## LAKES VICTORIA AND KIOGA NAVIGATION ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1921

### ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Lakes Victoria and Kioga Navigation Order in Council, 1921, the Secretary of State for the Colonies hereby makes the following additional Regulations, namely

(1) These Regulations may be cited as "the Lakes Victoria and Kioga Navigation (Amendment) Regulations, 1930," and shall be read as one with and part of the Lakes Victoria and Kioga Navigation Regulations, 1921 (hereinafter called "the Principal Regulations")

Short title

(2) The following Regulations, to be numbered 10A and 10B, shall be deemed to be added to Part II of the Principal Regulations —

Inspection of vessels

" 10A Every vessel plying or intending to ply on Lake Victoria or Lake Kioga shall be open at all times to inspection by a surveyor or surveyors appointed by the respective Governors of the Colony of Kenya, the Uganda Protectorate and the Tanganyika Territory jointly, and if any such surveyor or surveyors shall certify in writing that any vessel is an unsafe ship, that is to say, is by reason of the defective condition of her hull, equipments or machinery, or by reason of under manning, or by reason of overloading or improper loading, unfit to ply in the said lakes or either of them, without danger to human life, having regard to the nature of the service for which such vessel is intended, then in such case no such vessel shall ply on the said lakes or either of them unless and until a surveyor or surveyors appointed under this Regulation shall certify in writing that such vessel is no longer an unsafe ship

" 10B No person shall prevent or attempt to prevent any surveyor appointed under the last preceding Regulation from inspecting any vessel, and no person shall hinder or obstruct any surveyor appointed under the last preceding clause while he is inspecting any vessel "

(3) The respective Governors of the Colony of Kenya, the Uganda Protectorate and the Tanganyika Territory shall cause these Regulations to be published in the respective Gazettes of the said Territories on the same day, and these Regulations shall come into operation on that date

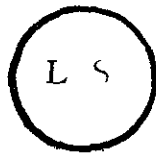

## BOUNDARIES OF THE SOUTH-WESTERN MAU FOREST RESERVE

Commencing at the south-east corner of L R No 3884,

thence bounded easterly by the southern boundary of the Western Mau Forest Reserve to the north-west corner of L R No 3683;

thence southerly by the western boundaries of L R Nos 3683 and 5227 and part of that of L R No 5692 to a point about 1,500 feet from its south-west corner,

thence in a generally south-easterly direction by a beaconed line to a point on the Sissimda River, which forms the south-eastern boundary of L R No 4627, about 5,700 feet downstream from the southern corner of that portion,

thence by that river up-stream to that southern corner and onwards to its intersection with the north-eastern boundary of L R No 4626,

thence still by that river up-stream to its junction with the tributary which forms part of the southern boundary of the Eastern Mau Forest Reserve,

thence by that tributary up-stream to its intersection with the western boundary of L R No 4610,

thence in a generally southerly direction by the western and part of the southern boundary of L R No 4610, the north-western boundaries of L R Nos 4611, 4605 and 4593, the north-western and south-western boundaries of L R No 4594, part of the western boundary of L R No 4599 and the western boundary of L R No 4600 to the south-west corner of the last,

thence south-westerly by the boundary of the Masai Province and Native Reserve to the Kipsonoi River,

thence northerly, north-easterly and westerly by the boundary of the Buret Native Reserve to the Dare (or Itare) River;

thence by that river down-stream to a tributary about three miles above the south-east corner of L R No 6026,

thence by that tributary up-stream to its source marked by a beacon

thence in a northerly direction by a beaconsed line to the source of a tributary of the river Maiaama,

thence down that tributary and the Maiaama to the south-east corner of L R No 5468,

thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that portion and the southern boundary of L R No 3884 to the point of commencement

The foregoing boundaries are shown edged green on Land Surveys Boundary No 71, deposited at the office of the Survey Department, Nairobi, copies of which are on record at the offices of the Conservator of Forests, Nairobi, and of the District Commissioner, Kericho

THE STATE RAILWAY PROVIDENT FUND  
ORDINANCE*(Chapter 35 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya)*THE STATE RAILWAY PROVIDENT FUND  
(AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1926

## RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 5 of the State Railway Provident Fund Ordinance (Chapter 35 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) as repealed and re-enacted by section 3 of the State Railway Provident Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, and of the powers conferred upon him by Article 7 (c) of the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Orders in Council, 1925 and 1927, His Excellency the High Commissioner for Transport has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as “ the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours Provident Fund Rules, 1929,” and shall be read as one with the Railway Provident Fund Rules dated the 1st of June, 1914 (as amended by the Railway Provident Fund (Amendment) Rules, 1920), hereinafter called “ the Principal Rules ”

2 Rule 3 (e) of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule is substituted therefor —

“ 3 (e) ‘ Servant ’ means a servant on the non-pensionable staff of the Services who does not come within any of the following categories —

- (i) who is an apprentice on probation,
  - (ii) who is in receipt of a salary of less than Shs 100 per mensem or, in the case of a driver shunter, fireman, or guard, who is in receipt of a salary of less than Shs 60 per mensem
  - (iii) who is serving under a special covenant which excludes his becoming a depositor,
  - (iv) who is engaged with the prospect of remaining in the services for less than 12 months,
- ‘ servant ’ however, includes the following
- (v) who, having been engaged with the prospect of remaining in the Services for less than 12 months, actually remains in the Services at the end of that period, in which case he shall be deemed to be a servant with effect from a date 12 months after that of his original engagement, provided that in such case the servant may within one month after such date elect to become a depositor with effect from the date of his original engagement ’

3 There shall be inserted immediately after Rule 3 (k) of the Principal Rules the following sub-rule 3 (1) —

“ 3 (1) ‘ Service ’ means the services as defined in the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Orders in Council, 1925 and 1927 ”

4 The note appearing immediately after Rule 3 (k) of the Principal Rules, commencing “ Note —Permanent establishment,” is hereby cancelled



5 Rules 22 and 23 of the Principal Rules are hereby revoked and the following are substituted therefor —

“ 22 Compulsory or voluntary deposits cannot be forfeited under any circumstances, but when a claim is presented for the balance at credit any amount due to the High Commissioner may be deducted from such compulsory or voluntary deposits and the bonus or bonuses allotted together with the interest accrued thereon before handing over such balance to the claimant ”

“ 23 (i) If a depositor is dismissed from the Government service the Manager may cause to be withheld all or any part of the bonus or bonuses provisionally allotted to him under Rule 9 with the interest accrued thereon, only the balance at his credit without such bonus or bonuses and interest thereon being paid to the depositor. In the case of there being any outstandings against a depositor, who may have absconded, resigned or been dismissed, the amount of such outstandings may be deducted from his compulsory or voluntary deposits, the balance only after such deductions being paid to him, provided that the Manager may apply so much of the bonus or bonuses provisionally allotted to such depositor with the interest accrued thereon and withheld under this Rule as will, together with the depositor's own contributions also deducted, make good the loss sustained by the High Commissioner

(ii) Subject to the provisions of Rule 22 and of this Rule, any bonus or balance of bonus withheld from a dismissed depositor shall be credited to the Fine Fund of the Railway ”

RULES of Court made under the provisions of the Kenya Order in Council, 1921, Article 9, with the approval of the Governor

#### RULES OF COURT No 4 OF 1930

1 These Rules may be cited as “ Rules of Court (Advocates' Remuneration and Taxation of Costs Amendment) No 4 of 1930 ” and shall be read together with Section III of Rules of Court (Taxation of Costs—Contentious Proceedings) of Part XIII of the Rules of His Majesty's Supreme Court of Kenya, appearing at pages 106 *et seq* of Vol I of the Orders, Proclamations, Rules and Regulations (hereinafter referred as “ the Principal Rules ”).

2 The First Schedule to Section III of Part XIII of the Principal Rules is amended by inserting the following proviso after the words "Instructions—To sue or defend Shs 60" therein appearing —" Provided that the taxing officer may for good cause to be recorded by him, allow a fee for instructions to sue or defend exceeding the fee above set forth, provided that the fee actually allowed shall be reasonable "

3 The Second Schedule to Section III of Part XIII of the Principal Rules is amended by inserting the following additional fee —

" On execution proceedings in the subordinate courts, to include taking instructions drawing applications, engrossing same, filing and paying fees Shs 15 Provided that when an attendance in Chambers in support of the application becomes necessary (as in applications for arrest and imprisonment) the Magistrate may in his discretion allow a further fee not exceeding Shs 10 for such attendance "

UNDER section 23 of the above-quoted Ordinance, the following table of fares is imposed for Taxicabs plying for hire within the Nairobi area —

## A —IF HIRED BY DISTANCE

For each additional passenger	0	75

*Detention Charges*

For every 15 minutes after the first 5 minutes	1	50
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## B —IF HIRED BY TIME

For every 4 passengers or less number whom the vehicle is licensed to accommodate, per hour or part of an hour	15	00
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Unless the hirer of the Taxicab inform the driver that he intends to hire by time he shall be presumed to have hired by distance

The above fares shall operate not only within the Municipality but also within a radius of 5 miles from the junction of Government Road and Sixth Avenue (Nairobi House)

No extra charge shall be made for a Taxicab returning from an engagement within the Municipal Area of Nairobi
