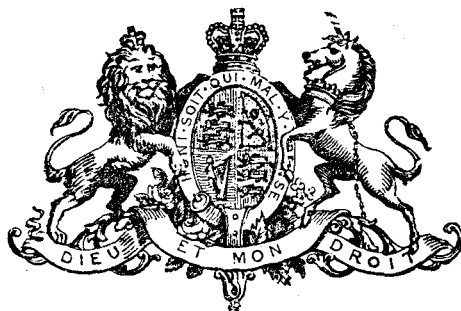

1. These Rules shall be read as one with Township Rules dated 2nd October, 1906, hereinafter called the Principal Rules.

2. Rule 1 of the Principal Rules is hereby repealed and the following Rule is hereby substituted therefor and shall for all purposes be read as Rule 1 of the Principal Rules, viz:

- (a) For the purpose of this Rule the word "vehicle" shall include any bicycle or tricycle and any conveyance for the carriage of persons or goods however drawn, propelled or kept or set in motion but shall not include a perambulator.
- (b) After the hour of 6-30 p.m., and until 6 a.m. Railway time, every vehicle standing in or proceeding along a public road, public place or thoroughfare shall be provided with a lighted lamp or lamps so placed as to throw the light in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding and giving a light equal to not less than one candle power per lamp.

- (c) Such lamp or one of such lamps shall be held or fixed and kept upon the off or right hand side of such vehicle except in the case of a bicycle.
- (d) Every vehicle used for freight or merchandise or for carrying timber shall be provided with a tail lamp in addition to a lamp in front and so placed as to throw the light backwards.
- (e) Every person being in charge of a vehicle or being conveyed in or on any vehicle not provided as aforesaid or (except as aforesaid) on which a lamp shall not be held or fixed and kept as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this Rule.

3. Rule 26 of Township Rules dated 28th April, 1909, is hereby repealed.

NOTICE.**Auction of Crown Leases, Eldoret Township.**

The District Commissioner, Eldoret, will sell by Public Auction at his Office at Eldoret on September 26th, 1913, at 10 a.m., the Crown Leases of the properties described in the schedule hereto.

The term of each lease shall be for 99 years, and the plots are offered for sale as Timber stacking and Fuel supply yards and necessary appurtenances thereto, subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned.

A sale plan of the plots may be inspected at the office of the District Commissioner, Eldoret, and also at the Public Map Office, attached to the Survey Department, Nairobi. Copies of the map may be obtained on application to the Survey Department, Cadastral Branch, Nairobi, price Rs. 1-50 post free.

Conditions.

1. Each plot will be auctioned separately, and no purchaser or body shall be allowed to purchase more than two plots.

2. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arises as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding. The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the Auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.

3. Each purchaser shall pay to the Officer representing Government immediately after the sale a deposit of 25% on his purchase money, and shall pay the residue of the purchase money to the Land Officer, Nairobi, on or before the 1st October, 1913. If a purchaser shall fail to pay the residue of the purchase money on or before the 1st October, 1913, the sale shall be void, and the deposit of 25% shall be forfeited to Government. Rent payable to 31st December, 1913, survey fees, and fees payable for preparation of deeds will be payable with the balance of the purchase money.

4. On payment of the residue of the purchase money the purchaser shall be entitled to enter into immediate occupation, and as soon thereafter as circumstances admit a formal lease shall be granted. The term of such lease, which shall be for 99 years, and the rent payable thereunder shall commence to run as from the 1st day of October, 1913.

5. Each purchaser shall within two years from the commencement of his lease fence in the plot or plots purchased by him on all sides and during the term of the lease shall keep the same so fenced with a good and substantial fence of not less than six feet in height to be approved by the Land Officer or such official as he may appoint for the purpose.

6. No building shall be erected on any plot unless the plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint.

7. Each purchaser shall be responsible *prorata* for the costs of the construction of roads adjoining his plot such cost to be leviable on completion of the roads.

8. Each purchaser shall undertake to drain his plot to the approval of Government, such drainage to be connected up with such main drainage system of the town as may hereafter be constructed.

9. No plot shall at any time during the term of the lease be used for any purpose other than the purpose for which it is sold, or used as a place of residence by any person or persons whatsoever.

10. Each lease shall contain a covenant against assigning, subletting or otherwise parting with the possession of the premises or any part thereof without the previous consent of the Governor in writing, and also a covenant to pay Rs. 15/- for every such consent.

11. If a purchaser shall fail to fence his plot as aforesaid within the said period of two years he shall either (a) pay as liquidated and ascertained damages for such default, and not as a penalty, the sum of Rs. 15/- per day for every day after the expiration of such two years until such completion, or (b) voluntarily and unconditionally surrender his lease and all expenses incurred thereunder. The lease of each plot shall contain a covenant on the part of the purchaser in the above terms, and also a proviso for re-entry on the breach of any of the covenants by the purchaser of the lease.

12. Each purchaser shall bear the cost of the deeds, stamps, registration and survey fees, and all other expenses, if any connected with the purchase.

13. So far as applicable the above conditions shall be embodied in each lease.
