THE INDIAN EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1881

#### 1 LLES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Explosives Act, 1884, as applied to the East Africa Protectorate and of all other powers him thereunto enabling His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

- 1 The Rules may be cited as "The Explosive (Blasting Powder) Amendment Rules, 1920," and shall be read as one with "The Explosive (Blasting Powder) Rules, 1919," hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules"
- Anything in the Principal Rules to the contrary notwithstanding licences to possess Blasting Powder at such places as shall be approved, and if the quantity to be possessed at the same time does not exceed 50 lbs may be granted to a person for his private use and not for sale by the District Commissioner of the district in which such person resides subject to such conditions as the District Commissioner may prescribe and in particular subject to the following conditions—
  - (a) Every application for a licence under this Rule shall be submitted to the District Commissioner and shall clearly set forth the description of Blasting Powder required, the purpose for which it is to be used, the situation, character and construction of the building in which the Blasting Powder is to be kept
  - (b) Every licence granted under this Rule shall be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto annexed, and shall be subject to the conditions prescribed therein
