A Bill to Amend the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Interpretation Short title. and General Clauses (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926," and shall be read as one with the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), herein-5 after referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

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2. (1) The following shall be inserted as paragraph (24a) Amendment of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance:—

" (24a) 'Native Reserve' shall include any area declared to be a Native Reserve under the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance."

- (2) Paragraph (36) of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:-
- " (36) Statutory declaration shall mean a declaration made by virtue of the Statutory Declarations Ordinance, 1926." 15
- 3. Where any Ordinance or part of an Ordinance is Effect of repeal repealed, all proclamations, rules, by-laws, orders and notices of Ordinance on rules, etc. issued under or made in virtue thereof shall remain in force made under it. 20 so far as they are not inconsistent with the repealing Ordinance and, unless the contrary intention appears, until they shall have been revoked or have been repealed by proclamations, rules, by-laws, orders or notices, as the case may be, issued or made under the provisions of the said repealing Ordinance.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

It is proposed by this Bill to amend the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance as follows:-

Clause 2 (1) of the Bill includes in the list of general definitions a definition of the term "Native Reserve." term is used in various enactments, but no general definition at present exists.

Clause 2 (2) substitutes a new general definition of the term "Statutory Declaration." This amendment becomes necessary in view of the introduction of a local Statutory Declarations Ordinance.

Clause 3 is intended to render it unnecessary, when an Ordinance is repealed and replaced by a substantially similar Ordinance, to re-issue proclamations, rules, by-laws, orders and notices which may have been made under the former Ordinance. The proposed clause preserves the effect of all such proclamations, rules, etc., so far as they are not inconsistent with the new Ordinance, until they are specifically revoked or replaced.

A Bill Relating to Statutory Declarations.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Statutory Declarations Ordinance, 1926."

Power to take declarations.

2. It shall be lawful for any Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or Commissioner for Oaths to take the declaration of any person voluntarily making and subscribing the same before him in the Form in the Schedule to this Ordinance.

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Fees payable on declarations.

3. Whenever any declaration shall be made and subscribed by any person under and in pursuance of the provisions of this Ordinance, such fees or fee as would have been due and payable on the taking or making any legal oath, 10 solemn affirmation, or affidavit shall be in like manner due and payable upon making and subscribing such declaration.

Mode of describing declaration. **4.** A declaration made under this Ordinance may be referred to in any Ordinance or other legal document as a Statutory Declaration.

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Penalty.

5. If any person knowingly and wilfully makes any statement which is false in a material particular in a Statutory Declaration he shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding two years or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to both such 20 imprisonment and fine.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

A number of local Ordinances contain reference to Statutory Declarations, and the term is defined in the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1) to mean—

"a declaration made by virtue of the provisions of the Imperial Act known as 'the Statutory Declarations Act, 1835.'"

Some doubt doubt has been expressed, however, as to whether the Statutory Declarations Act applies in the Colony, and it is therefore considered desirable to enact local legislation to provide for the making and subscribing of Statutory Declarations.

Provision will be made by another Bill for the amendment of the general definition of "Statutory Declaration" above referred to.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- 1. Each plot will be auctioned separately.
- 2. The highest bidder will be the purchaser, and, it any dispute arises as to any bid, the plot will be put up again at the last undisputed bid.
- 3. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 4. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 25 per cent. of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 5. Subject to the proviso contained therein if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent, fees and duty mentioned in Condition No. 5 is not paid to the Commissioner of Lands, at the Land Department, Nairobi, within seven days from the date of sale, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited and the purchaser will have no further claim to a lease of the plot.
- 8. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint.

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- 9. The grantee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the building clearly defined and shewing a system of drainage, which shall satisfy the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot and before any building may be occupied the grantee shall satisfy the said Director of Medical and Sanitary Services that such system of drainage has been properly constructed.
- 10. Each grantee shall suitably connect his premises with any town drainage system when, in the opinion of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the grantee reasonably so to connect.

The Government or such person as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL PLOTS.

- 1. Each purchaser shall within two years of the commencement of the grant completely enclose his plot with a fence of suitable design and in conformity with the Township Regulations.

The plot shall be used for purposes of a garage, or for the combined purpose of a garage and residence, and for no other purpose whatsoever, provided that should the plot be used for the said combined purpose not more than one-half of the area shall be built upon and that should the plot be used for garage purposes only then two-thirds of the area may be built upon.
- 2. The grantee shall erect on his plot within two years of the commencement of his grant a building constructed of stone, brick or concrete.
- 3. Subdivision of the plot or the subletting of a portion thereof will not be permitted.
