Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance proposed to be amended —

Interpretation 2 In this Ordinance, unless inconsistent with the context —

The term ‘ farm ’ includes also a plantation, orchard, and a market or nursery garden,

The term “ native ” means a native of Africa, not being of European or Asiatic race or origin, and includes a Somali and Swahili,

The term “ produce ” means agricultural produce and includes ostrich feathers,

The term “ stock ” means the male, female, or young or cross of an animal of any of the following kinds horse, ass, kine, sheep, goat, swine, or domesticated ostrich, and

The term “ theft ” includes every offence punishable under any of the following sections of the Indian Penal Code, and includes also an attempt to commit, and an abetment of any such offence, where such offence, attempt or abetment is committed with regard to stock or produce —

A Bill to Amend the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Stock and Produce Theft (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929 ”, and shall be read as one with the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance (Chapter 79 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance ”

2 Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion in the definition of “ stock ” of the word “ camels ” between the words “ swine ” and “ or domesticated ostrich ”

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Senior Commissioner, Northern Frontier Province, has reported that thefts of camels in his Province are not uncommon and has therefore asked that camels may be included in the definition of “ stock ” in the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance, in order that punishment for such thefts may follow the principles of punishment adopted for thefts of other stock

The Bill is designed to give effect to the suggestion of the Senior Commissioner

Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance proposed to be replaced —

Application of Ordinance 3 The Governor may, on being satisfied that the legislature of any British possession or protectorate has made, or is about to make, adequate provision for the recognition in that possession or protectorate of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of this Colony, direct by order published in the Gazette that this Ordinance shall apply to that possession or protectorate, and in the event of such provision not being made within a reasonable time, or if made, being so altered that it would not authorise the making of an order as aforesaid, the Governor may, by order published in the Gazette, revoke any such order

Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance proposed to be amended —

Sealing of probates and letters of administration granted in the United Kingdom or the Colonies or Protectorates or by British courts elsewhere 4 Where a court of probate in the United Kingdom, or in a British possession or protectorate to which the Ordinance applies, has granted probate or letters of administration in respect of the estate of a deceased person, the probate or letters of administration on being produced to, and a copy thereof deposited with the Supreme Court, shall be sealed with the seal of the court, and shall thereupon be of the like force and effect, and have the same operation in the Colony as if granted by the Supreme Court

Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance proposed to be amended —

Sealing of probates and letters of administration granted by British court in foreign countries 9 This Ordinance shall extend to authorise the sealing as hereinbefore mentioned of any probate or letters of administration granted by a British court in a foreign country, other than in a protectorate, in like manner as it authorises the sealing of a probate or letters of administration granted in a British possession or protectorate to which this Ordinance applies and the provisions of this Ordinance shall apply accordingly with the necessary modifications

A Bill to Amend the British and Colonial Probates Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as “ the British and Colonial Probates (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929,” and shall be read as one with the British and Colonial Probates Ordinance (Chapter 12 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance ”

Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor —

“ 3 The Governor may, on being satisfied that the legislature of any British possession or protectorate or of any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is being exercised by His Majesty’s Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or in any other part of His Majesty’s Dominions has made, or is about to make, adequate provision for the recognition in that possession or protectorate or territory as aforesaid of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of this Colony, direct by order published in the Gazette that this Ordinance shall apply to that possession or protectorate or territory, and in the event of such provision not being made within a reasonable time, or if made, being so altered that it would not authorise the making of an order as aforesaid the Governor may, by order published in the Gazette, revoke any such order ”

The British and Colonial Probates (Amendment) Ordinance, 1928, is hereby repealed

Repeal of Ordinance No 31 of 1928

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The British and Colonial Probates (Amendment) Ordinance, 1928, was passed last year for the purpose of carrying into effect the wishes of the Government of this Colony and of Tanganyika Territory in respect of the reciprocal recognition of probates and letters of administration granted in Kenya and Tanganyika respectively

The Secretary of State for the Colonies considers that the amending Ordinance, as it stands is open to certain objections in form, and has requested the Governor to invite the Legislative Council to repeal the 1928 amending Ordinance and to enact the necessary legislation in the form proposed by this Bill

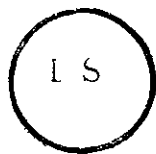

infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases
of Animals Ordinance —

TRYPANOSOMIASIS

1 An area in the Fort Hall District bounded
by a line commencing at the most northerly point
of Farm L O No 5938,

thence in a south-westerly direction following
the south-eastern boundaries of Farms L O
Nos 4466, 1979/4/R and 1979/1 to the southern
corner of Farm L O No 1979/1,

thence in a south easterly direction following
the south western boundary of Farm L O
No 4877 to the southern corner of Farm L O
No 4877,

thence in a north-easterly direction following
the northern boundary of Farm L O No 4741
to the northern corner of that portion,

thence in a south easterly direction following
the north-eastern boundaries of Farms L O
Nos 4741 and 4744 to the eastern corner of the
latter portion,

thence in a north easterly direction following
the northern boundary of Farm L O No 6727
to the northern corner of that portion,

thence in a south-easterly direction following
the north eastern boundaries of Farms L O
Nos 6727, 6728, 6729 and 2007 to the eastern
corner of the latter portion,

thence in a southerly direction following the
western boundaries of Farms L O Nos 2009,
3526, 3527 and 3528 to the north eastern corner
of Farm L O No 2008,

thence in a south westerly direction following
the northern boundary of Farm L O No 2008,
to the north western corner of that portion,

thence in a southerly direction following the
western boundaries of Farms L O Nos 2008 and
3524 to the south western corner of the latter
portion,

thence in a south westerly direction following
the southern boundary of Farm L O No 4720
to the south-western corner of that portion,

thence in a northerly direction following the western boundary of Farm L O No 4720 to the north-eastern corner of Farm L O No 4754,

thence in a south-westerly direction to the north-western corner of that portion, thence in a south-westerly direction in a straight line to the top of the Kakuzi Hills

thence in a south-easterly direction following the top of the Kakuzi Hills to a point on Farm L O No 1544 where the Kakuzi Hills end,

thence in an easterly direction in a straight line through a portion of Farms L O Nos 1544 and 4607 to the most southerly corner of Farm L O No 2307,

thence in a south-easterly direction following the northern boundaries of Farms L O Nos 4607, 2287, 3581, 2289/R, 4934 and 3582 to the north eastern corner of Farm L O No 3582,

thence in a south-westerly direction following the eastern boundary of Farm L O No 3582 to the Thika River,

thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction following the Thika River down stream to its junction with the Tana or Kiloluma River,

thence in a westerly direction following the Tana or Kiloluma River up stream to its junction with the Thaba River,

thence in a westerly direction following the Thaba River up-stream to the north-east corner of Farm L O No 4917,

thence in a south-westerly direction following the westerly boundary of Farm L O No 6778 to the eastern corner of Farm L O No 5938,

thence in a north westerly direction to the most northerly corner of Farm L O No 5938 the point of commencement

2 An area in the Fort Hall District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the Thika River where the eastern boundary of Farm L O No 2001 meets the said river,

thence in a westerly direction following the Thaba River up stream to its junction with the Thara River,

thence in a southerly direction following the Thara River up stream to the point where the western boundary of Farm L O No 324 meets the Thara River,

thence in a southerly direction following the western boundaries of Farms L O Nos 324 and 1979/3 to the south-western corner of Farm L O No 1979/3,

thence in an easterly and northerly direction following the southerly and easterly boundaries of Farm L O No 1979/3 to the southern boundary of Farm L O No 324,

thence in a north-easterly direction along the south easterly boundaries of Farms L O Nos 324 and 1977 to the eastern corner of Farm L O No 1977,

thence due east along the southern boundaries of Farms L O Nos 4689/R, 1972 and 2001 to the eastern corner of Farm L O No 2001,

thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of Farm L O No 2001 to the point where that boundary meets the Thasa River, the point of commencement

3 An area on either side of the Thika River including all points within a distance of 400 yards of any point on that river, commencing at the intersection of the north-western boundary of Farm L O No 4607 and the said river, and ending at the intersection of the south-eastern boundary of Farm L O No 3582, and the said river

SECOND SCHEDULE

DESCRIPTION OF BOUNDARIES

Commencing at a point bearing $329^{\circ} 9' 9''$ and distant 2,200 feet from a point on the north-western boundary of Kitale Township (as defined by Proclamation No 66 dated 23rd May, 1921, and amended by Proclamation No 82 dated 23rd October, 1926) about 3,791 feet from its northern corner,

thence bounded by a straight line to the said point on the north-western boundary of the township,

thence north-easterly by part of the said north-western boundary of the township to its northern corner,

thence south-easterly and south-westerly by the north-eastern and generally south-eastern boundaries of the township to its southern corner,

thence by a straight line bearing $239^{\circ} 9' 54''$ to its intersection with the south-western boundary of L R No 6700 (Government European School) extended southerly,

thence north-westerly by that extended boundary to the western corner of L R No 6700 and onwards by the same straight line extended northerly to a point bearing $239^{\circ} 9' 45''$ from the north-west corner of L R No 2049/2 (Golf Club Links),

thence north-easterly by a straight line to that north-west corner,

thence north-westerly by a straight line parallel to the south-western boundary of the township, to its intersection with the southern boundary of the feeder road reserve which intersects that township boundary about 4,900 feet from its northern corner,

thence easterly by that road reserve to its intersection with the south-western boundary of the township,

thence north-westerly by part of that boundary of the township to its western corner,

thence north-easterly by part of the north-western boundary of the township for a distance of about 4,580 feet to a beacon marking the eastern boundary of a road reserve leading in a northerly direction

thence northerly by the said eastern boundary of that road reserve to a point bearing $239^{\circ} 9' 9''$ from the point of commencement,

thence north-easterly by a straight line thereto

2 Rule 3 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule is substituted therefor —

“ 3 (1) The account and valuation to be furnished under the provisions of section 20 (1) of the Estate Duty (Consolidation) Ordinance 1926, shall be rendered in triplicate in the Estate Duty Form ‘A’ in the Schedule hereto

(2) The amended and corrective account and valuation which may be required to be furnished under the provisions of section 21 (1) of the Estate Duty (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1926, and the particular account and valuation delivered under the provisions of section 22 of the said Ordinance shall be rendered respectively in triplicate in the Estate Duty Form ‘B’ in the Schedule hereto

(3) An application for a certificate under section 25 of the said Ordinance shall be in the Estate Duty Form ‘C’ in the Schedule hereto ”

“ Anti-Rinderpest Serum shall be exchangeable free of charge only after a period of twelve months and before a period of eighteen months has elapsed from the date of its manufacture as indicated on the container in which it is supplied ”

1 These Directions may be cited as "the Air Navigation Directions, 1929 (No 3)," and shall be read as one with the Air Navigation Directions, 1928, as amended by the Air Navigation Directions, 1929 (No 2)

2 Paragraph 3 of the Air Navigation Directions, 1929 (No 2), is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor —

‘ 5 Sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 1 of Section IV of the Principal Directions is hereby amended by the addition thereto at the end thereof of the following words

LOCUST REPORT TO 23RD JULY, 1929

FLYING SWARMS

Flying swarms reported last week Lumbwa-Koru have reached Nandi and concentrated. They are now moving off northwards over Turbo and Soy. No damage has been reported.

Two small swarms are reported from the Machakos Reserve, they have flown off at a great height northwards over Embu.

Small flying swarms are accumulating in Maraquet from undestroyed hopper bands in these regions.

HOPPER AREAS

Kerio Province — Information regarding the disposition of staff and labour in the Karamoja District is now to hand. Work is taking place in four areas. The heaviest infestation is on the slopes of the mountain towards Moroto.

Northern Turkana — Hoppers are now reaching the flying stage, but no information as to the size of flying swarms is as yet available. Hopper destruction is continuing, but should cease at the end of this month.

Southern Turkana — Near Lake Rudolph, and on the Baisalo boundary, there are only small swarms most of which have been dealt with. In the central area, the hopper areas are under control. On the Turkwell where the infestation has been heaviest, great destruction has been effected, and over the whole district work appears to have been effective.

Suk — No report to hand.

Elgeyo and Maraquet — Excellent work and progress is reported from all areas save one. Some small flying swarms may be expected to arise.

Baringo — Work is proceeding rapidly and effectively. Only from areas which it is a physical impossibility to enter will flying swarms of any dimensions arise. Baiting on small young swarms will be carried out.

Uasin Gishu Masai Reserve — There has been a change over in staff in this area. Destruction by beating is the chief means adopted.

Nalumu District — In addition to hatchings there has been a further invasion of the district by hoppers which have travelled rapidly from the west. An augmented staff is dealing with the situation.

Loi District — Operations ceased, and staff redistributed.

Masai Reserve — Areas are now being reported clear, but there is an area of 500 square miles on which work has but recently commenced. Considerable stretches of country along the Railway are now clear. There has been a new hatch four miles south of Kajado, and a small hatch in the Kedong Valley. These are being dealt with. The officer in control reports that only small swarms from patches of inaccessible country may escape, but the success attending baiting on roosting swarms of young flies and on mixed hopper and flying bands may account for many which would otherwise get away.

Lailipia Plateau — The officer working in the area near the confluence of the Matara and Guaso Nyiro reports that he is able to deal rapidly with converging bands. The rivers are very high, and form an effective barrier.

From Laikipia, Baringo and the Kerio Province generally, reports of an enormous increase in the numbers of locust birds have been received.

So far there are no reports of damage to crops.

“ Provided that, before such cancellation shall take place, an enquiry into the circumstances shall be held by the District Commissioner who shall certify his approval of such cancellation

“ In the event of such cancellation, the holder of such stand permit or lease shall be allowed one month in which to dispose of any buildings on the stand to a person to be approved by the Town Clerk, and, failing such disposal to an approved person, the buildings shall be put up to auction and the proceeds of the sale, after deducting such expenses in connection therewith as to the Town Clerk may seem reasonable, shall be paid to the owner of such buildings ”

ORDINANCE, 1928

BY-LAWS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by section 66 of the Local Government (District Councils) Ordinance, 1928, the Naivasha District Council have made the following by-laws —

1 These by-laws may be cited as “ the Naivasha District Council (Standing Orders) By-laws, 1929 ”

2 No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the District Council other than that specified in the agenda relating thereto, except any matters which the Chairman considers urgent, or which the Council resolves by a majority of the whole Council or three-fourths of the members present to deal with as urgent Meetings of
the Council

3 When a meeting of the Council is adjourned, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be sent to each member of the Council, specifying the business to be transacted

4 If, at the expiration of twenty minutes after the hour at which any meeting of the Council is appointed to be held, a quorum shall not have assembled, no meeting shall take place, unless it is decided, with the unanimous consent of the members present, to allow further time not exceeding an additional ten minutes in order to enable a quorum to assemble

5 If during any sitting of the Council the attention of the Chairman of the Council shall be called to the number of members present, he shall count them, and if it be found that there is not a quorum present, and if after an interval of five minutes a quorum is still not present, the Council shall stand adjourned

6 Every member of the Council attending a meeting of the Council shall sign his name in the attendance book kept for that purpose

7 Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council shall be drawn up and printed or typewritten, and shall, if confirmed, be signed at the next ensuing ordinary meeting by the Chairman Minutes

8 The minutes of the last meeting shall be taken as read, with a view to confirmation, provided that a copy of the minutes shall have been sent to each member of the Council twenty-four hours previously

9 No motion or discussion shall be allowed upon the minutes, except as to their accuracy

10 Members of the Council shall stand when speaking, and shall address the chair Conduct of
debate

11 A member who speaks shall direct his speech strictly to the motion under discussion, or to an explanation or a question of order

12 Whenever the Chairman of the Council rises during a debate, any member then speaking, or offering to speak, is to sit down and the Council is to be silent, so that the Chairman of the Council may be heard without interruption

13 No speech shall exceed ten minutes in length without the consent of the Council

14 The Chairman of the Council shall call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order on the part of a member, and shall direct such member, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, or in the event of persistent disregard of the authority of the chair, to retire for the remainder of the sitting

15 No member shall address the Council more than once on any motion or amendment, the mover of the original motion may however reply but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. The right of reply shall not extend to the mover of an amendment which, having been carried, has become the substantive motion

16 Any member whether he has spoken on the matter under discussion or not, may rise to a point of order, or in explanation, but such explanation shall be confined to some material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood. A member so rising shall be entitled to be heard forthwith

17 A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover with the consent of the Council, which may be signified without debate and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused

18 The ruling of the Chairman of the Council on a point of order or on the admissibility of a personal explanation, shall be final and shall not be open to discussion

19 The Council may resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council

20 The quorum of the Committee of the whole Council shall be not less than one half of the members of the whole Council

Voting

21 Every motion proposed and seconded, shall be submitted to the Council by the Chairman of the Council, who shall call upon the members in favour of the motion to say "Aye" and those against to say "No", and he shall thereupon declare what he collects to be the sense of the Council. Provided it shall always be in the power of any member to challenge the declaration of the Chairman of the Council, and to demand a division whereupon the Chairman of the Council shall take the vote of each member separately, which shall be recorded in the minutes, and the motion shall be declared carried or lost according to the numbers voting for or against it

22 Previously to the Chairman taking the division, the question before the Council shall be put again by the Chairman of the Council, and every member then present, save any member prohibited from exercising a vote under any provisions of the Local Government (District Councils) Ordinance (with the exception of the member occupying the chair, with whom it shall be optional whether he votes or not) shall record his vote either for or against the question

23 No member shall vote in a division unless he shall have been present when the question was put the second time

24 When the Clerk shall have recorded all the votes cast, the Chairman of the Council shall announce the result of the division

25 All receipts shall be deposited daily to the credit of Financial the Council's banking account without abatement

26 Written receipts on printed and numbered forms bearing the name of the District of which duplicate copies shall be kept, shall be issued for all moneys received by or on behalf of the Council

27 All work not carried out departmentally the amount of which exceeds seventy-five pounds must, except in cases of emergency, be put up for public tender, and all work not carried out departmentally the amount of which does not exceed seventy-five pounds shall when possible, be put up for public tender

28 Tenders shall be received only in closed envelopes, and placed in a box appointed for the purpose

29 The tenders shall be opened by two members of the Council or of a Committee duly authorised to deal with such tenders in conjunction with the Clerk, who shall sit in public for that purpose fifteen minutes before the time fixed for the sitting of the Council, or Committee as the case may be, and one of the members of the Council or Committee so present shall date and sign each tender received All tenders received shall be recorded in the minutes of the Council or Committee as the case may be

30 If a Committee shall accept or recommend the acceptance of a tender other than the lowest they shall state their reasons in a report thereon to the Council

31 All orders for works and goods shall be given on official order forms, and copies of such orders shall be attached to all accounts before payment is made

32 All payments shall be made by cheque

33 No cheques shall be drawn for any amount the account for which is not signed by the Chairman of the Committee directing the expenditure, the Clerk and the Engineer
