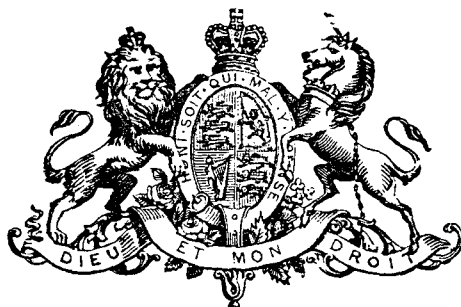

## AN ORDINANCE

No. 6 of 1910.

### An Ordinance to amend the Penal Code Ordinance, 1909.

[ 15th April, 1910. ]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof :—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Penal Code Amendment Ordinance, 1910,” and shall be read as one with “The Penal Code Ordinance, 1909”.

Amendment of Penal Code Ordinance, 1909.

2. Section 3 of the Penal Code Ordinance, 1909, shall be and is hereby amended by the insertion of the words “who in the opinion of the Court is” between the words “person” and “under” in the said Section.

## AN ORDINANCE

No. 7 of 1910.

### An Ordinance to prevent the Introduction and spread of insect pests and Diseases of plants.

[ 15th April, 1910. ]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof :—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Diseases of Plants Prevention Ordinance, 1910”.

Power to make regulations for prevention of Disease amongst plants and for other purposes

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make, alter or repeal regulations for all or any of the following purposes :—

- (a) for regulating the importation into the Protectorate of any plant affected or liable to be affected with insect pest or plant disease;
- (b) for preventing the introduction or spread of any insect pest or plant diseases to which plants are liable;
- (c) for the licensing and inspection of nurseries or other places in which plants are reared for purposes of sale or other method of disposal;
- (d) for the charging of fees in respect of any licences issued or inspections or treatment carried out by or under regulations under this Ordinance;

Provided that no penalty shall be imposed by any such regulation as aforesaid exceeding a fine of one thousand Rupees or in default of payment of the same imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months.

Interpretation.

3. In this Ordinance the term “plants” includes growing trees, plants or portions thereof, such as cuttings, buds, roots, tubers, bulbs, seeds, fruit, and vegetables.

4. The enactments set forth in the Schedule hereto are hereby repealed. Repeal. Provided that until other provision is made on that behalf, the provisions of the said enactments and all rules, Proclamations, Orders and appointments thereunder in force at the commencement of this Ordinance shall have the effect of Regulations under this Ordinance.

## AN ORDINANCE.

### No. 8 of 1910.

## The Export of Maize Ordinance, 1910.

[ 29th April, 1910. ]

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the examination by the Preamble. Agricultural Department of Maize intended for export and for regulating the export of Maize found to be in a weevily condition or considered to be insufficiently dried.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ The Export of Maize Ordinance, 1910 ” Short Title. and shall come into force on such date as the Governor by notice in the “ Official Gazette ” shall appoint.

2. In this Ordinance the following words shall have the meanings herein- Interpretation. after attached to them :—

“ Director of Agriculture, ” shall include any person in the Agricultural Department who may be authorised by the Director of Agriculture to exercise any of the powers or authorities conferred upon the Director of Agriculture by this Ordinance.

“ Prescribed Port ” shall mean the ports of Mombasa and Kilindini and any port which the Governor may, from time to time, by notice in the “ Official Gazette, ” declare to be included in the said term.

3. No Maize shall be exported in any Steamship from any prescribed port unless and until it shall have been examined by the Director of Agriculture and sanctioned for such exportation shall have been given by him.

4. All Maize intended for export as aforesaid shall be produced for examination by the intending exporter at such place in or near the Customs premises at the port of export, and at such time as the Director of Agriculture may determine. Maize to be produced for examination at port of export.

5. If upon the examination of any Maize under this Ordinance, the Director of Agriculture shall find such Maize to be free of weevils and sufficiently dried he shall sanction the exportation thereof and shall notify such sanction by causing each bag or parcel containing such Maize to be stamped with such mark or marks as he may determine. Director of Agriculture's sanction to be notified by marking the bags or parcels.

Sanction not to be given if maize in a weevily condition or insufficiently dried.

Removal and examination of maize to be at the expense of the exporter.

Exporting maize prohibited to be exported.

Penalty.

6. If upon the examination of any Maize under this Ordinance the Director of Agriculture shall find such Maize to be in a weevily condition or insufficiently dried he shall withhold his sanction to the exportation thereof until such time as the weevils therein shall be destroyed to his satisfaction or the Maize shall have been sufficiently dried, as the case may be.

7. The carrying and bringing of any Maize to the proper place of examination, and the removal of any Maize from the place of examination shall be performed by or at the expense of the exporter.

8. Any person who shall export from a prescribed port in any Steamship any Maize the exportation of which has not been sanctioned shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding 1,500 Rupees and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months, and any Maize in respect of which such offence shall have been committed shall be forfeited.

## AN ORDINANCE

No. 9 of 1910.

### The Provincial Insolvency Act 1907 Application Ordinance 1910.

[ 29th April, 1910 ]

Preamble.

WHEREAS doubts have arisen as to the application of the Provincial Insolvency Act 1907 to this Protectorate.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof :—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Provincial Insolvency Act 1907 Application Ordinance 1910.”

Application of Act to the Protectorate.

2. (1) The Provincial Insolvency Act 1907 (Act No. III of 1907) passed by the Governor General of India in Council is hereby applied to the Protectorate as and from the First day of January 1908.  
(2) For the purposes of anything done or purported to have been done under or in pursuance of the said Act before the date of this Ordinance the said Act shall be deemed to have been applied to the Protectorate as and from the aforesaid First day of January 1908.

Modifications in application.

3. In the application of the said Act the following modifications shall be made that is to say :—

- (1) The “Protectorate” shall be substituted for “British India”.
- (2) The powers of the Local Government and the Governor General in Council shall be exercised by the Governor.
- (3) The “High Court” shall be substituted for the ‘District Court’ and ‘District Courts’.
- (4) The proviso to Sub-section (1) of Section 46 shall be deemed to be deleted.
- (5) In Section 46 Sub-sections (2), (3) and (4) “His Majesty’s Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa” shall be substituted for “the High Court”.
- (6) In Sub-section (2) of Section 47 the “High Courts” shall be deemed to be deleted.

As to certain things done under Chapter 20 of the Indian Civil Procedure Code before public notification of the repeal of the same in the Protectorate.

4. WHEREAS Chapter 20 of the Indian Civil Procedure Code was repealed by the aforesaid Act AND WHEREAS public notification of such repeal was not made in the Protectorate until the month of April 1908, AND WHEREAS certain matters and things were done in, and certain orders, decrees and judgments were made or given by, some of the Courts of the Protectorate in ignorance of such repeal AND WHEREAS it is proper that under the circumstances aforesaid such matters, things, orders, decrees and

judgments should be legalized. It is hereby enacted that any matter or thing done or any order, decree or judgment made or given under and in pursuance of Chapter 20 of the Indian Civil Procedure Code between the thirty first day of December 1907, and the first day of May 1908, and not reversed or set aside before the date of this Ordinance shall be deemed to have been lawfully done, made or given anything in this Ordinance or in any Order-in-Council under or by virtue of which the aforesaid Act shall have been applied to this Protectorate, to the contrary notwithstanding.

## AN ORDINANCE

No. 10 of 1910.

### An Ordinance for the Regulation of Banks Established or to be Established in the East Africa Protectorate.

[29th April, 1910.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

#### PART I.

##### General.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Bank Ordinance 1910,” and shall have effect from the date of the publication of the Ordinance. Short title.  
Commencement.

2. In this Ordinance when not inconsistent with the context:—

The words “The Protectorate” shall mean the East Africa Protectorate. Interpretation  
of terms.

The word “Bank” means any company, whether registered in the Protectorate or British or Foreign engaged in the business of banking within the Protectorate.

The words “British Bank” mean any company, duly constituted in Great Britain or Ireland in accordance with the laws for the time being in force therein relating to the formation of companies, engaged in the business of banking within the Protectorate.

The word “Agent” means an agent for the bank duly appointed under Section 7.

The words “Registrar of Companies” shall mean the Registrar of Companies in and for the Protectorate.

The words “Bank Notes” shall mean any bill, draft or note issued by any bank for the payment of money to the bearer on demand, or entitling or being intended to entitle the holder without endorsement, or without any further endorsements than may exist thereon at the time of issue, to the payment of any sum of money on demand whether the same shall be so expressed or not.

3. Every bank not already carrying on business in the Protectorate, shall before commencing business in the Protectorate and every bank already carrying on business in the Protectorate shall within three months after the commencement of this Ordinance transmit to the Governor two true copies of the deed of settlement, registered memorandum of association and articles of association, or other instruments constituting or regulating the bank and a document giving the names of the chairman and directors of the bank and full particulars with regard to its capital, each copy and document to be signed and certified:—

(1) If the Head Office be within the Protectorate by two directors.

(2) If the Head Office be outside the Protectorate by the Agent of the bank in the Protectorate.

Alteration in deed of settlement, &c., to be notified to the Governor.

4. Every bank having its Head Office within the Protectorate shall, within fourteen days, and every bank having its Head Office out of the Protectorate shall, within sixty days, after the date of any alteration or amendment of the deed of settlement, registered memorandum of association, articles of association or other instrument constituting or regulating the bank, or after the date of any increase or diminution of its nominal capital, transmit and lodge as aforesaid two copies of such alteration or amendment, or two documents setting forth the particulars of each increase or diminution signed and certified as in the last section provided.

Copies to be filed at the Office of the Registrar of Companies.

5. A copy of every instrument or document transmitted under sections 3 and 4 shall be filed at the Office of the Registrar of Companies, and shall be open to inspection, and copies thereof may be obtained in the manner and on payment of the fees prescribed for the inspection and copies of similar documents relating to Companies registered in the Protectorate.

Penalty for failure to comply with the provisions of sections 3 and 4.

6. Every bank which shall fail to comply with any of the provisions of the Third and Fourth sections of this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding 1,500 Rupees for each day during which it shall so make default.

Power of attorney appointing agent in the Protectorate shall be lodged with the Governor by bank having Head Office out of the Protectorate.

7. Every bank having its Head Office outside the Protectorate shall, before commencing business therein, lodge with the Governor a Power of Attorney appointing an agent in the Protectorate for the purpose hereinafter mentioned; such Power of Attorney shall be executed and authenticated in accordance with the law of the country where the Head Office of the said bank is situated and shall:—

Particulars to be contained in Power of Attorney.

- (a) State the address in the Protectorate of the agent;
- (b) Expressly authorise the agent so appointed to accept service of process in all suits and proceedings against the bank in the Protectorate and to accept all legal notices which the Governor or any Officer of the Government may desire to serve upon the said bank.
- (c) Declare that service of such process or such notices upon the agent so appointed shall be legal and binding and be good service upon the bank in all respects.

Proviso.

Provided that any Bank such as in this section referred to which is carrying on business in the Protectorate at the commencement of this Ordinance shall lodge the power of attorney aforesaid within three months after the commencement of this Ordinance.

And Provided further that in the event of any Bank having two or more branch offices or places of business in the Protectorate and having at each such branch office or place of business a Manager or Agent duly authorised by Power of Attorney on that behalf to accept service of process in all suits and proceedings against the Bank in relation to the business of the Bank at such branch office or place of business it shall be lawful for the Agent appointed for the purposes of this Section to refuse to accept service of any process in any suit or proceeding relating solely to any matter arising out of the business of the Bank at some branch office or place of business in the Protectorate at which he does not manage or transact the business of the Bank and at which the Agent or Manager is duly authorised as aforesaid to accept the service of such process, and in such case if service of the process is accepted by such other Agent or Manager then notwithstanding anything in the Power of Attorney given in pursuance of this Section contained, service on the Agent appointed for the purposes of this Section shall not be deemed to be good service upon the Bank.

8. Whenever any such bank as aforesaid shall change its agent or the address of its agent in the Protectorate, it shall file a fresh Power of Attorney as hereinbefore mentioned, containing any such change or changes and containing a similar declaration as to the service of process and notices to that in the last section mentioned, and every such bank shall at the time of making the yearly return required by section 15 or at the time of forwarding the statement required to be forwarded by Section 32 of this Ordinance, as the case may be, declare that no change has been made in the chief agent and chief agency without such change having been duly notified.

Fresh Power to be filed on change of agent or agency.

9. Any bank that shall make default in complying with the terms of the preceding two sections shall incur a penalty of not exceeding 1,500 Rupees for each day during which such default shall continue.

Penalty for not complying with preceding sections.

10. No bank shall issue or cause to be issued any bank notes within the Protectorate;

The issue of bank notes prohibited.

Any bank which shall issue or cause to be issued within the Protectorate any bank note shall be liable to a penalty of 150 Rupees for each note issued.

Penalty.

11. Every bank holding deposits or trust monies from the public shall not later than the end of the month of February in each year publish in the "Official Gazette" a detailed statement of all monies within the Protectorate in its hands or in the hands of any of its branches or agents as at the 31st December last past; whether dividends on shares, or debentures of such bank, amounts to credit of depositors in trust or otherwise, or other monies not the property of such bank and on which no valid lien exist and which monies shall at the date of publication have remained unclaimed by the respective owners thereof for the period of ten years or more and such statement shall, so far as practicable, set forth the full names and last known addresses of such owners; provided, however, that nothing in this section contained shall be held to apply to any such dividends deposits or other monies of an amount not exceeding 150 Rupees.

Statement of unclaimed trust monies.

Any bank that shall make default in complying with the terms of this Section shall incur a penalty not exceeding 1,500 Rupees.

12. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to exempt any Company registered in the Protectorate from any of the provisions of the law relating to the incorporation, regulation or winding up of such companies.

Company registered in the Protectorate not to be exempt from the law relating to the incorporation, &c., of such Company.

13. All penalties mentioned in this Ordinance may be recovered at the suit of the Governor in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Recovery of Penalties.

## PART. II.

### Provision Relating to Banks Other than British Banks.

14. The Provisions of Part II of this Ordinance shall not apply to British Banks.

British Banks exempt from the provisions of this Part.

15. Every bank having its Head Office within the Protectorate shall within 30 days after the 31st of December in each year, and every bank having its Head Office outside the Protectorate shall, within sixty days after the said date file at the office of the Registrar of Companies a list of shareholders and of its chairman and directors on the 31st December, preceding.

Return of shareholders, chairman and directors to be made annually to Registrar of Companies.

Such list shall also state the names, addresses and occupations of all the members appearing therein and the number of shares held by each of them and shall contain a summary specifying the following particulars:—

Particulars required to be forwarded in such returns.

- (1) The amount of the capital of the bank and the number of shares into which it is divided.
- (2) The number of shares issued.
- (3) The total amount paid for each share.
- (4) The names and last known addresses and occupations of the persons who ceased to be members since the last list was made, and the number of shares formerly held by each of them.

The above list shall be signed by two directors if the chief office be within the Protectorate, and by the agent if the Head Office be without the Protectorate, and any bank making default in complying with the provisions of this section by not forwarding such list and summary, shall incur a penalty of not exceeding 150 Rupees for each day during which such default shall continue.

Copy of register of shareholders to be kept by every bank.

16. Every bank shall keep, at the Head Office or with its agent, in the Protectorate, a copy of the register of the shareholders of such bank containing the following particulars :—

- (1) The name address and occupation of every shareholder together with the shares held by him.
- (2) The date at which the name of any person was entered in the register.
- (3) The date at which any person ceased to be a shareholder ;

Penalty if register not kept.

Any bank acting in contravention of this section shall incur a penalty of not exceeding 75 Rupees for every day during which such default continues, and every director, manager or agent who shall knowingly and willingly permit such contravention shall incur a like penalty.

Inspection of register of shareholders.

17. The register of shareholders shall be open to the inspection of any shareholder of the bank, gratis, and to the inspection of any other person on the payment of one Rupee, during business hours on every day on which such bank shall be open for the transaction of business, and every shareholder or other person may require a copy of such register or any part thereof, or of such list or summary of members as is hereinbefore mentioned, on payment of fifty cents for every hundred words required to be copied, and if such inspection or copy be refused the bank shall incur for such refusal a penalty not exceeding 30 Rupees for every day during which such refusal continues, and in addition to the above penalty any Judge of the High Court sitting in chambers may, by order, compel the bank to allow the immediate inspection of the register.

Penalty for refusing inspection.

Half yearly statement of assets and liabilities to be published.

18. Every bank shall publish in manner hereinafter provided a half yearly statement of its assets and liabilities at the close of business on the 30th of June, and the 31st of December, in each year ; every such statement shall be in the form in the Schedule to this Ordinance.

Mode of publication of statement

19. Every such Statement shall be published in the "Official Gazette" within 60 days after the day to which such statement relates and shall be transmitted to the Governor within the said period and shall also be posted in some conspicuous place in the office of every branch of the bank within the Protectorate.

Provided that the Governor may, in the case of a bank having its Head Office or branches out of the Protectorate extend the time within which such statement shall be published and transmitted by such bank to such time as may be reasonably necessary to enable such bank to comply with the provisions of this and the preceding sections.

Statement by whom to be signed.

20. Every such statement shall be signed as follows :—

- (a) In the case of a bank having its Head Office within the Protectorate, by any two directors and by the accountant.
- (b) In the case of a bank having its Head Office outside the Protectorate, by the agent.

Bank having Head Office outside the Protectorate to publish in "Gazette" and transmit to the Governor a copy of statement submitted to shareholders.

21. Every bank carrying on business in the Protectorate and not registered as a Company in the Protectorate shall publish in the "Official Gazette," and transmit to the Governor within 40 days after the presentation thereof a copy of the annual or half yearly statement of its affairs submitted to the shareholders of such bank, and such statement shall specify the dividend declared and the amount carried forward (if any), every copy of such statement shall be certified by the agent of the Bank in the Protectorate, who shall be responsible for its correctness as a copy.

Penalty for failure to publish or transmit statements.

22. Every bank which shall fail to publish or to transmit the statements required in the preceding sections, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding 750 Rupees, for every day during which it may be in default after the day fixed for the publication or transmission of the same, and any director, agent, or other officer of any bank who shall sign any statement as aforesaid, containing any item which such director, agent or other officer knows to be false and erroneous, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to imprisonment of either kind for any period not exceeding ten years or to a fine not exceeding 15,000 Rupees or to both such imprisonment and fine, and any director, agent, or other officer who shall sign

any statement as aforesaid containing any item which is false and erroneous and which he ought to know to be false and erroneous, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to imprisonment of either kind for any period not exceeding two years or to a fine not exceeding 7,500 Rupees or to both such imprisonment and fine.

23. The Governor shall have power to appoint one or more competent Inspectors to examine into the affairs of any bank, on the application of shareholders holding not less than one fourth of the total number of shares in such bank for the time being issued, or on the application of depositors holding deposits of the value of not less than one half of the gross value of the total deposits within the Protectorate shown in the last half yearly statement of such bank.

The Governor may appoint inspectors on application of shareholders or depositors.

24. The application should be supported by such evidence as the Governor may require for the purpose of showing that the applicants have good reason for requiring such investigation, and that they are not actuated by malicious motives in instituting the same. The Governor may also require the applicants to give security for the payment of the costs of any enquiry before appointing any Inspector or Inspectors.

Good grounds must be shown for application.

Security for cost may be required.

25. It shall be the duty of all officers and agents of the bank to produce, for the examination of the Inspectors, all books and documents in their custody and power. Any Inspector may examine the officers and agents of the bank in relation to its business, and if any officer or agent refuses to produce any book or document hereby directed to be produced or to answer any question relating to the affairs of the bank, he shall incur a penalty not exceeding 750 Rupees in respect of each offence.

Duties and powers of Inspectors.

26. Upon the conclusion of the examination the Inspectors shall report their opinion to the Governor who shall forward a copy thereof to the Chief Office of the bank, and shall, at the request of the members upon whose application the inspection was made, deliver to them or to any one of them a copy of the report. All expenses of and incidental to any examination as aforesaid shall be defrayed by the persons upon whose application Inspectors were appointed, unless the Governor shall direct the same should be paid out of the assets of the bank which he is hereby authorised to do.

Inspectors shall report to the Governor.

Expenses how to be borne.

27. Every bank registered as a Company in the Protectorate shall appoint annually by nomination or election two persons subject to the approval of the Governor in respect to their competency, who shall act as auditors, whose duties shall be to make a report twice a year to the shareholders of such bank upon the balance sheet and accounts and in every such report they shall state after careful examination of accounts, vouchers and securities, whether in their opinion the balance sheet is a full and fair balance sheet and properly drawn up, whether it exhibits a true and correct statement of the bank's affairs, and in case the auditors shall have called for explanation or information from directors or officers of the bank, whether they have been satisfactory, and such report shall be read together with the report of the directors at the ordinary meeting of the shareholders and a copy of such report shall be sent to the Governor and also be published in the "Official Gazette" within 15 days after the same has been submitted to the meeting of the shareholders; provided that in case such bank shall fail or neglect to appoint such auditors or shall appoint only one such auditor it shall be lawful for the Governor, and he is hereby required to appoint such auditor or auditors according as the bank has appointed one auditor or none; provided further that the remuneration of such auditors shall be paid by the bank, and in the case of an auditor or auditors appointed by the Governor under the provisions of this section shall be fixed by the Governor.

Appointment and duties of Auditors.

28. Every auditor shall be eligible for re-election and in case any vacancy or vacancies occur in the office of auditor, whether by reason of the expiration of the period of service of any auditor or auditors or by any other reason, such vacancy or vacancies shall forthwith be filled by the bank; with the approval of the Governor or, if the bank shall fail to do so, by the Governor.

Re-election of auditors.

29. No person having any interest in any bank otherwise than as shareholder and no officer of any bank shall be eligible for appointment as an auditor for such bank and any person appointed as auditor to any bank who shall after such appointment acquire such interest or become an officer of such bank shall *ipso facto* cease to be such auditor.

Persons not eligible as auditors.

Information to be supplied to auditors.

30. Every auditor shall have delivered to him on his appointment as auditor a list of all books kept by the bank to which he is appointed, and shall at all times have access to the books and accounts of such bank, and any bank which, or the manager, or any director, of which shall fail to deliver such list or refuse to allow such access shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 150 Rupees for every day during which such failure shall continue.

Governor may appoint Inspectors should bank suspend payment or forfeit penalty prescribed by section 22.

31. In the event of any bank suspending payment or in the event of any bank being by the judgment of any competent Court sentenced to pay the penalty prescribed by section 22 of this Ordinance then it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint one or more competent Inspectors to examine into the affairs of such bank and every Inspector so appointed shall have all the powers conferred upon the Inspectors under section 25 of this Ordinance and all officers and agents of the bank shall be liable to the duties and subject to the penalties prescribed in the said section, and all the expenses of and incidental to such examination shall be paid out of the assets of the bank.

### PART III.

#### Provisions Applicable to British Banks.

Statement to be sent by British Bank.

32. Every British Bank, being a limited banking company, shall forthwith forward or cause to be forwarded to the Governor two copies of every statement which such bank shall make in compliance with the requirements to section 108 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act 1903 (8 Edw. 7 C. 69.)

List and summary to be sent by British Bank.

33. Every British Bank, being a company under the aforesaid Companies (Consolidation) Act 1908, and having a Share Capital shall forthwith forward or cause to be forwarded to the Governor two copies of every list and summary which such bank shall make in compliance with Section 26 of the aforesaid Companies (Consolidation) Act. 1908.

Penalty.

34. If any British Bank makes default in forwarding any copy of any statement or of any list or summary required to be forwarded under either of the two preceding sections, such delinquent bank shall incur a penalty not exceeding seventy five Rupees for every day during which such default continues.

Copies to be filed at Office of the Registrar of Companies.

35. One copy of every such statement, list and summary received by the Governor shall be filed at the office of the Registrar of Companies, and may there be inspected and copies thereof may be obtained in the manner and on payment of the fees prescribed for the inspection and copies of similar documents relating to Companies registered in the Protectorate.

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**AN ORDINANCE**

**No. 11 of 1910.**

**An Ordinance to Amend the Land Titles Ordinance 1908.**

[ 30th April, 1910 ]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Land Titles Amendment Ordinance 1910” and shall be read as one with the Land Titles Ordinance 1908 hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance. Short Title.

**PART I.**

2. The Principal Ordinance shall be and is hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) By omitting in Section 4 of the said Ordinance the words “who shall be a Barrister or Solicitor of not less than five years standing.” Amendments in Land Titles Ordinance 1908.
- (2) By substituting the word “six” for the word “twelve” in Subsection (1) of Section 15 of the said Ordinance.
- (3) By substituting the word “six” for the word “twelve” in Subsection (1) of Section 20 of the said Ordinance.
- (4) By substituting the word “six” for the word “twelve” in Section 37 of the said Ordinance.

Provided, however, that the foregoing amendments (2) (3) and (4) shall not apply in the case of any District area or place to which the Principal Ordinance shall have been applied before the commencement of this Ordinance and in such case the Principal Ordinance shall be read and interpreted as if such amendments had not been made.

Where claimant has surrendered to the Government the immovable property claimed for other immovable property to be granted by the Government the Recorder may grant certificate for such last mentioned property.

When certificate may be granted notwithstanding that a claim has not been made in the manner or within the time prescribed.

3. Whenever the Recorder of Titles shall, in the course of dealing with any claim or claims under the Principal Ordinance, be satisfied that any person who shall have made a claim for a certificate of ownership under the said Ordinance has agreed with the Government to surrender to the Government his rights and interests in or over the immovable property claimed in consideration of the Government granting to him a certificate of ownership in respect of other immovable property in the district area or place to which the said Ordinance shall have been applied, he may issue to such person a certificate of ownership in respect of such area of Crown land as the Government shall have agreed to grant to him and he shall have agreed to accept. In every such case as aforesaid the Recorder of Titles shall record in the file relating to the claim made by the claimant the fact that he has surrendered to the Government all his rights and interest in and over the immovable property claimed and that the certificate granted has been granted in consideration of such surrender. Such record shall for all purposes, be conclusive evidence of the facts therein set forth.

4. If the Recorder of Titles shall, in the course of dealing with any claim or claims under the Principal Ordinance, be satisfied that any person has any interest in any Crown land subject to the Ordinance but is prevented from asserting such claim by reason only that he has not made a claim in respect thereof in the manner or within the time specified by the said Ordinance the Recorder of Titles may, with the consent of the Governor or of such officer as the Governor may appoint on that behalf, grant to such person such certificate as the Recorder of Titles may be satisfied that he would have been entitled to had he made a claim under and in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinance.

## PART II.

### Registration of Documents Affecting Holdings in Respect of which a Certificate of Ownership shall have been granted.

Application of this Part.

5. This Part shall apply to all holdings in respect of which a certificate of ownership shall have been issued by the Recorder of Titles.

Definition of the term "holding."

6. For the purposes of this part

- (1) Each parcel of land the subject of a certificate of ownership shall be deemed to be a separate holding; and
- (2) The term "holding" shall include the land and the cocoanut trees, houses and buildings for the time being on the land.

Governor may appoint Principal Registrar.

7. (1) The Governor may, from time to time, appoint by notification in the "Official Gazette" such person as he may think fit to be the Principal Registrar for the purposes of this Part.

Governor may appoint Registrars for the purposes of this Part.

(2) It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, to appoint by notification in the "Official Gazette" such person or persons as he may think fit to perform the duties of the "Registrar" under this Part and in like manner to define the area or areas in respect of which such person or persons shall perform such duties.

Registrars to have custody of Register Book.

(3) A Registrar appointed under the preceding Sub-section shall have, for and on behalf of the Recorder of Titles, the custody of the "Register Book," provided for by Section 26 of the Principal Ordinance, relating to the area in respect of which he shall have been so appointed.

Registration of documents affecting immovable property in respect of which a certificate of ownership shall have been given.

8. After the issue of a certificate of ownership under this Ordinance or the Principal Ordinance every document affecting any holding or any interest in any holding may, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, be registered in the "Register Book."

Effect of non-registration.

9. Every document, unless so registered, shall be deemed void against all parties claiming an adverse interest thereto on valuable consideration by virtue of any subsequent document which shall have been duly registered as aforesaid. Provided that:—

- (1) Fraud or collusion in obtaining such last mentioned document, or in securing such prior registration, shall defeat the priority of the person claiming thereunder;
- (2) Priority shall not be lost merely in consequence of the person claiming under the registration having been affected with actual or constructive notice of the document first executed, except in case of actual fraud; and

- (3) Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to give any greater effect or different construction to any document registered in pursuance thereof, save the priority hereby conferred on it.
- (4) Such priority shall not be affected by the subsequent registration of any document executed before the document first registered.
- (5) Nothing in this Section shall apply to :—
  - (a) any composition deed.
  - (b) any document relating to shares in a joint stock company, notwithstanding that the assets of such company consists in whole or in part of immovable property subject to this Part; or
  - (c) any debenture issued by such company, and not creating, declaring, assigning, limiting or extinguishing any right, title, or interest to or in immovable property subject to this Part, except in so far as it entitles the holder to the security afforded by a registered instrument, whereby the company has mortgaged, conveyed, or otherwise transferred the whole or part of its immovable property, or any interest therein, to trustees upon trust for the benefit of the holders of such debentures; or
  - (d) any endorsement upon or transfer of any debenture issued by any such company.
  - (e) any document not itself creating, declaring, assigning, limiting or extinguishing any right, title, or interest to or in immovable property subject to this Part, but merely creating a right to obtain another document, which will, when executed, create, declare, assign, limit, or extinguish any such right, title or interest.

10. No lien, charge or, mortgage (other than such as may arise or be created in favour of the Crown or the Government under or by virtue of any Ordinance or other enactment) shall be created or affected so as to be of any legal validity upon or in respect of a holding or interest therein, unless the same be created or affected by a last will, of which probate is registered under this Ordinance, or by the order of a competent Court, or by a duly executed instrument, such order or instrument being duly registered under this Part. No lien etc., to be created except by registered document.

Provided, however, nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the provisions of "The Equitable Mortgages Ordinance 1909" or the lien of any Solicitor or Pleader in respect of taxable costs, charges or expenses incurred by him in connection with the holding or any interest therein. Proviso.

11. (1) It shall be lawful for the party gaining an interest or benefit under any document registrable under this Ordinance, personally or by his agent, to produce or send the same, or a duplicate, or authenticated copy thereof to the Registrar of the area in which the immovable property thereby affected is situate. Production of documents for Registration.
- (2) Such Registrar shall forthwith, upon receipt of the document with the proper fee for registration, enter the document consecutively according to the order of its receipt in a book to be kept substantially in the Form A hereto, and which shall be called "The Day Book" and he shall thereafter, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, register the deed on the appointed page of the "Register Book".
- (3) Upon such registration the deed shall, save as hereinafter provided, be deemed to have been registered at the time of its entering in the "Day Book".

12. It shall be the duty of any Court in which a judgment decree or order has been pronounced granted or made relating to or affecting any immovable property subject to this Part or any right, title or interest therein to transmit a copy thereof to the Registrar for the purposes of registration along with any map or plan which may have been put in evidence and referred to in such judgment decree or order. Provided, however, such judgment, decree or order shall not be registered unless and until the prescribed fee shall have been paid by the persons in whose favour such judgment decree or order shall have been pronounced granted or made. Registration of judgment decrees and orders of a Court.

Registration of  
Probates and letters  
of Administration.

13. (1) On the death of any person possessed of or entitled to any immovable property or interest therein subject to this Part every person to whom probate of a will or letters of Administration shall have been granted, and every Wasi or Court administering an estate of a deceased native, shall:—
- (a) Forthwith apply to the Registrar for the registration of the will or letters of Administration or of the order of the Court appointing the Wasi or declaring that the estate shall be administered by the Court.
- (b) Transmit to the Registrar for registration a document in which shall be set forth the names of the person or persons on whom the immovable property subject to this Part, of the estate of the Testator or Intestate shall have devolved together with a sufficient description, for the purposes of identification, of such immovable property and a statement as to the estate or interest therein of each such person.

Registrar may call  
for proof and give  
notice to third  
parties.

- (2) Any person who shall fail to comply with the requirements of the preceding Sub-section shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding three hundred Rupees. Provided, however, that no proceedings under this Sub-section shall be taken except on an information or complaint laid by the Principal Registrar.
14. (1) Every Registrar shall be entitled, if he sees fit so to do, to require any person applying for the registration of any document to prove its due execution, the identity of the immovable property affected by the deed or of the parties to it, and in case of an authenticated copy, other than the copy of a judgment decree or order of a Court, the loss or destruction of the original. And where he may have reason to apprehend that a fraud has been or is about to be committed on any person, he shall give notice to such person of the intended registration in order to prevent the same being effected to his prejudice.
- (2) If the Registrar is satisfied upon enquiry that the document was duly made and, in the case of an authenticated copy, of the loss or destruction of the original, and as to the identity of the immovable property or the parties, and that there is no reason to believe that a fraud has been or is about to be committed, he shall register the document, and the registration shall take effect from the time of the entry in the "Day Book".
- (3) If he is not satisfied he shall refuse to register the document, and shall return the same unregistered, together with a statement of his reasons in writing and shall record his refusal in the "Day Book".

15. (1) A document other than a judgment decree or order of a Court, to which there is attached a map or plan which is not signed by a Government or Licensed Surveyor shall not be accepted for registration.

Registrar may  
require a plan to be  
attached to a  
document presented  
for registration.

- (2) Whenever the Registrar shall consider that in regard to any document presented for registration a description of the boundaries of any land, sufficiently clear and accurate to prevent confusion cannot be obtained unless a plan is attached to the document he may refuse to register the document until a plan of the land the subject of the document signed by a Government or Licensed Surveyor is attached to the document and presented for registration therewith.

Provided, however, in the case of such refusal if the document is presented for registration together with a plan to the satisfaction of the Registrar within such time as the Registrar shall consider reasonable under the circumstances of the case the registration of the document shall take effect as from the time when it was first presented for registration.

"And provided further an appeal shall lie against an order made by a Registrar under this Sub-section to the Principal Registrar, and the Principal Registrar may reverse or alter such order; and if the order of the Principal Registrar directs the document to be registered, the Registrar shall obey the same; but if the Principal Registrar confirms the order of the Registrar his decision thereon shall be final."

16. (1) Every document or copy thereof produced for registration shall contain embodied therein, or in a Schedule annexed thereto, an accurate and clear description of the property affected thereby, its boundaries, extent and situation, and a reference to the volume and folium of the Register Book in which such property has been previously registered. Mode of description of lands in documents.
- (2) If such property consists of a divided portion of land, the property of the person alienating the same or any interest therein, such portion shall be clearly and accurately defined by its particular boundaries and extent.
- (3) If such property consists of an undivided share in immovable property, the proportion which the same bears to the entire property shall be stated, and a description of such property shall be given as required by Sub-section (1).
17. No document which does not state the particulars required by the preceding section shall be admitted to registration except with the sanction of the Principal Registrar, upon the necessary particulars being supplied by affidavit by the person producing the document for registration, and on such other terms as the Principal Registrar may think expedient. Treatment of documents executed in violation of preceding Section.
18. (1) An Appeal shall lie against an order refusing to register any document from the Registrar to the Principal Registrar, and the Principal Registrar may reverse or alter such order. Appeal from order refusing Registration.
- (2) Any person dissatisfied with the decision of the Principal Registrar on such appeal may, except as otherwise provided in Sub-section (2) of Section 15 of this Ordinance, appeal against the same to the High Court within thirty days from the decision being communicated to him. The Registrar shall, in terms of the decision of the Principal Registrar or in case of an appeal being taken, of the High Court in appeal, register or refuse to register the same.
19. (1) If the registration of the document be ordered by the Principal Registrar or the High Court to be made on condition of payment of a fee for registration or other terms, then upon the compliance of the person seeking registration with such condition or terms the Registrar shall register such document in the Register Book, and the same shall be deemed to have been registered on the date of such compliance. Registration ordered conditionally should take effect from time of compliance with condition.
- (2) If the Principal Registrar or the High Court in appeal shall decide that the document should have been registered when originally tendered to the Registrar, the document shall, upon registration, be deemed to have been registered at the time of its entry in the Day Book.
20. If any document presented for registration is not written in English, Arabic, or Kiswahili, or such other language as may, from time to time, be prescribed, either generally or locally, the Registrar shall refuse to register the same unless it is accompanied by a true translation in English, certified to the satisfaction of the Registrar. As to documents not written in specific language.
21. (1) It shall be competent to any person to lodge with the Registrar a caveat substantially in the Form **B** in the Schedule hereto to prevent the registration of any deed or other instrument affecting any immovable property subject to this Ordinance, and such caveat shall state a postal address within the Protectorate of the person lodging the same, and upon payment of the prescribed fee shall be registered in the "Register Book". Caveat against Registration of Document.
- (2) On such caveat being registered the party lodging the same shall be entitled to notice of any application for registration as regards such immovable property, which notice shall be deemed to have been duly given if posted to the address stated in the caveat.
- (3) Where the caveat limits the time of its operation it shall cease to have any force upon the lapse of such time.
- (4) No caveat shall be sufficient to prevent a registration applied for unless it be followed up within thirty days after the posting of the notice of application for such registration by an action before some competent Court and notice thereof to the Registrar, in which case the Registrar shall suspend the registration until the final adjudication of such action, and shall then give effect to such adjudication.

Fee and stamp duty to be paid before registration.

Registered Document to be copied into Register Book.

Document when registered to be endorsed by Registrar.

Documents affecting holdings lying in areas of two or more Registrars.  
Power of Registrar to hold enquiry.

Appeals to High Court.

Registrar not to be liable for anything done in good faith.

Register to be open to inspection.

Fees chargeable.

Power to make rules.

The Registration Regulations 1901 and the Registration of Documents Ordinance 1902 not to apply to documents registrable under this Ordinance. Proviso.

22. No document shall be registered unless the fee prescribed has been paid and, if the document is one which is liable to stamp duty under the provisions of the Indian Stamp Act 1879 or other enactment for the time being in force in the Protectorate, the document is duly and sufficiently stamped.

23. Save as may be otherwise prescribed by rule under this Ordinance, the Registrar shall cause a complete copy to be made of every document to be registered, and in the case of a document within Section 20 also of the translation, in such part of the volume of the Register Book as relates to the immovable property affected by such instrument. Every such copy shall bear the number of the volume and folium in which the same is registered and the date of Registration.

Provided, however, whenever any document to be registered affects more holdings than one such document shall be copied into such part of the volume of the Register Book as relates to any one of such holdings, provided that a note referring to the registered instrument shall be made by the Registrar in the part or parts of the volume of the Register Book in which the other holding or holdings have been previously registered.

24. The Registrar shall, immediately after registration, make and sign an endorsement thereof on the document registered, and deliver the same to the person who presented it for registration, or his agent or representative, and the endorsement shall be substantially in the Form C hereto.

25. Documents affecting holdings lying in the areas of two or more Registrars shall be registered in the Office of the Registrar of each such area.

26. For the purposes of enquiries under this Part the Principal Registrar and any Registrar shall have power to cite and examine witnesses upon oath or affirmation and to call for the production of any document material to the enquiry from the person having custody of the document.

27. Every appeal to the High Court under this Part shall be dealt with and disposed of in such manner as the High Court shall, by rules of Court, prescribe.

28. The Principal Registrar, Registrar or a person acting under his orders shall not be liable to any action, suit or proceeding for or in respect of any matter *bona fide* done or omitted to be done under this Ordinance.

29. Subject to such precautionary directions as may be given by the Principal Registrar, and on payment of the prescribed fees the Register Book and Day Book shall, at all times at which the Office of the Registrar is open for the transaction of business, be open to be searched and examined by any applicant and certified copies of any document or extract therefrom or of any entry in the Register Book may be obtained on application to the Registrar.

But no person shall be permitted to copy any document or to make any note or memorandum relating thereto or to any entry, except the registered number and the date of registration.

30. (1) The Governor may, from time to time by order published in the "Official Gazette", specify the fees and charges which shall be levied in respect of any act, matter or thing to be done under this Part or any rule thereunder by or in the office of the Principal Registrar or of a Registrar.

(2) Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall make it obligatory on the Principal Registrar or any Registrar to do any act or permit any act to be done, in respect of which such fee is specified and fixed, except on payment of the fee.

(3) The Principal Registrar may, in special cases and with the consent of the Governor, remit or reduce any of the prescribed fees.

31. The Governor may, from time to time, make, alter or cancel rules for the better carrying out of the purposes of this Part.

32. The East Africa Registration Regulations 1901 and the East Africa Registration of Documents Ordinance 1902 shall not apply to any document registrable under this Ordinance. Provided, however, if any document shall relate both to immovable property which is subject to this Part, and to other immovable property not so subject, such document shall be registered under this Ordinance and, if the document is one the registration whereof is compulsory under the first mentioned Regulations, also under the said Regulations.

## AN ORDINANCE

No. 12 of 1910.

## An Ordinance to provide for the making of Roads in Native Reserves, and for the Maintenance of the same.

[30th April, 1910.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Roads in Native Reserves Short Title. Ordinance 1910”.

2. In this Ordinance “Native Reserve” means any area which by notification in the “Official Gazette” has been declared to be a “Native Reserve”. Interpretation.

3. It shall be lawful for the Governor to order a Chief, Council of Elders, or a Headman to erect and maintain such beacons or mounds as the Governor may direct to mark the boundaries of the area over which the Chief, Council of Elders, or Headman exercises jurisdiction. Governor may require Chiefs, etc., to mark boundaries of their jurisdiction.

4. Any Chief, Council of Elders, or Headman, who having been ordered by the Governor as aforesaid to erect and maintain boundary beacons or mounds shall fail to do so within a period of time specified by the Governor, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding seven hundred and fifty Rupees. Penalty for disobedience to order of Governor.

Such fine shall be recoverable in the Court of the Provincial Commissioner and may be levied by distress, seizure and sale of the property of the Chief, Elders or Headman making default in payment.

5. Whenever an order under Section 3 of this Ordinance shall have been given, or whenever any Chief, Council of Elders or Headman shall have agreed with the Governor to construct or maintain any road or bridge within or abutting upon the area within which such Chief, Council of Elders or Headman exercises jurisdiction, it shall be lawful for any Chief, Council of Elders or Headman to whom such order shall have been given or who shall have entered into such agreement, and the successor or successors of such Chief, Council of Elders or Headman to require all able-bodied men under his or their rule or jurisdiction and residing within the local limits of his or their jurisdiction to work in erecting or maintaining the boundary beacons or mounds or in making or maintaining such road or bridge as aforesaid on such days as he may think necessary not exceeding six days in each quarter. Governor with concurrence of Chiefs may direct that roads be made and kept in repair. Liability of able-bodied person to labour in marking boundaries and on roads.

6. Every person required to work as aforesaid neglecting or refusing to work when called upon by the Chief, Council of Elders or Headman or disobeying lawful orders whilst engaged on such work, shall be liable at the option of the Chief, Council of Elders, or Headman to punishment according to native customary laws, provided that such punishment is not contrary to humanity or natural justice, or on summary conviction before a District or Assistant District Commissioner to a fine not exceeding fifteen Rupees or in default of payment to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding one month. Penalty for refusing to labour.

Provided, however, anything in this Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding no person shall be required to work as aforesaid or shall be liable to punishment for neglecting or refusing to work, as aforesaid, if he can show that he is under an agreement for service outside the Native Reserve and is then in the Native Reserve with the sanction of his employer. Exemption of certain persons to labour.

7. The Governor may, from time to time, make such rules as he may consider expedient for the carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance. Governor may make rules.

## PROCLAMATION.

### The East Africa Outlying Districts Ordinance, 1902.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under the East Africa Outlying Districts Ordinance, 1902, I, Sir EDOUARD PERCY CRANWILL GIROUARD, K.C.M.G., D.S.O., R.E., Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby declare that the area mentioned in the Schedule hereto attached and which is located in the Nyanza Province is excluded from the Native Reserve and Closed Districts as before proclaimed.

### Schedule.

#### Kisumu ( Port Florence ) Township area.

The Township has for Administrative and Sanitary purposes been divided into three areas Vide "Official Gazette" November 15th, 1908. These areas were described as "**A**" Port Florence area; "**B**" a zone approximately 440 yards wide on the outside boundary of "**A**"; and "**C**" the remaining area comprised within the Township limits.

Boundary marks have now been erected defining the limits of the different areas which are as follows :—

**Area A** is bounded by a line marked as follows :

Starting from Pole No. 1 situated at a position on the Lake shore 220 yards North East of the second slaughter house on the Old Kisumu road. Thence in a South Easterly direction 3,100 yards through Poles 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 to Pole 7; thence South Westerly direction for 2,950 yards through Poles 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 to Pole 13. Thence in a Westerly direction for 1,100 yards through Poles 14 and 15 to Pole 16 at the old Limé Kiln pier.

**Area B** is bounded by a line running parallel to that of boundary area **A**. It starts with a Pole No. 34 on the Lake shore at a distance of 320 yards North East of the Pole 1. Thence for 880 yards in a South Easterly direction through Pole No. 31 to Pole 32; thence in a North Easterly direction for 120 yards to Pole 31; thence in a South Easterly direction again for 2,750 yards through Poles 30, 29, 28 and 27 to Pole No. 26; thence for 3,700 yards in a South Westerly direction through Poles numbered 25, 24, 23, 22, 21 and 20 to Pole 19; thence in a Westerly direction through Pole 18 to Pole No. 17 on the Lake shore 440 yards of Pole No. 16.

**Area C** is bounded by a line commencing at Pole No. 26 in area **B** boundary; thence in a North Easterly direction through Poles No. 84, 83, 82, 81, 80 for 1,700 yards to the iron survey pillar No. II. Thence in a Northerly direction through Poles numbered 79, 78, 77 and 76 for 1,400 yards to Pole No. 75. Thence in a North Westerly direction for 6,900 yards through Poles marked 74 to 53 inclusive to Pole No. 52. Thence in a Westerly direction through Poles marked 51, 50, 49, 48, 47, 46 for 2,100 yards to iron survey pillar No. VI. Thence in a Southerly direction through Poles marked 45 to 36 inclusive for 3,000 yards to Pole 35 on the Lake shore.

Rules issued by His Excellency the Governor under the powers conferred on him by section 38 of the Master and Servants Ordinance 1910.

1. The term "Labour Agent" shall mean and include any person who shall himself, or through agents or messengers, in his own name or otherwise procure or attempt to procure, seek for, engage, conduct, take charge of, supply or undertake to supply natives to be employed in work or labour within the East Africa Protectorate; provided that the term "Labour Agent" shall not include any person who procures or engages or conducts natives for his own *bonâ fide* domestic or personal service or business exclusively.

2. (1) Every application for a Labour Agent's permit must be made to the Provincial Commissioner in whose Province the Labour Agent intends to recruit and shall be accompanied by a statement giving the following particulars :—

- (a) The place or places where the natives to be engaged or conducted by him are to work (if known)
- (b) The district or districts in which he desires to recruit labour; and the route which he desires to follow (if he is a conductor).
- (c) Particulars of any previous permit issued to the applicant, or of any application refused, in any Province in the East Africa Protectorate.

(2) In addition to this statement the applicant must at the time of making his application pay Rs. 5/- in respect of a permit to recruit labour, and if so required sign a bond for such amount as may be necessary for the fulfilment of the provisions of the Master and Servants Ordinance 1910 and of any rules and conditions prescribed by the Governor.

3. (1) Permits shall be granted for such period as the Provincial Commissioner may think fit, but not exceeding in any case one year.

(2) A Provincial Commissioner may refuse any application for a permit to recruit labour in any Native Reserve or Outlying District or may grant such application subject to any condition or conditions which he may deem necessary.

4. The granting of a permit to any person shall not confer any right to its renewal.

5. (1) Every employer of a labour agent shall authorize the labour agent who is recruiting for him to enter into agreements with the natives recruited for him and sign the contract entered into with such natives before a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace on his behalf, and every such contract entered into by a labour agent on behalf of his employer shall be binding on the employer.

(2) Upon his arrival for the purpose of recruiting in a district the Labour Agent must forthwith notify the District Commissioner of such arrival, and of the localities in which he desires to recruit.

(3) Every Labour Agent shall supply all natives recruited by him with sufficient food free of charge to enable them to reach the place of employment.

6. No permit issued under these rules shall confer upon any person the sole right to recruit labour in any district or specified area.

7. No concession or contract by any native chief or headman binding himself or his people to provide native labour shall be valid.

8. Lists shall from time to time be published in the "Official Gazette" of permits issued to Labour Agents, as well as of permits which have expired or been cancelled.

9. Every Labour Agent shall be bound by the conditions endorsed on his permit.

10. Every Labour Agent shall produce his permit whenever requested to do so by a Magistrate, Justice of the Peace or Railway Officer.

## RULES.

### Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

Rules issued by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

Nairobi,

Dated this 29th day of April, 1910.

Governor.

1. These Rules shall apply to the infected Areas "A" and "B" defined in the Schedule hereto.

2. The Governor may, from time to time, appoint such Officer as he may think fit to have charge of the Administration of these Rules, and such Officer shall have all the powers of an Inspector appointed for the purposes of any of the Diseases of Animals Ordinances or of any Rules thereunder, in addition to the powers conferred upon him by these Rules.

3. In these Rules :—

"European Area" shall mean Area "A" as defined in the Schedule to these Rules.

"Native Area" shall mean Area "B" as defined in the Schedule to these Rules.

"Quarantine Officer" shall mean the Officer for the time being appointed by the Governor under Rule 2 of these Rules.

"Prescribed penalties" shall mean a fine not exceeding 1,500 Rupees or imprisonment of either kind not exceeding 6 months or both fine and imprisonment.

"Manner prescribed" when used in reference to the seizure and dealing with cattle, shall mean, as prescribed by the "Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1908."

4. The Quarantine Officer may order the owner or person in charge of any cattle the property of any Native or Natives or of any Native Community which may be found within the "European Area" to be removed to the "Native Area" and may order the route by which the same shall be moved and the part of the Native Area to which the same shall be moved.

Whenever cattle which shall have been ordered to be removed from the European Area to the Native Area shall not have been so removed within the time specified by the Quarantine Officer or, when the route by which the same shall be moved has been specified, shall have been removed by any route other than that specified, or, when the part of the Native Area to which the same shall be removed has been specified, are removed to any part of such Native Area other than that specified, such cattle may be seized and dealt with in the manner prescribed, and the owner or person in charge to whom such order shall have been given and every person who shall knowingly be concerned with the breach of or noncompliance with such order or any portion thereof shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties.

5. All cattle in the European Area shall be branded within such time as the Quarantine Officer shall prescribe and in the manner following:—

- (i) In the case of cattle the property of the owner of a registered brand, by the owner of the cattle and in the manner prescribed by the Branding of Stock Ordinance 1907.
- (ii) In the case of cattle the property of a non-native who is not the owner of a registered brand, by the Veterinary Department, and with such brand as may be prescribed by the Chief Veterinary Officer.
- (iii) In the case of cattle the property of any Native or Natives, by the Veterinary Department and with such Brand as may be prescribed by the Chief Veterinary Officer.

6. It shall be the duty of every non-native occupying land in the European Area to notify the "Quarantine Officer" within 14 days after the publication of these Rules by letter addressed to the Quarantine Officer, Nairobi, of the number of cattle upon the land held or occupied by him in such area at the date of such letter and to state therein whether the cattle are his property and if not whether they are the property of a non-native or of a Native.

Any person who shall fail to notify the Quarantine Officer as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 150 Rupees and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twenty one days.

7. (1) The Quarantine Officer shall notify each non-native occupying land within the European Area and having or believed to have cattle thereon of the date on which the same will be inspected, and, if not branded by the owner in the manner before provided, branded by the Veterinary Department.
- (2) It shall be the duty of the occupier of the land to whom such notification shall have been given as aforesaid, and of the owner of the cattle on such land to produce or cause to be produced on demand being made whether on the day named or any subsequent day by any person representing the Veterinary Department, all cattle on his land for inspection and branding.

8. Whenever after the date prescribed by the Quarantine Officer any cattle shall be found in the European Area which shall not have been branded as before provided such cattle may be seized and dealt with in the manner prescribed and the owner or person in charge of the cattle shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties.

Provided, however, nothing in this Rule shall apply to any calf calved in a herd in the European Area after the herd has been branded as herebefore provided. Provided, however, that the owner or person in charge of such calf shall brand the same or produce the same for branding within three months of its birth.

9. All cattle in the Native Area at the commencement of these Rules, or introduced into, or calved within, the said area after such date shall be branded within such time and by or under the supervision of such person and in such manner and with such brand as the Quarantine Officer shall prescribe.

Any cattle found within the Native Area which are in the opinion of the Quarantine Officer over three months old and not branded as herebefore provided may be seized and dealt with in the manner prescribed, and the owner or person in charge thereof shall, on conviction, be liable to prescribed penalties.

10. (1) No cattle shall be moved into either the European Area or the Native Area from any place outside such areas, or from the Native Area to the European Area, or from European Area to the Native Area, except with the permission in writing of the Quarantine Officer and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Quarantine Officer may prescribe.
- (2) All cattle moved with the permission aforesaid shall be branded at such place, and in such manner, and within such time as the Quarantine Officer shall prescribe.
- (3) All cattle which shall be moved in breach of the provisions of this Rule or which when moved with the permission aforesaid shall not be branded as hereinbefore provided may be seized and dealt with in the prescribed manner, and the owner and person in charge of the same and all persons aiding, abetting or concerned in the said breach, or neglect to brand shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties.

11. The Quarantine Officer may, from time to time, divide the Native Area into such sub-areas as he may think fit and may, by order to be issued to the Chiefs, Headmen and Elders in such sub-areas, prohibit the movement of cattle from one sub-area into another sub-area, or order that the cattle in any sub-area shall be moved from such sub-area to any other sub-area and may generally give in the manner aforesaid such orders as he may deem necessary for the purposes of quarantining cattle, cleansing any land, or for the prevention of the spread of disease amongst cattle in the Native Area.

Any person who shall fail to comply with any such order as aforesaid or shall commit any breach of any such order or shall aid, or abet any such noncompliance or breach shall be guilty of an offence and, on conviction, shall be liable to the prescribed penalties, and any cattle in respect of which such offence shall have been committed may be seized and dealt with in the prescribed manner.

12. (1) No cattle shall be moved in the European Area from one farm to another farm or along or over any public road or way except with the permission in writing of the Quarantine Officer and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Quarantine Officer may prescribe.

(2) No cattle shall be moved over land sold by, or leased from, the Crown (not being a public road) except with the permission of the Quarantine Officer and with the consent in writing of the owner or occupier of such land.

(3) The owner or person in charge of any stock moved in breach of this Rule and any person aiding or abetting such movement shall be guilty of an offence and, on conviction, shall be liable to the prescribed penalties and any stock in respect of which such offence shall have been committed may be seized and dealt with in the prescribed manner.

13. No cattle sold by a Native to a Non-Native shall be removed from the farm or premises of the seller until a permit for the removal has been obtained by such seller.

Any Non-Native who shall permit, or shall fail to take all reasonable precautions to prevent, the removal of cattle in breach of this Rule shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties.

14. The Quarantine Officer or any Veterinary Officer acting under the Quarantine Officer may require the owner or person in charge of any cattle or any farm in the European Area to remove and confine the same to any part of such farm or may prohibit cattle from being upon any part of any farm or upon any land which may be specified by the Quarantine Officer or Veterinary Officer.

Any cattle which may be found on any part of any farm from which cattle shall have been ordered to be removed as aforesaid or upon any part of any farm or on any land upon which cattle shall have been prohibited from being as aforesaid, may be seized and dealt with in the prescribed manner, and the owner of the cattle and any person in charge thereof shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties.

15. The Quarantine Officer may order that, for the purposes of cleansing any farm or land in the European Area, all cattle shall be removed therefrom, and that no stock shall be permitted to be upon such farm or land except with his permission in writing. And in such case the cattle shall be removed therefrom by or at the expense of the owner of the cattle to such place as the Quarantine Officer shall determine and shall be kept in such place at the risk and at the expense of the owner of the cattle until such time as the Quarantine Officer shall permit their removal therefrom. The Quarantine Officer shall, unless otherwise directed by the Director of Agriculture, order the owner of the cattle to pay any expenses incurred by the Government in the removal or keep of the cattle and in the event of the owner making default in the payment of such expense within such time as the Quarantine Officer shall specify shall order all or any of the cattle to be sold and shall, after deducting the costs of the sale and any monies due to the Government as aforesaid, hand the balance, if any, of the proceeds of the sale to the owner in default.

Any cattle which may be found on any land after an order shall have been made by the Quarantine Officer prohibiting cattle from being thereon may be seized and dealt with in the prescribed manner and the owner of the cattle and person in charge thereof shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties.

16. The Quarantine Officer or any Veterinary Officer or Inspector may require the owner or person in charge of any cattle within the areas to which these Rules apply to isolate any of such cattle from the other cattle, and may order any cattle to be herded as far as possible from any public road.

Any person who shall fail to comply with any such order shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties and any cattle in respect of which such offence shall have been committed may be seized and dealt with in the prescribed manner.

17. The Quarantine Officer and any Veterinary Officer or Inspector or Police Officer may enter any land or building within Areas "A" and "B" in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of carrying out their duties under the Diseases of Animals Ordinances or any Rules made thereunder.



18. All permits for the removal of cattle shall, at the expiration of the period for which such permit is granted, be sent or delivered to the Quarantine Officer or to such person as shall be authorised by him to receive the same. Any person who shall fail to comply with the provisions of this Rule shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred and fifty Rupees.

### Schedule.

#### Area "A"

1. An area comprising all land in the Fort Hall District of the Kenya Province bounded on the South by the Chania River and commencing at a point where the said river is cut by the Western boundary of Farm 465 (L. 296) thence to this river's junction with the Theika River and to the point made on the Theika River by the intersection of this river with the N. E. boundary of Farm 477 (L. 314) thence by the North East boundary of farms 477 (L. 314) 478 (L. 315) 486 (L. 316) 488 (L. 324) to the Mara River thence by the Mara River and swamp to the junction of this swamp with the New Fort Hall Road thence by the road to the Kiboko River thence by the Kiboko River and the N. W. boundary of Farm 470 (L. 298) thence by the western boundaries of farms 470 (L. 298) 468 (L. 297) 465 (L. 296) to the Chania River.

2. All land in the Nairobi and Kikuyu districts of the Ukamba Province not coming within Area "B" as hereafter defined.

#### Area "B"

1. An area bounded on the North by the Chania River, on the East by the boundary of the European farms, with the exception of Farm 464 (L. 225) (which is included in the said Area "B") down to the Kamiti River, on the South by the Kamiti River from the South West corner of Farm No. 74 (L. 99) along the Kamiti River towards its source as far as farm 81 A (L. 240) then in a Northerly direction along the Eastern boundaries of farms 81 A (L. 240) and 80 A (L. 241) thence along the Northern boundary of 80 A (L. 241) thence along western boundaries of farms 80 A (L. 241) and 81 A (L. 240) to the Uganda Railway at mile 353 thence along the railway to Kijabe Station, omitting farm 103 A (L. 366) and thence in a Northerly direction to the South East boundary of the Kinangop block of farms, thence along the Eastern boundaries of these farms in a northerly direction to the Chania River.

2. An area bounded on the North by the Kamiti River between farms 74 (L. 99) and 39 A (L. 126) and the Southern boundary of the block of Limoru Farms to the Uganda Railway near mile 346, on the west by the Railway to as far as the Government Farm at Kabete thence along the western boundary of the Government Farm and thence in a north easterly direction along the farm boundaries to the Kamiti River.

3. An area bounded on the North East by the line of the Uganda Railway commencing at a point where the North Western beacon on F. 201 cuts the said line and mile 359.8 on the South by the boundaries of farms 206 328 (L. 7) 329 (L. 990) 327 (L. 6) 326 (L. 5) 324 (L. 4) 330 (2?) and thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of the Forest Reserve to the N. E. corner of Farm 304 (L. 1008) and thence to farms 315 (L. 192) 302 (L. 195) 301 (L. 196) 300 (L. 197) and thence in a S. W. direction to the southern source of the Mbagathi River thence in a N. N. W. direction along the boundary demarcation between the southern Masai Reserve and Kikuyu Reserve till this line strikes the eastern boundary of Kedong Valley Farms thence in a Northerly direction along the Eastern boundaries of those farms to the Railway line near Kijabe Station, thence along the railway line to the North West boundary of farm 83 A (L. 173) thence by the boundaries of the farms impinging on the native reserve to mile 399.8 excluding farm 71 A (L. 1058) and 104 (L. 366).
