## LOCUST REPORT, 28TH MAY, 1929.

*Laying.*—Additional laying areas have been found and marked in the Kerio Province and in the Masai Reserve.

*Hoppers.*—Hatching is taking place in Suk, Masai Reserve, Kikuyu Reserve and at Ngong.

Destruction has been completed in Enbure country. The Kitui infestation is now overcome and the Locust Officers have returned and been reposted to other areas.

Work is continuing in the Voi area, Chyulu, Rombo, Ngong and Maraquet.

Work is commencing on hoppers in the Kikuyu Reserve, Masai Reserve and in Suk.

There are 18 officers and 9 trucks in the Kerio Province between Baringo and Lake Rudolf and to the Uganda boundary, more staff and equipment has been sent during the last few days.

There are 3 officers in the Naivasha-Gilgil area.

In the Masai Reserve there 11 officers, and in Voi 3, Kiambu 1, Machakos 2 and Masongaleni 2. There are 4 District Locust Officers now about the settled areas.

The Department has 28 trucks in the field, and 47 officers.

No work is being attempted in the Northern Frontier Province where there are laying swarms still moving about.

Extensive hatching has followed heavy laying in Karamoja, Uganda, Sudan Border, Suk and Turkana, and further supplies together with extra staff have been despatched to Kerio Province.

The Deputy Director left on Monday last to visit the areas most heavily infested; he will meet various Locust Committees in the settled areas, and will attend the Farmers' Association meeting at Kitale, on Friday.

The infestation now known is very heavy, and it will require intense work to overcome the infestations reported.

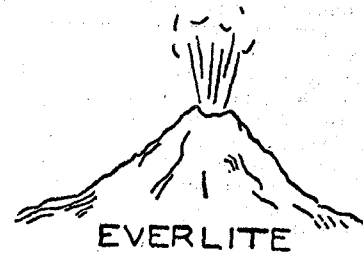
