A Bill

Intituled

An Ordinance to make provision for the Substitution of Imprisonment for Transportation under the Indian Penal Code.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Criminal Law Amendment Ordinance, 1923." Short title.

2. The Indian Penal Code, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate, is hereby amended by the substitution of the words "imprisonment for life" and "imprisonment" respectively for the words "transportation for life" and "transportation" wherever appearing therein. Amendment of Indian Penal Code.

3. Such imprisonment may be either rigorous or simple. Interpretation.

THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT, 1898

AND

THE POST OFFICE AMENDMENT ORDINANCES, 1919 AND 1921.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Indian Post Office Act, 1898, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate, and the Post Office Amendment Ordinances, 1919 and 1921, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Acting Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Post Office Rules, 1923, and shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1923.

2. Ordinary and Insured parcels may be accepted for inland transmission between any two Money Order Offices in the Colony and Protectorate, to any Money Order Office in Uganda, and to any place in the United Kingdom as "Value-Payable" postal articles, provided that the parcel is accompanied by a declaration made by the sender that such parcel is sent in execution of a *bona fide* order.

3. The amount to be collected on any one "Value-Payable" article for payment to the sender shall be known as the "Trade Charge" and such amount shall not exceed eight hundred shillings (S. 800).

4. Insured "Value-Payable" parcels may only be posted at Post Offices at which postal insurance business is transacted.

5. The sender of a "Value-Payable" parcel must furnish on the cover of the parcel his name and address, the word "Rembursement" followed by the amount described in the currency of the country of origin, the Trade Charge in figures and words, and the name of the Office on which the order in payment of the Trade Charge is to be drawn. These particulars may be furnished on the back of the parcel if there is not sufficient place for them to be shewn on the front thereof. No erasure or alteration of the entry of the amount will be permitted. An incorrect entry must be completely obliterated and a fresh entry made.

6. The sender must also fill up a form, obtainable at the Post Office, containing a formal request for the collection of the Trade Charge and a declaration that the parcel is sent in fulfilment of a *bona fide* order. He must pay in addition to the ordinary postage and other charges, a special despatch fee, particulars of which are shewn hereunder. He may also indicate on the cover of the parcel and on the relative Customs Declaration Form (where one is used) whether, in the event of its non-delivery, it shall be (a) treated as abandoned or (b) tendered for delivery at a second address. No

other alternative will be permitted. A request for delivery at a second address without payment of the Trade Charge will not be admitted.

7. All undeliverable Value-Payable parcels, unless the sender shall have requested their abandonment, will be returned to the sender at his expense without previous notification.

8. The sender must hand the parcel in at a Post Office authorised to transact "Value-Payable" business where he must obtain a certificate of posting of which the production may be required as a condition of payment of the Trade Charge to the sender.

9. The amount of the Trade Charge indicated on the parcel when collected from the addressee will be remitted direct to the sender, by card Money Order, without deduction. If the Trade Charge is not expressed in local currency, it will be converted into local currency at the rate in force for the payment of Money Orders in the Colony and Protectorate.

10. When a Value-Payable parcel is received at a Post Office, a notice of its arrival will be sent to the addressee requesting him to take delivery at such Post Office. Value-Payable parcels which are not claimed within two months from the date of their arrival at the Office of destination will be treated as undeliverable.

11. No Value-Payable parcel will be given up or allowed to be opened until the amount of the Trade Charge and any other charges due have been paid.

12. No receipt will be given by the Post Office for the Trade Charge collected.

13. When the Trade Charge has been collected, the Post Office will undertake the responsibility for the due remittance of such amount to the sender of the parcel. A Trade Charge, once collected, will in no circumstances be refunded to the addressee of the parcel.

14. The despatch fee chargeable on Value-Payable parcels posted in this Colony shall be:—

50 cents for the first twenty shillings or part thereof of Trade Charge and 1 cent for each additional shilling or part thereof.

The despatch fee must be prepaid by means of postage stamps affixed to the parcel.

15. On all Value-Payable parcels delivered in Kenya Colony from places abroad a delivery fee of 50 cents will be collected from the addressee in addition to the amount of Trade and other Charges due.

16. No application as to the disposal of the amount of the Trade Charge will be entertained unless made within a year of the posting of the parcel.

17. Parcels on which Trade Charges are to be collected, in other respects than those above specified, will be treated like other parcels, for example, as regards insurance and compensation.
