SUPPLEMENT

KENYA PROCLAMATIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Suspension
and dismissal
of members.

Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to repeal :—

5. A provincial commissioner may suspend for a period not exceeding three months, or, with the approval of the Governor, may dismiss or may suspend for a period exceeding three months, any member of a native tribunal who shall appear to have abused his power, or to be unworthy or to be incapable of exercising the same justly, or for other sufficient reason. On such dismissal or for the period of his suspension the member shall be disqualified from exercising any powers or jurisdiction as a member of the tribunal unless and until he is expressly reinstated by the provincial commissioner.

Section 12 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

12. Subject to the express provision conferring jurisdiction, no native tribunal shall have jurisdiction to try—

- (a) cases in which a person is charged with an offence in consequence of which death is alleged to have occurred or which is punishable under any law with death or imprisonment for life;

A Bill to Amend the Native Tribunals Ordinance, 1930.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Native Tribunals (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Native Tribunals Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.
No. 39 of 1930.

2. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor—

Repeal and replacement of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance.

“5. A district officer may suspend and a provincial commissioner may dismiss or may suspend any member of a native tribunal who shall appear to have abused his power, or to be unworthy or to be incapable of exercising the same justly, or for other sufficient reason. On such dismissal or for the period of his suspension the member shall be disqualified from exercising any powers or jurisdiction as a member of the tribunal unless and until he is expressly reinstated by the provincial commissioner.”

Suspension and dismissal of members.

3. Paragraph (c) of section 12 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion at the end thereof of the following proviso :—

Amendment of section 12 (c) of the Principal Ordinance.

“Provided that any township situated in a native reserve may be excluded from the operation of this paragraph by order of the Governor.”

- (b) cases in connexion with marriage other than a marriage contracted under or in accordance with native law or custom, except where the claim is one for bride price only;
- (c) cognizable offences committed in any place which, under any law in force in the Colony, is declared to be a municipality or a township.

Section 43 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Power to make provision for certain matters by rule.

43. The Governor in Council may by rule make provisions for the following matters—

- (1) the fees to be charged in any native tribunal and on appeals from a native tribunal;
- (2) the disposal and application of fines and fees received by native tribunals;
- (3) the practice and procedure of native tribunals;
- (4) the practice and procedure on appeal from a native tribunal;
- (5) the establishment and government of native prisons; and
- (6) generally for the carrying into effect the provisions of this Ordinance.

4. Section 43 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the word "folowing" which occurs in the second line thereof and the substitution therefor of the word "following".

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill proposes to amend the Native Tribunals Ordinance, 1930, in two respects.

Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance provides that a provincial commissioner may suspend and with the approval of the Governor dismiss a member of a tribunal. It is proposed in clause 2 that a district officer should have the power to suspend and a provincial commissioner to dismiss a member without reference to the Governor, and that the powers of reinstatement should vest in a district officer instead of in a provincial commissioner.

Under section 12 of the Principal Ordinance tribunals have no jurisdiction to try cognizable offences committed in any township or municipality. It is considered that this prohibition should not apply to certain townships in native reserves, and clause 3 proposes that the Governor should have power to exclude townships in native reserves from the provisions of section 12 (c) of the Principal Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

LOCUST REPORT, 16TH JANUARY, 1935.

KENYA.

Information received indicates that invasion by small swarms from Tanganyika should be anticipated. Hence the outlook in Kenya is not as favourable as earlier in the month. These swarms are attended by predatory birds. Also, egg-laying on the plains south of the Usambara Mountains and other places in north-eastern Tanganyika necessitates caution in predicting the situation in this Colony later in the year. Flying locusts might eventuate from these layings, cross the border into Kenya and menace crops. In addition, locusts reported in the north-eastern portion of Tanganyika might continue their northerly direction of flight and enter this Colony. Kenya is indebted to authorities in the Territory for full telegraphic reports at frequent intervals. These reports are of very great value.

There is nothing further to report from other parts of the Colony except the Coast Province where hoppers have emerged on a very small scale. Suitable measures for their extermination have been taken by owners of the land on which these hoppers have appeared.

TANGANYIKA TERRITORY.

As mentioned above egg-laying is reported to be general on the plains south of the Usambara Mountains where maize planted during the short rain season has been damaged. Emergence of hopper is reported south-east of Moshi and two large swarms approaching maturity are present in the vicinity of Moshi. The direction of flight to the Usambara swarms has been northerly until the mountains have been reached when it has changed to south-westerly.

Reports received from this Territory are unfavourable to Kenya but not such as to cause alarm.

RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

UASIN GISHU DISTRICT.

One case of positive rabies is reported since the publication of our last report on the 15th November. The case occurred in a dog on a farm in the Lessos Road area, about 20 miles from Eldoret. Four out of the last five cases recorded have occurred in the Turbo-Soy-Eldoret district and it would now appear that the incidence of rabies is mainly centred around this area, which during the course of a year, has been thoroughly baited. From the particulars furnished in the above-mentioned case, it is considered that the dog must have come into contact with an infected jackal and it is again urged that all Europeans and natives resident in areas where rabies is prevalent or has been prevalent should endeavour to exterminate these carriers of rabies infection.

NYANZA PROVINCE—CENTRAL KAVIRONDO NATIVE RESERVE.

Poison baiting in North and South Ugenya was continued during December, a mortality of dogs 411, cats 23, jackals 3, being reported.

A case which might be regarded as suspicious was reported on December 4th, from Samia, a dog having assumed a vicious character. The brain, however, was unobtainable, the dog being said to have been killed by a leopard, but Samia will be included in an intensive baiting campaign during January.

A further suspicious case occurred at Kibigori on December 31st, and 1,200 baits were laid on the following day. The laboratory report on the brain indicated that a positive diagnosis was impossible.

Instructions have been issued to Chiefs and Mlangos that no dogs may cross the Nzoia River in either direction. In the meanwhile, baiting is in progress along a three-mile front on the north bank of the Nzoia in the North Ugenya location, as a prelude to a massed drive in January, when the whole of the South Ugenya, North Ugenya, Samia and part of the West Alego locations will be systematically baited.

NYANZA PROVINCE—NORTH KAVIRONDO NATIVE RESERVE.

Cases of natives being bitten by jackal are reported from the Kakalelwa and West Kakamega areas and unfortunately in both cases the jackals escaped. Poison baiting has been carried out during the month of November with the following mortality:—Dogs, 445, jackals, 172, other animals 51.

Nineteen positive cases of rabies have been reported during the year 1934, of which 12 have been found affecting jackal, 7 in dogs with a history of having possibly come into contact with rabid jackals. The outbreaks were reported from the following districts:—

Uasin Gishu District: 9; North Kavirondo Reserve: 5; Central Kavirondo: 3; Kisumu-Londiani District (Songhor): 2.
