out in three or four months.

Seed. Every precaution is taken to ensure the genuineness and good quality of the seed supplied, but it cannot be guaranteed, particularly as most of it has to be imported. In Eucalypt seed the fertile

and barren seed are supplied mixed; it is often impossible to separate or distinguish them.
