No. 17 of 1912.

Title

Date.

An Ordinance to make provision for the Registration of Trade Marks in the East Africa Protectorate.

16th October, 1912

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

Short Title and Commencement.

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Registration of Trade Marks Ordinance, 1912" and shall come into operation, for the purpose of making rules and prescribing forms and fees, on the publication of the Ordinance, and, for all other purposes, on such date as the Governor, by notice in the "Gazette," shall determine

PART I

Definitions.

Definitio 19.

- In and for the purposes of this Ordinance (unless the context otherwise requires) —
- "Marks" shall include a device, brand, heading, label, ticket, name, signature, word, letter, numeral, or any combination thereof.
- "Trade Mark" shall mean a mark used or proposed to be used upon or in connection with goods for the purpose of indicating that they are the goods of the proprietor of such trade mark by virtue of manufacture, selection, certification, dealing with, or offering for sale

"Registrable Trade Mark" shall mean a trade mark which is capable of registration under the provisions of this Ordinance

"Register" shall mean the register of trade marks kept under the provisions of this Ordinance

"Registered Trade Mark" shall mean a trade mark which is actually upon the register

- "Prescribed" shall mean, in relation to proceedings before the Court, prescribed by rules of Court, and, in other cases, prescribed by this Ordinance or the Rules thereunder
 - "Court" shall mean His Majesty's High Court for East Africa

"Person" includes a body corporate

"Goods" shall mean anything which is the subject of trade, manufacture, or merchandise

Register of Trade Marks

egister of trade arks.

There shall be kept at the Office of the Secretary under the Inventions and Designs Act 1888 (Act V of 1888) for the purposes of this Ordinance a book called the Register of Trade Marks, wherein shall be entered all registered trade marks with the names and addresses of their proprietors, the dates on which applications were made for their registration, as hereinatter provided, notifications of assignments and transmissions, disclaimers, conditions, limitations, and such other matters relating to such trade marks as may from time to time be The register shall be kept under the control and management of the aforesaid Secretary, who is in this Ordinance referred to as the Registrar

st not to be red in register.

There shall not be entered in the register any notice of any trust expressed, implied, or constructive, nor shall any such notice be receivable by the Registrar

The register kept under this Ordinance shall at all convenient times be Inspection of and open to the inspection of the public, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance extract register or to such regulations as may be prescribed; and certified copies of any entry in any such register shall be given to any person requiring the same on payment of the prescribed fee.

Registrable Trade Mark

A Trade Mark must be registered in respect of particular goods or Particularity,

classes of goods.

The applicant shall, in his application, state goods included in one class only. If the applicant desires to register the same mark for goods falling in more than one class, he shall make a separate application in respect of each class and each of such applications shall be treated for all purposes as a separate and distinct application and the entries on the register in pursuance of such applications shall for all purposes, be deemed to relate to separate and distinct trade marks.

7. A registrable trade mark must contain or consist of at least one of the Essentials

following essential particulars .—

The name of a company, individual, or firm represented in a special or particular manner;

The signature of the applicant for registration or some predecessor (2)

in his business;

(3)An invented word or invented words,

A word or words having no direct reference to the character or (4)quality of the goods, and not being according to its ordinary signification a geographical name or a surname,

Any other distinctive mark, but a name, signature or word or (5)words, other than such as fall within the descriptions in the above paragraphs (1), (2), (3), and (4), shall not, except by

order of the Court, be deemed a distinctive mark:

For the purposes of this Section "distinctive" shall mean adapted to distinguish the goods of the proprietor of the trade mark from those of other persons.

In determining whether a trade mark is so adapted the Court may, in the case of a trade mark in actual use, take into consideration the extent to which such user has rendered such trade mark in fact distinctive for the goods with respect to which it is registered or proposed to be registered.

Provided always that any mark which has been registered as a distinctive mark in the United Kingdom under the Trade Marks Act 1905, shall be deemed

to be a distinctive mark for the purpose of this Ordinance.

8. A trade mark may be limited in whole or in part to one or more specified Coloured trade colours, and in such case the fact that it is so limited shall be taken into marks consideration by any Tribunal having to decide on the distinctive character of such trace mark. If and so far as a trade mark is registered without limitation of colou int shall be deemed to be registered for all colours.

9. (1) It shall not be lawful to register as a trade mark or part of a Restriction on trade mark any matter, the use of which would by reason of its registration being calculated to deceive or otherwise be disentitled to protection in a Court of Justice, or would be contrary to law or morality, or any scandalous design.

No trade mark shall be registered for any goods set forth and included in classes 23, 24, and 25 of the third part of the Schedule hereto unless such trade mark has been and is registered in the United Kingdom in respect of such goods.

Registration of Trade Marks

- 10. Any person claiming to be the proprietor of a trade mark may by Application to (1)himself or his agent apply to the Registrar for the registration register thereof
 - The application must be made in the prescribed form, and must (2)be accompanied by not less than three representations of the trade mark and by a stereotype block of such representation

(3)The applicant must state the particular goods or classes of goods in connection with which he desires histrade mark to be registered.

The application must be left with or sent by post to the Registrar. (4)(5)

The date of the delivery or receipt of the application shall be endorsed thereon and recorded in the Registrar's Office.

When an applicant for the registration of a trade mark or an, (6)agent does not reside or carry on business in the Protectorate he shall give the Registrar an address for service in the Protectorate and if he fails to do so the Registrar may refuse to proceed with the application until the address has been given.

ction in regard application

- 11. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance the Registrar may refuse such application as aforesaid, or may accept it absolutely or subject to conditions, amendments or modifications.
 - (2) In case of any such refusal or conditional acceptance the Registrar shall, if required by the applicant, state in writing the grounds of his decision and the materials used by him in arriving at the same, and such decision shall be subject to appeal to the Court.
 - (3) An appeal under this section shall be made in the prescribed manner, and on such appeal the Court shall, if required, hear the applicant and the Registrar, and shall make an order determining whether, and subject to what conditions, amendments, or modifications, if any, the application is to be accepted.

Advertisement of application

12. When an application for registration of a trade mark has been accepted, whether absolutely or subject to conditions, the Registrar shall, as soon as may be after such acceptance, cause the application as accepted to be advertised in the "Official Gazette." Such advertisement shall set forth all conditions subject to which the application has been accepted

Opposition of registration

Any person may, within three months, or such further time, not exceeding nine months in all as the Registrar shall allow from the date of the advertisement of an application for the registration of a trade mark, give notice to the Registrar of opposition to such registration.

(2) Such notice shall be given in writing in the prescribed manner, and shall include a statement of the grounds of opposition.

Counter-statement,

Notice

(3) The Registrar shall send a copy of such notice to the applicant, and within one month after the receipt of such notice, or such further time, not exceeding three months in all, as the Registrar may allow, the applicant shall send to the Registrar, in the prescribed manner, a counter-statement of the grounds on which he relies for his application, and, if he does not do so, he shall be deemed to have abandoned his application.

Copy of counterstatement to party opposing

- (4) If the applicant send such counter-statement, the Registrar shall furnish a copy thereof to any person giving notice of opposition, and shall require him to give security in such manner and to such amount as the Registrar may require for such costs as may be awarded in respect of such opposition, and if such security is not given within fourteen days after such requirement, was made or such further time as the Registrar may allow, the opposition shall be deemed to be withdrawn.
- (5) If the person who gave notice of opposition duly gives such security as aforesaid, the Registrar shall inform the applicant thereof in writing, and thereafter the case shall be deemed to stand for the determination of the Court.
- (6) Where the opponent is out of the Protectorate he shall, with notice of opposition to registration, give the Registrar an address for service in the Protectorate.

Cases how brought before the Court.

- 14. (1) When a case stands for the determination of the Court under the provisions of the last preceding Section, the Registrar shall require the applicant to make a written application to the Court for an order that, notwithstanding the opposition of which notice has been given, the registration of the trade mark be proceeded with by the Registrar, or to take such other proceedings as may be proper and necessary for the determination of the case by 'he Court.
 - (2) The applicant shall thereupon make his application or take such other proceedings as aforesaid, within the period of one month or such further time as the Registrar may allow, and shall also within the like period give notice thereof to the Registrar
 - (3) If the applicant shall fail to make such application or to take such other proceedings of which failure the non-receipt by the Registrar of the said notice shall be sufficient proof, the applicant shall be deemed to have abandoned his application.

Powers of the Court 15. (1) The Court shall have power in proceedings under the last two preceding Sections to award to any party such costs as it may consider reasonable and to direct how and by what parties they are to be paid.

The Court shall, if required, hear the parties and the Registrar, and shall make an order determining whether, and subject to what conditions, if any, registration is to be permitted

The Court may permit the trade mark proposed to be registered to be modified in any manner not substantially effecting the idenity of such trade mark, but in such case the trade mark as so modified shall be advertised in the "Official Gazette" before being registered

If a trade mark contains parts not separately registered by the Disclaimers proprietor as trade marks, or if it contains matter common to the trade or otherwise of a non-distinctive character, the Registrar or the Court, in deciding whether such trade mark shall be entered or shall remain upon the register, may require, as a condition of its being upon the register, that the proprietor shall disclaim any right to the exclusive use of any part of parts of such trade mark, or of all or any portion of such matter, to the exclusive use of which they hold him not to be entitled, or that he shall make such other disclaimer as they may consider needful for the purpose of defining his rights under such registration Provided always that no disclaimer upon the register shall affect any rights of the proprietor of a trade mark except such as arise out of the registration of the trade mark in respect of which the disclaimer is made

When an application for registration of a trade mark has been accepted Date of registration and has not been opposed, and the time for notice of opposition has expired, or having been opposed, the opposition has been decided in favour of the applicant, the Registian shall, unless the Court otherwise direct, register the said trade mark, and the trade mark, when registered, shall be registered as of the date of the application for registration, and such date shall be deemed for the purposes

of this ordinance to be the date of registration

The Registral shall have a seal and on the registration of a trade certificate of mark he shall issue to the applicant a certificate in the prescribed form of the registration

registration of such trade mark under the hand and seal of the Registrar

Where registration of a trade mark is not completed within twelve No. completion of months from the date of the application by reason of default on the part of the registration applicant, the Registral may, after giving notice in writing of the non-completion to the applicant or to his agent (if any), treat the application as abandoned unless it is completed within the time specified in that behalf in such notice

Identical Trade Marks

Except by order of the Court of in the case of trade marks in use Identical mails before the coming into operation of this Ordinance, no trade mark shall be registered in respect of any goods or decription of goods which is identical with one belonging to a different proprietor which is already on the register with respect to such goods or description of goods, or so nearly resembling such a trade mark as to be calculated to deceive

Where each of several persons claims to be proprietor of the same Rival claims to identical mails trade mark or of nearly identical trade marks, in respect of the same goods or description of goods, and to be registered as such proprietor, the Registrar may refuse to register any of them until their rights have been determined by the Court, or have been settled by agreement in a manner approved by him

In case of honest concurrent user or of other special circumstances concurrent user which, in the opinion of the Court, make it proper to do so, the Court may permit the registration of the same trade mark, or of nearly identical trade marks, for the same goods or description of goods by more than one proprietor subject to such conditions and limitations, if any, as to mode or place of user or otherwise as it may think it right to impose

Assignment.

A trade mark when registered shall be assigned and transmitted only Assignment and in connection with the goodwill of the business concerned in the goods for which trade makes it has been registered and shall be determinable with that goodwill

24 In any case where from any cause, whether by reason of dissolution Apportunient of of partnership or otherwise, a person ceases to carry on business, and the good-of partnership will of such person does not pass to one successor but is divided, the Registrar may (subject to the provisions of this Ordinance as to associated trade marks,) on the application of the parties interested, permit an apportionment of the registered trade marks of the person among the persons in fact continuing the business, subject to such conditions and modifications, if any, as he may think necessary in the public interest. Any decision of the Registian under this Section shall be subject to appeal to the Court

A-sociated Trade Mark

Associated trade

25 If application be made for the registration of a trade mark so closely resembling a trade mark of the applicant already on the register for the same goods or description of goods as to be calculated to deceive or cause confusion if used by a person other than the applicant, the tribunal hearing the application may require as a condition of registration that such trade marks shall be entered on the register as associated trade marks

Combined trade

If the proprietor of a trade mark claims to be entitled to the exclusive use of any portion of such trade mark separately he may apply to register the same as separate trade marks. Each such separate trade mark must satisfy all the conditions and shall have all the incide its of an independent trade mark, except that when registered it and the trade mark of which it forms a part shall be deemed to be associated trade marks and shall be entered on the register as such, but the user of the whole trade mark shall for the purposes of this Ordinance be deemed to be also a user of such registered trade marks belonging to the same proprietor as it contains

Series of trade

- When a person claiming to be the proprietor of several trade marks for the same description of goods which, while resembling each other in the material particulars thereof, yet differ in respect of
 - (a) Statements of the goods for which they are respectively used or proposed to be used, or
 - (b) Statements of number, price quality, or names of places, or
 - (i) Other matter of a non-distinctive character which does not substantially affect the identity of the trade mark, or

(d) Colour,

seeks to register such trade marks, they may be registered as a series in one registration. All the trade marks in a series of trade marks so registered shall be deemed to be, and shall be registered as, associated trade marks.

Assignment and user of associated trade marks

Associated trade marks shall be assignable or transmissible only as a whole and not separately, but they shall for all other purposes be deemed to have been registered as separate trade marks. Provided that where under the provisions of this Ordinance user of a registered trade mark is required to be proved for any purpose, the tribunal may, if and so far as it shall think right, accept user of an associated registered trade mark, or of the trade mark with additions or alteratious not substantially affecting its identity as an equivalent for such user

Duration and Renewal of Registration

Duration of registration

29 The registration of a trade mark shall be for a period of fourteen years, but may be renewed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance

Renewal of

The Registiar shall on application made by the registered proprietor of a trade mark in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed period, renew the registration of such trade mark for a period of fourteen years from the expiration of the original registration or of the last renewal of registration, as the case may be, which date is herein termed, 'the expiration of the last registration

Procedure on expiry of period of registration

At the prescribed time before the expiration of the last registration of a trade mark, the Registrar shall send notice in the prescribed manner to the registered proprietor at his registered address of the date at which the existing registration will expire and the conditions as to payment of tees and otherwise upon which a renewal of such registration may be obtained and if at the expiration of the time prescribed in that behalf such conditions have not been duly complied with, the Registrar may remove such trade mark from the register, subject to such conditions (if any) as to its restoration to the register as may be prescribed

Status of unicnewed trade mark

Where a Trade Mark has been removed from the register for non-payment of the fee for renewal, such trade mark shall, nevertheless, for the purpose of any application for registration during one year next after the date of such removal, be deemed to be a trade mark which is already registered, unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Registrar that there had been no bouû tide trade user of such trade mark during the two years immediately preceding such removal

The Registrar may, on request in writing accompanied by the Registrar may correct formal errors prescribed fee, in application

Any decision of the Registrar under this Section shall be subject to appeal to the Court

Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance where a person becomes Registration of entitled to a registered trade mark by assignment, transmission, or other operation a signments &c of law, the registral shall, on request made in the prescribed manner, and on proof of title to his satisfaction, cause the name and address of such person to be entered on the register as proprietor of the trade mark. Any decision of the Registrar under this Section shall be subject to appeal to the Court

> The registered proprietor of any trade mark may apply in the Alteration of prescribed manner to the Registrar for leave to add to or alter registered trade such trade mark in any manner not substantially affecting the identity of the same, and the Registrar may refuse such leave or may grant the same on such terms as he may think fit, but any such refusal or conditional permission shall be subject to appeal to the Court

If leave be granted, the trade mark as altered shall be advertised (2)in the prescribed manner, and the Registrar shall on payment of the prescribed fee, cause the register to be altered in conformity

The Court may, on the application of any person aggreed by Rectification of 37 the omission without sufficient cause of the name of any person regular terby the Court or of any other particulars from the register kept under this Ordinance or by any entry made without sufficient cause in the register, or by any entry wrongfully remaining on the register, or by any error or defect in any entry in the register make such order for making, expunging, or varying the entry as the Court thinks fit, or the Court may refuse the application, and in either case may make such order with respect to the costs of the proceedings as the Court thinks fit

The Court may in any proceedings under this section decide any (2)question that it may be necessary or expedient to decide for the rectification of a register, and may direct an issue to be tried for the decision of any question of fact, and may award damages to

(3)Notice of any intended application to the Court under this section shall be given to the Registrar by the applicant, and the Registrar shall be entitled to be heard on the application

(4)In case of fraud in the registration or transmission of a registered trade mark, the Registral may himself apply to the Court under

the provisions of this section

 $\langle 5 \rangle$ If any order of the Court rectifying the register is made the Registrar shall on proof thereof and on payment of the prescribed fee cause the register to be altered in conformity with such order

Non user of trade m_{1}

A registered trade mark may, on the application to the Court of any 38 person aggreeved, be taken off the register in respect of any of the goods for which it is registered, on the ground that it was registered by the proprietor or a predecessor in title without any bona fide intention to use the same in connection with such goods, and there has in fact been no boud fide user of the same in connection therewith, or on the ground that there has been no bona fide user of such trade mark in connection with such goods during the five years immediately preceding the application, unless in either case such non-user is shown to be due to special circumstances in the trade, and not to any intention not to use or to abandon such trade mark in respect of such goods

Effect of Registration

39 Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance

Powers of registered proprietor

The person for the time being entered in the register as proprietor of the trade mark shall, subject to any rights appearing from such register to be vested in any other person, have power to assign the same, and to give effectual receipts for any considertion for such assignment

Any equities in respect of a trade mark may be enforced in like

manner as in respect of any other personal property

Rights of propiletor Subject to the provisions of section 42 of this Ordinance and to any limitations and conditions entered upon the register, the registration of a person as proprietor of a trade mark shall, if valid, give to such person the exclusive right to the use of such trade mark upon or in connection with the goods in respect of which it is registered

More than one propuetor

of trade mark

Provided always that where two or more persons are registered proprietors of the same (or substantially the same) trade mark in respect of the same goods no rights of exclusive user of such trade mark shall (except so far as their respective rights shall have been defined by the Court) be acquired by any one of such persons as against any other by the registration thereof, but each of such persons shall otherwise have the same rights as if he were the sole registered proprietor thereof

Registration prima factor evidence of validity

In all legal proceedings relating to a registered trade mark (including applications under section 37 of this Ordinance) the fact that a person is registered as proprietor of such trade mark shall be prima facie evidence of the validity of the original registration of such trade mark and of all subsequent assignments and transmissions of the same

Registration conclusive after 7 rears

In all legal proceedings relating to a registered trade mark (including applications under section 37 of this Ordinance) the original registration of such trade mark shall after the expiration of seven years from the date of such original registration (or seven years from the passing of this Ordinance, whichever shall last happen) be taken to be valid in all respects unless such original registration was obtained by fraud, or unless the trade mark offends against the provisions of section 9 of this Ordinance

Provided that nothing in this Ordinance shall entitle the proprietor of a registered trade mark to interfere with or restrain the user by any person of a similar trade mail upon or in connection with goods upon or in connection with which such person has, by himself or his predecessors in business, continuously used such trade mark from a date anterior to the user of the first mentioned trade mark by the proprietor thereof or his piedecessors in business, or to object (on such user being proved) to such person being put upon the register for such similar trade mark in respect of such goods under the provisions of section 22 of this Ordinance

Unregistered trade

No person shall be entitled to institute any proceeding to prevent or to recover damages for the intringement of an unregistered trade mark unless such trade mark was in use before the coming into operation of this Ordinance, and has been refused registration under this Ordinance The Registrar may, on request, grant a certificate that such registration has been refused

Infringement

44 In an action for the infringment of a trade mark the Court trying the question of infringement shall admit evidence of the usages of the trade, in respect to the get-up of the goods for which the trade mark is registered, and of any trade marks or get-up legitimately used in connection with such goods by other persons

No registration under this Ordinarce shall interefere with any bona fide User of name, use by a person of his own name or place of business or that of any of his tion of goods predecessors in business, or the use by any person of any bona fide description of the character or quality of his goods

Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall be deemed to affect rights "Passing off" action of action against any person for passing off goods as those of another person of

the remedies in respect thereof

Legal Proceedings

AN ORDINANCE

No. 18 of 1912.

An Ordinance to make Provision for the Licensing of Theatres, Stage Plays and Cinematograph Exhibitions.

[16th October, 1912]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Stage Plays and Cinematograph Short Title Exhibitions Ordinance, 1912," and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor by notice in the "Gazette" shall determine

2 In this Ordinance —

Definition

"Stage play" includes any tragedy, comedy, farce, opera, burletta, interlude, inclodrama, pantonime, dialogue, prologue, epilogue, or other dramatic entertainment or any part thereof

"Cinematograph exhibition" means any exhibition of pictures or other optical effects presented by means of a cinematograph or other similar apparatus

"Theatre" means any building, tent or other erection, open to the public, gratuitously or otherwise, where a stage play or cinematograph exhibition is performed or presented

"Licensing officer" means such person as the Governor shall by notice appoint for the purposes of this Ordinance

- No person shall direct of take part of assist in any Licence for play performance of any stage play or any cinematograph exhibition of exhibition to which the public shall be admitted, gratuitously of otherwise, unless the licence of the licensing officer in respect to such stage play of cinematograph exhibition shall previously have been obtained as hereinaster provided
 - (2) No person shall direct or take part or assist in any performance of any stage play in respect to which a licence shall have been granted as atoresaid, if any new part shall have been added to such play, unless such new part shall have been licensed as hereinafter provided

4 One copy of every stage play, and of every new part added to any Play to be stage play for which a licence has already been granted, intended to be submitted performed shall be sent to the licensing officer with an account of the theatre where and the time when the same is intended to be performed. If any stage play or any new part thereof sent to the licensing officer for licence shall be in a language which the licensing officer does not understand, a true translation in English, certified to the satisfaction of the licensing officer, shall on demand be transmitted with the copy of the said stage play or new part thereof in the original language in which it is written. Provided always that the licensing authority may, with the approval of the Governor, dispense with such translation, and may submit any play or new part thereof for the examination and report of such person or persons as he may, with the approval of the Governor, appoint for such purpose

Power to inspect

The Licensing officer may inspect or cause to be inspected any picture of pictures before issuing a licence in respect thereof

6 The licensing officer may refuse to grant a licence in respect to any stage play or new part thereof or any cinematograph exhibition or may grant it subject to any rules made under this Ordinance or subject to such special conditions and restrictions, to be specified in such licence, as to him may seem fit Any such licence may be revoked by the Governor at any time

Safety of theatre

7 No theatre shall be used for the performance of stage plays or the presentation of cheematograph exhibitions without the licence in writing of the District Commissioner being previously obtained. If the District Commissioner shall consider that the safety of persons attending such performances or presentations at such theatre is adequately provided for, he may grant such licence either generally or in respect of any single performance or presentation or for such period not exceeding 12 months as he may think fit. The District Commissioner may refuse to grant such licence or may grant it subject to such terms and conditions as he may think desirable for the purpose of ensuring the safety of the persons attending such performances or presentations at such theatre. Any such licence may be revoked by the District Commissioner if he shall consider that the safety of persons attending such performances or presentations is or may be endangered.

Appeal to Governor 8 An appeal shall be to the Governor in respect to any act or decision of the licensing officer or District Commissioner done or made or omitted to be done or made under the provisions of this Ordinance, and the Governor may confirm, disallow or vary such act or decision of the licensing officer or District Commissioner or direct him to act in such manner as to the Governor shall seem fit, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance

Supervision to ensure safety from fire

9 Where the District Commissioner grants any licence as aforesaid upon condition that the stage play or cinematograph exhibition be conducted under the superintendence of some officer or person designated in the licence, then it shall be lawful, at any time, for the officer or person so designated to order such stage play or cinematograph exhibition to cease or to give any other direction which he may think necessary for ensuring the safety of the premises at which the stage play or cinematograph exhibition takes place and of the persons attending the stage play or cinematograph exhibition

Duty of occupier, do of theatre

The occupier or other person who manages or receives the rent of any theatre at which it may be proposed to perform or present any stage play or emematograph exhibition shall ascertain whether the prescribed licences have been obtained, and, if so, the terms of such licences. Such occupier or person shall give notice to the Commissioner of Police, or to the Officer in charge of the nearest Police Station, if and so soon as he has reason to believe that there is an intention to proceed with any stage play or emematograph exhibition either without the prescribed licences or without everything having been done which may be required under such licences or under any rules made under this Ordinance to be done previous to such stage play or emematograph exhibition taking place

Power of entry

A Police-Officer, or any Officer appointed for the purpose by the Governor, may at all reasonable times enter any premises in which he has reason to believe that any stage play or cinematograph exhibition is being or is about to be performed or presented with a view to seeing whether the provisions of this Ordinance or any Rules made thereunder and the conditions of any licences granted under this Ordinance have been complied with. Any person preventing or obstructing the entry of a Police-Officer or any Officer appointed as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence under this Ordinance.

Penalty

Any person who commits any breach or non-observance or attempts to commit any breach of this Ordinance or of any rule made thereunder or of any of the terms and conditions specified in any licence made in pursuance thereof, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding three hundred rupees or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months or to both

Application of Ordinance

13 This Ordinance shall not apply to a performance of a stage play or cinematograph exhibition to which the public are not admitted either gratuitously or otherwise

The Governor may by notice in the Gozette direct that the powers Power to appoint and duties of the District Commissioner under this Ordinance shall, in any Officer to perform District, area, Township or place specified in such notice, be exercised and District performed by such other Officer, person or persons as the Governor may appoint Commissioner in that behalf. An Ordinance to make Provision for the Payment of a Poll Tax by non-natives

[16th October, 1912]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council —

- This Ordinance may be cited as "The Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance Short Title 1912"
 - 2 In this Ordinance unless inconsistent with the context "The Tax" means the Non-Native Poll Tax prescribed by this Ordinance

"Non-Native" means a male person other than a Native within the meaning of "The Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1910"

- "Magistrate' means a Magistrate holding a Subordinate Court of the first, second or third class and the powers conferred upon a Magistrate by this Ordinance may be exercised by any such Magistrate notwithstanding any law limiting the jurisdiction of such Magistrate over Europeans or other Non-Natives
- From and after the first day of January, 1013, there shall be paid in every pate to Commence year by every Non-Native a tax of fifteen rupees, to be called the Non-Native amount of lax Poll Tax
- The tax pavable in any year shall be paid between the first and thirty-lixwhen partible first day of January in each year. Provided, however, that in the case of any Non-Native who is not residing in the Protectorate on the first day of January or who although residing in the Protectorate on such date leaves the Protectorate during the month of January without having paid the tax payable in that year, such Non-Native shall priv the tax within one month of his coming or returning to the Protectorate, as the case may be. And Provided further that any Non-Native who shall come to the Protectorate after the 30th day of June, in any year and who shall not have previously resided in the Protectorate in the same year, shall pay a tax of seven rupees and fifty cents in heu of the tax before prescribed

The Official Secrets Ordinance, 1912.

[16th October, 1912]

BE it enacted by the Governo. of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council —

Short Title

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Official Secrets Ordinance, 1912

Interpretation

- 2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires —
- ' Document" includes part of a document
- "Model" includes design, pattern, and specimen
- "Sketch" includes any photograph or other mode of representing any place or thing
- "Superintendent of Police" includes an Assistant Superintendent of Police and any police officer of a like or superior rank
- "Office under His Majesty" includes any office or employment in or under any department of the Government
- "Offence under this Ordinance" includes any act, omission, or other thing which is punishable under this Ordinance
 - ' Prohibited place" means
 - (a) any work of defence arsenal, factory, dockyard, camp, ship, telegraph or signal station, or office belonging to His Majesty, and any other place belonging to His Majesty used for the purpose of building, repairing, making or storing any ship, arms, or other materials or instruments of use in time of war, or any plans or documents relating thereto, and
 - (b) any place not belonging to His Majesty where any ship, aims, or other materials or instruments of use in time of war, or any plans or documents relating thereto, are being made, repaired, or stored under contract with, or with any person on behalf of, His Majesty, or otherwise on behalf of His Majesty, and
 - (c) any place belonging to His Majesty which is for the time being declared by notice by the Governor to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section on the ground that information with respect thereto, or damage thereto, would be useful to an enemy, and
 - (d) any railway road, way, or channel, or other means of communication by land or water (including any works or structures being part thereof or connected therewith), or any place used for gas, water, or electricity works or other works for purposes of a public character, or any place where any ship, arms, or other materials or instruments of use in time of war, or any plans or documents relating thereto, are being made, repaired, or stored otherwise than on behalf of His Majosty, which is for the time being declared by notice by the Governor to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section, on the ground that information with respect thereto or the destruction or obstruction thereof, or interference therewill would be weful to an enemy

Expressions referring to communicating or receiving include any communicating or receiving, whether in whole or in part, and whether the sketch, plan, model, article, note, document, or information itself or the substance, effect, or description thereof only be communicated or received, expressions referring to obtaining or retaining any sketch, plan, model, article, note, or document, include the copying or causing to be copied the whole or any part of any sketch, plan, model, article, note, or document, and expressions referring to the communication of any sketch, plan, model, article, note or document include the transfer or transmission of the sketch, plan, model, article, note or document

- 3 If any person for any purpose prejudicial to the satety or interests Penalties for of the Government -
 - approaches or is in the neighbourhood of, or enters any (a) prohibited place within the meaning of this Ordinance, or

- On a prosecution under this section, it shall not be necessary to show that the accused person was guilty of any particular act tending to show a purpose prejudicial to the safety or interests of the Government, and, notwithstanding that no such act is proved against him, he may be convicted if, from the circumstances of the case, or his conduct, or his known character as proved, it appears that his purpose was a purpose prejudicial to the safety of interests of the Government, and it any sketch, plan, model, article, note, document, or information relating to or used in any prohibited place within the meaning of this Ordinance, or anything in such a place, is made, obtained, or communicated by any person other than a person acting under lawful authority, it shall be deemed to have been made, obtained, or communicated for a purpose prejudicial to the safety or interests of the Government unless the contrary is proved

7 If any person knowingly harbours any person whom he knows, or has reasonable grounds for supposing, to be a person who is about to commit or who has committed an offence under this Ordinance, or knowingly permits to meet or assemble in any premises in his occupation or under his control any such persons, or if any person having harboured any such person, or permitted to meet or assemble in any premises in his occupation or under his control any such persons, wilfully refuses to disclose to a Superintendent of Police any information which it is in his power to give in relation to any such person he shall be hable on conviction to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding one year, or to a fine, or to both

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council —

1 This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Public Holidays Short Title Ordinance, 1912"

The several days and each and every one of them in the first Schedule Days to be kept as mentioned, shall be kept as Public Holidays by the several Public Offices and Public Holidays in all Banks in the Protectorate

It shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, as may seem Apportinent of fit, by Proclamation, to appoint a special day or special days to be observed as special days to be observed as Public Holiday or Public Holidays, and any days so appointed shall be kept Holidays as Public Holidays as aforesaid

4 It any day appointed to be a Public Holiday shall tall on a Sunday, the Whin Public day next following not being itself a Public Holiday shall be kept as a Public Sunday

5. Anything in this Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding, it shall be Right to open lawful for the Head of any Government Department to open the Offices and public offices and works thereof and to call upon all or any persons employed in such department of public servants to perform such of their duties on any Public Holiday as to such Head of and Government Department may seem fit

(1) Whenever in any Ordinance, whether enacted before or atter the Interpretation of the commencement of this Ordinance, the expression "Public Holiday" in other Holiday" is used, such expression shall, unless a contrary Ordinances intention appears, be interpreted as meaning a Public Holiday appointed by or under this Ordinance

In the application of any imperial statute to the Protectorate the Interpretation of the expression "Bank Holiday" shall be interpreted as meaning Holiday" in a Public Holiday appointed by or under this Ordinance

An Ordinance to make further and better provision in regard to the powers and duties of Native Chiefs, Councils and Headmen recognised or appointed by the Governor and to provide for the enforcement of Native Authority.

[16th October, 1912]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council —

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Native Authority Ordinance, 1912

Appointment of He idmen

(1)It shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint any Chief or other Native he may think suitable or any Council of Elders to be the Official Headman or Collective Headmen (hereinafter referred to in the singular only as Headman) of any area which shall be specified in such appointment, and to make the Headmen of any area subordinate to the Headman of any other area, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time to suspend or cancel any such appointment Every appointment under this Section and every suspension or cancellation of such appointment shall be notified in the "Gazette"

All persons appointed as Headmen under the Village Headmen Ordinance, 1902 shall be deemed for the purposes of this Ordinance to have been appointed under this Ordinance

> Whenever a Council of Elders is appointed the Collective Headmen (2)of any area, the Provincial Commissioner in whose Province such area is situate shall from time to time appoint or shall cause the members of the Council to appoint, from among the Members of the Council, a President and a Deputy President of the Council, and any order of the Council issued under this Ordinance shall be issued through the President or in his absence through the Deputy President

Duty of Headmen to ment or order

It shall be the duty of every Headman to maintain order in the area in respect of which he shall have been appointed and for such purpose he shall have and exercise the jurisdiction and powers by this Ordinance conferred over the Natives residing or being within such area.

- Every Headman receiving information that any cattle or other live stock or other property of any description which has been stolen outside the local limits of his Jurisdiction has been brought and is within such local limits shall cause such cattle or other live stock or other property to be seized and detained pending the orders of the District Commissioner, and shall forthwith report such seizure and detention to the District Commissioner
- Any Headman may compel the attendance before a Native Tribunal of Heidmannian any Native within the local area of his jurisdiction and subject to the jurisdiction attendance of of such Tribunal

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council —

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Sales by Auction Ordinance Short Title 1912," and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1913

In this Ordinance the term "Auctioneer" includes every person selling by Definition Auction

Every person who sells or offers for sale any moveable or immove-Business of able property or any interest therein at any sale or roup where any person Auctioneer becomes or may become the purchaser of the same by competition and being the highest bidder, either by being the sole bidder, or increasing upon the biddings made by others, or decreasing on sums named by the Auctioneer or person acting as Auctioneer or other person at such sale, or by any other mode of sale by competition shall be deemed to carry on the business of an Auctioneer

Licensing of Auctioneers

Whoever carries on the business of an Auctioneer without Auctioneer to take having a licence in force authorising him to do so as by this licences Ordinance directed, shall be hable for each offence to a fine not exceeding 750 rupees

An Ordinance to make further and better Provision the Prevention of the Theft of Stock and Produce

- This Ordinance may be cited as "The Stock and Produce Theft Short Title Ordinance, 1912 "
 - (1) Sections 1 to 7 (both inclusive) shall apply to the whole of the Commencement Protectorate and shall come into operation on the publication of the Ordinance in the Gazette
- The Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, direct that the provisions of Section 8 shall apply to any Province, District or area specified in such notice, and may by such notice fix the date on which such section shall come into operation and take effect in such Province, District or area
 - In this Ordinance, unless inconsistent with the context Interpretation The term "District Commissioner" includes an Assistant District

Commissioner,

The term "farm" includes also a plantation orchard, and a market or nursery garden,

The term "Native" means a Native of Africa, not being of European or Asiatic race or origin, and includes a Somali,

The term 'produce" means agricultural produce and also all skins, hides, hoins of stock, wool, mohair and ostrich feathers.

The term "stock" means the male, female, or young, or cross of an animal of any of the following kinds —horse, ass, kine, sheep, goat, swine or domesticated ostrich, and the carcase or portion of the carcase of any slaughtered stock,

The term "sufficient fence" when applied to wire fences shall mean a fence of not fewer than four wires and not less than three feet six inches high, in other cases any fence, wall or hedge through which no stock could pass without breaking, or any natural boundary through or across which no sheep would ordinarily pass, and

The term "theft" includes every offence punishable under any of the section, tollowing of the Indian Penal Code, and includes also an attempt to commit and an abetment of, any such offences —

Sections 379, 380, 381, 382, 384, 386, 387, 392, 394, 395, 396, 403, 406, 408, 411 412, or 411

4 Whenever any Court shall convict any Native of the theft of stock of Minimum fine produce the Court shall, in addition to or in heu of imposing any other punishment to be imposed on authorised by law, sentence the Native convicted to pay a fine which shall of theft of stock in no case be less than ten times the value of the stock or produce in respect of or produce which the offence has been committed Provided, however, when two or more Natives tried jointly are convicted of such offence as aforesaid, the Court shall sentence each Native convicted to pay a fine of such amount as the Court may deem proper, provided that the total fine payable by all the convicted Natives shall not be less than ten times the value of the stock or produce in respect of which the offence has been committed

Whenever any Native shall be convicted of the theft of stock or produce Warrant for Jevy and shall be sentenced to pay a fine the Court passing sentence shall, unless the of fine imposed amount of the fine shall be forthwith paid, issue a wairant for the levy of the convicted of amount of the fine by distress and sale of any moveable property of the offender theft of stock or of the offender's family, sub-tribe or tribe or of any member of the offender's produce family, sub-tribe or tribe

Where warrint may be executed

6 A warrant issued under the last preceding section may be executed within the local limits of the jurisdiction of such Court, and it shall authorise the distress and sale of any such property without such limits, when endorsed by a Magistrate within the local limits of whose jurisdiction such property is found

Effect of such warrant

Whenever a warrant shall have been issued under Section 5, and no or insufficient moveable property of the offender shall be found to satisfy the fine, the warrant shall be executed against the moveable property, (1) or any member or members of the sub-tribe to which the offender belongs, (3) of any member or members of the tribe to which the offender belongs, in the order set out above, until the amount of the fine is levied

Trespass on farm offence

8

(1) Any Native who shall be found within a tarm or part of a tarm enclosed on all sides with a sufficient tence, or within a stock boma, and who, when so found, was not proceeding along some road or thoroughfare traversing such farm or part of a farm, and who also was on such tarm or part of a farm or in such cattle boma without the authority or consent of the owner or occupier or of some one who was entitled, or was by the person so found bona fide believed to be entitled to give such authority or consent, may be found guilty by the Court by which he is tried, of criminal trespass, unless he shall satisfy the Court that he was not there with intent to commit theft in respect of any stock or produce

Onus of proof ou accused

Any Native found guilty of criminal trespass under this section shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to three months, or with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees, or with both
