MUNICIPALITY OF MOMBASA.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MUNICIPALITIES)
ORDINANCE, 1928.

MOMBASA BY-LAWS No. 3 OF 1930.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon it by section 69 of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928, the Mombasa Municipal Board (hereinafter called "the Board"), with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council has made the following By-laws:—

1. These By-laws may be cited as the "Mombasa (Public Markets) By-laws, 1930", and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1930.

2. For the purpose of these By-laws:—

"Public market" shall mean and include the existing markets, namely Mackinnon Market, the Fish Market in Mzizima Road and the market at Mwembe Tayari, and any other public market that may be established by the Board in the manner hereinafter provided.

3. The Board shall maintain and control all public markets within the municipality and shall appoint suitable persons as market masters who shall be authorized generally to maintain order within such markets and to see that the business of such markets is conducted in accordance with these By-laws.

4. The Board shall cause all public markets to be divided into stalls and shall apportion certain stalls for the sale of certain commodities as it may think fit.

5. The Board shall determine a monthly rent to be paid in respect of each stall and such rent shall be paid monthly in advance by the stall-holder and shall not be varied during the year for which it has been fixed.

6. The right to occupy any stall shall be sold by auction under the supervision of the Town Clerk and shall be granted to the person bidding the highest premium. The upset price shall be equivalent to two months' rent where the stall is auctioned before the 30th day of June in any one year and one month's rent where the stall is auctioned after that date unless the Board shall in any particular case determine otherwise.

7. The Town Clerk shall refuse to accept the bid of any person who may be prohibited under these By-laws from participating in the business of a public market.

8. The period of the right to occupy any stall shall be from the date of payment of the premium and the first month's rent until the 31st day of December in each year.

9. If the highest bidder fail to pay the premium bid by him together with the first month's rent on or before the first day of the month following the sale by auction, or if, having so paid, he shall fail to make any monthly payment of rent in advance or if he be guilty of any contravention of these By-laws or conduct himself with impropriety towards any officer of the Board or member of the public or fellow stall-holder, the Town Clerk may declare the stall to be vacant and after confirmation of his action by the Board shall cause the stall again to be auctioned.

10. Public markets shall be open for the sale of goods at such times as the Board shall from time to time appoint.

11. No goods shall be hawked in any public market or exposed for sale in any place or part of the public market other than a stall provided therefor.

12. No fire or cooking shall be allowed in any public market.

13. No person shall bring a dog into any public market.

14. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to enter into any public market.

15. The market master shall have power to seize any food exposed for sale in a public market which in his opinion is unfit for human consumption and shall forthwith report such seizure to the Medical Officer of Health or any Sanitary Inspector of the municipality and shall deal with such food as directed by the officer to whom he has so reported.

16. No person shall be allowed to serve in any public market unless he be clean in person and clothing.

17. It shall be the duty of the market master to order any person (other than a genuine purchaser) loitering in any public market to the inconvenience or annoyance of the public or to the prejudice of orderly conduct of the market immediately to quit such market and any such person failing to comply with such order shall be guilty of an offence.

18. Any person found guilty of an offence against or contravening or failing to comply with any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding three hundred shillings or imprisonment of either description not exceeding two months, or to both, and any stall-holder or person serving who shall have been convicted on more than two occasions may in addition to any other penalty be prohibited from taking any further part in the business of a public market.

19. Part XXI of the General Rules and Part XIII of the Mombasa Rules made under Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya and appearing at pages 414 and 614 respectively of the Revised Subsidiary Legislation are hereby repealed in so far as they are applied to Mombasa.

20. By-laws Nos. 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 11 of these By-laws shall not apply to the Fish Market in Mzizima Road.

KENYA AND UGANDA RAILWAYS AND HARBOURS.

EMPIRE DAY AND KING'S BIRTHDAY HOLIDAYS.

May 24th and June 3rd, 1930.

EXCURSION FARES.

(1) *Excursion Tickets* will be issued as under in connection with the above holidays:—

First and Second Class Tickets between Kenya and Uganda Railway Stations and Ports, including Moshi, at single fare for the double journey, minimum charge Shs. 5.

First and Second Class Excursion Tickets will also be issued in through bookings between stations on the Tanganyika Railways and all Kenya and Uganda Stations and Ports at single fare for the double journey, minimum fare Shs. 10.

(2) *Period of Issue and Availability.*—Tickets will be issued during the period Thursday, 22nd May, 1930, to Tuesday, the 3rd June, 1930, both dates inclusive. Return tickets will not be valid before Monday, the 26th May, 1930, and the return journey must be commenced not later than Sunday, the 8th June, 1930.

(3) *Intending passengers* should give the Station Master at starting station 24 hours' clear notice of their intention to travel, so that the necessary accommodation may be arranged. Passengers are also advised to book their luggage well in advance of the starting time of the train by which they travel.

NOTE.—Excursionists travelling between all Kenya and Uganda Stations and Ports when taking a motor car, motor cycle or a motor cycle and sidecar with them are granted a discount of 50% on Tariff Book rates. A certificate must be produced by the passenger at the time of the original despatch, stating that the car or cycle is his private property, that he is proceeding on holiday, and that he will purchase by the next available train an excursion ticket as advertised above. Double journey freight less 50% must be paid at sending station. The receiving station will, on the return journey, subject to the availability of the excursion ticket, book the car or cycle free.

NOTICE.

TENDERS are invited for the purchase of the grant of each of the farms detailed in the Schedule below.

2. A plan of Farm No. L.R. 3095 may be seen at the office of the Surveyor General, Nairobi, or at the office of the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani, Kisumu, and a copy may be obtained on application to the Surveyor General, Nairobi, at the price of Shs. 4, post free. The other three areas in the Schedule have not been surveyed, but sketch plans may be seen at the office of the District Commissioner, Nairobi, or at the office of the Surveyor General, Nairobi.

3. Each grant will be for a term of 999 years from the 1st July, 1930, and will be subject to the ordinary conditions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition). The titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance, 1919.

4. Tenders should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

- (a) the present land holding (if any) of the tenderer in the Colony, and the amount and nature of development thereon;

(b) the proposals of the tenderer for the development of the area if his tender be accepted;

(c) the amount of guaranteed capital available for development purposes.

5. Each of the successful tenderers will be required to pay within 7 days of notification that his tender has been accepted, 10 per cent. of the amount tendered, together with the survey fees, and the amount of rent due from the commencement of the grant to 31st December, 1930, as shown in the Schedule hereto. The balance of the purchase price shall be paid prior to the issue of title or may be paid in nine equal annual instalments, the first of such payments becoming due on the 1st January, 1931.

6. The titles will be issued as soon as conveniently may be, the successful tenderers being required to pay on demand the cost of the preparation and registration of the grant (Shs. 110), and the stamp duty in respect of the grant.

7. Sealed tenders marked "Tender for Farm Grants" must be deposited with the undersigned before noon on the 4th June, 1930.

8. Farm L.R. No. 3095 is open to tender by all persons irrespective of race, and the remaining three areas are restricted to tenders by persons of pure European descent only.

KISUMU TOWNSHIP PLOTS.

NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given that grants in respect of the plots at Kisumu specified in the Schedule hereto, will be sold by auction at the office of the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani District, Kisumu, on Wednesday the 4th June, 1930, commencing at 10 a.m.

Plans of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office attached to the Survey and Registration Department, Nairobi, and at the office of the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani District, at Kisumu, or may be had on application to the Surveyor General, on payment of Shs. 3, post free.

The right to withdraw any plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement.

In the following General and Special Conditions of Sale, the term "Authority" means the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani District, Kisumu, or such other Municipal Authority as may be hereafter established by law.

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

(a) AUCTION.

1. Each plot will be auctioned separately.
2. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted.
3. The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but if any dispute arise as to any bid, the plot will be reoffered at the last undisputed bid.
4. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 25% of the purchase money. In default of such payment, the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
5. Each purchaser shall on paying the deposit inform the auctioneer of the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the plot is purchased; the grant will be issued in accordance with this information.
6. The balance of the purchase money, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1930, shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani District, Kisumu, while the survey fees, the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Shs. 110) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant, and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor General, Nairobi; all the amounts to be paid within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition), and to the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be. Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter, unless and until the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7. Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No. 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days from the date of sale, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement, may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

(b) GENERAL.

1. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

2. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof, shall have been previously approved by the Authority, and by the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement, or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani District, Kisumu, for necessary action.

3. Grants will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance, and the term of each grant will be 25 years from the 1st day of July, 1930, subject to extension to 99 years as provided in Special Condition No. 2.

4. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.

5. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Authority.

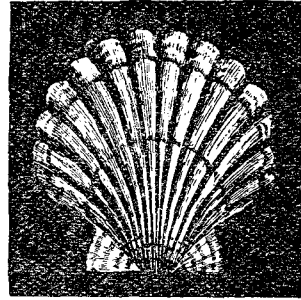

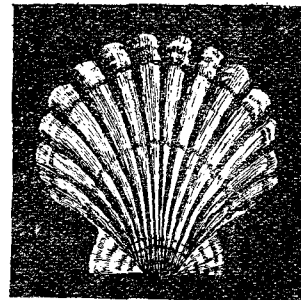

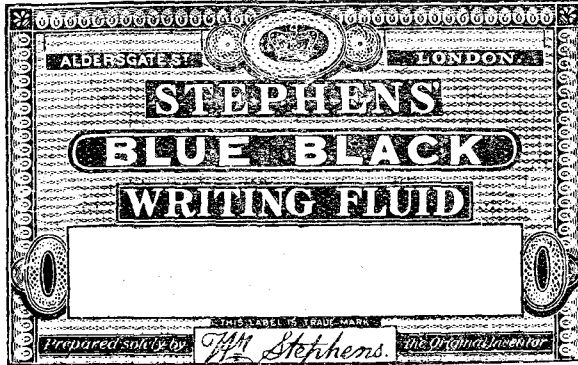
