INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Kenya.

GEORGE, R. I.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Kenya, or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Colony

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland bearing date the Eleventh day of September 1920, We did constitute order and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) in and over Our Colony of Kenya (therein and hereinafter called the Colony)

Recites Letters Patent of 11th September 1920

And whereas We did thereby authorise, empower and command the Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenour of Our said Letters Patent and of any Orders in Council relating to the territories formerly known as the East Africa Protectorate, save in so far as any provision of any such Order in Council may be repugnant to any of the provisions of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as may be issued to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order in Council or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Colony

And whereas certain Instructions bearing date the Eleventh day of September 1920 were issued under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet for the guidance of the Governor or other Officer administering the Government of the Colony, and providing amongst other things for the constitution of the Legislative Council of the Colony

Recites instructions of 11th September 1920

And whereas We are minded to make further and other provision in regard to the constitution of the said Legislative Council

Now therefore, We do, by these Our Additional Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, revoke, as from the date of the receipt thereof by the Governor in the Colony, Clauses XV, XIX and XX of the aforesaid

Revokes Clauses XV, XIX, and XX of above recited Instructions

Instructions of the Eleventh day of September 1920 but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and instead thereof We do direct and enjoin and declare Our Will and pleasure that, as from the date of such receipt the aforesaid Instructions of the Eleventh day of September 1920 shall be read and construed as if in place of the above-mentioned Clauses the following Clauses had been inserted therein

Constitution of the
Legislative Council

XV The Legislative Council of the Colony shall consist of the Governor as President, ten *ex officio* Members, Nominated Official Members not exceeding seven in number, eleven European Elected Members and one Nominated Indian Unofficial Member. Provided that if one of the Nominated Official Members is not specially appointed to represent the interests of the Arab community there shall be a Nominated Unofficial Member to represent such interests

Nominated Arab Un-
official Member

XIX The Nominated Indian Unofficial Members of the Legislative Council shall be such fit persons not holding office in the Public Service of the Colony or of the Protectorate of Kenya as the Governor in pursuance of Instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time appoint by an Instrument under the Public Seal. The Nominated Unofficial Member (if any) of the Council to represent the interests of the Arab community shall be such Arab or other person representing such interest and not holding office in the Public Service of the Colony or of the Protectorate of Kenya as the Governor in pursuance of Instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal. All such members hold their places in the Council during Our pleasure and shall in any case vacate their seats at the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment but may be re-appointed

Order of Members

XX The Members of the Legislative Council shall take precedence as We may specially assign and, in default thereof first the *ex officio* Members in the order in which their respective offices are above mentioned secondly the Nominated Official Members according to the priority of their respective appointments, or if appointed by the same Instrument according to the Order in which they are named therein, thirdly, the European Elected Members in order of date of election, or if elected at the same general election according to the alphabetical order of their names, fourthly, the Nominated Indian Unofficial Members according to the priority of their respective appointments, or, if appointed by the same Instrument, according to the order in which they are named therein, fifthly, the Nominated Unofficial Member (if any) representing the interests of the Arab community

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS
ORDINANCE, 1909

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1909, the Municipal Council of Nairobi with the approval of His Excellency the Governor have made the following Bye laws —

1 These Bye-laws may be cited as the Nairobi (Municipal Forest) Bye-laws, 1922, and shall be read as one with the Nairobi Township Rules of 1917

2 The area in Nairobi hereunder described and hereinafter referred to as the Municipal Forest Reserve, shall be under the control of the Municipal Council of Nairobi that is to say, an area bounded as follows viz —

Commencing at the junction of the Fort Hall or Limoru Roads thence bounded by the Eastern boundary of the Limoru Road Northerly to its intersection with the South eastern boundary of a Road of access to Sub division No 870, thence by the South-eastern boundary of that Road of access North-eastern to the South western boundary of Sub division No 870 thence by a part of the South-western boundary of that Sub division South-eastern to its most Southern corner on the North-western boundary of Sub division No 193 thence by a part of the North western boundary of that Sub-division South westerly to its most Western corner, thence by a part of the generally South-western boundary of Sub division No 193 South easterly to the most Northern corner of Sub-division No 195, thence by the North western boundary of that Sub division South westerly to its most Western corner, thence by a part of the South western boundary of that Sub division South easterly to its intersection with the North-western boundary of the Kiambu Road, thence by the North western boundary of that Road South westerly to its intersection with the Northern boundary of the Fort Hall Road where it merges into the Kiambu Road, thence by the Northern boundary of that Road Westerly to the point of commencement But excluding therefrom that part thereof which is at present controlled by the Municipal Council of Nairobi and used as a Cemetery

3 Any person who shall in the Municipal Forest Reserve —

(1) be found trespassing between the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m., except on the fenced pathway traversing the Western section thereof

(2) drive or pasture cattle, sheep or goats or other animals except on the said pathway

(3) injure or deface any trees or shrubs or injure any fences, seat or notice boards, or without authority of the Council fell or remove any trees, shrubs or flowers

(4) shoot or hunt, without authority of the Municipal Council

(5) deposit paper, bottles or refuse of any sort

(6) kindle fire, except at places approved by the Council

shall be guilty of an offence

4 Offences against these Bye-laws shall be cognizable by the Police

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE 1909

BYE-LAWS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1909 the Municipal Council of Nairobi with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, have made the following Bye-laws —

1 These Bye-laws may be cited as Nairobi (Barbed Wire) Bye-laws, 1922 and shall be read and construed with Nairobi Township Rules of 1917 (hereinafter called "the Principal Bye-laws")

2 Bye-law 544 of the Principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following clause —

The Town Clerk may serve upon the owner or occupier of any plot upon which there is unauthorised barbed wire a notice in writing calling upon him to remove such barbed wire within a period to be specified in such notice and such owner or occupier shall comply with such notice, and if such notice be not complied with any authorised servant of the Council may enter upon the premises and remove such barbed wire therefrom

The Council may cause such barbed wire to be sold by auction and shall apply the proceeds of sale (1) in paying the expenses (if any) attending such sale (2) in recouping themselves for the expenses of removing such barbed wire and rendering the overplus (if any) to the owner of such barbed wire

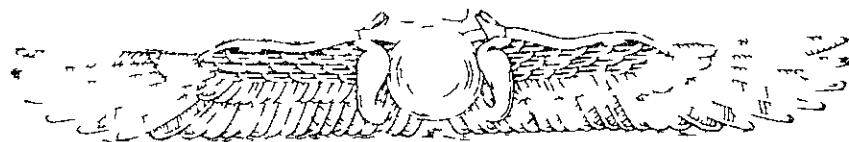
