A Bill to make Provision for Raising a Loan of Three Hundred Thousand Pounds Sterling for Certain Public Purposes.

WHEREAS it is expedient to raise a loan of three hundred thousand pounds sterling for the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Specific Loan Ordinance, 1933". Short title.

2. The Governor is hereby authorized to issue debentures or stock or both under the provisions of the General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance to an amount sufficient to produce as nearly as may be the sum of three hundred thousand pounds sterling, and such further sum as may be necessary to defray the expenses of issue. Authority to Governor to borrow by sale of debentures or inscribed stock.
Cap. 46.

3. The money to be borrowed under the authority of this Ordinance shall be appropriated and applied to the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto. Application of loan.

4. Contribution to the sinking fund as contemplated by sections 14 and 28 of the General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance shall commence in respect of any stock or debentures issued under this Ordinance not later than three years after the date from which the interest on such stock or debentures shall commence to run. Commencement of contribution to Sinking Fund.
Cap. 46.

5. Pending the issue of the whole or any portion of the loan hereby authorized, the Governor may, if necessary, raise instalments of the money as required by the issue of Treasury Bills under the Colonial Treasury Bills Ordinance. Power to issue Treasury Bills.
Cap. 49.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill makes provision for raising a loan of three hundred thousand pounds, and such further sum as may be necessary to defray the expenses of issue, for the purposes set out in the Schedule to the Bill.

Expenditure of public moneys will be involved to the extent necessary to meet the service of the loan, but as to £260,000, Government will receive interest on money provided for the Land Bank, and as to loans to local authorities Government will be reimbursed to an extent necessary to meet loan charges.

10. The magistrate shall after making such an investigation as aforesaid forward a certified copy of the proceedings to the Colonial Secretary for the information of the Governor, and a certified copy of the proceedings may be obtained by any member of the public from the magistrate holding the investigation upon payment of the usual fees charged for making copies of documents as laid down in the table of Court fees.

**A Bill to Amend the Fire Inquiry Ordinance,
1929.**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Fire Inquiry (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933," and shall be read as one with the Fire Inquiry Ordinance, 1929, hereinafter called "the Principal Ordinance".

Short title.
No. 33 of 1929.

2. Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "record his finding in writing and shall" after the word "aforesaid" which occurs in the second line thereof, and by the insertion of the words "(including the finding)" after the word "proceedings" wherever that word occurs in the said section.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

It has been represented to Government that it is not clear in the Principal Ordinance that the magistrate shall record a finding after holding a fire inquiry. Recently a magistrate refused to record a finding in a fire inquiry holding that he was not authorized to do so by the Principal Ordinance.

This Bill makes it quite clear that a magistrate shall record a finding in writing.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

TRANS NZOIA EUROPEAN COTTAGE
HOSPITAL.

AT a meeting of the Trans Nzoia District Council held on the 7th June, 1933, on the motion of Eng.-Capt. H. G. T. Howes, R.N., seconded Mr. S. H. Powles, it was resolved:—

TENDERS by way of royalty are invited for concessions to collect Beche-de-Mer, on the coast of the Kenya Protectorate, within the following two areas:—

Area No. 2. The foreshore from the mouth of Kilindini Harbour to Kipini.

Area No. 3. The foreshore from Kipini to the boundary of Italian Territory near Ras Kiambone or Dick's Head.

In each case the area will include the foreshore of the islands adjacent thereto.

Each concession will be for a term of two years and three months from the 1st July, 1933, to the 30th September, 1935.

No tender by way of royalty of less than Sh. 15 per bag of 150 lb. collected, will be accepted; and the amount of royalty payable will be subject to revision after the 30th day of the month of September, in each successive year of the term of each Concession. Royalty shall be payable to the Commissioner of Customs upon production for export.

It will be a condition of the concession for each area that the licensee shall collect at least 3,360 pounds weight of Beche-de-Mer during each year of the term of the concession.

Successful tenderers will be required to enter into agreements ensuring the proper working of their concessions, and providing for forfeiture in the event of collections being inadequate; and to pay the cost of preparation of the agreements, and the necessary stamp duty thereon, within one month of a request in writing.

Tenders must be submitted in sealed envelopes, marked "Tenders for Beche-de-Mer" to the Provincial Commissioner, Mombasa, before noon on Saturday, 24th June, 1933.

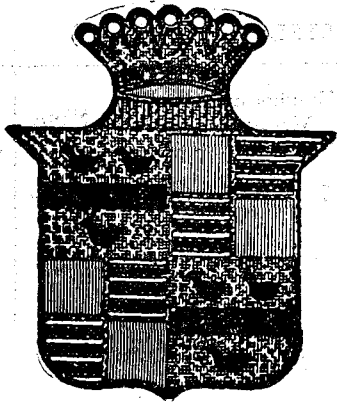

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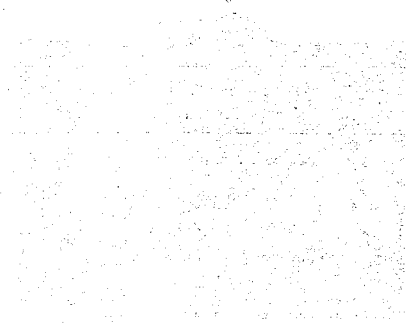
