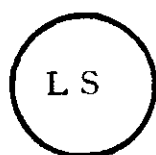

BY His Excellency Sir Edward William Macleay Grigg, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by section 3 of the Forest Ordinance (Chapter 149 of the Revised Edition), I do hereby declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a forest area for the purposes of the aforementioned Ordinance

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 722

## THE TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE

## RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Townships Ordinance (Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition) and of all other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as the Kyambu and Runu Townships (Dustbin) Rules, 1929, and shall apply to the Townships of Kyambu and Runu

2 The expression “ nuisance ” herein shall include any accumulation or deposit of domestic refuse whether the same shall be detrimental to health or not

3 The occupier of any building or premises shall provide and maintain to the satisfaction of the District Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health a receptacle for ashes and other non-liquid domestic refuse of a sufficient size, of a capacity not more in any case than six cubic feet, of an approved pattern and fitted with a good and efficient lid. Provided that, in the case of any house occupied by more tenants than one, the owner shall be deemed to be the occupier for the purposes of these Rules

4 The occupier of any building or premises shall daily cause to be placed within the dustbin, provided in terms of the foregoing Rule, the domestic refuse from the said building or premises in so far as such dustbin shall be sufficient to contain the same, and not elsewhere, and shall cause such dustbin to be placed and kept in an approved place on the plot or sub-plot upon which such building or premises stands and shall not cause or suffer the same to be placed or kept elsewhere and shall make and keep such dustbin accessible to the public sweepers during the whole period between 6 a m and 2 p m on Saturdays and between 6 a m and 5 p m on other days. For the purpose of this Rule premises not occupied for human habitation shall not be deemed to be occupied on any day in which they are not actually occupied after the hour of 4 p m

5 If any nuisance shall exist upon or near any premises, by reason of domestic refuse, the District Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health or person acting on his behalf, shall serve upon the occupier of such premises a notice in writing requiring him to remove the nuisance within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent its recurrence, and, if after the expiry of the time specified in such notice as aforesaid such nuisance shall continue or shall, by the act, default, or sufferance of the person upon whom such notice shall have been served recur, then in either of such cases such person shall be guilty of an offence

6 If there shall be any accumulation or deposit of any trade refuse upon or near any premises used or occupied by any person or used or occupied by any person for or on behalf of any such person as aforesaid for the purposes of any trade

or business whatsoever, which shall, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or a person deputed by him be, or in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or a person deputed by him, is likely or calculated to be injurious to health, then and in any of such cases the District Commissioner or Medical Officer of Health or other person acting on his behalf shall serve upon the person using or occupying the said premises, or upon the person using or occupying the said premises for or on behalf of such person as aforesaid, a notice requiring him or them to remove the said accumulation or deposit within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent the recurrence of such accumulation or deposit, and, if after the expiry of the time specified in the said notice as aforesaid, such accumulation or deposit shall not be removed or, by the act, default or sufferance of the person so using or occupying the said premises as aforesaid or of the person using or occupying the said premises on his behalf as aforesaid shall recur, then in either of such cases, such person shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence

7 Any person contravening or failing to comply with any of the provisions of these Rules shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding two months or both

## LOCUST REPORT TO 13-11-29

## FLYING SWARMS

All swarms in the Colony are rapidly approaching the ovipositing stage, whilst in some places laying grounds have already been discovered.

Information received from districts indicates the position to be as follows —

*Northern Frontier Province and Meru* — It is now considered that there has not been a new infestation of locusts from the north, but that numerous swarms emanating from other parts of Kenya are concentrating in the Northern Frontier Province for breeding purposes. Laying is taking place from Barsaloi to Archers' Post and Merte, also north as far as Kauro on the Marsabit Road. There are gravid swarms in the vicinity of Garba Tulla and Wajir, and laying is expected to take place in these areas.

In some of the above districts, particularly Archer's Post, the locust eggs are being attacked by parasites.

Meru reports that a large swarm of yellow locusts infested the Tharaka area on the 6th November and, after doing considerable damage to native crops, flew in the direction of Embu on the 7th November.

*Embu* — The Agricultural Officer at Embu reports on the 12th November that the entire Lower Embere district is infested with yellow locusts moving slowly towards Embu. Serious damage is being done to young crops. This swarm appears to be the same one that passed over Meru on the 17th and 18th October, and was expected to fly in the direction of Kitui.

*Kitui* — A report from the locust scout in the Kitui district states that from the 5th to the 10th November yellow swarms were continually passing the Muvukuni area, flying in a south-westerly direction, and that laying has taken place on a fairly extensive scale. From the native point of view there is a paucity of information to be obtained in this neighbourhood, as three-quarters of the population have migrated in consequence of the famine conditions that exist.

*Donyo Sabuk* — A large swarm of yellow mature locusts is moving slowly about the country in the vicinity of the Nzene Estate and the Quarantine Station on the Kitui Road. Laying is reported, and a locust scout has proceeded to this district to investigate.

*Thika* — Two small yellow swarms stated to be heavily parasitised, passed through the Kianzabe Estates, Thika, flying in a southerly direction.

*Machakos* — A large yellow swarm passed over the locations of Kiteta and Mbooni on the 3rd November, flying in a south-westerly direction. No further information has been received.

*North Turkana and West Suk* — One very scattered yellow swarm is reported from Northern Turkana in the vicinity of Kampiya Simba, whilst in West Suk two large gravid swarms have been located, one near Logitanyalla and the other at Kateruk. Extensive laying is not anticipated, however, in these districts or in Southern Turkana.

Preparations are now being made for a hopper campaign in the Northern Frontier Province and,

should hoppers appear, it is possible that destructive operations on a small scale will take place in Tharaka, Lower Embere, Kitui, and Voi, with a probable extension to the Coast.

*Tanganyika* — Telegraphic information from Tanganyika states that the swarm reported on Pare Hills has now moved down from the Forest Reserve to Hedaru. There is also a small swarm of red locusts near Mbulu flying westward.

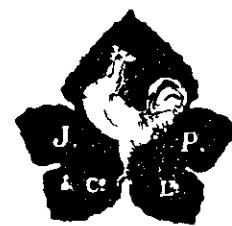
