An Ordinance to Supply a Further Sum of Money for the Service of the Period 1st April to 31st December, 1921.

- This Ordinance may be cited as "The Supplementary short title. Appropriation Ordinance, 1922.
- 2. The Public Revenue for the period 1st April to 31st Public Revenue and charged. December, 1921, and other funds of the Colony Protectorate of Kenya are hereby charged towards the service of the period 1st April to 31st December, 1921, with a further sum of one hundred and seventy-one thousand, nine hundred and fiftythree pounds, eight florins and twenty-nine cents, in addition to the sums provided by the Appropriation Ordinance No. 52, 1921.

3. The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied to Application of the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed money granted.

4. The Treasurer of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya is Treasurer's hereby given authority for having paid out of the Revenue and authority for other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, for the payment. several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of one hundred and seventy-one thousand nine hundred and fifty-three pounds, eight florins and twenty-nine cents, which have come in course of payment during the period 1st April to 31st December,

A Bill

Intituled

An Ordinance to Amend the Customs Ordinance, 1910, as Amended by the Customs Amendment Ordinance, 1913.

Short title and commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Customs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922, and shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1923.

Definition.

2. The terms "nett revenue" and "nett total import and export duty" shall have the meanings assigned to them by Agreement between the Governor and the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate.

Amount of Customs revenue payable to Uganda. 3. Section 4 of the Customs Amendment Ordinance, 1918, is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:—

"4. There shall be payable annually to the Government of the Uganda Protectorate a sum which bears the same proportion to the nett revenue collected by the Customs Department as the total nett import and export duty collected on goods re-exported to or imported from Uganda bears to the nett total import and export duty collected."
