Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Telegraph Rules (No. 7), 1924," and shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1925.
- 2. Rule 2 of the Rules, dated the 20th day of June, 1914, made under the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885, as amended by "The Telegraph Rules, 1918," and the Telegraph Rules (No. 3), dated 8th day of October. 1924, is hereby cancelled and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—
 - 2. The charges for transmission of Inland telegrams, which unless otherwise provided by Rule must be prepaid, shall be as follows:—
 - (i) For telegram in plain language—10 cents per word with a minimum charge of Sh. 1.
 - (ii) For code or cypher telegrams—15 cents per word with a minimum charge of Shs. 1/50.
 - (iii) A telegram of either class may be forwarded as "urgent" on payment of double rates.
