LOCUST REPORT TO 19-12 29

Weather conditions over both transport routes and hopper areas have scriously hampered operations during the last week, nevertheless, considerable des truction has been effected, and numbers of hoppers have also been destroyed by the elements. The intestation is still confined to the Northern Frontier Province, Embu, and Ukamba Province

HOPPER AREAS

Voithern Frontier Province — Over 100 acres of hoppers have been baited and destroyed

Embu —Staff has been reinforced, and extensive destruction is being effected. Native crops have been invided by hopper bands

hitui —No report

Donyo Sabuh —Intestation cleared up Staff has been transferred to the Yatta Plains

Machahos —Two Locust Officers operating in this district have destroyed 65 acres of hoppers with bran bart which is proving most effective

I or — Two Locust Officers and a locust train are in this area. Hoppers are in small groups, but are being rapidly killed by bait. Very heavy rains are also doing damage to the young hoppers.

S Masai Reserve -No report

It is inticipated that from escapes, and from inaccessible areas such as those to the north and eat of Meru District, flights of young locusts will arise probably after the middle of January. They hould move southwards over Einbu Kitur Machakos, and some swarms may reach Donyo Sabuk. The destruction now being effected in the area to the west and north-west of Meru, will effectively reduce the size of any swarms which may travel south along the western face of Mount Kenya. It is not expected that excessively large swarms will arise
