NOTICE.

THE attention of persons desirous of proceeding to Lupa Goldfields from Kenya is drawn to General Notice No. 386 of the 10th June, 1925, published in the Official Gazette of Tanganyika Territory on the 12th of June, 1925.

Intending gold-diggers are also informed that before they can be admitted into Tanganyika Territory they will be required to:—

(a) Comply with the Tanganyika Territory Immigration Ordinance, 1924, which requires, *inter alia*, that:—

- (i) He shall only enter at one of the gazetted ports of entry;
- (ii) He shall forthwith present himself in person to the nearest Immigration Officer;
- (iii) Shall be in possession of a passport or shall otherwise establish his identity to the satisfaction of the Immigration Officer;

(iv) If called upon to do so by the Immigration Officer shall make and sign the prescribed declaration;

(v) Shall satisfy the Immigration Officer as to his financial position, as otherwise liable to be called upon to make a deposit not exceeding Shs. 1,000. For this purpose it is suggested that a Banker's letter is the most expeditious method of meeting this enquiry.

(b) To pay such Customs duties on provisions, firearms, ammunition, motor-cars, motor-cycles, etc., as are laid down in the Tanganyika Territory Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1923, and any amendment thereto.

(c) (i) To comply with the Tanganyika Territory Arms and Ammunition Ordinance which requires that all arms and ammunition shall be registered and licensed on entering the territory.

(ii) That an export licence shall be obtained for all firearms except shot guns being taken out of the territory.

(d) To comply with the regulations issued under the Tanganyika Territory Motor Traffic Ordinance, 1922, which requires *inter alia* the carrying of a plate displaying the letter K in a fixed visible position on rear of a motor-car.

Further, in the case of motor-cars, motor-cycles and firearms, provided re-exportation is made within six months of importation a refund of deposit for duty may be made. For the purpose of assessing Customs duty on motor-cars and motor-cycles, a certificate of valuation from a responsible garage will be accepted.

The deposit for Customs duty required by (b) and (c) may be paid to the Customs Officer, Nairobi, failing which it should be paid to the Senior Commissioner at Arusha, or to the Customs Officer at any port of entry.

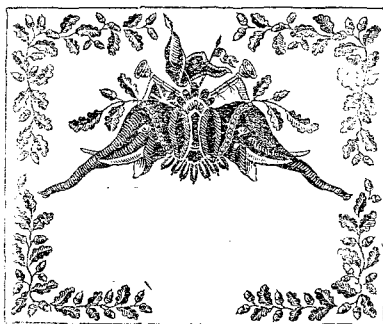

Subject to the proviso contained therein if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent, fees and duty mentioned in Condition 5 is not paid to the Commissioner of Lands within seven days from the date of the sale, the Commissioner of Lands may order that the deposit made by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government and that the purchaser shall have no further claim to a grant of the plot or plots.

8. Each purchaser shall erect a building or buildings upon his plot within 2 years from the date of the grant, such buildings to be erected according to plans and specifications which must be approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands or such other official as he may appoint for the purpose and by the General Manager.

9. The proportionate cost of the main line siding has been included in the upset price. Subsidiary sidings will be the subject of private arrangement with the Hon. General Manager, Uganda Railway.

10. Each purchaser shall drain his plot or plots to the satisfaction of Government and shall connect such drainage with any main drainage system of the Township of Nairobi as may hereafter be constructed.

11. Each purchaser shall be responsible for the proportionate cost of construction of roads and main drains serving the plots such costs to be leviable on completion of construction.

12. Each purchaser shall keep his plot or plots in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of Government.

13. No plot or plots shall at any time during the term of the lease be used as a place of residence by any person or persons whatsoever.

14. Purchasers of more than one plot in accordance with No. 3 of these conditions are hereby notified that plots so purchased will be treated in the grant as one plot which must not be subdivided without the consent of the Governor, but the rent payable in respect thereof will be the total rent of the number of plots purchased.

9. Government will not be responsible for an adverse effect caused by any constructional works which may be undertaken in the vicinity of the area selected.

10. Residence of employees on the area selected will be sanctioned, if approved by the Medical Officer of Health.
