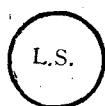

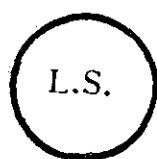

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE MKUNI FOREST RESERVE.

(L.R. No. 5,040).

The Mkuni Forest Reserve lies about five miles east of
Witu, south-east of the Utwani Forest Reserve and includes
two portions of forest, Mkuni and Utwani Ndogo, west and
east of the Ziwa la Mkuni, which is included in the reserve.

Commencing near the Witu-Mkonumbi Road about half
a mile east of Mambu Sasa; it is bounded easterly by a cut
and beacons line following approximately the forest edge for
about nine-tenths of a mile and thence southerly for about
380 feet to the Ziwa la Mkuni;

thence easterly across the northern edge of the latter;

thence north-easterly and south-easterly by a beacons
line to a beacon near the most eastern point of the Utwani
Ndogo Forest about two miles easterly of the point of the
commencement;

thence south-westerly, north-westerly, south-westerly and northerly by a beaconed line enclosing the latter forest to the Ziwa la Mkuni;

thence north-westerly across the southern neck of the latter;

thence south-westerly and north-westerly by a beaconed line south of the Mkuni forest edge to the point of commencement.

The foregoing boundary is more particularly delineated edged green on Land Surveys Boundary Plan No. 63 deposited at the Survey and Registration Department, Nairobi, copies whereof are on record at the office of the Forest Department, Nairobi, and at the office of the District Commissioner, Lamu.

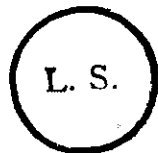

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 49 of the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Traffic (Eldoret Municipality) Rules, 1929 ”, and shall apply to the Municipality of Eldoret.

2. (1) No motor vehicle shall be driven at a speed exceeding fifteen miles per hour upon any road mentioned in the Schedule hereto; and

(2) No motor vehicle shall be driven at a speed exceeding twenty-five miles per hour upon any road elsewhere within the boundaries of the Municipality.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Diseases of Plants Prevention Ordinance (Chapter 155 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Locust (Amendment) Rules, 1929 ”, and shall be read as one with the Locust Rules, 1928, hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Rules ”.

2. Rule 8 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following is substituted therefor :—

“ 8. In the event of any occupier failing to give the notice required in Rules 3 and 6 (i) above, or failing to destroy the hoppers in the manner prescribed under Rule 6 (ii), or in the event of there being no occupier, the Director of Agriculture or any person authorised by him may carry out the destruction, and the occupier or, in the event of there being no occupier, the lessee or owner of the land as the case may be, shall be liable for any expenditure thereby incurred.”

2. Rule 5 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following is substituted therefor:—

“5. No net shall be used the mesh of which is less than five inches unless the thread of which it is composed is as thick as or thicker than the flax twine known as No. 30/3 ply and no net shall be used in which the thread of the meshes is composed of separate strands liable to come apart during use.”

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

LOCUST REPORT TO 14TH JUNE, 1929.

Flying Swarms.—An old swarm is moving between Kijabe and the top of the Escarpment.

HOPPER AREAS.

Masai Reserve.—Work on a large scale is proceeding between Kajiado and the Tanganyika border and from Mount Margaret in the direction of Magadi. Contact spraying and bran baiting are both proving very effective. Fresh hatching is continually taking place. The locust train for the Magadi line is still in process of assembly.

Kerio Province, West Suk.—The organisation of the district is complete and operations are proceeding. The area for each officer is small and complete destruction is anticipated.

Northern Turkana.—Hopper destruction proceeding rapidly. Operations have reached Lake Rudolph at a point seventy miles north of Lodwar. As there are large hopper bands a great distance away which cannot be reached except on foot and as there is no water, a proportion will not be destroyed. The same situation exists in Karamoja where the effort cannot be on any scale.

Southern Turkana.—Work proceeding.

Baringo.—Hopper destruction proceeding in every district. It is proposed to make a special effort to enroll farmers for a month to clear up Kamasia and Njemps. An early clearance of this area will permit of more officers moving into the Kerio Valley and to the east.

Kikuyu Province.—Destruction in the Kiambu area of the Native Reserve is well advanced.

Small hopper bands on Estates near Thika, Ruiru, Ngong and elsewhere have been destroyed.

Elmenteita-Gilgil-Naivasha.—Work has commenced at three points; contact spraying of newly hatched hoppers has been carried out with good effect. Hatching is taking place within Gilgil Township, near Eburru Station and on Barry's Farm; at these points no work has as yet been undertaken, the staff being all busily employed on private land at present.

Owing to the fact that the hopper destruction campaign may be said only now to have commenced against the hatchings from the main layings, it is too early to indicate what success is being achieved towards a clearance of the infestation. That will become more readily ascertained when hatchings are complete and staff is able to report areas as clear.

Wherever possible it is perhaps simpler to use the bran bait on newly hatched swarms. The bait should be as wet as possible, but not so wet that it cannot be distributed thinly or loosely.
