Boundaries of the Nakuru District Council Area.

Commencing on the Kipsonoi River at the south-west corner of Nakuru Administrative District as defined by Proclamation No. 54 of 25th February, 1924;

thence bounded northerly by that Administrative District boundary to its intersection with the generally southern boundary of Ravine Administrative District as defined by the said Proclamation;

thence westerly and northerly by the latter district boundary to the southern corner of L.O. No. 6261;

thence southerly and easterly by the western and southern boundaries of L.O. No. 6260 and the southern boundary of L.O. No. 1866 to its intersection with the western boundary of L.O. No. 503 (Lembus Forest Concession);

thence northerly by part of that western boundary to its intersection with the generally northern boundary of Ravine Administrative District;

thence in a generally eastern direction by that district boundary to its intersection with the generally northern boundary of Nakuru Administrative District at the most northern corner of L.O. No. 4103;

thence northerly and easterly by the latter district boundary to the north-east corner of L.O. No. 3843;

thence by the northern boundary of L.O. No. 5260 to its north-east corner;

thence easterly by a straight line to the trigonometrical beacon Legesianan;

thence north-easterly by part of the western and the north-western boundary of L.O. No. 5259 to the northern corner of that portion on the generally north-western boundary of Nakuru Administrative District;

thence easterly and northerly by that district boundary to the north-west corner of L.O. No. 2682;

thence easterly by the northern boundary of L.O. No. 2682 and part of that of L.O. No. 2687 to the intersection of the latter with the Ghusa Ugeri (En Diloi) River;

thence by that river down-stream to its intersection with the northern boundary of L.O. No. 2689 on the Nakuru Administrative District Boundary;

thence by that District Boundary easterly, south-easterly, westerly and southerly to its intersection with the northern boundary of L.O. No. 439;

thence westerly by the northern boundaries of L.O. Nos. 439, 436, 433 and 434 to the intersection of the last with the eastern 100-foot zone of the Kenya and Uganda Railway;

thence southerly by that zone to its intersection with the northern boundary of L.O. No. 5697 extended across the railway;

thence westerly by that extended boundary to low water mark on Nakuru Lake;

thence westerly by that low water mark to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Nakuru Lake Forest Reserve (L.O. No. 1520) extended thereto;

thence westerly and southerly by that forest reserve boundary and part of the western boundary of the Eastern Mau Forest Reserve to its intersection with the southern boundary of the Nakuru Administrative District;

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

LOCUST REPORT-11TH JANUARY, 1929.

The Deputy Director of Agriculture, as indicated in the Locust Report dated 3rd January, 1929, is away from Headquarters on a tour of the Settled Areas. He is expected to return on the 18th of January.

Southern Turkana.—The main infested areas appear to be—

- (a) Karpeddo-Kamuge area;
- (b) Kalowenyang River;
- (c) Turkwell River from Lokwiyam to Loiapuwa;
- (d) Lokichar.

Further swarms of locusts are entering the above areas from Baringo and West Suk. The Administration is taking every possible step; natives are working in the area at locust destruction day and night.

West Suk.—The infestation at Abberrit has been cleared up. Operations are proceeding successfully in Katirak Kamunono and Chepropo district. In about three weeks' time, on the completion of road-making operations, it should be possible to take tank lorries from Napan Pass to Katirak, Chepropo and Turkwell Gorge. Eight temporary Locust Officers and three tank lorries are now in the District.

Northern Frontier.—Reports indicate a high degree of locust infestation in the Northern Frontier Province as a whole. The locust staff, consisting of fourteen temporary Locust Officers, is concentrating on the Isiolo-Uaso Nyiro area. Operation reports indicate very successful destruction of hoppers.

Kitui.—A further hatching of hoppers is reported over almost the whole district. Sixteen temporary Locust Officers and approximately 21,200 natives are engaged on locust destruction. The organisation is working extremely well.

Voi.—Eight temporary Locust Officers are in the district, and the destruction of hoppers is proceeding in every area. A special locust train is now in commission in order to spray hoppers with poison from the line.

Masongaleni-Kibwezi.—Reports of hoppers to hand. Two temporary Locust Officers with poison and pumps have been despatched to this area.

Kerio.—The Deputy Director of Agriculture met the Provincial Commissioner on the 6th January in order to discuss the position in this area. Seven temporary Locust Officers are now operating in the North Suk and Baringo area. Reports indicate successful destruction of hoppers. A tank lorry left Nairobi on 10th January to reinforce work in this area.

Masai.—Two tank lorries, one motor cycle and three temporary Locust Officers arrived at Kajiado on the 6th January, and are carrying out a complete reconnaissance of the suspected laying areas.

Digo District.—This area is now clear and the Locust Destruction Unit has been withdrawn.

Kilifi.—A heavy infestation at Sokoku is being successfully dealt with. It is anticipated that the area will be reported clear about January 14th. Two temporary Locust Officers are in this district.

Malindi.—The north bank of the Sabaki River is fairly heavily infested. The situation is well in hand and expected to be clear this month. Two temporary Locust Officers are in the district.

Kipini.—A heavy infestation, and every effort being made to deal with the situation. The temporary Locust Officer in the district is being reinforced by one temporary Locust Control Officer and one temporary Locust Officer who have been withdrawn from Digo. Further supplies of locust pumps and arsenite have been sent forward. The Provincial Commissioner for the Coast is leaving to visit this area on 12th January.

Tambach.—A temporary Locust Officer left Nairobi on the 8th January for duty in this area.

Settled Areas.—A District Control Officer has been appointed for the Laikipia, Nanyuki, etc., area. Arrangements are being made for a similar appointment for—

- (a) Thompson's Falls, Elmenteita, Gilgil, Naivasha, and Kijabe area;
- (b) Nakuru area;
- (c) Eldoret area.

As a result of the Deputy Director of Agriculture's tour an organisation for dealing with the Settled Areas is being evolved.

Supplies of pumps and poison are at Nakuru, Eldoret, Rongai, Kitale and Naro Moru.

General.—Orders have been placed for a further four tank lorries.

Steps have been taken to ensure that further temporary Locust Officers can be engaged, trained, equipped and despatched into the field with the least possible delay should occasion arise.

The rent due to the 31st day of December, 1929, the survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation (90/-), and registration (20/-) of the grant, and the stamp duty payable (approximately 2% ad valorem) in respect of the grant and, if the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money in full, the balance of the purchase money, shall be paid to the Surveyor General at the Survey and Registration Department, Nairobi, on or before the 1st April, 1929, and upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and, if the conditions of sale have been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the farm, which grant will be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.
- 9. If the payments mentioned in Condition No. 8 are not made on or before the 1st April, 1929, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order that the deposit paid by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government, and in such case the purchaser shall have no further claim to a grant of the farm.
- 10. The grants will be under the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 142 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and will be for 999 years commencing from the 1st day of April, 1929. Rent will be payable from that date.
