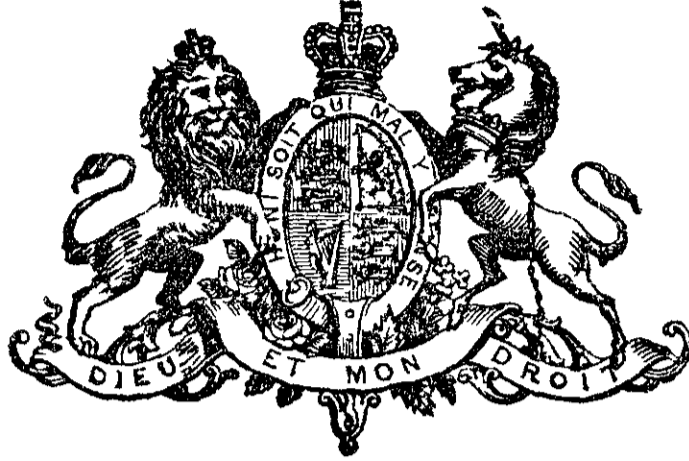

EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

AN ORDINANCE

No 5 OF 1917

An Ordinance to amend the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1915.

[June 13th, 1917]

Date of Assent and Commencement

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Compulsory Service Amendment Ordinance, 1917," and shall be construed with the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1915, hereafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

Short title

2 In this Ordinance —

Interpretation,

The expression "Employee" shall mean any person of European or Asiatic origin who at the date of the enactment of this Ordinance is engaged or who may at any time thereafter be engaged in any employment in any capacity other than as a master or employer and

The expression "Native" means any native of Africa not of European or Asiatic origin and includes any Somali

3 (1) No employee shall leave his employment without the consent of his employer. Provided that in the event of an employer's consent being unreasonably withheld the employee may appeal to the District Committee of the District in which the trade, business or occupation in which he is employed is situated and such District Committee may give the employee permission to leave his employment,

Employees not to leave employment without permission

And provided that in the event of the District Committee refusing such permission the employee may appeal from the decision of the District Committee to the War Council whose decision shall be final

(2) No person who has undertaken to perform work or supervision otherwise than as an employee for or on behalf of any person serving in any military corps formed in the Protectorate shall enlist or accept service in any military corps whether formed under the provisions of the Principal Ordinance or not or shall abandon or cease to perform such work or supervision without the sanction of the District Committee. Such sanction may be given on such terms as the District Committee may think fit. Provided that if such sanction is refused the person applying for such sanction may appeal to the War Council whose decision shall be final. Any person who performs such work or supervision negligently shall be deemed to have committed a breach of the provisions of this Ordinance

4 (1) Where an employee is discharged or dismissed by his employer or the employee otherwise leaves his employment in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance the employer shall forthwith give him a certificate that he is free to accept employment.

Issue of certificates that bearer is free to accept employment

(2) If any person complains to a District Committee that an employer has unreasonably refused or neglected to issue a certificate as aforesaid the District Committee may after inquiry into the case if it thinks fit itself issue such a certificate or order the issue of such a certificate by the employer

(3) A District Commissioner may issue a certificate as aforesaid to any person of European or Asiatic origin who has not heretofore been in employment in the Protectorate or to any person of European or Asiatic origin who is out of employment and has been out of employment since the 2nd day of May, 1917

PROCLAMATION No 55]

BY THE KING

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO
THE UNITED KINGDOM

GEORGE R I

WHEREAS by Section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas by Proclamations dated the 30th November, 1915, and the 15th February and 10th March, 1916, and entitled the Machine Tools (Prohibition of Import) Proclamation, 1915, the Prohibition of Import (Paper, Tobacco, Furniture Woods and Stones) Proclamation, 1916, and the Prohibition of Import (Canned, Bottled, Dried and Preserved Fruits) Proclamation, 1916, respectively, and by Proclamations dated the 21st March, 30th March, 10th May, 1st June, 27th June, 28th July, 18th August, 3rd October, 16th November, and 5th December and 22nd December, 1916, and entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations, 1916, and numbered 3 to 13 respectively, and by a Proclamation dated the 23rd February, 1917, and entitled the Prohibition of Import (No 14) Proclamation, 1917, the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly

And whereas it is expedient that the said Proclamations should be revoked, and a Proclamation consolidating the same, with amendments and additions, substituted in their place

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring, and it is hereby declared, that the above-mentioned Proclamations be and the same are hereby revoked

And we have further thought fit, by and with the advice aforesaid, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, further to declare, and it is hereby declared as follows —

As from and after the date hereof the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz —

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence

PROCLAMATION No 56]

BY THE KING

A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM,
 EXCEPT UNDER LICENCE OF ALL FOREIGN COINS OTHER THAN
 GOLD AND SILVER COINS

GEORGE R I

WHEREAS by Section two of the Customs Amendment Act, 1886, We are empowered from time to time to make and when made to revoke a Proclamation prohibiting the importation into Our United Kingdom of such coins coined in a foreign country as are in that behalf specified in such Proclamation

And whereas by Our Proclamation made the twenty fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty seven We did prohibit the importation into Our United Kingdom of all coins coined in any foreign country other than gold or silver coins

And whereas it is expedient that Our said Proclamation should be revoked, and that the importation into the United Kingdom of such coins coined in a foreign country as are hereinafter specified should be prohibited

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows —

1 Subject as hereinafter provided, all coins coined in any foreign country other than gold or silver coins are prohibited to be imported into Our United Kingdom

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that the foregoing prohibition shall not extend to any coins which are imported under and in compliance with the terms of any special or general licence issued by the Minister of Munitions

2 Our said Proclamation of the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, is hereby revoked

3 This Proclamation shall not affect the provisions of the Prohibition of Import (Consolidation and Amendment) Proclamation, 1917

4 This Proclamation may be cited as 'The Foreign Coins (Importation Prohibition) Proclamation, 1917,' and shall come into operation on the Thirtieth day of March, 1917

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1916.

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Ordinance, 1916, Section 2 (2), I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that the Statutory List contained in the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916 (Proclamation No 37), as amended by subsequent Proclamations, be further amended by making therein the additions, variations and removals contained in the Schedule to the Order dated the 30th day of March, 1917, made by the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and published in the *Official Gazette* (Government Notice No 199 of 1917)

ORDER OF THE LORDS IN COUNCIL

At the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 30th day of *March*, 1917

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such List as so varied or added to being in the last mentioned Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List"

And whereas the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect —

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from the Belgian Government the text of a declaration, which was published on the 19th March, 1917, of which the following is a translation —

An order of the German Governor, dated August 29th, 1916, prescribes, in violation of the principles of international law, the forced liquidation of certain concerns in the parts of Belgium occupied by the enemy

Further, according to reliable information, the German Government have ordered certain establishments to hand over to the Reichsbank the balances of current accounts standing in the names of French and British nationals

Belgian legislation, in which are incorporated the Hague Conventions, recognises neither the validity of the powers given by the occupying authorities to the sequestrators named by them for the purposes of liquidating nor the validity of the actual liquidations themselves. Consequently, after the liberation of the country, persons adversely affected by any abuse which the sequestrators or other authorities concerned with the liquidation may make of their powers, will have a legal remedy against such authorities or sequestrators and against their estates

All agreements or judicial acts involving anything beyond mere custody and maintenance will be liable to be annulled. The same applies to any alienation of real or personal property, transfers of credit, and in general to all acts disposing of property

Representatives, domiciled outside of the occupied parts of Belgium, of Belgian or foreign firms or companies placed under sequestration by the German authorities would run the risk of incurring, besides civil claims against them, the infliction of the penalties provided for by the law of December 10th, 1916, if they should carry out instructions given them by sequestrators or other authorities concurred in a liquidation

In denouncing to neutral and allied Powers these latest abuses of the German occupation, the Belgian Government begs them to warn their nationals against the possible legal consequences of entering into any transactions with agents whose powers are not valid

SILVER WAR BADGES

NOTICE

His Majesty The King has been pleased to approve of a silver badge being awarded to officers, soldiers, nurses and certain civilians who have left the Army owing to physical disability incurred by military service. Details are given below.

In order to be eligible for the badge, a soldier must have served a minimum period of 7 days with the colours since the 4th August, 1914.

Applicants belonging to the Protectorate forces should make application to the Secretariat, enclosing in original a statement from the Staff Officer Volunteers giving the dates of their enlistment and discharge.

SERVICE BADGES

A silver badge of the Imperial Cipher, pierced, within a circle. The circle bears the words "For King and Empire—Services Rendered". Each badge to bear a serial number.

(1) To be awarded to those officers and soldiers who, having served at home or abroad since 4th August, 1914, have, for age or physical incapacity, retired, relinquished their commissions, or been discharged from the Service, such incapacity being due to wounds or to sickness caused by military service.

(2) The award to include all troops—British, Indian and Colonial.

(3) To be worn only with plain clothes on the right breast or on the right lapel of the jacket.

(4) To be accompanied by a certificate bearing the same serial number. The certificate always to be in possession when the badge is worn.

(5) The badge will also be awarded to members of Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service, Regular, Reserve and Territorial Force, Queen Alexandra's Military Nursing Service for India, and members of Voluntary Aid Detachments who have quitted the Service under the conditions noted in (1).

(6) Also to civil practitioners regularly appointed to perform military duties and to other civilians who have occupied positions normally held by officers or other ranks of the Royal Army Medical Corps under a fixed agreement for a period of service, who have been forced to resign from physical incapacity caused by Military Service.
