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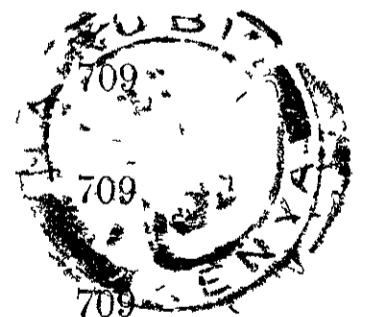

5 Rule 15 (2) is hereby amended by deleting the words 'registered certificate' in line 4 thereof and substituting therefor the words "registration certificate"

6 Rule 18 (1) of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by deleting the word 'returns' where it last appears and substituting therefor the word 'nature'

7 Rule 26 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by deleting the word 'therefore' and substituting therefor the word 'thereto'

8 Rule 32 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition of the words

'Moria'

'Lakipia'

'Kitui'

9 Subject to the provisions of Section 5 (2) of the Principal Ordinance it shall not be necessary for a registered native to carry his certificate upon his person within the Reserve to which such native belongs except in Townships situate within the boundaries of such Reserve

EMIGRATION TO THE UNION OF SOUTH
AFRICA

NOTICE

THE following notice is published for general information —

1 Intending emigrants to the Union of South Africa are again warned that the continued congestion of the Labour Market there has compelled the Government of the Union to revise the regulations. Notwithstanding repeated warnings that owing to the conditions of unemployment prevailing there immigration which was likely to aggravate those conditions would be restricted immigrants continue to arrive in large numbers who have no employment and who are not possessed of means to maintain themselves. In these circumstances it is necessary to warn intending emigrants that the provisions of the Immigrants Regulation Act will be strictly enforced. The possession of £20 on landing which sum was at one time looked upon as a sufficient safeguard for a capable worker, is now regarded as totally inadequate. What is an adequate sum it is not possible to say but it must be clearly understood that unless the intending immigrant is able to produce to the Immigration Officer at the port of arrival evidence of adequate capital or satisfactory written evidence of definite employment his entry into the Union will be prohibited

2 Such evidence must show the nature of the employment and the proposed wage. The ability of the offeror to carry out his undertaking must be indicated and, to avoid difficulties, the offeror should obtain the support of a Justice of the Peace or other competent Public Official to his written statement. General assurances of friends as to employment, or courteous offers of a home for a time will not be accepted

3 In the absence of employment, the intending immigrant must establish the fact that he has sufficient capital to maintain himself for a considerable period after arrival at least twelve months. Even skilled artisans in the standard trades should note that there is no prospect of employment in sight and no forecast of a change can be made with any certainty

4 The High Commissioner can give no assurance that a person will be allowed to land in the Union if the Immigration Regulations are administered at the Union ports and not in London
