The following instructions from the Secretary of State regarding the wearing of Uniform by Civil Officers of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya are published for information of those concerned.

The date upon w'ich this uniform will be brought into use will be notified later when a supply of the necessary buttons and badges has been procured from the Crown Agents.

FIELD SERVICE DRESS.

The Field Service Dress described below will be worn by Administrative Officers when on duty and other officers when on tour:

(a) Khaki tunic, military pattern, without shoulder straps, of drill or serge, with turn-down collar and four large brass buttons having the Badge of the Colony thereon. Khaki braid ½ inch wide with ½ inch between each row, and small brass buttons of the above-mentioned design on the two breast pockets and two side pockets and also on cuffs according to Grade. No belt, but fitting at waist; slit at back from waist.

Grade 1. Three rows of braid, the uppermost with circle, and three buttons.

Grade 2. Two rows of braid, the uppermost with circle, and two buttons.

Grade 3. One row of braid with circle, and one button.

- (b) Khaki shirts with two pockets and small buttons as described above may be worn when on tour, in place of a tunic.
- (c) Khaki drill or serge breeches or trousers. Shorts may be worn on tour only.
 - (d) Khaki puttees, or leggings of brown leather.

- (c) Brown boots.
- (f) White shirt and black tie, or khaki shirt and khaki tie.
- (a) Khaki helmet with khaki puggaree and Badge of the Colony.
- (h) White, with white braid, may be substituted for khaki for use at Coast Stations if so desired.

If Field Service Dress is worn by the Governor or Officer Administering the Government, the uppermost row of braid, but not the circle, will be one inch in width.

Medical Officers will wear a piping of very narrow red braid on both edges of the uppermost row of braid and circle.

With the sanction of the Governor, junior officers may wear the Field Service Dress, but without braid or buttons on the cuff.

FEES FOR VETERINARY ATTENDANCE.

THE Public are hereby informed that until further notice and with effect from this date Veterinary Officers are permitted to charge fees for services rendered in connection with: (a) Examinations of animals for soundness; (b) Treatment of diseases of livestock of a non-contagious and non-infectious nature; (c) Surgical operations such as castrations, parturitions and treatment of wounds and injuries, and (d) Treatment of all ailments of dogs and cats.

If a Veterinary Officer uses a Government motor car in attending private cases he shall pay the usual Government rates for the hire of same, and he will be entitled to recover that amount from the owner of the animal attended.

It is to be understood that Government has the first claim upon the time of the Veterinary Officer for services under the Diseases of Animals Act, and such private practice as Veterinary Officers are allowed to perform must not interfere with their official duties.
