INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Kenya.

GEORGE, R I

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Kenya, or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Colony

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Recites Letters Patent Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland bearing date the Eleventh day of September 1920, We did constitute order and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) in and over Our Colony of Kenya (therein and heremafter called the Colony)

of 11th September 1920

And whereas We did thereby authorise, empower and command the Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenoin of Our sud Letters Patent and of any Orders in Council relating to the territories formerly known as the East Africa Protec torate, save in so far as any provision of any such Order in Council may be repugnant to any of the provisions of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as may be issued to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order in Council or by Us through one of Om Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Colony

And whereas certain Instructions bearing date the Recites instructions of Eleventh day of September 1920 were issued under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet for the guidance of the Governor or other Officer administering the Government of the Colony, and providing amongst other things for the constitution of the Legislative Council of the Colony

The surplus, if any, will be paid to the proprietor of the goods on his application in writing for the same within 12 months from the date of sale, but if on the expiration of that time no such application shall have been made the surplus will be forfeited and will be applied as if it had been originally paid as the duty due and pavable
