THE EAST AFRICA WILD BIRDS PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1903.

PROCLAMATION.

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, and of all other powers him thereunto enabling His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to issue the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Township (Explosives) Rules, 1924," and shall be read as one with the Rules dated the 20th day of March, 1915, under the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, published on page 209 of the Official Gazette for 1915 as Government Notice No. 60.

2. Rule 1 of the above-mentioned Rules, dated 20th day of March, 1915, is hereby amended by added thereto the following words:—

"Provided further that nothing herein contained shall render unlawful the storing within a township of blasting powder by any person licensed to possess blasting powder under "The Explosives (Blasting Powder) Rules, 1919."

3. When any person is prosecuted under these Rules the onus shall be upon him to prove that he is protected by any of the provisos of Rule 1.

THE INDIAN PETROLEUM ACT, 1899.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Petroleum Act, 1899, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Petroleum Possession and Transport (Amendment) Rules, 1924," and shall be read as one with the Petroleum Possession and Transport Rules, 1923, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules."

2. The proviso to Rule 3 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition of the following sentence:—

"Such licence shall be endorsed accordingly."

3. Rule 5 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso:—

"Provided that a District Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor, in the case of bulk petroleum installations constructed and existing on or before the 7th day of March, 1923, may, for special reasons to be recorded by him in writing before granting such licence, dispense with any or all of the above conditions. Such licence shall be endorsed accordingly."

THE COTTON (TAX) ORDINANCE, 1923.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Cotton (Tax) Ordinance, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Cotton (Tax) Rules, 1924.

2. No transporting agency shall accept ginned cotton for transport by rail or by sea from the Colony, unless and until the person tendering the same shall produce a certificate signed by a District Commissioner of the Colony showing that he has paid a tax of cents 6 per pound on same.

Such certificate shall be in the form set out in Schedule A of these Rules and shall be retained by the transporting agency and forwarded to the District Commissioner who signed it.

3. Any person desiring to transport ginned cotton by rail or by sea from the Colony, shall submit to the District Commissioner of the district whence the ginned cotton is to be transported an application in the form set out in Schedule B of these Rules for the issue of a certificate, accompanied by a remittance of the full amount of the tax payable.
