WHEREAS We have taken into Our Royal consideration the loyal and zealous services rendered to Us and to Our Empire by Native Chiefs or other Native Dignitaries in Our Colonies and Protectorates and in other territories in East and West Africa, or elsewhere, which are under the administration or surveillance of Our Principal Secretaries of State for Foreign Affairs or for the Colonies

And Whereas We are desirous of recognizing such services by some mark of Our Royal favour,

Now We do by these Presents for Us, Our heirs and successors, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded to such Native Chiefs or other Native Dignitaries as aforesaid who by their zeal in Our service and loyalty to Us and to Our Empire may have merited or may hereafter merit such distinction

2 The Medal shall be of silver, or in exceptional cases of silver-gilt, and shall be designated and styled "The King's Medal for Native Chiefs" It shall be worn around the neck pendent from a chain of silver or silver-gilt as the case may be

3 The obverse of the Medal shall bear Our effigy and on the reverse shall be depicted a merchant vessel, plying, under the protection of a ship of war, outside a harbour illumined by a tropical sun

4 The Medal shall be awarded with the approval of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State by Our Governor or other Our Representative for the time being in the Colony, Protectorate or other territory in which the Chief or Dignitary may be resident

5 The names of the recipients of the Medal shall be published in the *Government Gazette* of the territories concerned, or in such other manner as may be deemed practicable

6 If any Chief or Dignitary to whom the Medal is awarded be guilty of any grave misdemeanour, he may be deprived of it by Our Governor or other Our Representative as aforesaid with the assent of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, but the Medal may, with the like assent, be subsequently restored to him

7 Upon the death of any recipient of the Medal it shall forthwith be returned to Our Governor or other Our Representative as aforesaid, unless he shall in any instance deem otherwise expedient, but

in no case shall the Medal be worn by any other than the Chief or Dignitary to whom it was awarded

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as "The Diseases of Animals Amendment Rules (No 2) of 1920," and shall be read as one with the Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Rules" and all amendments thereof

2 Rules 26, 28 (2) and 31 of the Principal Rules are hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor —

26 Persons with cattle from the Northern Frontier District or Jubaland entering the Kenya or Naivasha Province shall follow the Uaso Nyiro River to its junction with the Isiolo River, thence along the West Bank of the Isiolo River, upstream, to the Isiolo Quarantine Station and by no other route

At the Isiolo Quarantine Station they will be inspected and actively immunised against Rinderpest at a charge of Rs 3/- per head and otherwise dealt with as may be considered necessary. Before leaving the quarantine station they will be dipped as required at a charge of cents six per head per dipping

When released they will be under the same conditions as cattle in the clean areas

Before arrival at the Uaso Nyiro River notice shall be given to the Administrative Officer Archer's Post, giving the probable date of arrival of the cattle at Isiolo Quarantine Station and the numbers of such cattle

3 28 (2) Every person moving sheep or goats from the Northern Frontier District or Jubaland shall enter the Kenya or Naivasha Province via the Isiolo Quarantine Station where the sheep or goats shall be dipped at a charge of cents four per-

head per dipping and thereafter a permit for further movement shall be obtained from the Officer-in-Charge, Isiolo Quarantine Station

4 31 Persons with horses or mules from the Northern Frontier District or Jubaland shall enter Kenya or Naivasha Province overland via the Isiolo Quarantine Station, or such other place as the Chief Veterinary Officer may by notice in the Official Gazette direct, where such horses or mules shall be inspected and tested with Mallein at a charge of Rs 5/- per head and shall be dipped as may be required at a charge of cents six per head per dipping

TRAVELLERS through France are hereby notified that the French Government have prohibited the export from France of gold and silver coin, whether French or foreign Travellers will be allowed to take out of France not more than ten francs in silver or the sterling equivalent. Not more than 1,000 francs or the sterling equivalent may be exported in Bank Notes, whether French or foreign.
