#### AN ORDINANCE

#### No. 16 of 1910.

Title.

An Ordinance to supply a further sum of money for the service of the year ended the 31st of March, 1910.

Date.

[ 15th August, 1910. ]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legistative Council thereof:—

Public Revenue charged.

1. The Public Revenue for the year 1909-1910 and other funds of the East Africa Protectorate are hereby charged towards the service of the year ended 31st day of March, 1910, with a further sum of twenty three thousand eight hundred and eighty seven pounds two shillings and seven pence in addition to the sums provided by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1909.

2. The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied to the purposes

and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto.

Application of

3. The Protectorate Treasurer is hereby authorised and required, from time to time, upon warrant or order of the Governor, to pay out of the Revenue and other funds of the Protectorate, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of £23,887-2-7 which have come in course of payment during the year ended on the 31st day of March, 1910.

4. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Additional Appropriation 1909-1910 Ordinance, 1910."

#### AN ORDINANCE

## No. 17 of 1910.

An Ordinance to make provision for the Registration Title of vessels Navigating Lake Victoria.

[ 15th August, 1910. ]

Date.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The East Africa Registration of Short Title. Lake Vessels Ordinance 1910" and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor, by notification in the "Official Gazette," shall determine.
  - 2. In this Ordinance—

Interpretation.

- "Vessel" means any description of vessel used in navigation;
- "Prescribed" means prescribed by any rule or order under this Ordinance;
- "Master" includes every person (except a pilot) having coand ommr charge of any vessel.
- 3. Every vessel employed in navigation in the waters of Lake Victoria Obligation to within the Protectorate, which belongs to, or is used by any person residing in register. the Protectorate, or to any Company or partnership carrying on business therein, shall unless exempted, be registered, lettered, and numbered in manner hereinafter provided.
- 4. Every application for registration of a vessel shall be in writing, and Application for in the Form A in the Schedule hereto, or to that effect, and shall be sent or registry. delivered to the prescribed Officer.
- 5. For purposes of registration, numbering, and lettering, vessels shall Classes of vessels. be divided into three classes:—

1st Class:—Vessels of 15 tons burthen and upwards;

2nd Class:—Vessels of less than 15 tons burthen, navigated otherwise than by oars, paddles, or poles only;

3rd Class:—Vessels of less than 15 tons burthen navigable by oars, paddles, or poles only;

Provided that the officer to whom the application to register is made may' if he thinks proper, place any small vessel occasionally navigated or propelled by sail in the 3rd instead of the 2nd class.

- 6. On the receipt of the application and of the prescribed fee the pressential cribed Officer shall, after inspecting the vessel, register her in the Register of Shipping, which shall be in the Form B in the Schedule hereto, or to that effect, and shall contain the particulars therein appearing.
- 7. On registration of the vessel such Officer shall issue to the applicant a Certificate of certificate of registry in the Form C in the Schedule hereto.
- 8. Once in every year the owner of every vessel shall submit his certificate Annual examination fregistry for examination by the prescribed officer, who shall sign his name on tion of certificate the back of the said certificate, together with the date of examination, as a record of its authenticity and correctness.

Change of ownership or master.

On change of ownership a fresh certificate of registry must be applied for, and the former certificate be given up, in order that the same, together with the former registry, may be cancelled; and on a change of master due notice shall be given of such change, which shall be duly noted in the Register, and be indorsed on the certificate of registry. A failure on the part of the owner of any vessel to comply with the requirements of this section shall subject the owner to the same penalties as would have been incurred if the certificate of registry had never been applied for.

Certificate to be kept on board.

10. The master of every vessel registered under this Ordinance shall have the certificate of registry on board his vessel at all times; and any master not having such certificate on board, or failing to produce the same when required as provided by Section 20 of this Ordinance, shall, in the absence of any reasonable excuse (proof whereof shall lie on him), be liable, together with his vessel and crew, to be taken by the commander of any ship belonging to the Government of the Protectorate, without warrant, summons, or other process, into the nearest or most convenient port or place, and there to be ordered by a Court on any proceeding in a summary manner to pay a penalty not exceeding three hundred Rupees.

No change in name after registration.

11. After registration no change shall be made in the name of any vessel.

Lettering and numbering.

Every vessel shall be lettered and numbered.

Position and dimensions of bers.

The letter or letters and number shall be placed on each bow of the 13. letters and num. vessel, 3 or 4 inches below the gunwale.

> The breadth of the paint of the letters and number shall be: for vessel of 1st Class,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches; for vessels of the 2nd and 3rd Classes,  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inches.

> The height of the letters and numbers shall be: for vessels of the 1st Class, 18 inches; for vessels of the 2nd and 3rd Classes, 10 inches.

> The same letter or letters and number shall also be placed on each side of the mainsails of the vessel.

Ships boats to be lettered and numbered.

Name on stern.

When vessels carry, or have attached to them, small boats, as tenders. 14.or otherwise, such boats must be marked with the same numbers and letters as the vessels to which they belong.

All vessels, of whatever class, shall have their names, and those of the ports or places to which they belong, painted on the outside of the sterns in letters which shall be at least 3 inches in height.

Letters, &c., not to be effaced.

The letters, numbers and names placed on vessels, and on the sails of vessels, shall be clearly painted in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground, and shall not be effaced, covered, or concealed in any manner whatsoever.

Penalty for non-

If any vessel required to be registered, lettered and numbered, in-17. registration, &c. pursuance of this Ordinance, is not so registered, lettered and numbered, in the manner prescribed, the owner and the master shall each be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rupees 300, and the commander of any ship belonging to the Government of the Protectorate or Customs Officer may seize and detain such vessel, and prevent her from proceeding on her voyage and from being employed. as aforesaid until it is duly registered, lettered and numbered; and may, for that purpose, take it back into the nearest or most convenient port or place within the Protectorate.

Names, &c., to be inserted in documents.

18. The names, letters and numbers of vessels shall be inserted on the certificate of registry or other official papers of those vessels.

Certificates.

The certificate of registry or other official papers of vessels shall contain the description and tonnage of each vessel, as well as the names of its owner and of its master.

Papers to be produced.

The master shall whenever required, exhibit his certificate of registry to the commander of any ship belonging to the Government of the Protectorate or to a Customs Officer or to the prescribed Officer.

Certain officer to tion of the requirements of this Ordinance.

The execution of the requirements of this Ordinance concerning see to the execu-certificates of registry, the lettering and numbering of vessels, is placed under the supervision of the prescribed officer and of the commanders of vessels belonging to the Government of the Protectorate, and all other officers designated by the Governor for that purpose.

- 22. In all proceedings against the owner or master of or any person As to effect of belonging to any registered vessel for offences against this Ordinance, and in all registry. actions or proceedings for the recovery of damages for injury done by any such vessel, such register shall be conclusive evidence that the persons registered at any date as owners of such vessel were at that date owners thereof, provided that—
  - (1) This provision shall not prevent any proceedings or action being taken or instituted against any person not registered who is beneficially interested in the vessel;

(2) This provision shall not affect the rights of the owners among themselves, or the rights of any registered owner against any person not registered who is beneficially interested in the vessel;

(3) Save as aforesaid, the registry of any vessel shall not confer, take away, or affect any title to or interest in the vessel.

23. All penalties, offences, and proceedings under this Ordinance may be Mode of recover-recovered, prosecuted, and taken in a summary manner in any Court of the ing penalties. Protectorate.

24. The Governor may by rule or order—

Rules and orders.

- (a) Exempt any vessel or class of vessels from the operation of this Ordinance or any part of it;
- (b) Appoint such Officer or Officers as he may think fit to perform the duties and exercise the powers of the prescribed Officer.

(c) Prescribe any matter which by this Ordinance is intended to be prescribed;

(d) Generally give any directions necessary or expedient for carrying this Ordinance into effect; and

(e) Prescribe the fees to be taken under this Ordinance.

#### AN ORDINANCE

#### No. 18 of 1910.

#### An Ordinance to amend the East Africa Marriage Title. Ordinance 1902.

[ 15th August, 1910. ]

Date.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:-

This Ordinance may be cited as "The East Africa Marriage Amend-Short Title. ment Ordinance 1910" and shall be read as one with the East Africa Marriage Ordinance 1902, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

The Principal Ordinance shall be and is hereby amended as follows:—

By the deletion from Clause (d) of Section 11 of the aforesaid Ordinance of the words "neither of the parties to the intended marriage" and by the substitution therefor of the words", if either of the parties is a person subject to Native law or custom, neither of the parties so subject."

By inserting in Section 33 Sub-section (1) of the aforesaid Ordinance after the words "either of the parties thereto" the words", being a person subject to Native law or custom,".

By inserting in Section 35 of the aforesaid Ordinance after the (3)words "in accordance with any native law or custom" words "by persons subject to such law or custom,"

(4)By inserting in Section 51 of the aforesaid Ordinance after the first word of the said section the words", being a person subject to native law or custom,".

By inserting in Section 52 of the aforesaid Ordinance after the first word of the said section the words", being a person subject to native law or custom,".

3. For the purposes of this Ordinance every Native shall be deemed to all natives to be be "a person subject to native law or custom" notwithstanding that he or she law or custom for may not be subject to native law or custom for other purposes.

#### AN ORDINANCE

#### No. 19 of 1910.

#### An Ordinance to amend the Collective Punishment Title. Ordinance 1909.

[ 15th August, 1910. ]

Date.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Collective Punishment Amend-short Title. ment Ordinance 1910" and shall be read as one with "The Collective Punishment Ordinance 1909" hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Governor may in lieu of imposing a fine, order persons to make roads, etc. 2. The Governor may, in any case in which he is empowered to impose a fine under the Principal Ordinance on the inhabitants of any village area or district, or the members of any tribe sub-tribe or community, in lieu of imposing such fine, order the persons on whom such fine would have been imposed to construct or repair a road or roads or other public work on or near the lands occupied by such persons, as the Governor may direct within such time and in such manner and to the satisfaction of such Officer, as shall be prescribed in such order.

Liability of able bodied person to labour on work ordered. 3. Whenever an order shall have been given under the last preceding Section, any Chief, Council of Elders or Headman, having rule or jurisdiction within the village, area or district or over the tribe, sub-tribe or community, affected by such order, may require all able-bodied men under his or their jurisdiction and residing within the local limits of his or their jurisdiction and included in the persons against whom such order shall have been made, to work in constructing or repairing any road or other public work ordered to be constructed or repaired.

Penalty for refusing to labour.

4. Every person required to work as aforesaid neglecting or refusing to work when called upon by the Chief, Council of Elders or Headman or disobeying lawful orders whilst engaged on such work, shall be liable at the option of the Chief, Council of Elders or Headman to punishment according to native customary laws, provided that such punishment is not contrary to humanity or natural justice, or on summary conviction before a District or Assistant District Commissioner to a fine not exceeding fifteen Rupees or in default of payment to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding one month.

If order under Section 2 not obeyed, Governor may impose a fine 5. Whenever an order shall have been made under Section 2 of this Ordinance and the work ordered to be done shall not have been completed within the time and in the manner and to the satisfaction of the Officer prescribed in the order the Governor may impose a fine on all or any of the inhabitants of the village area or district, or the members of the tribe, sub-tribe or community against whom such first mentioned order shall have been made.

# An Ordinance to amend the Wakf Commissioners Regulations.

Short Title.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Wakf Commissioners Regulations Amendment Ordinance 1910".

2. The Wakf Commissioners Regulations (No. 29 of 1900) shall be and are hereby amended as follows:—

By the deletion from Section 3 of the aforesaid Regulations of the words "not more than three persons" and by the substitution therefor of the words "such number of persons, as the Appointed Commissioners may deem necessary."

#### No. 21 of 1910.

An Ordinance to make further and better provision Title. for the formation of a Volunteer Reserve in the East Africa Protectorate.

[ 15th August, 1910. ]

Date.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title.

- This Ordinance may be cited as "The East Africa Volunteer Reserve Ordinance 1910" and shall come into force on such date as the Governor shall by Proclamation determine.
  - The Governor may on behalf of His Majesty sanction the forma-Governor may tion of a Volunteer Reserve for the East Africa Protectorate. sanction the formation of a Such Volunteer Reserve shall be known as "The East Africa Volunteer Protectorate Volunteer Reserve" and shall consist of units Reserve and may formed as in this Ordinance provided.

divide the Protectorate into

The Governor may from time to time by notice to be published in Districts for the the "Gazette" divide the Protectorate into such areas (herein-purposes of the Ordinance and after referred to as Districts) as he may think fit for the sanction the purposes of this Ordinance and may in like manner sanction the formation of a formation of a unit of the Volunteer Reserve for each or any unit in any such such area.

The Governor may by notice in the "Gazette" sanction the formation Uganda Railway of a unit of the Volunteer Reserve to be known and hereinafter Unit. referred to, as the Uganda Railway Unit to be constituted as is hereinafter provided.

- Officer for the time being commanding the troops in the Organisation. 3. (1)Protectorate shall be the President of the Volunteer Reserve.
  - (2)The head of each unit of the Volunteer Reserve shall be called a Deputy-President and shall be nominated or elected in the manner hereinafter provided.
- The President shall be directly responsible to the Governor for the Annual Report proper carrying out of this Ordinance throughout the Protectorate and shall to be sent by the send to the Governor before the 1st day of April in each year a report on the Governor. Volunteer Reserve and all matters relating thereto for the year ending December 31st preceding.

**5.** Before a Unit of the Volunteer Reserve is formed in any District Formation of (1)the names of not less than twelve persons of European race or Unit. origin being British subjects and over sixteen years of age who are willing to join such unit together with the name of the person whom such persons desire shall be the Deputy President of the Unit, shall be submitted to the President who shall report to the Governor as to the advisability or otherwise of the formation of such unit.

Deputy President to be Gazetted.

(2)

6.

When the sanction of the Governor shall have been given to the formation of a unit, the person nominated to be the D-puty President shall, if approved by the Governor, or if he shall not be approved, such other person as the Governor shall nominate, be gazetted as the Deputy President of the Unit and shall hold office until his successor shall have been elected and approved in the manner hereinafter provided.

Qualifications for membership.

- (1) Any male British subject of European race or origin and over 16 years of age may join the unit of the District in which he ordinarily resides, or with the approval of the Deputy President and the consent of the President any other District Unit.
  - (2) Any male British subject as aforesaid in the service of the Uganda Railway Administration may join the Uganda Railway Unit. On cause to the satisfaction of the President being shown any person eligible to join a District Unit may with the consent of the President be permitted to join the Uganda Railway Unit.
  - (3) Anything in the preceding Sub-sections contained notwithstanding if any person applying to be registered as a member of a unit shall appear to the Deputy President not to be a fit and proper person to be a member of such Unit, the Deputy President may refuse to register him as a member. Provided, however, that such person may appeal against such refusal to the Governor, whose decision thereon shall be final.

(4) No person shall at any time be a member of more than one unit, but a member may be allowed by the President to transfer

from one unit to another.

Members to be either "District Service Members" or "Field Service Members." 7. (1) Persons permitted to join a District Unit may join either as a "District Service Member" or as a "Field Service Member."

Oaths to be taken on joining a District Unit. (2) Every person on joining a District Unit as a "District Service Member" shall take an oath in the Form A set forth in the 1st Schedule hereto, and every person on joining as a "Field Service Member" shall take an oath in the Form B in the said Schedule.

Oaths to be taken on joining the Uganda Railway Unit.

(3) Every person on joining the Uganda Railway Unit shall take an oath in the Form C in the aforesaid Schedule.

Member on joining to sign the roll of the Unit.

(4) Every person on joining a Unit and on taking the oath herein before prescribed shall sign the roll of membership of his unit.

Units to be registered by President.

8. When not less than twelve persons shall have joined a unit the formation of which has been sanctioned by the Governor, the Deputy President of the unit shall report accordingly to the President, who shall, if arms are available, register the unit as duly formed.

Units to hold annual meeting for election of Officers.

9. Each unit registered under this Ordinance shall in the month of January in each year hold a meeting at which the members present shall elect from the members of the unit a Deputy President and an Assistant Deputy President whose election shall be submitted to the Governor for approval and who if approved shall be gazetted and hold office from the first day of February in the year in which they are elected until their successors shall be elected and take office as herein provided.

In the event of the office of Deputy President becoming vacant through any cause whatever, the Assistant Deputy President shall become Deputy President

and may appoint a member of his unit to be Assistant Deputy President.

In the event of the office of Assistant Deputy President becoming vacant through any cause whatever the Deputy President may appoint a member of his unit to be Assistant Deputy President. Should at any time the office of Deputy President and Assistant Deputy President in any Unit be vacant, the President may appoint such members of the unit as he may think fit to the said offices.

The property of each Unit shall be vested in the Deputy President, and Deputy Presihe shall be responsible to the President that all arms, ammunition and dents responsible other property issued by the Government to the unit, or belonging to the unit for the property of are kept in serviceable condition and in good order, and shall furnish the Unit and for President with such returns as may be required by this Ordinance or out of the Ordinance any rule thereunder or which may at any time be called for by the President, nance by their and shall be responsible generally that this Ordinance and all rules made there-respective Units. under shall be strictly enforced in their respective units.

In the absence of the Deputy President the powers and authorities conferred upon the Deputy President by or in virtue of this Ordinance may be exercised by

The majority of the members of a unit present at any special meeting Members of Units convened for the purpose may from time to time make, alter, or add to rules for may make rules the convening of meetings of the unit, the election of the Deputy President and for certain Assistant Deputy President, shooting and prize competitions, the issue of ammunition purposes. and for the general management of the property, finances and civil affairs of the unit, but any such rules shall not have effect until they have been approved by the Governor, such approval being notified in the "Gazette."

Any member may resign his membership by giving to the Deputy Resignation of President of his Unit fourteen day's notice in writing and by paying all monies members. due or becoming due by him under this Ordinance or any rules thereunder and by delivering up in good order all arms and other articles as may have been issued to him; provided always that no member can claim his discharge when any members of the Unit to which he belongs are called out under Section 33 of this Ordinance.

- Any member of the Volunteer Reserve who shall be guilty of an Dismissal of offence specified in the Second Schedule hereto may be dismissed from the members. Volunteer Reserve by the Governor, in addition to the infliction of a fine.
- 14. The President or a Deputy President may impose upon any Fines. member who shall be guilty of any offence set forth in the Second-Schedule hereto a fine not exceeding the amount set opposite such offence in the said Schedule. The Deputy President shall issue to each member of his unit when he shall be first enrolled as a member or as soon thereafter as circumstances will allow one Government Rifle and accessories. Every rifle issued under this Ordinance shall remain the property of the Government.

Wrongful sale. etc., of arms.

Any member who wrongfully makes away with, sells, pawns or destroys, damages, alters or loses any rifle issued to him as a member of the Reserve or wrongfully refuses or neglects to deliver up or produce any such rifle when duly requested by the President or a Deputy President to do so, or removes or attempts to remove such rifle from the Protectorate shall, on conviction, be liable for the value of the rifle and in addition, to a fine not exceeding one hundred and fifty Rupees.

Issue of ammuni-

The Deputy President shall issue to each member of his unit so soon as 20.tion to members. he is satisfied that the member is able to properly handle a rifle 100 rounds of ammunition and it shall be the duty of every member at all times to have in his possession 100 rounds of ball ammunition suitable to the Government rifle in his possession and shall produce the same whenever called upon by the President or a Deputy President to do so.

Rifle meetings.

- 21. (1) Each Unit shall hold at least one Rifle Meeting for competition for prizes in each year. The date on which any such meeting will be held shall be notified by the Deputy President to the

Member may be permitted to fire his Musketry course on a range other than that of his unit.

A Deputy President may for any sufficient cause, authorise a member of his unit to comply with the requirements for efficiency at a meeting of some other unit which has been called for rifle practice or efficiency purposes or on a Military or Police Range, provided that in such case the member shall obtain a certificate signed by a Deputy President or a European Military Officer or a Superior Police Officer. There shall be paid by the Government an Annual Capitation 24. (1)

Capitation grant

Grant of fifteen Rupees in respect of every efficient member. The Deputy Presidents shall in the month of January in each year submit to the President a list of the members of their respective units who shall have made themselves efficient during the 12 months preceding the first day of January, together with Musketry Register of their Units. The President shall before the 1st day of March issue vouchers for the payment of the amount of the Capitation Grant which he shall be satisfied is due to each unit and such Grant shall be paid by a Paymaster of the Local Battalion of the King's African Rifles.

Appointment of Officers for Military service.

36. Whenever a unit or any members thereof shall be called out for service as hereinbefore provided, the Governor shall after consulting the wishes of the members called out, appoint from among them officers or leaders; such appointments shall be in force during the continuance of their service unless the Governor shall otherwise direct.

Reserve to be under command of officers of Regular Forces.

Whenever any unit or any members of a unit shall be called out for active service the Governor may place them and their officers under the command of officers of His Majesty's Regular Forces; provided always that the Volunteer Reserve shall, when the circumstances of the service admit, be led by their own officers under such command.

When Reserve is called out the Governor may authorise any resident to join the Reserve

- Anything in this Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding the (1)the Governor may, in the event of the Volunteer Reserve or any members thereof being called out on active service, accept on behalf of His Majesty the services of any resident in the Protectorate who may desire to serve on active service with the Volunteer Reserve.
  - (2) Every person whose services shall be accepted by the Governor under the preceding sub-section shall, on taking an oath in such form as the Governor may prescribe, be enrolled as a member of such unit as the Governor may direct, and shall thereafter be deemed to be a member of the Volunteer Reserve and shall be subject to all the provisons of this Ordinance. Provided. however, he shall cease to be a member of the Volunteer Reserve on the termination of the war or other disturbance on account of which his services shall have been accepted, or when he shall be notified that his services are no longer required by the Governor.

Discipline.

- With respect to the discipline of members of the Volunteer Reserve when they are on active service the provisions of the Army Act 44 and 45 Victoria, cap. 58 and all Acts amending or substituted for the same so far as applicable shall apply with the following modifications:
  - The words "The East Africa Volunteer Reserve" may be read therein for the words "Regular Forces", the words "member of the East Africa Volunteer Reserve" for the word "soldier" and the word "Governor" for the words "His Majesty" and "Secretary of State"

No member of the Volunteer Reserve shall, for any offence (b)against the said Acts, be subject to the penalty of death or to any longer term of imprisonment than five years;

Any person who but for the last foregoing provision would be subject to the penalty of death, shall be liable to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding five years;

No sentence of a Court-Martial upon the trial of a member of the (d)Volunteer Reserve shall be carried into execution unless confirmed by the Governor.

Pay on active service.

All members of the Volunteer Reserve when called out for Active Service shall be entitled to such pay as may be determined by the Governor.

#### Repeal.

- 41. (1) On the coming into operation of this Ordinance the Rifle Corps Rifle corps under of the Volunteer Reserve formed under the East Africa the Volunteer Volunteer Reserve Ordinance 1905, shall be disbanded and every member of such corps shall forthwith return the Government rifle and ammunition issued or transferred to him to the President or to such person as may be authorised by the President to receive the same on his behalf. An Ordinance to further amend the Land Titles Ordinance 1908.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Prorectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

Short Title.

ance 1908.

Amendment of The Land-Titles Ordin-

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Land Titles Amendment Ordinance, (No. 2) 1910" and shall be read as one with 'The Land Titles Ordinance 1908' and 'The Land Titles Amendment Ordinance 1910."
- 2. The Land Titles Ordinance 1908 hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance shall be and is hereby amended as follows:—

(i) By the deletion of Section 50 of the Principal Ordinance and by the substitution therefor of the Section following:—

50 (1) The Recorder of Titles shall fix a date within which the fee payable in respect of a Certificate of Title shall be paid by the person entitled to such certificate. If the fee shall not have been paid by such date the Recorder of Titles

shall endorse on the certificate the sum then payable in respect of the certificate together with a note that such sum is due and payable to the Government, and shall then issue the certificate to the person entitled thereto. In the case of every certificate the sum endorsed thereon as aforesaid shall be a debt due to the Government from the person to whom the certificate shall have been granted and his heirs and successors, and, in the case of a certificate of ownership, shall have priority over all charges or interests over the land the subject of such certificate, whether existing at the date of the certificate or created thereafter.

- (2) Until the fee payable in respect of a certificate of ownership shall have been paid any sale, mortgage, charge or other disposition of the land the subject of such certificate or any right or interest in or over such land and every agreement for the sale, mortgage, charge or other disposition (except a devise by will or lease for a period not exceeding twelve months), to which the consent of the Governor has not been expressed, shall be null and void.
- (3) The Governor may, in any case he may think proper, authorise the Recorder of Titles to remit the whole or a portion of the fee payable in respect of a Certificate of Title, and in such case the Recorder of Titles shall endorse the certificate with a note of such remission.
- (ii) By the deletion of the first item in the Second Schedule to the Principal Ordinance and by the substitution therefor of the following:—

1. (a) Certificate of Ownership.

A fee at the rate of 2 per cent on the value of the land

in respect of which the certificate is granted.

Provided that no land shall be assessed for the purpose of such fee at a higher rate than Rs. 1,500 per acre or at a lower rate than Rs. 10 per acre, and that in no case shall a fee of less than Rs. 5 be payable. Provided further that no such fee shall be required for a certificate of ownership in respect of land granted by or on behalf of the Crown.

(b) Certificate of Interest ... Re. 1. (c) Certificate of Mortgage ... 1.

3. Section 8 of the Land Titles Amendment Ordinance 1910 shall be and is Amendment of Land hereby amended by the deletion of the word "may" after the word "holding" Titles Amendment in the said Section and by the substitution therefor of the word "shall."

#### Under the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903.

Rules issued by His Excellency the Governor under the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903.

1. These Rules shall apply to the Townships of Naivasha and Nakuru.

#### Vehicles.

2. In these rules the word "vehicles" includes motor car, motor cycle, trolley, carriage, cart, wagon, lorry, buggy, rickshaw, wheel barrow, hand barrow, hand cart, and any kind of cycle.

"Passenger vehicle" means a vehicle used for the conveyance of passengers for hire.

3. Every vehicle used in the Township for the purpose of trade or business or plying or hire in the streets of the Township, and not being the property of His Majesty's Government shall be registered at the office of the District Commissioner. Provided that nothing in this rule shall apply to the vehicles of persons who neither reside nor carry on business within the Township.

4. Every vehicle used in the Township for the conveyance of passengers for the purpose for hire shall be registered at the office of the District Commissioner as a passenger vehicle.

- 5. When any vehicle is brought to the office of the District Commissioner for registration and the same is registered, the District Commissioner shall give the person registering it (1) a registration paper bearing the name of the person or firm in whose name it is registered, the registered number, the weight or number of packages which such vehicle is allowed to carry, or in the case of a passenger vehicle the number of passengers which are permitted to be conveyed in such vehicle and (2) a tin plate or other badge bearing the registered number of such vehicle.
- 6. The District Commissioner may refuse to register any vehicle which is not in proper order and repair or the wheels of which are in such condition that they cannot be used without injury to the roads.

7. Every vehicle registered as a passenger vehicle and used in the Township shall be in charge of a driver licensed at the office of the District Commissioner.

The licence shall specify the kind of vehicle which the person to whom it is granted, is licensed to drive.

8. The District Commissioner may refuse to license any person as a driver of a passenger vehicle until such person has proved to the satisfaction of the District Commissioner that he is competent to drive the kind of vehicle which he applies to be licensed to drive.

9. No person may drive a passenger vehicle in any public street or place within the

Township, unless he has been licensed to do so at the office of the District Commissioner.

No person may drive a passenger vehicle of a different kind to that which he is licensed to drive, in any public street or place within the Township.

10. The following shall be offences under these Rules:—

(1) Driving or using in any public street or place a vehicle which has not been registered at the Office of the District Commissioner or to which the tin plate or other badge bearing the registration number issued by the District Commissioner in respect of such vehicle is not attached.

2) Using a vehicle in any public street or place, which is loaded with a greater weight or number of packages than that stated in the registration paper

granted in respect of such vehicle.

3) Conveying in a passenger vehicle a greater number of passengers than that

specified in the registration paper granted in respect of such vehicle.

(4) Driving or using a vehicle in any public street or place so carelessly or negligently as to cause danger to any person using such street or place or so as to put any person using such street or place in fear of immediate injury to his person or property.

11. After the hours of 6. 30 p.m. and until 6 a.m. Railway time, every vehicle standing in or proceeding along a public street or place, shall be provided with a lighted lamp or lamps so placed as to throw the light in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding and giving a light equal to not less than one candle power per lamp, provided that every vehicle used for freight, or carrying wood shall carry a tail lamp in addition to a lamp in front and so placed as to throw the light backwards.

12. No persons suffering from a contagious or infectious disease, shall drive or be in

charge of any vehicle to which rule 3 of these Rules applies.

13. Every person driving or being in charge of any vehicle proceeding along any public street or place shall, when practicable, keep such vehicle to the left or near side of the road, and shall when passing any vehicle going in the same direction cause the vehicle which he is driving or of which he is in charge to pass on the right or off side of the vehicle he is passing, and shall permit a vehicle going in the opposite direction to pass on the right or off side of the vehicle which he is driving or of which he is in charge.

For the purposes of rules 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 of these Rules "person in charge of any vehicle" or "person being in charge of any vehicle" shall extend to and include any person

propelling or drawing or assisting in propelling or drawing any vehicle.

14. When loading or unloading a vehicle in any public street or place, the person in charge of such vehicle shall rest it parallel with the foot path and immediately on the edge of the carriage way or if there is no foot path, then parallel with and on the extreme edge of the street.

15. No person shall lead, ride or drive any horse or mule, donkey or ox, or allow any such animal to remain on any pathway, public place or thoroughfare, that shall have been reserved by His Excellency the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate for the use of the foot passengers only and no person shall drive or propel any vehicle or allow any such vehicle to remain on any pathway, public place or thoroughfare so reserved.

Any person committing a breach of this rule shall on conviction be liable to a fine not

exceeding Rs. 75/- or in default to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding 14 days.

16. The driver or person in charge of any vehicle other than a cycle, shall not drive or

propel such vehicle over any stone drain except over a proper bridge or culvert.

17. The driver or person in charge of any vehicle in respect of which any of the terms of the above rules Nos. 9 to 16 inclusive are not complied with or in respect of which any offence is committed against any of the said rules, shall on conviction be liable for each offence to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100/- or in default to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding one month in addition to any damage at the suit of any party aggrieved that may be awarded by a Court of competent jurisdiction against the owner of such vehicle or the driver or person in charge of the same.

18. The owner or occupier of any town plot or premises who shall require to drive or propel any vehicle over any stone drain for the purpose of obtaining access for such vehicle to the said plot or premises shall construct across the said drain opposite to the entrance of the said plot or premises a good and sufficient bridge of planks or other material suitable in the opinion of the District Commissioner for the said purpose in such manner as to protect the said drain from damage so as to avoid obstructing the proper flow of water in the same.

Any person who shall be guilty of contravening or not complying with any of the terms of this rule shall upon conviction in any Court of competent jurisdiction be liable to pay a fine not exceeding Rs. 100/- or in default to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding one month

19. The driver or person in charge of any animal or of any vehicle shall not permit such animal or vehicle to collide with or damage any drain, culvert, bridge, fence, gate, lamp-post or any other property of the Government, and in every case where any such damage shall have been done or any such collision shall have occurred the driver or person in charge of the animal or vehicle shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this rule and the owner of the animal or vehicle by which any such damage as aforesaid shall have been done, shall pay to the District Commissioner the amount of the damage; and the driver or person in charge shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 40/- for each offence or in default to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding one month.

#### Washing and Bathing.

20. No person shall perform ablutions or wash any clothes, cooking utensils or any other article at any public hydrant or stand pipe.

21. No person shall wash any article of clothing in or on the banks or any river, pool, quarry, watercourse or irrigation trench except at a place authorized by the District

Commissioner for the purpose.

- 22. No person shall bathe in any river, pool, quarry, watercourse or irrigation treuch within the Township area except at a place or places authorised for the purpose by the District Commissioner on a certificate of approval being previously received from the Medical Officer of Health.
- 23. Any person guilty of an offence against the provisions of rules Nos. 20 to 22 inclusive of these Rules, shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 30 for each offence or in default to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding two weeks.

#### Eating Houses.

24. The words "common lodging house" as used in rules 122 to 125 inclusive, of the Township Rules 1904 shall include native eating houses.

25. "Native Eating house" means any premises kept for the purpose of gain, where food

or drink is supplied to African natives or Asiatics, for consumption on such premises.

26. No premises shall be registered as a common lodging house or native eating house unless the Medical Officer of Health shall first certify that such premises are fit to be used for such purpose.

27. The Medical Officer of Health, the Police or the District Commissioner or any other Officer appointed by him for that purpose shall have power at all times to enter upon any premises registered as a common lodging house or native eating house in order to inspect such

premises.

28. The registration paper granted by the District Commissioner in respect of any premi-es registered as a common lodging house or native eating house shall state the period for which such registration is available, and the number of persons that may be accommodated on such premises at any one time.

29. The licensee shall not allow any larger number of persons than by the conditions of

his licence stipulated to be upon the licensed premises at any one time.

30. Any person who uses or permits any premises to be used as a common lodging house or for the purpose of carrying on the business of a native eating house, without such premises having been registered at the Office of the District Commissioner or after the expiry of the period for which such registration is available under rule 28 of these rules shall be deemed to have committed an offence under these Rules.

31. The fee mentioned in the First Schedule for the registration of common lodging

houses and native eating houses shall be levied.

#### Sales by Public Auction.

32. Every boma or yard or other place used for the sale of cattle or any livestock by public auction shall be registered at the Office of the District Commissioner. The fee mentioned

in the First Schedule shall be paid in respect of such registration.

33. Any person selling or offering for sale or assisting in selling or offering for sale by public auction any cattle or other livestock in any boma, yard or other place which has not been registered at the Office of the District Commissioner shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction before a Court having jurisdiction to pay a fine not exceeding Rs. 100 or in default to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding one month.

## Permits to Keep Cattle, &c.

34. No person shall keep any cattle, sheep, goats or pigs within the Township except under a permit from the District Commissioner. Any person committing a breach of this rule shall be liable on conviction to pay a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 or in default to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding fourteen days.

The fees mentioned in the First Schedule shall be paid for such permit.

#### Cemetery.

35. The District Commissioner shall have power to set aside one or more places within the Township to be used as cemeteries and to charge the fees mentioned in the First Schedule in respect of the use of the same.

#### Pound.

- 36. The District Commissioner shall have power to set aside a place within the Township as Pound.
- 37. Any animal found wandering in any public street or place or on unoccupied land or trespassing on any private property within the Township may be impounded.

38. The District Commissioner shall have power to collect fees in respect of every

animal impounded under rule 33 of these rules, as mentioned in the First Schedule.

39. If any animal impounded under rule 33 of these Rules remains unclaimed by any person entitled to possession thereof for a period of seven days after such animal was impounded, or if the fees leviable in respect of such animal under rule 34 of these Rules remain unpaid for a period of seven days after such animal was impounded, such animal may be destroyed, sold or otherwise dealt with as the District Commissioner may direct.

40. The District Commissioner may refuse to release any animal impounded under rule 33 of these Rules until (a) the fees leviable under Rule 34 of these Rules have been paid or (b) until he is satisfied that the person claiming such animal is entitled to the possession

- 41. The District Commissioner before proceeding to sell or destroy any animal which has been impounded shall give not less than seven days public notice of the intended sale or destruction.
- 42. The proceeds of the sale of any animal which has been impounded under Rule 33 of these Rules shall be used first in defraying the fees leviable in respect of such animal under Rule 34 of these Rules and the remainder, if any, shall be paid to any person who proves to the satisfaction of the District Commissioner that such animal was his property at the time when it was impounded and if no such proof be established, shall be at the disposal of the Government.

#### Slaughter House.

43. The District Commissioner shall have power to set aside a place within the Township to be used as a public slaughter house and to charge the fees set out in the First Schedule for every animal slaughtered therein.

#### General.

44. Rules Nos: 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 18, 19, 28, 29, and 30 of these Rules are cognizable by the Police.

45. Rules 157, 174 and 175 of the Township Rules 1904, shall from the publication of

these Rules cease to be applied to the Township of Naivasha and Nakuru.

- 46. In these rules the words "First Schedule" mean the First Schedule appended to these Rules and the words "Second Schedule" mean the Second Schedule appended to these Rules.
  - 47. The fees mentioned in the First Schedule shall be levied.
- 48. The Rules mentioned in the first column of the Second Schedule are hereby repealed to the extent mentioned in the second column thereof.

## RULES.

## The East Africa Railways Ordinance, 1910.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 47 sub-section 1 (g) of the East Africa Railway Ordinance 1910, the Governor in Council has sanctioned the following Rules made by the Manager of the Uganda Railway for the provision of Ledger and Deposit Accounts on the Uganda Railway.

#### Ledger and Deposit Accounts.

The Uganda Railway Administration will be prepared to open from a date to be hereafter notified by the Manager, monthly Credit Accounts with Merchants, Trades and others who are in the habit of regularly forwarding by rail considerable quantities of Goods, etc., on application to the Traffic Manager, on the following conditions:—

1. Before opening a Ledger Account in the name of any person, the Railway Administration will require that the applicant shall conform to one of the following

requirements, that is to say he shall:-

(a) Deposit and retain to his credit with the Railway Administration an amount

equal to his estimated traffic account for two months.

(b) Furnish the written and signed guarantee of a Bank Manager that the Bank will hold itself responsible up to the amount of two months' traffic as estimated by applicant and give the Chief Accountant of the Railway Administration one month's notice of the Bank's intention to cancel such guarantee.

2. All traffic for which freight is paid monthly, is subject in every particular to the

Regulations, rates, etc., in force at the time the traffic was forwarded.

3. Ledger Accounts are opened on the express condition that all unpaid charges for carriage or other charges in relation to goods consigned to or from the parties to whom such accounts are granted, shall be borne and discharged by them.

4. All Goods must be properly described, the correct weights given and nature and contents of the packages stated in writing upon a consigment note to be signed and tendered

at the time of delivery of the goods to the Railway.

5. The Goods Ledger Accounts are made up monthly to the last day of each month, and

they must be paid in full within six days after the rendering of the accounts.

6. No claims for loss of, or damage to, Goods for alleged errors, overcharges, or any other claim preferred by a party having a Ledger Account, can be allowed to postpone or interfere with the settlement of the Railway Administration's Accounts as rendered by the time stipulated above, and which account the Railway Administration reserves to itself the right to close at any time, upon giving one day's notice in writing of its intention to do so, whereupon the whole of such account shall become immediately payable. Should the person in whose name the account has been opened, commit any act of bankruptcy, the account may be closed without any such notice having been given.

7. These accounts are opened on the express condition that all Goods or Property in the possession of the Railway Administration, or subsquently coming into its possession, belonging to the party in whose favour the credit is given, or in which such party is interested shall be subject to a general lien for the amount which may at any time be due or payable on such an account, whether before or after the closing thereof, with power at all times for the Railway Administration to realise such lien or security by sale of such Goods, or other property, or any portion thereof, or the interest of the party therein without previous notice to such party.

8. Passenger Tickets will not be included in Ledger Accounts.

9. Should the amount of any account upon which credit is given under these conditions, exceed two thirds of the sum guaranteed or should the provisions of clause 5 not have been complied with, whether the said proportion has been reached or not, it shall be competent for the Railway Administration in its discretion either to stop delivering traffic or to have recourse to the guarantor or such other security as shall have been provided, or to exercise both of such remedies, and no liability shall attach to the Railway Administration in respect of such action.

10. The Railway Administration will not continue any Ledger Account which averages

less than Rs. 300 per month for three consecutive months.

11. Credit will only be given at the station or stations mentioned in the original request for a Ledger Account. A fresh application, on the proper form, must be made for credit at any additional station.

12. Persons not having sufficient traffic by rail to warrant the opening of a Ledger Account with the Railway Administration may, from time to time, hand to the Traffic Manager any amount that may be desired not being less than Rs. 50 or more than Rs. 300 to meet freight on goods to be forwarded or received by them at one particular station. Receipts for the amounts deposited will be given, and a memorandum kept for their inspection at the

station giving particulars and showing at any time the sums deducted and the balance in hand. A copy of such memorandum will be posted to the person on the beginning of each month showing the balance (if any) left to his credit. All such accounts will be closed as soon as the balance to the person's credit is exhausted unless it is renewed.

Cheques will only be accepted in payment of sums due to the Railway with the

previous consent of the Traffic Manager.
