### A Bill to Amend the Crown Lands Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Crown Lands (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929,” and shall be read as one with the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “the Principal Ordinance.” Short title.
- 5    2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires:— Interpretation.
  - “ Arab Reserve ” means any area reserved for the benefit of the Arab inhabitants of the Colony;
  - 10    “ Communal Reserve ” means any area reserved for the joint benefit of the Arab inhabitants and a Native tribe or Native tribes of the Colony.
- 15    3. The Governor in Council may by notice in the Gazette declare that any area of Crown land, either by general or particular description and whether the same has been surveyed or not, shall be an Arab Reserve or a Communal Reserve. Power to establish Arab and Communal Reserves.
- 20    4. The provisions of Part VI of the Principal Ordinance (relating to the reservation of land for the use of Native tribes) as amended by the Crown Lands (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to any area declared under the last preceding section to be an Arab Reserve or a Communal Reserve. Application of Part VI of Principal Ordinance to Arab and Communal Reserves.

### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The Crown Lands (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, gave the Governor in Council power to declare any area of Crown land to be a Native Reserve, that is, reserved for the benefit of the Native tribes of the Colony, and various Native Reserves were duly declared under that Ordinance, including one known as the South Nyika Reserve.

Towards the end of last year, certain Arabs put forward a claim to communal rights with the Natives over 30,000 acres of land in the Coast area, about 26,000 acres of which were included in the South Nyika Reserve. Their claim was investigated by Government and eventually a compromise was arrived at, the Arabs agreeing to abandon their claim to the whole area of 30,000 acres provided they were given equal rights with the Natives over the 26,000 acres included in the South Nyika Reserve. The Secretary of State was approached

with a view to his sanction being obtained to this compromise and his reply was that he had no objection to the proposed arrangement so long as safeguards equivalent to those relating to Native Reserves were provided for the settlement area to be composed partly of Natives and partly of Arabs.

It is considered that the proper way of providing such safeguards is to amend the law so as to allow of Communal Reserves (comprised of Natives and Arabs) being established on the same footing as Native Reserves. Opportunity has been taken in the amending Bill to provide for the establishment of Arab Reserves, in addition to Communal Reserves, as it is thought that at some future date such Reserves may be required.

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Fish Protection Rules, 1929.”

2. No person shall kill or take fish in—

(a) the Athi River at any point between its source and the cable-way on the Machakos-Kitui Road ; or

(b) the Thika River at any point between its source and its junction with the Tana River,

by netting, trapping, poison or explosives.

3. Any person who contravenes any provision of the last preceding Rule shall be guilty of an offence against these Rules, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding thirty pounds and in default of payment to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding three months.

4. Any Court before which any person is convicted of an offence against these Rules may, in addition to or in lieu of any other punishment, order that any net, stake, machine, instrument or appliance used or suspected of being used by such person in contravention of these Rules shall be confiscated.

5. The Fish Protection Rules, 1928, dated the 15th day of September, 1928, are hereby revoked.

STORAGE CHARGES ON WET MAIZE, KILINDINI  
HARBOUR.

THE High Commissioner for Transport has approved of the following additional clause relative to the storage charges on wet maize at Kilindini Harbour being incorporated in Harbour Tariff Book No. 1, dated 1st April, 1928, which clause will have effect as from the date hereof:—

## Wet Maize.

- (i) Unless there is a machinery breakdown at the reconditioning plant—maize found to be wet on arrival in the Transit Sheds shall be strictly subject to the free storage period as specified in the Tariff.
- (ii) The elapsed period during which wet maize is travelling from transit shed to and through the reconditioning plant and back again will be free of storage rent.
- (iii) That on its return to Transit Shed from the reconditioning plant, maize shall be treated as though it had not left the shed, and free storage period and rent applied to it as from the date of its original arrival in the harbour; less the free period allowed under (ii) above.
- (iv) In the case of a machinery breakdown at the reconditioning plant, any storage rent on wet maize awaiting re-conditioning shall be waived as from the date on which it would otherwise have left the shed for the reconditioning plant.

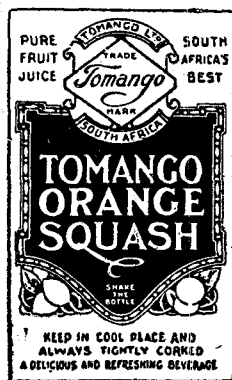

## SALE OF QUININE TO THE PUBLIC.

ARRANGEMENTS have been made by Government for the sale of quinine to the public at approximately cost price. The quinine will be sold in packets each containing a quarter pound (four ounces) of Quinine Bisulphate at the price of eight shillings per packet including postage. Full directions for use, together with a leaflet on the treatment of malaria will be attached to each packet.
