THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ORDINANCE, 1919.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Legislative Council Ordinance, 1919, Section 29, the Deputy to His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Register of Voters (Validity) Rules, 1923," and shall be read as one with the Rules contained in Schedule II of the Legislative Council Ordinance, 1919, (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules").
- 2. The revised Registers of Voters published respectively in the Official Gazettes, dated the 31st day of July and 26th day of September, 1923, shall, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Principal Rules, for all purposes be deemed to have been prepared before the 1st day of May, 1923: Provided that every person qualified to have his name entered on the register for any electoral area prior to the 1st day of April, 1923, whose name is omitted from such register and who claims to have it inserted therein, may apply in writing, within 4 weeks from the date hereof, to the proper registering officer to have his name inserted therein. Subject as aforesaid, the provisions of the Principal Rules shall apply mutatis mutandis.
- 3. The revised Register of Voters, mentioned in the last preceding Rule, after being certified

pursuant to the provisions of Rule 7 of the Principal Rules, shall continue in operation until superseded by other revised registers.
