CONDITIONS

1 Each plot shall be auctioned separately

2 The Government reserve the right to withdraw any plot from the sale at any time prior to the same being offered for sale

3 The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arises as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding

4 The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the Auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted

5 Each purchaser shall pay to the Auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 25% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused. Provided that no monies need be paid for any plot unless and until Government is in a position to give occupation of that plot

6 The balance of the purchase money together with the survey fees amounting to Rs 42/50 and the fees payable for the preparation of the lease amounting to Rs 45/- shall be paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office, Nairobi within 7 days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser, if the conditions of sale have been complied with, shall be entitled to a lease of the plot, which lease shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be but the purchaser shall not be entitled to any interest or compensation for delay, other than

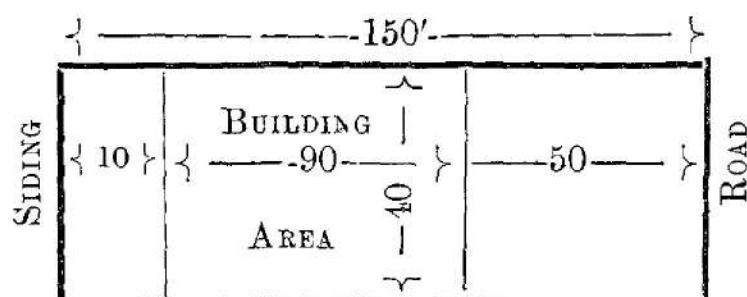
8 Subject to the provisions contained in condition 6 hereof, if the balance of the purchase money, together with the survey fee, and the fees payable for the preparation of the lease, is not paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office, Nairobi as aforesaid within 7 days from the date of the sale the Land Officer may order that the deposit made by the purchaser shall be forfeited to Government and the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the plot

9 Each purchaser shall erect on his plot within 2 years from the date of the commencement of his lease a Godown constructed of stone, brick, concrete or corrugated iron on an iron frame or other approved material on a raised stone plinth with a platform abutting the railway siding of the regulation height of 2 feet 3 inches above rail level with efficient latrine accommodation thereto annexed, the said building to be erected under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the Manager of the Uganda

Railway or such official as he may appoint for the purpose. Provided that if satisfactory proof be produced that owing to abnormal conditions beyond his control a lessee has been unable to fulfil the conditions within the period specified His Excellency the Governor may grant such relief as he thinks fit provided further that if any abnormal delay shall occur in returning building plans to the lessee after the same have been submitted for approval a period equal in extent to that of the delay shall be added to the period specified for the fulfilment of the building conditions, and provided also that in the case of any dispute as to whether there has been "any abnormal delay" the decision of His Excellency the Governor thereon shall be final.

10 Each purchaser shall within two years from the commencement of his lease completely enclose his plot with a fence of suitable and approved design and in conformity with any Township Regulations for the time being in force for the Township of Kisumu.

11 No building shall be erected nearer than 50 feet from the road frontage of any plot or nearer than 10 feet from the siding frontage of any plot, thus



12 No building shall be erected on any plot unless and until full and proper plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Manager of the Uganda Railway or such other person as he may appoint for the purpose.

13 Each plot and every building and erection thereon shall be kept clean and in a good and tenantable state of repair.

14 Before any buildings erected on any plot may be occupied the lessee shall submit a block plan of the plot with the position of such buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot which will satisfy the Medical Officer of Health for the time being of the Township of Kisumu and shall also satisfy the said Medical Officer of Health that such system of drainage has been properly constructed, such satisfaction in both cases to be expressed in writing.

15 Any buildings erected upon any plot shall at all times during the term of the lease be used for the purposes of a Godown and offices for business purposes in connection therewith and for no other purposes whatsoever and in particular shall not be used as a place of residence by any person or persons whomsoever.

16 The storage of any goods of an inflammable or explosive nature on any plot or in any building erected on any plot is prohibited, except with the previous written consent of the Manager of the Uganda Railway.

17 The Railway Administration cannot guarantee the construction of Railway sidings within any definite period, but the General Manager undertakes to construct sidings as soon as material is available.

18 The stacking of any goods on any plot is prohibited unless in a godown or unless properly protected from the weather.

19 Each lessee shall duly and suitably connect his premises with any Town Drainage System when in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health for the time being of the Township of Kisumu such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the lessee reasonably so to do.

20 At no time shall any plot be sub divided in any manner whatsoever.

21 The Government and all persons duly authorised by them shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the lessee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

22 Every purchaser shall bear the cost of the preparation and completion of the necessary deeds, stamp duty, registration and survey fees, and all other expenses, if any, connected with the purchase of the plot.

23 In so far as applicable the above conditions shall be embodied in each lease.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1 Each plot shall be auctioned separately.
- 2 The highest bidder shall be the purchaser and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding.
- 3 The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 4 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 25% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 5 The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st day of December, 1920, the survey fees and the fees payable for the

7 Subject to the proviso contained therein if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent, fees and duty mentioned in Condition No 5 is not paid to the Land Officer, at the Land Office, Nairobi, within 7 days from the date of the sale, the Land Officer may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited and the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the plot.
