### Intituled

# An Ordinance to Amend the Reformatory Schools Ordinance, 1910.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Reformatory short title. Schools (Amendment) Ordinance, 1925," and shall be read as one with the Reformatory Schools Ordinance, 1910, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by the Amendment of deletion of the figures "15" and the substitution therefor of the word "sixteen."
