GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 30.

THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT, 1898,

AND

THE POST OFFICE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1919.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Indian Post Office Act, 1898, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate, and the Post Office Amendment Ordinance 1919, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

(I). These rules may be cited as the Foreign Money Order and Postal Order Rules, 1921.

(II). All rules heretofore made, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act and Ordinance, or howsoever otherwise, relating to the issue by the Post Office of Foreign Money Orders or of Postal Orders are hereby suspended.

(III). The issue of Foreign Money Orders, and Postal Orders is hereby suspended.

(IV). These rules shall come into operation on the Second day of February, 1921.
