Reciprocity between Kenya and other British possessions

Where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of any British possession or any territory under His Majesty's protection for the enforcement within such possession or territory of maintenance orders made by the court in the Colony, the Governor may by proclamation extend this Ordinance to maintenance orders made by the courts within such possession or territory, and thereupon this Ordinance shall apply to such maintenance orders as if they had been made in England or Ireland

# A Bill to Amend the Maintenance Orders Enforcement Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "the Maintenance Short title Orders Enforcement (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929," and shall be read as one with the Maintenance Orders Enforcement Ordinance (Chapter 169 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter 5 referred to as "the Principal Ordinance"

2 Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Repeal and repealed and the following is substituted therefor— replacement

Repeal and replacement of section 10 of the Principal Ordinance

Where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal Ordinance provisions have been made by the legislature of any British 10 possession or any territory under His Majesty's protection or any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Butain and Northern Ireland, or in any other part of His 15 Majesty's dominions, for the enforcement within such possession, protectorate or territory of maintenance orders made by courts in the Colony, the Governor may by proclamation extend this Ordinance to such possession, protectorate or territory and this Ordinance shall thereupon 20 apply in respect of such possession, protectorate or territory as though the reference to England or Ireland were references to such possession, protectorate or territory and the references to the Secretary of State for the Colonies were references to the Governor of such possession, protectorate or territory "

# OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under the Maintenance Orders Enforcement Ordinance—

- (a) certified copies of Maintenance Orders which have to be forwarded to other British possessions or territories under His Majesty's protection require to be forwarded through the Secretary of State however near the other colony or protectorate may be,
- (b) there is no power to make in absentia a provisional maintenance order against a person resident anywhere except in England or Ireland,

(c) there is no provision for admissibility of depositions taken, or documents signed, anywhere except in England or Ireland

This Bill remedies these defects by changing the "recipiocity" clause so as to enable references to England or Ireland to be read as references to the possession or territory concerned and references to the Secretary of State for the Colonies as references to the Governor of such possession or territory

The Bill also makes provision for the application of the Principal Ordinance to mandated territories

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting

Whereas by a Commission passed under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the Fifth day of November, 1928, We did appoint Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Jacob William Barth, Knight, Commander of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, to administer the Government of Our Colony of Kenya during Our Pleasure, with all the powers, rights privileges and advantages to the same belonging or appertaining, in the event of the death, incapacity, removal or absence of Our Governor of Our said Colony and of the person for the time being holding the substantive appointment of Colonial Secretary thereof

And whereas by a further Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the Tenth day of April, 1929, We did suspend the operation of Our said Commission bearing date the Fifth day of November 1928, and in lieu thereof did appoint the said Sir Jacob William Barth to administer the Government of Our said Colony, during Our pleasure, with all the powers, rights, privileges and advantages of the same belonging or appertaining, in the event of the death, incapacity, removal or absence of Our Governor of Our said Colony

AND WHEREAS We no longer deem it necessary to make provision as set forth in Our said Commission dated the Fifth day of November, 1928 or in Our said Commission dated the Tenth day of April, 1929

Now, Therefore, We do hereby revoke Our said Commission dated the Fifth day of November, 1928, and Our said Commission dated the Tenth day of April 1929, and do declare that henceforth and until Our pleasure shall be further signified, the administration of the Government of Our Colony of Kenya shall be regulated by the provisions of the Letters Patent in force in Our said Colony

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this Twenty-eighth day of August, 1929, in the Twentieth year of Our Reign

# THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MUNICIPALITIES) ORDINANCE, 1928

Mombasa By-Laws No 5 of 1929

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon it by Section 69 of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928, the Mombasa Municipal Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, has made the following By-laws —

- These By-laws may be cited as "the Mombasa Title Municipality (Slaughterhouse and Sale and Conveyance of Meat) By-laws, 1929 ''
- These By-laws shall apply to the Mombasa Municipal Application Area and shall come into operation after the expiration of a and date of effect period of three calendar months from the date of their publication in the Gazette
  - For the purpose of these By-laws —

Definitions

- 'Slaughterhouse' means all buildings, spaces and larrages within the site set apart by the Municipal Board for the purpose of slaughtering animals
- "Animal" means any animal the meat of which is intended for human consumption
- "Meat" means the flesh or offal of any animal intended for human consumption but shall not include canned meats or potted meats
- "Meat Inspector" means the person appointed by the Municipal Board to act as Meat Inspector or other qualified person authorised by it to act in that behalf
- "Veterinary Inspector" means an officer of the Veterinary Department or other qualified person authorised by the Municipal Board to act as Veterinary Inspector
- 4 No animal the meat of which is intended for human Veterinary consumption shall be slaughtered unless and until such animal has been inspected and passed as fit for slaughter by a Veterinary Inspector within forty-eight hours of the time of slaughter

Provided that nothing in this By-law shall imply that any animal passed as fit for slaughter shall be fit for human consumption

- Every animal passed as fit for slaughter shall be Animals to branded or marked by a Vetermary Inspector or his assistants
- No person shall slaughter within the Municipal area Private elsewhere than in the slaughterhouse any animal the meat of slaughterwhich is intended for human consumption Provided that this prohibited By-law shall not apply to pigs
- No person shall slaughter any animal at the slaughter- Hours of house except between the hours of 5 pm and 12 midnight slaughter Provided that in cases of emergency it shall be lawful for the Town Clerk to issue a permit to slaughter at other times

Permits

Every person requiring permission to slaughter at hours other than those stated in By-law 7 hereof shall submit an application in writing to the Town Clerk for a permit and such permit shall be delivered to the Meat Inspector at least two hours before the intended time of slaughter

Animals not to be subjected to unnecessarv suffering

Every person using the slaughterhouse or driving or bringing any animal to the slaughterhouse shall adopt such methods and precautions as will prevent the infliction on the animal of any unnecessary suffering

Animals not to be kept it the slaughterthan 48 hours

No person shall keep or suffer any animal to be kept at the slaughterhouse for a longer period than 48 hours for house for more the purpose of preparing such animal for the process of slaughter, and any animal kept at the slaughterhouse shall not be confined elsewhere than in the larrages provided for the purpose

Animals not to be slughtered or dressed in view of another

No person shall slaughter or cause or suffer to be 11 slaughtered any animal and no person shall dress or cause or suffer to be dressed the carcass of any animal in the view of another animal

[nspection of carcases

No person shall remove the carcass or part of the carcass of any animal the meat of which is intended for human consumption from the slaughterhouse until such carcass or part of a carcass has been inspected, passed and stamped by the Meat Inspector

Carcases not to be divided before inspection

No person shall cut the carcass of any animal the meat of which is intended for human consumption into joints or pieces or remove the offal so as to prevent identification until such carcass has been inspected, passed and stamped by the Meat Inspector

Transport of mert

No person shall convey the carcass of any animal or any meat intended for human consumption or undressed hides along any road, passage-way or public place otherwise than in a clean covered cart or closed receptacle of a partern approved by the Municipal Board

Uncleanly conveyance of meat

No person shall convey or deposit, or cause to be conveyed or deposited any carcass or meat intended for human consumption in an unwholesome, uncleanly or offensive manner or in such a way as to be unnecessarily or improperly exposed to contamination, and no person shall stand sit or recline on any such carcass or meat which is being conveyed or has been deposited

Inspection of meat

No person shall offer or expose or deposit for sale 16or have in his possession for the purpose of sale or delivery within the Municipal area any meat unless the same has been inspected and passed as fit to human consumption by the Meat Inspector

Sale of meat

No person shall within the Municipal area carry on the trade of a butcher in or upon any premises other than the Municipal Markets in which such trade is permitted to be carried on under the Market By-laws, unless he shall first have obtained a licence from the Board in respect of such premises

Duration, etc, of licence

A butcher's licence may be issued either for a year or for a half-year, every licence for a year shall expire on the 31st day of December and every licence for a half-year shall

expue on the 30th day of June or the 31st day of December (as the case may be) of the year or half-year for which it was issued. A fee of Sh. 200 for a year or Sh. 125 for a half-year will be charged for each butcher's licence

- A licence issued under these By-laws shall not be Trunsfers transferable from the holder thereof to any other person without the permission of the Board and no licence shall in iny case be transferable from the premises in respect of which it is granted to any other premises
- Any person desiring a licence shall send to the Town Application Clerk a written upplication for the same and shall furnish all for licence the information required by the Town Clerk
- No person shall allow any fresh meat to remain over- Storage of night in the Municipal Meat Market or other premises licensed in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws except in storage approved by the Municipal Board
- Every person engaged in the handling of meat for Clothing of human consumption shall be clean in person and clothed in persons engaged in the clean suitable clothes The following shall be deemed to be handling of suitable clothing —

In the case of persons handling or carrying or loading or unloading carcases at the slaughterhouse, at any place where the trade of a butcher is permitted to be carried on or in transit to any place whatsoever an overall of white or khaki drill or other washable material, reaching from the neck to at least the knees, and a head-covering reaching, at the back, to at least the shoulders

In the case of persons serving or cutting up in any butcher's shop stall or meat market an apron of suitable washable material covering the entire front of the body from the neck to at least the knees

- Every person engaged in the slaughtering of any General numal or the preparing or selling of any meat for human consumption shall keep at all times all vessels, receptacles, instruments and appliances belonging to and used in connection with the trade of a butcher in a thoroughly clean and wholesome condition
- No person shall use any wrappings for a carcass, part of a carcus or meat intended for human consumption, unless such wrappings are clean and free from contamination
- No person who is suffering from any form of infectious or contagious disease shall be engaged or employed in any manner in connection with the public meat supply
- No person shall, directly or indirectly, obstruct or Obstruction resist any examination or inspection referred to in these Bylaws or refuse to answer or knowingly make false answer to יחי inquiry in connection therewith
- There shall be paid at the time of slaughter the fees Fees prescribed below in respect of all animals slaughtered —

Sh 4 each Camels Cattle Sh 2 each Sh 1 each Sheep and goats Other animals Sh 1 each. Penalty

Any person guilty of an offence against or contravention of or default in complying with any provisions of these By-laws, or who obstructs any duly authorised officer of the Municipal Board in the execution of his duty in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws, shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding four hundred shillings or imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months, or both, and on conviction on more than two occasions may in addition to any other penalty be suspended for a period of twelve months from taking any part in any trade or business affecting the public meat supply

# THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MUNICIPALITIES) ORDINANCE, 1928

Mombasa By-Laws No 6 of 1929

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon it by Section 69 of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928, the Mombasa Municipal Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, has made the following By-laws —

Title

1 These By-laws may be cited as "the Mombasa Municipality (Inspection, Storage and Sale of Food) By-laws, 1929"

Application and date of effect

- Definitions
- These By-laws shall apply to the Mombasa Municipal area and shall come into operation on the 1st January, 1930
  - 3 For the purpose of these By-laws —
- "Food" means and includes every article other than drugs used for human consumption and every article which ordinarily enters into or is used in the composition or preparation of human food and includes flavouring matters and condiments
- "Infectious or contagious disease" means and includes every disease which can be communicated directly or indirectly by any person suffering therefrom to any other person

Licences

4 No person shall use any premises for the manufacture of preparation or storage for sale or sale of food unless he shall be in lawful possession of a then current licence issued in accordance with these By-laws or any other laws or by-laws in force in the Municipality in respect of premises where food

is manufactured or prepared or stored for sale or sold. Provided that nothing contained in these By-laws shall apply to Municipal Markets

- All applications for licences shall be made in the form Applications prescribed in the Schedule to these By-laws and shall be for- for licences warded to the Town Clerk to whom all fees for licences shall be payable in advance
- No premises shall be licensed for the manufacture, Unsuitable preparation, storage for sale or sale of food if the lighting, premises not to be licensed ventilation, water supply, drainage, sanitation, situation or general condition are not such as are necessary and proper in the opinion of the Municipal Board on the advice of the Medical Officer of Health
- No licence shall be granted for a longer period than Duration of one year and every licence shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year for which it has been granted
- For every licence issued before the 1st of July a fee Licence fee of five shillings shall be paid to the Municipal Board For every licence issued on or after the 1st of July a fee of two shillings and fitty cents shall be paid to the Municipal Board, provided that the full amount of five shillings shall be payable in respect of all piemises liable to be licensed under these By-laws before that date
- A licence shall not be transferable from the holder Transfer of thereof to any other person without the permission of the Municipal Board and for every such transfer a fee of two shillings shall be paid to the Board and no such licence shall in any case be transferable from the premises in respect of which it is granted to any other premises
- The Municipal Board may on sanitary or hygienic Cancellation grounds or on account of any contravention of these By-laws of licence cancel any licence or suspend such licence for such period as it shall think fit
- No person who is suffering from any form of in-Infectious fectious or contagious disease shall stay in any premises licensed under these By-laws or take any part in the manufacture, preparation, storage or sale of food
- The occupier of any premises where any article of Food vendors' food is manufactured, prepared, stored or exposed for sale premises to be shall been such as a premise to be shall keep such premises and any instrument or utensil used in such manufacture or preparation or storage in a thoroughly clean and wholesome condition
- All food intended for sale shall be stored in a room Storage of set apart for that purpose, and such room shall be well food for sale ventilated to the open an and shall at all times be kept in a cleanly and wholesome condition, and no such food shall be stored in any living-room or bedroom
- All reasonable measures shall be taken on any pre- Contamination mises licensed under these By-laws to prevent the contamina- of food tion of any food
- All persons engaged in connection with the manu- Personal facture, preparation, storage and sale of food shall at all times cleanliness be clean in clothing and person

Uncleanly conveyance of food

16 No person shall hawk, convey or deposit or cause to be hawked, conveyed or deposited within the Municipality any article of food in an unwholesome, uncleanly or offensive manner, or in such a way as to be unnecessarily or improperly exposed to contamination, and no person shall stand, sit or recline on any such article which is being leawked or conveyed or has been deposited

Conveyance of toodstuff

17 Any person hawking or conveying any foodstuff in any handcart, barrow or other conveyance shall have his name and address legibly painted on some conspicuous part of such conveyance

Right of entry

18 The Medical Officer of Health or any Sanitary Inspector may at any time enter upon and inspect any premises used for the manufacture, preparation, storage or sale of tood, and may examine the water supply and any vessels and utensils which may be found on the premises and the process of manufacture employed and for the purpose of such inspection may make any inquiry that appears necessary

Inspection

Inspector or other person duly authorised by the Municipal Board in writing may at any time inspect and examine and for that purpose cut into any food and may examine any food sold or exposed for sale or deposited in any place or in course of transmission for the purpose of sale or preparation for sale and for the purpose of being supplied by any employer to his employees and intended for the food of man, and in any subsequent proceedings relating thereto the onus of proof that the same was not exposed or deposited or sold for any such purpose or was not intended for food shall be upon the owner or the person in whose possession the food was found

Seizure

of Health or any Sanitary Inspector or other person duly authorised by the Municipal Board in writing to be diseased or unsound or unwholesome or unfit for food such officer may detain such tood for examination or may forthwith, himself or by an assistant, serze and carry away such tood, and thereupon any magistrate on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health Sanitary Inspector or of a Veterinary Officer may order it to be destroyed or to be so disposed of as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for food, and may direct the Municipal Board to effect such removal and destruction or disposal

Foodstuffs from without the Municipality

21 It shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health or any Sanitary Inspector to detain and examine any food from without the Municipality at its point of entry into the Municipality or in any street or in any railway station and any such food which is diseased or liable injuriously to affect any person consuming the same may be dealt with in the manner provided in the preceding By-law

Taking of samples

The Medical Officer of Health or any Sanitary Inspector authorised by the Municipal Board in writing shall be empowered to exercise within the Municipal area all such functions with regard to the purchase of samples of food as may be exercised by persons appointed by any law relating to the sale of food for the time being in force in the Colony

The owner of any such food proved to be diseased Penalties or unsound or unwholesome, or unfit for food, or the person in whose possession the same was found, or the person by whom the same was exposed or consigned or delivered for sale or sold shall be hable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding six months or to both and in addition the Municipal Board may recover from such person all expenses incurred in the removal and destruction or disposal of such food under the provisions of By-laws Nos 20 and 21

Any person guilty of an offence against or contravention of or default in complying with any provisions of these By-laws, or who obstructs any duly authorised officer of the Municipal Board in the execution of his duty in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws shall, if no penalty is expressly provided for such offence, contravention, default or obstruction be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding three hundred shillings or imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months or both and on conviction on more than two occasions may in addition to any other penalty be prohibited from taking any further part in any trade or business connected with the manufacture, preparation, storage or sale of food

Locust Report to 16-10-29

#### FLYING SWARMS

Three small swarms of red locusts moved south over Maraquet, then turned east into Kamasia

A thin swarm is reported from the region of Eburru

A heavy swarm was observed in the Solai area on 12-10 29 It flew north-east No further reports to hand as to its subsequent movements

Swarms still persist in the region of Rumiuruti, but the Northern Frontier Province is reported to be practically clear of flying swarms

Tanganyika reports that the report of a fresh pink swarm flying south over the border at Mashewa (wrongly named Moiben in the last report), now proves to be false. There is a further report of a swarm damaging native maize in the Paie Hills. No damage has been reported from Kenya this week.

#### HOPPER AREAS

A report of hoppers on a farm in the settled area is to hand—confirmation is awaited

From Northern Turkana a final report states that, within an area of ten square miles, mixed large hoppers and young fliers were successfully bran-barted, and the area entirely cleared. Staff has been reduced

There is a possibility of a further campaign against hoppers November—February Should the swarms already known to be in the Colony receive no reinforcement, the campaign will be on a restricted scale
