RULES.

Under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

Rules issued by His Excellency the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate under the Powers conferred upon him by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

1. No hide or skin of any animal, within the meaning of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906, shall be removed from any place within the Northern Masai Reserve to any place outside such reserve, until such skin shall have been examined at Rumuruti by such Officer as may be prescribed on this behalf by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and a pass for such removal shall have been obtained from such prescribed officer.

2. (1). Any skin removed in breach of the foregoing rule shall be confiscated and thereafter destroyed or otherwise dealt with, as the Chief Veterinary Officer may direct.
- (2) Any person who shall remove or shall be a party to the removal of any skin in breach of the aforesaid rule, shall be liable to the penalties prescribed by the aforesaid Ordinance for a breach of a rule thereunder.

Under the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1902.

WHEREAS by an Indenture of Lease made the 14th day of July, 1909, BETWEEN HIS LATE MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY KING EDWARD the Seventh of the one part and Frank Emley of Johannesburg, Architect (thereinafter referred to as the Lessee) of the other part. ALL THAT piece or parcel of land situate in the Province of Naivasha in the East Africa Protectorate comprising 5,000 acres or thereabouts and therein described was demised unto the Lessee for the term of 99 years as therein mentioned. AND WHEREAS the Lessee covenanted to use the said land for the purpose of grazing and Agriculture. AND WHEREAS the Lessee impliedly covenanted by virtue of Section 14 (e) of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1902, to use and develop the natural resources of the land leased with all reasonable speed having regard to all the circumstances of the case. AND WHEREAS the Lessee has failed to use the said land for the purpose of grazing and Agriculture and further has committed a breach of the Lessee's covenant implied by virtue of Section 14 (e) of the said Crown Lands Ordinance 1902. NOW THEREFORE by virtue of the provisions of Section 18 (1) of the said Crown Lands Ordinance 1902, I, Colonel Sir Edouard Percy Cranwill Girouard, K.C.M.G., D.S.O., R.E., Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby give notice to the said Lessee that I intend after one month from the publication of this notice to commence an action in the High Court for a declaration that the said lease be forfeited.

EXAMINATION FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

An open Competitive Examination for admission to the Civil Service of India will be held in London commencing on the 1st August, 1911.

The number of persons to be selected at this examination will be announced hereafter.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received on or before the 1st July, 1911, an application on the prescribed form. No question as to the delay or loss in the post of any such Application Form can be entertained. Candidates who delay their applications until the last days, will do so at their own risk.

Acknowledgements of such Application Forms are sent, and any Candidate who has filled up and returned the printed Application Form but has not received any acknowledgement of it within four complete days, should at once write to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, Burlington Gardens, London, W., Failure to comply with his provision will deprive the Candidate of any claim to consideration.

The Order for admission to the Examination will be posted on the 20th July, 1911, to the address given on the form of Application. It will contain instructions as to the time and place at which Candidates will be required to attend and as to the manner in which the fee (£6) is to be paid.
