GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 217.

THE TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Townships Ordinance (Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as "the Nanyuki Township Rules, 1929", and shall apply to the Township of Nanyuki.

2. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires :---

- the expression " night " means the interval between nine o'clock in the evening and six o'clock in the morning of the next succeeding day;
- the expression "native" shall include a native of the Comoro Islands, and a native of Madagascar.
- 3. Every native who :---
- (a) not being a servant housed therein by his or her employer or the husband, wife or child of such servant, shall be found or remain, by day or by night, in or upon any house, tent, warehouse, coachhouse, garage, stable, outhouse, yard, garden, or other premises without the consent of the owner or occupier of such house, tent, warehouse, coachhouse, garage, stable, outhouse, yard, garden, or other premises or without other lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on such native);
- (b) without valid excuse, the proof whereof shall be on such native, shall be found lying, wandering or loitering on any highway, yard, or other place during the night or shall be found wandering abroad and/or lodging in any barn or outhouse or in any deserted or unoccupied building or in the open air or under a tent or in any cart or wagon;
- (c) shall be found by night having in his possession without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on such native) any dangerous or offensive weapon, firearm, or instrument or any key, pick-lock, crowbar, jemmy, jack, bit or other implement of housebreaking or having his or her face disguised;
- (d) shall remain within the township for a longer period than forty-eight hours without employment (the proof whereof shall be on such native); provided that the provisions of this sub-rule shall not apply to any native who is in possession of a valid permit to reside in the township issued by the District Commissioner, and provided that the said District Commissioner may issue to any native showing good and sufficient cause a permit in the form of the Schedule

hereto, and such permit shall constitute the authority of such native to reside within the township for the period stated on such permit;

and every person wilfully aiding or wilfully assisting any such native aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a fine not exceeding four hundred shillings or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding two months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

4. Any police officer may take into custody without warrant any person found or reasonably suspected of committing or attempting to commit or wilfully aiding or wilfully assisting any native to commit any offence against these Rules.

5. When there is reasonable cause for so doing any European police officer of or above the rank of Assistant Inspector or any police officer authorised in writing by him may enter any house, tent, warehouse, coach house, garage, stable, outhouse, yard, garden or other premises at any time to ensure that the provisions of these Rules are being complied with.

THE MINING ORDINANCE, 1925.

It is notified for public information that Government has under consideration the grant of two sole exploration licences for coal, minerals and common minerals in respect of the following areas, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State :---

A. An area of approximately 11,350 square miles being a portion of the territory transferred to Kenya Colony by the Kenya Colony and Protectorate (Boundaries) Order in Council, 1926, that was formerly included in the Uganda Protectorate, together with a portion of the Turkana District, which said area is bounded as follows, that is to say :—

Commencing at the intersection of the boundaries of Kenya Colony, Uganda Protectorate, and the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan near Mount Zulia;

thence bounded north easterly and easterly by the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan Boundary to its intersection with the Meridian 35° 30' East;

thence southerly by that Meridian to its intersection with the generally northern boundary of the West Suk District;

thence south westerly by that boundary to its intersection with the Uganda Protectorate boundary;

thence northerly by the latter boundary to the point of commencement.

B. An area of approximately 1,350 square miles being a portion of the territory transferred to Kenya Colony by the Kenya Colony and Protectorate (Boundaries) Order in Council, 1926, that was formerly in the Uganda Protectorate, which said area is bounded as follows, that is to say :--

Commencing at the intersection of the parallel 3° 40' north with the Kenya Uganda boundary;

thence bounded easterly by that parallel for a distance of 15 miles;

thence southerly by the line which includes all points distant 15 miles from the aforesaid boundary to the intersection of that line with the parallel 2° 40' north;

thence westerly by that parallel to its intersection with the said boundary;

thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

DETENTION OF AIRCRAFT.

The following authorisation is published for general information.

AUTHORISATION.

WHEREAS by Article 11 of the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Order") the Governor may authorise persons in writing to give such directions and take such steps by way of detention of certain aircraft in certain circumstances as may appear to them necessary in order to prevent the flight of such aircraft.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Sir Jacob William Barth, Knight, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, do hereby authorise all officers of the Kenya Police Force of and above the rank of Assistant Inspector, in cases where it appears to them or any of them that any aircraft is intended or likely to be flown in such circumstances that the flight would be in contravention of any of the provisions of sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (1) of Article 4, or sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) of Article 5, or Article 19 of the said Order, or in such circumstances as to infringe any other provision of the said Order and to be a cause of danger to persons in the aircraft or to persons or property on the ground, to give such directions and take such steps by way of detention of the aircraft or otherwise in relation thereto, as appears to them or any of them to be necessary in order to prevent the flight.

3. The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but if any dispute arise as to any bid, the plot will be re-offered at the last undisputed bid.

4. Each purchaser shall pay to the Auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 25 per cent. of the purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.

The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to 31st December, 1929, shall be 1 aid to the Senior Commissioner, Nakuru, while the survey fees, the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 110), and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor General, Nairobi; all the amounts to be paid within 7 days from the date of the sale and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 142 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and of these conditions of sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.
