Paragraph (a) of section 49 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace:—

- 49. Any person who does or causes or procures to be done any of the following acts, namely, who—

shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

# A Bill to Amend the Kenya and Uganda Railway Ordinance, 1927.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Kenya and Short title. Uganda Railway (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933," and shall be read as one with the Kenya and Uganda Railway Ordinance, No. 15 of 1927. 1927, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

## OBJECTS AND REASONS.

It has been found that paragraph (a) of section 49 of the Principal Ordinance, which it is proposed to repeal, created a difficulty in that, before a conviction for an offence against the section could be obtained, or proceedings issued, it was necessary to establish that a trespasser received warning to leave the High Commissioner's premises and that after such warning he refused to leave such premises.

There have been many instances in which trains have had to be stopped to prevent serious accidents to trespassers, and because such trespassers had not received warning to leave the High Commissioner's premises, or because they left immediately such warning was given, no action could be taken against them.

This position should be altered and the High Commissioner should be enabled to bring proceedings against trespassers more easily than he can do at present. This Bill effects this purpose. It follows section 55 of the Railways Ordinance, 1931, of Tanganyika.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Section 33 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Appointment of courts of appeal.

- 33. (1) A provincial commissioner may, with the approval of the Governor, by order under his hand, appoint the native tribunal presided over by a headman or senior elder or a tribunal composed of not fewer than three selected elders in a province or district, to be a court of appeal from all or any of the native tribunals in the province or district in respect of all or any of the cases arising therein.
- (2) If there be no native tribunal competent to hear an appeal under the preceding sub-section, or if in any particular case, or class of cases, the provincial commissioner shall so direct, an appeal shall lie from the native tribunal of first instance to the district commissioner.

Section 34 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Appeals.

- 34. (1) Any person aggrieved by any order or decision of a native tribunal of first instance may within thirty days from the date of such order or decision, appeal therefrom to the native court of appeal or, if there be no such native court of appeal, or if the provincial commissioner shall so direct under sub-section (2) of section 33, to the district commissioner.
- (2) Any person aggrieved by any order or decision of a native court of appeal may within thirty days from the date of such order or decision appeal therefrom to the district commissioner.
- (3) Any person aggrieved by any order or decision of a district commissioner, whether made or given upon appeal from a native tribunal of first instance or upon appeal from a native court of appeal, may within thirty days from the date of such order or decision appeal therefrom to the provincial commissioner.
- (4) Any person aggrieved by any order or decision of the provincial commissioner made or given upon appeal from a district commissioner, whereby such person is sentenced to a term of imprisonment of four months or more, or to pay a fine exceeding £15, or, in civil proceedings other than cases in connexion with marriage or inheritance or relating to immovable property, where the sum involved is more than fifty pounds, excluding costs, may within thirty days from the date of such order apply to the provincial commissioner to state a case for the consideration of the Supreme Court, and the provincial commissioner shall thereupon state and sign such case and transmit it to the Registrar of the Supreme Court.

# A Bill to Amend the Native Tribunals Ordinance, 1930.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Native Tribunals Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933," and shall be read as one with the Native Tribunals Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to No. 39 of 1930. as "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Section 33 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by substituting the words "a district officer" for the Principal Ordinance.

3. Section 34 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by substituting the words "a district officer" for the Principal the words "the district commissioner" in sub-sections (1) Ordinance. and (2) of the section, and by substituting the words "district officer " for the words " district commissioner " in sub-section 5 (3) and (4) of the section.

Section 37 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Power on appeal.

- 37. A native court of appeal, a district commissioner, a provincial commissioner or the Supreme Court, in the exercise of appellate jurisdiction in any cause or matter under this Ordinance, may require the aid of such persons as assessors as the court or other authority shall think fit and may—
  - (a) confirm vary or set aside the order of the tribunal of first instance or make any such order or pass any such sentence as the tribunal of first instance could have made or passed in such cause or matter;
  - (b) order any such cause or matter to be reheard before the tribunal of first instance, or before any other native tribunal, or before any subordinate court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 43 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Power to make provision for certain matters by rule.

- 43. The Governor in Council may by rule make provisions for the following matters—
  - (1) the fees to be charged in any native tribunal and on appeals from a native tribunal;
  - (2) the disposal and application of fines and fees received by native tribunals;
  - (3) the practice and procedure of native tribunals;
  - (4) the practice and procedure on appeal from a native tribunal;
  - (5) the establishment and government of native prisons; and
  - (6) generally for the carrying into effect the provisions of this Ordinance.

4. Section 37 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by substituting the words "district officer" for the words "district commissioner." section 37 of the Principal Ordinance.

5. Section 43 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by substituting the word "following" for the word "following" in the second line of the section.

# OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Although a district officer has the power of revising a decision of a native tribunal he has no power to entertain an appeal, a power which is limited to district commissioners.

This involves an unnecessary tax on the time of district commissioners and also delay and inconvenience to litigants.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
