**An Ordinance to supply a further sum of Money  
for the Service of a period from January 1st,  
1923, to 31st December, 1923.**

BE it enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) Ordinance, 1922." Short title.
2. The public revenue for the above period and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya are hereby charged towards the service of the period of twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three with a further sum of one million, and eighty-four thousand and one pounds in addition to the sums provided by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1922. Public revenue charged.
3. The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied to the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto. Application of money granted.
4. The Treasurer of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya is hereby authorised and required, from time to time, upon warrant or order of the Governor, to pay out of the Revenue and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of one million and eighty-four thousand and one pounds which will come in course of payment during the period of twelve months ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three. ## A Bill

## Intituled

**An Ordinance to preserve Mango and other Food  
Producing Trees.**

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Food Preservation Ordinance, 1923." Short title.
2. No person shall cut down or otherwise destroy any mango tree or any other species of food-bearing tree to which the Governor-in-Council may by order apply the provisions of this Ordinance without the permission in writing of the District Commissioner of the District in which such tree is situated. Preservation of food-bearing trees.
3. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Shillings 300 or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months or to both. Penalties.
4. The Governor-in-Council may by order apply this Ordinance to any District or part of a District and may by order suspend such application. Application and suspension of Ordinance.

## RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Master and Servants Ordinance, 1910, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules.

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Native Women Workers Protection Rules, 1923."

2. In these Rules the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them:—

"Farm" shall mean any area of land privately owned or leased whether such land is sold or leased by the Crown, or not.

"Owner" shall mean the owner or lessee of a farm, and shall include any person acting on behalf of the owner.

3. No owner shall allow any native woman worker employed by him to remain at night on any farm unless:—

(a) accompanied by her husband, if married, or

(b) accompanied by her father, or other relative if single, or

(c) suitable separate or joint female housing accommodation and supervision is provided by the owner to insure security from molestation to females availing themselves of such accommodation.

4. No owner who has not provided such accommodation shall employ any native woman not accompanied as aforesaid on any farm at a greater distance than three miles from her home.

5. Any owner failing to comply with these Rules, and any person molesting a native woman worker sleeping on a farm in quarters provided as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty shillings for such offence.

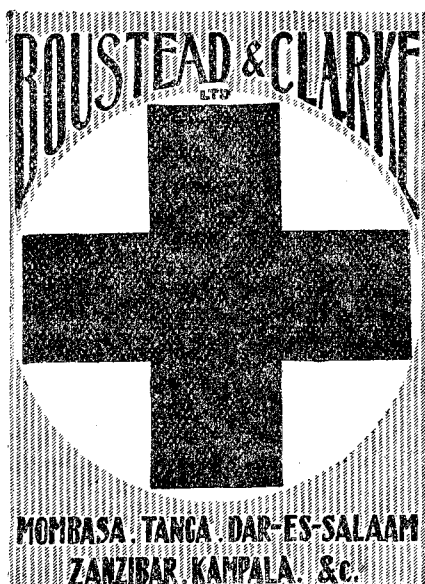

The Directors much regret the reduction in the dividend which was necessary owing to the sum of Rs. 8 lacs earmarked against doubtful debts in East Africa, where there has been a collapse of credit causing widespread financial distress.

Some months ago the Board had reason to believe that the affairs of our branch in East Africa were not satisfactory, whereupon they deputed the Bank's Auditors, European and Indian, to proceed to Mombasa to investigate matters and report to the Board.

The Auditors' enquiry revealed that the Bank's Agent at Mombasa had concealed certain facts from us, and, without our knowledge and against our instructions, had made the Bank responsible for considerable sums of money in connection with one of the principal Indian traders in East Africa.

At this stage, while it is impossible to assume that the Bank has actually lost money, it is in the opinion of the Directors and Auditors essential that the sum of Rs. 8 lacs from this year's profits should be set aside to cover any probable losses in this connection. The Directors hope gradually to recover the outstandings, against which the Bank holds considerable securities.

With the exception of the Mombasa transactions the business of the Bank has been eminently satisfactory as is shown by the profits specified above.

The Bank's Investments amount to over Rs. 2 crores; they include Government of India Treasury Bills Rs. 83 lacs and miscellaneous Government securities Rs. 120 lacs.

The Directors report, with great regret, the death of their valued colleague Mr. Khetsey Khaisey which took place in March last, they desire to place on record their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by him to the Bank of which he was an original Director.

Mr. F. Nelson recently resigned his seat on the Board owing to his inability to attend the weekly meetings. The Directors take this opportunity of congratulating Mr. Nelson upon his appointment as President of the Associated Chambers of Commerce of India and Ceylon.

It devolves upon the meeting to elect two Directors in the places of Mr. D. S. Shellim and Mr. Ambalal Sarabhai, who retire in accordance with the provision of Clause 92 of the Articles of Association. Both are eligible and offer themselves for re-election.

The Shareholders are requested to appoint Auditors for the ensuing year and to fix their remuneration.



