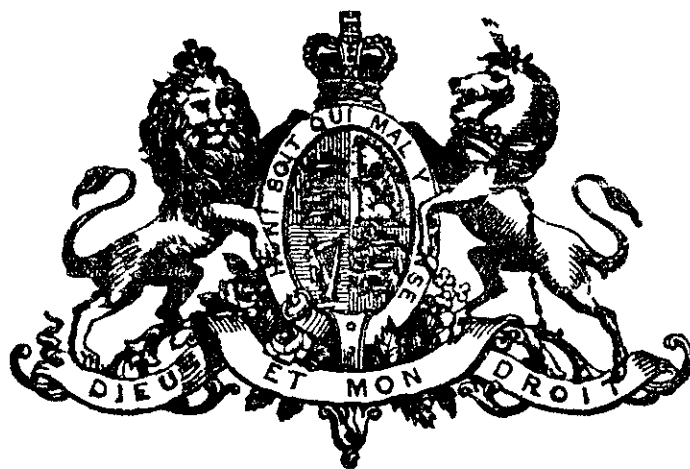

EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

AN ORDINANCE

No 6 OF 1917.

An Ordinance to apply a Sum of Money for the Service of the year ending the 31st day of March, 1918.

[June 18th, 1917] Date of Assent and commencement

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the “Appropriation Ordinance, 1917” Short Title

2 The Public Revenue for the year 1917–18, and other funds of the East Africa Protectorate, are hereby charged towards the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, with a sum of one million, four hundred and eighty-four thousand, and seventy-five pounds Total Expenditure charged in Public Revenue and other funds

3 The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied to the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto Application of money granted

4 The Treasurer of the Protectorate is hereby authorised and required, from time to time, upon the warrant or order of the Governor to pay out of the Revenue and other funds of the Protectorate, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of one million, four hundred and eighty-four thousand, and seventy-five pounds, which will come in course of payment during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen Treasurer's Authority for payment

AN ORDINANCE

No 7 OF 1917

An Ordinance to amend the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906.

[June 18th, 1917]

Date of Assent and Commencement

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1917," and shall be read together with the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, hereafter called the Principal Ordinance and all Ordinances amending the Principal Ordinance Short title

2 No action shall lie against the Government or any Officer of the Administration or any local authority for any act done in good faith under the provisions of the Principal Ordinance, or any amendment thereof or of any Proclamation, Rule or Order thereunder and no compensation shall be payable to any person for any act done under the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance or any amendment thereof unless the Governor otherwise directs, provided that, subject to the provisions of section 11 of the Principal Ordinance compensation for animals slaughtered under the Principal Ordinance shall be paid to the owner as follows —that is to say, where the animal was affected with disease one half of its value immediately before it became so affected but so that the compensation shall not exceed in the case of horses Rs 300/- in the case of mules Rs 200/- in the case of cattle Rs 150/- in the case of donkeys and camels Rs 100/- and in the case of other animals Rs 50/- and where the animal was not so affected but was suspected of being so affected the value of the animal immediately before it was slaughtered, but so that the compensation shall not exceed in the case of horses Rs 600/- in the case of mules Rs 400/- in the case of cattle Rs 300/- in the case of donkeys and camels Rs 200/- and in the case of other animals Rs 100/- Indemnity and payment of compensation

3 Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Repealed Repeal

AN ORDINANCE

No 8 OF 1917

An Ordinance to amend the Merchant Seamen Discipline Ordinance, 1917.

[June 18th, 1917]

Date of Assent and Commencement

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Merchant Seamen Discipline Amendment Ordinance, 1917" and shall be construed together with the Merchant Seamen Discipline Ordinance, 1917, hereafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance Short title

- 2 (1) That part of section 2 (1) of the Principal Ordinance from the beginning down to and including the words "requisitioned by the Admiralty" is hereby repealed and the following words are hereby substituted therefor —
- "If whilst within the jurisdiction a person lawfully engaged to serve on board any ship or vessel belonging to or chartered, hired or requisitioned by the Admiralty or Army Council" —
- (2) In section 2 (1) (a) of the Principal Ordinance after the words "to proceed to sea in his ship" shall be inserted the words "or deserts"
- (3) To section 2 of the Principal Ordinance shall be added the following sub-section —
- Evidence**
- "(3) For the purposes of this section a copy of any entry made in an official log book in manner prescribed by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall if it purport to be signed and certified as a true copy or extract by the officer in whose custody the original log book is entrusted be admissible in evidence"

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the "Anzac" (Restriction on Trade Use of Word) Ordinance, 1917

Prohibition of

word Anzac

2 (1) As from the commencement of this Ordinance it shall not be lawful to use in connection with any trade, business, calling, or profession the word "Anzac" or any word closely resembling that word, without the authority of the Governor given on the request of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the Dominion of New Zealand, and this prohibition shall apply notwithstanding that such word forms part of any trade mark, or of the name of any company or society or other body, which has been registered before the passing of this Ordinance

(2) If any person acts in contravention of this Ordinance he shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance, and liable on conviction by a Magistrate holding a Subordinate Court of the 1st or 2nd Class to a fine not exceeding 150 rupees, or in the case of a second or subsequent conviction not exceeding 1,500 rupees, and when a company or society is guilty of any such contravention, without prejudice to the liability of the company or society, every director, manager, secretary, or other officer of the company or society who is knowingly a party to the contravention, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and liable to the like penalty

THE CUSTOMS AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1915.

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Customs Amendment Ordinance, 1915, Section 2, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that the Proclamation dated the 24th day of June, 1916 (Proclamation No 34), as amended and added to by subsequent Proclamations be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same —

PROCLAMATION No 61]

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906.

PROCLAMATION,

WHEREAS cases of rinderpest have occurred in the Fort Hall District of the Kenya Province Now therefore I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, do hereby declare all the following area to be an infected area for the purposes of the above Ordinance —

Commencing Summit Mt Kinangop (Niaudamara), thence in a straight line to the source of the Maragua River, thence along the Maragua to its junction with the Kithanuye, thence down the Kithanuye River to its junction with the Tana River, thence up the Tana River to its junction with the Mugono River, thence up the Mugono River to its principal source, thence by a straight line in a Westerly direction to Mt Kinangop (Niaudamara) the point of commencement

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 214]

UNDER MARTIAL LAW

REGULATIONS

HIS EXCELLENCY the Acting Governor has been pleased to issue the following Regulations under Martial Law —

1 Until further notice no person shall sell or attempt to sell at Nairobi for cash native grown maize, maize meal made from native grown maize or Machakos ghee at a price above the following maximum prices —

Native grown maize	2—00	per load of 60 lbs
Maize meal from Native grown maize or in the case of quantities less than 60 lb of maize meal	2—75	„ „ „ „ 20 lbs for Re 1
Machakos ghee	0—70	per lb

2 (1) The District Commissioner of any District other than Nairobi may fix the maximum price in the District for cash sales of the articles set out in Regulation 1 having due regard

- (a) to the fact whether or not the article is produced in the District,
- (b) to the maximum price fixed at Nairobi by Regulation 1, and
- (c) to the cost of transport

(2) The District Commissioner shall post outside his office any maximum prices fixed under this Regulation

(3) When a maximum price for sale for cash of any article has been fixed by a District Commissioner under these Regulations no person in the District shall sell or attempt to sell such article for cash at a price above such maximum price

3 These Regulations and the Regulations under Martial Law of the 25th day of May, 1917 (Government Notice No 179), and of the 5th day of June, 1917 (Government Notice No 196), may be administered by any Magistrate holding a Subordinate Court of the first or second class

4 These Regulations shall be read together with the Martial Law Regulations of the 10th day of December, 1914, and any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs 5,000 or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding 6 months or to both

5 Regulation 4 of the Regulations under Martial Law dated the 25th day of May, 1917 (Government Notice No 179), the Regulations under Martial Law of the 28th day of May, 1917 (Government Notice No 180), and the Regulations under Martial Law of the 30th day of April, 1917 (Government Notice No 150) are hereby revoked

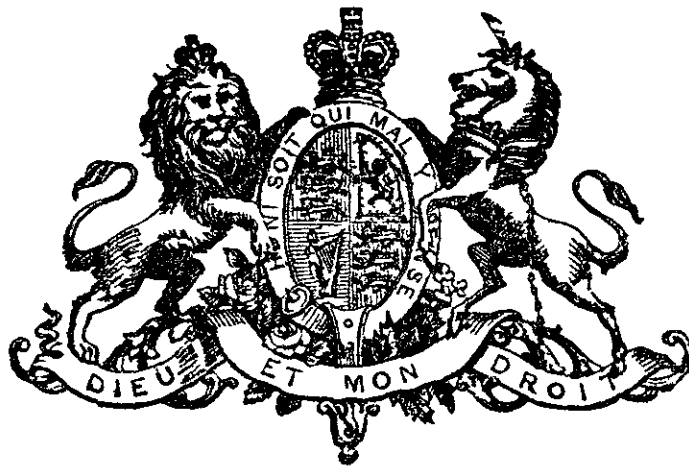

SIR,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Circular (b) of September 7th, 1916, and, in reply, to submit for the consideration of the Army Council the names of the undermentioned local units and of individuals prominently connected therewith which are in my opinion deserving of official recognition in respect of valuable services rendered to the Protectorate

2 The Mombasa Town Guard was formed immediately after the outbreak of war, and was the first organised effort made to resist attack, either by sea or land, on the island and the adjacent area. With the assistance of a Naval and a Military officer, it constructed and manned such defences as were possible on the seaward side of the island, at the cable station, and at the Salisbury railway bridge. The arrangements made by this force were such that, had the "Königsberg" arrived off the island, as was hourly expected, it would have been possible to remove all European non-combatants from the island before the commencement of an offensive by the enemy.

3 The late Captain Arthur Thomas Bonham Carter was principally responsible for raising this force. He commanded it with most exemplary energy, and it was largely due to his personal efforts that it became a valuable asset in the defence of the Coast.

4 The Mombasa Defence Force was formed in 1915 in accordance with the expressed desire of the civilian community that they should be trained and armed so as to enable them to share with the military forces the various duties appertaining to the defence of the island. Their attention to training was assiduous, and they rendered material service by sharing with the military detachment the duties of guards and patrols.

5 The force was under the command of Mr George Northcote Crisford, District Commissioner, who displayed commendable activity in maintaining its efficiency and supervising the performance of the duties entrusted to it.

6 When the various units recruited from the British community of the Protectorate were enrolled at the commencement of the war, it became necessary at the same time to establish a staff office to control all details relating to these organisations. Captain Hamilton Frederick Waid, late Irish Guards and King's African Rifles, was appointed Staff Officer at the outset, and has continued to perform those duties up to the present time to the complete satisfaction of the General Staff and of the members of the Protectorate units. Devoting the whole of his time to this work, it has been necessary for him to sacrifice his business for the time being, and the part he has thus played in the defence of the country is worthy of high appreciation.

7 The Nairobi Defence Force came into existence in 1915 as the result of the determination of the local European community that it was their duty to render the fullest assistance should the necessity arise for defending the town from attack. The movement was taken up with general enthusiasm, most of the heads of Government Departments and of the principal commercial houses setting the example to their subordinates by joining the ranks. Drills, target practice, route marches, and other details of training were carried out daily, with the result that within a few months the force had developed into a most serviceable unit of four companies numbering over 400 men. I know that the Military authorities are in agreement with my view that, had Nairobi been exposed to any offensive movement by the enemy, the Defence Force could be relied upon to render most material assistance.

8 The Defence Force was commanded throughout by Major Joseph Corbet Ward, late Imperial Yeomanry. He accepted the task with alacrity and performed it to the complete satisfaction of all. Since the activities of the Force have been relaxed he has acted as Base Commandant at Nairobi. Both these duties have been performed in a manner which merits appreciative recognition.

9 The success which attended the enrolment and development of the Nairobi Defence Force was very largely due to the unwearying efforts and conspicuous example of the late Captain Henry Valder Kershaw, the London Regiment. This officer acted as Adjutant to the Force and did much to encourage and support the movement by his personal enthusiasm and untiring devotion to its cause. I estimate his services at a high value and well worthy of official approbation.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch of the 15th November last, submitting the names of those local units and officers whom you wish to bring to notice for their special services in connection with local defence measures, and the military situation caused by the war

2 These recommendations were laid before the Army Council, who decided to make a special public notification of the names of those officers throughout the Empire deemed to be deserving of recognition, although their services may not have been sufficient to merit the recognition known as a "mention in despatches" or any higher reward, judged by the standard applied in the cases of officers who have participated in actual military operations in the field

3 The publication of names was made by a War Office notice of 24th February, 1917, issued through the Press Bureau on the 26th and 27th of February I enclose a copy of this notice I have been informed by the War Office that the officers named therein are granted the Reward of an honourable "entry in their record of service"

4 I would suggest that the portion of the list which concerns the Protectorate should be published in the Official Gazette of the Protectorate, together with your despatch and this reply as a public acknowledgment on behalf of His Majesty's Government of the local services which have been rendered

5 I would explain that the Army Council have dealt only with the services of military officers or with those services which may be considered to bear a purely military character, but I shall not overlook the fact that you may desire also to submit for consideration the names of civilians who may deserve eventual recognition In any case you will be good enough to cause a note to be made on the record of service of any official of the Protectorate administration whose name has been included in your recommendations as meriting recognition in this connection

6 I have also received Mr Bowring's despatch of 29th December last with the accompanying lists of those members of the Uganda Railway running staff commended for their courage and sense of duty in working the traffic through the danger zone from April 1915, to January 1916 Their names have been communicated to the Army Council, and I shall be glad if you will publish Mr Bowring's despatch along with this correspondence as a further notification of my recognition of their work
