AMERICAN PASSPORTS.

AMERICAN CITIZENS. Passports are no longer required of American Citizens entering or leaving the United States, but on account of the fact that almost all other countries require visaed passports as a condition of entry, passports will continue to be issued to American Citizens upon application.

ALIENS. Aliens are not required to have passports for leaving the United States, but all Aliens desirous of entering the United States must have passports which must be visaed by an American Consular Officer in the country and the Consular district from which the holder first starts upon his journey with the intention of proceeding to the United States.

Should application for a visa to enter the United States be made before a Consular Officer in a country which the bearer may afterwards visit, Consular Officers are instructed to refuse to visa and to advise the applicant to return to the country from which he started in order to make application at the appropriate Consular Office.

An Alien's passport may include his wife, female children under 21 years of age, and male children under 16 years of age, provided that a photograph of each person included in the passport is attached thereto. Males over 16 and females over 21 years of age must have separate passports. Children below the age of 12 unaccompanied by their parents are not required to have passports, but they must be in the charge of a duly authorised guardian.

A fee of \$1 (Fls. 3/25) is to be collected for the visa application and a fee of \$9 (Fls. 29/00) for the visa.

The purchaser shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage which shall satisfy the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he shall appoint, for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot, and before any building may be occupied, the purchaser shall satisfy the Commissioner of Lands that such system of drainage has been properly constructed.

9. The purchaser shall suitably connect his premises with any Town Drainage System, when, in the opinion of the Commissioner of Lands such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the purchaser reasonably so to connect.

10. No sub-division of the plot will at any time be allowed.

11. The purchaser shall, within one year of the commencement of the Lease, completely enclose the plot with a fence of suitable design and in conformity with the Township Regulations.

12. All outbuildings, offices, etc. shall be properly screened from view to the satisfaction of the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint and shall be kept so screened during the term of the Lease.

13. No building may approach within a less distance than 10 feet of the boundary of the plot, and at least one-half of the plot must remain unbuilt upon.

The Director of Public Works, or such person as may be appointed for the purpose, shall have the right to enter upon the plot and lay and have excess to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the purchaser shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforesaid.
